THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 6-1 (3-1 in Seattle and 3-0 in Anaheim), the Twins began their five-game homestand with a win over the White Sox last night...today they will play the second of three with the Sox, wrap the series tomorrow afternoon then host the Brewers for two on Monday and Tuesday...the Twins have won 14 of their last 18 and nine of their last 10...they lead baseball with 17 wins this month and have the best winning percentage in baseball overall at .680.

TWIN KILLING AGAIN: The Twins beat the White Sox last night by a score of 11-4...José Berríos (7-2) was the starter and winner...Berríos and Martín Pérez become the fifth set of Twins pitchers to record seven wins within 50 games of any season, the first since Joe Mays and Brad Radke (7 each) in 2001...the offense recorded 12 hits, four coming from Eddie Rosario...Rosario (15), Max Kepler (11) and Miguel Sanó (5) each homered for the second straight game.

TWINS AND SOX: Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the second of 19 times this season...Twins enter today having won their last five over the Sox, their longest win-streak over Chicago since April 3-June 22, 2014 (also 5); their last six-gamer came May 3-July 8, 2011...Twins have gone 25-14 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

CASE OF THE RUNS: The Twins have now scored 300 runs on the season, the most in baseball, 25 more than second place Texas (275)...they are averaging 6.0 runs-per-game, the club-high is a 5.41 in 1996...the MLB record (since 1901) is 6.90, done by the 1930 New York Yankees.

☞ Twins have scored six-plus runs in 25 of 50 games this season.
☞ After reaching 300 runs last night, the Twins became the ninth team since the club came to Minnesota (1961), to reach the 300-run mark in their first 50 games:

LAND OF 10,000 RAKES: The Twins have hit 101 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 327, which would break the major league record of 267, done by the Yankees last season.

☞ The 101 home runs in the Twins first 50 games last night fell one short of the major league record for homers by a team in their first 50 games...the 1999 Mariners hit 102.
☞ Twins lead baseball with a +41 home run differential...second best is Houston at +28.
☞ Twins have hit multiple home runs in 25 of 50 games this season, going 20-5 in those games.

BUCK DOUBLE UP: Byron Buxton hit his 19th double of the season last night, the most in baseball...the Twins lead the AL in doubles with 108, tying them for second in all of baseball with Philadelphia, trailing Arizona (111)...19 doubles for Buxton are the fourth most in the Twins first 50 games, trailing Chuck Knoblauch's 25 in 1994, Kirby Puckett's 20 in 1989 and Dan Gladden's 20 in 1988...the Twins all-time high for doubles in the club's first 50 games is 119, done in 1994, their current total of 108 being second-most.

EDDIE! EDDIE! EDDIE! Eddie Rosario is hitting .451 (23-for-51) with two doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI in his last 12 games...he has multiple hits in five of his last seven games, including three-plus in four of those...last night he recorded his 42nd RBI on the season, and is the 12th player in Twins history to eclipse the 40-RBI mark within the Twins first 50 games of any season, first since Justin Morneau drove in 45 in the first 50 games of 2009...the 42 RBI through 50 games tie Tony Oliva (1970), Harmon Killebrew (1970) and Torii Hunter (2007) for sixth-most in club history; the leader being Kirby Puckett with 51 in 1994.

HITMEN: The Twins have recorded double-digit hit totals in each of their last four, eight of their last nine and 10 of their last 13...the Twins 472 hits rank second most in baseball, trailing Houston (482)...Twins have 24 games with double-digit hit totals, tied with Houston, Colorado and Arizona for the most in baseball.

BRIEFLY: Former Twins outfielder Jason Kubel is celebrating his 37th birthday today...Kubel had 22 home runs and 77 RBI in 84 career games vs. the White Sox, both by far his most vs. any opponent over his career.

LAST START: Pitched 6.0 innings on Sunday against the Mariners, but allowed four runs on nine hits as the Twins fell 7-4 in Seattle...held the M's scoreless through the first turn through the order before back-to-back one-out doubles by Edwin Encarnación and Domingo Santana put an end to any thoughts of a shutout...

ON THE VERGE OF HISTORY: Gibson enters today's matchup with 977.1 career innings pitched, 22.2 innings short of marking 1,000 innings in his career...the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, will become just the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1000.0 IP threshold, first since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP as a Twin from 2000-2007.

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enters today's start with the sixth-most starts (159, teammate Odorizzi is fourth with 162) and the eighth-highest innings pitched total (926.1) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...

AGAINST THE PALE HOSE: The right-hander is making his 15th career start against the White Sox, first this season...owns a career line of 7-4 with a 2.93 ERA (92.0 IP, 30 ER) against Chicago-AL...
