THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-1 on their current seven-game homestand, sweeping the Orioles over the weekend and going 2-1 vs. the Astros this week...following this afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to New York for three over the weekend vs. the Yankees followed by three in Toronto Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won nine of their last 12 games overall.

PÉREZ 8-STRONG OVER 'STROS: The Twins beat the Astros last night by a score of 6-2... Martín Pérez (4-0) was the starter and winner, pitching 8.0 shutout innings with four hits, wo walks and seven strikeouts...8.0 innings marked his most since 2015 and it was the fourth consecutive start with 6.0-plus...the offense recorded seven hits, two from both Jorge Polanco and Nelson Cruz...Jonathan Schoop hit his fifth home run of the season, a two-run shot in the third inning off Collin McHugh...the game was played in 2:28.

TWINS-ASTROS: The Twins and Astros are playing the seventh and final time this season... the Twins are 30-33 all-time against the Astros, including a record of 19-24 since Houston joined the American League in 2013...they have won just six times in their last 21 meetings with the Astros, but have three of those wins this season.
$\Phi$ A win today would make the Twins 4-3 over the Astros this season, winning the sea-son-series for just the second time between these two teams, the other coming in 2013 when the Twins went 5-1
$\Phi$ A win today would give the Twins their first series win over the Astros since taking two of three April 9-11, 2018 at Target Field...this series marks the Twins second ever four-game series vs. Houston and a win would secure their first four-game series win
$\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is hitting .329 (23-for-70) with a .368 OBP vs. Houston, hitting safely in 14 of 18 career games.
玉 Jonathan Schoop is hitting . 359 ( 37 -for-103) with nine doubles, six home runs, 17 RBI and a .987 OPS in 26 career games vs. the Astros; the .359 average is his highest vs. any AL opponent...additionally, he is hitting 429 (21-for-49) with seven doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI in his last 12 games vs. the Astros.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have placed left-handed pitcher Adalberto Mejía on the 10 -day injured list with a right calf strain (retro to May 1)...Mejía appeared in 11 games for the Twins, going 0-1 with an 8.14 ERA (11.1 (P, 11 ER), nine walks and 11 strikeouts...to replace Meiía on the Twins 25 -man roster, the Twins have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Mike Morin (pronounced MORE-in) from Triple-A Rochester...Morin appeared in eight games ( 1 start) for the Red Wings, going $0-1$ with a 2.25 ERA ( 12.0 IP, 3 ER), one save, three walks and 12 strikeouts...Morin, who turns 28 on Friday, has appeared in 186 career major league games, going 10-8 with a 4.66 ERA (174.0 IP, 90 ER), one save, 49 walks and 166 strikeouts with Los Angeles-AL, Kansas City and Seatlle...the Twins 40-man roster is now at 40

YARD WORK: The Twins have hit 51 home runs so far through 28 games...they have homered in 20 of 28 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 12 of 28 , going 9-3 in those games...the Twins rank fourth in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the fewest

THE SCOOP ON SCHOOP: Jonathan Schoop is hitting . 326 (15-for-46) with six doubles, three home runs and seven RBI in his last 12 games (Twins 9-3)...since 2016, he ranks third in extra-base hits (184) among all second basemen, trailing Brian Dozier (208) and Jose Altuve (191)...Schoop has the sixth best slugging percentage among all second basemen in baseball (.516)...he ranks fourth in all of MLB in slugging percentage out of the seventh spot in the lineup (.698).

Myers Miracle on Tuesday night, going 0 -for-1 with a walk and HBP...he is scheduled to continued his rehab with the Miracle for 7.0 innings at third base in game one of their doubleheader vs. Clearwater, starting at 3:00 pm (CT).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1964, at Municipal Stadium in Kansas City, the Twins hit four consecutive home runs in one inning, Tony Oliva, Bob Allison, Jimmie Hall and Harmon Killebrew all went deep in the 11th inning to win 7-3...in 1992, Yankees pitcher Scott Sanderson became the 12 th pitcher in major league history to surrender four home runs in a single inning as Shane Mack, Kirby Puckett, Kent Hrbek, and Randy Bush all went deep (all solo) in the fifth inning as the Twins won 7-6.

LAST OUTING: Berríos extended his winning streak to four games, allowing two runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings with eight strikeouts on April 27 vs. Baltimore...threw $6.0+$ innings for the sixth consecutive start....he raised his strikeout total to 41 , marking the most through his first six starts in his career.

MOVING UP IN THE RANKS: Through his six starts, Berríos' strikeouts rank third, trailing Johan Santana (45 in 2005 and 2007) on the Twins all-time strikeout totals for March/April...in fact, he is the only player in Twins history to record at least 35 strikeouts in March/April in back-toback seasons...below are the leaders for March/April in Twins history:

AGAINST THE ASTROS: He has appeared in four games against Houston (all starts)...is 1-3, 8.36 ERA ( 14.0 IP, 13 ER) with 13 walks and 15 strikeouts...owns a 0-2 record, 11.57 ERA in just 7.0 innings at Target Field vs. the Astros...last time out came July 14, 2017 at Minute Maid park, he was dealt the loss after allowing two runs on four hits in 6.2 innings pitched in a 5-10 Twins defeat...only career win vs. the Astros came in his first start vs. Houston on May 2, 2016 at Minute Maid Park, allowing two runs on three hits in 5.1 innings pitched with two home runs (George Springer and Preston Tucker).

JOSÉ'S HOME: Berríos enters today 3-0, 1.77 ERA (20.1 IP, 4 ER) in three starts at Target Field this season...he has a four-game winning streak at home dating back to September 28, 2018... since May 15, 2018, he has gone 11-2, 2.64 ERA (105.2 IP, 31 ER) in his last 16 home starts with 12 of those being quality starts; in that span, the 11 home wins since that date are the most in baseball...he went 9-4, 3.03 ERA (107.0 IP, 36 ER) in 17 appearances (17 starts) at home in 2018...conversely, Berríos was 3-7, 4.85 ERA (85.1 IP, 46 ER) on the road and suffered six consecutive road losses before winning at Toronto July 24, 2018.

LEADERBOARD LOVE: Among American League pitchers, he ranks tied for fourth in wins (4), tied for seventh in strikeouts (41), eighth in inning pitched (39.1), 11th in ERA (2.97), 12th in opponent batting average (.206), and 15th in opponent OPS (.245).

REST UP: Over his career, he is $8-9,4.53$ ERA (136.2 IP, 76 ER ) when given 5 day's rest as opposed to 9-5, 3.20 ERA (107.0 IP, 38 ER) with 29 walks and 102 strikeouts when given $6+$ day's rest... in 2018, Berríos was 3-5, 3.89 ERA on five day's rest and 3-1, 1.82 ERA on 6+ day's rest.

HAVE A DAY: Berríos is $16-12$, 4.43 ERA ( 182.2 IP, 90 ER ) with 66 walks and 178 strikeouts in day starts over his career...over 14 day starts in 2018, he was 4-7, 4.63 ERA (81.2 IP, 42 ER) with 31 walks and 81 strikeouts...this year he carries a 3-1 record, a 2.05 ERA and has allowed only six runs in 26.1 innings pitched...his day loss came on a Sunday afternoon in Philadelphia on April 7.

PITCH SELECTION: José is throwing his curveball this season at a 34.0 percent usage rate...in 2018 he threw it 30.4 percent of time, 30 percent in 2017 and 21.6 in 2016...he has thrown a total of 583 pitches on the year with 50.4 percent of those landing in the strike zone...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitch arsenal, according to Baseball Savant:

COMING UP CLUTCH: In 2018, opponents batted just . 139 (5-for-36) against Berríos in close and late situations which ranks 3rd best in the MLB among starting pitchers with at least 80 innings pitched, (according to Inside Edge).
