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THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 6-1 (3-1 in Seattle and $3-0$ in Anaheim), the Twins began their five-game homestand with consecutive wins over the White Sox...today they will play the three-game series finale with the Sox...tomorrow night they will begin a two-game series with the Brewers Monday-Tuesday...the Twins have won 15 of their last 19 and 10 of their last 11 ...they lead baseball with 18 wins this month and have the best winning percentage in baseball overall at .686 .

AND ANOTHER ONE: The Twins beat the White Sox yesterday afternoon by a score of 8-1, winning the series, their 11th in 17 chances this season...Kyle Gibson (5-2) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 10 hits, three from Ehire Adrianza, who hit his fourth home run and drove in a career-high tying four...the four RBI was matched by C.J. Croon, tying his season-high.

BRING 'EM OUT! BRING 'EM OUT!: Yesterday afternoon's paid attendance was 39,139, the second highest for the Twins this season, second to Opening Day when the Twins drew 39,519 vs. Cleveland...yesterday marked the second sellout of the season for the Twins (OD the other) and 163rd in Target Field's history...it marked the first non-Opening Day sellout at Target Field since August 29, 2015 vs. Houston, drawing 38,876.
$\Phi$ The Twins have now sold out 163 regular season games at Target Field in 753 openings since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and two in 2019.

CALENDAR CHECK: Yesterday the Twins improved to 18-6 this month, marking the Twins most wins in a month since they went $20-10$ in August of 2017... prior to that, their winningest month was May of 2015, going 20-7...the Twins have five games remaining in May...the Twins have won 19-plus games in a single month 18 times in their history, their high being $23-7$ in July of 1969 ...they have won 20-plus game in a single month 10 times...their best in May was 21-7 in 1990
$\Phi$ This month, Jorge Polanco leads the American League in hits (34), Eddie Rosario ranks third (31) and C.J. Crown is tied for fourth (28)...Cron is tied for third in RBI (20) and tied for second in home runs (8).

SWEEPS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their seventh sweep of an opponent this season...their previous six sweeps came: three games May 20-22 at Los Angeles-AL, three games May 6-8 at Toronto, three games April 26-28 vs. Baltimore, three games at Baltimore April 20-21, two games April 13-14 vs. Detroit, and two games April 2-3 at Kansas City...Twins recorded eight sweeps all of last season...Twins last sweep of the Sox was in four games Sept. 28-30, 2018.
TWINS AND SOX: Twins and White Cox are playing each other for the third of 19 times this season...Twins enter today having won their last six over the Cox, their longest win-streak over Chicago since May 3-July 8, 2011...Iast time they won seven straight over Chicago came September 14, 2010-July 8, 2011 when they won nine straight...Twins have gone 26-14 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

W-W-W-W-W-W: The Twins have won each of last Odorizzi's seven starts (beginning April 17), while he is personally 6-0 with a 1.30 ERA ( $41.2 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{ER}$ ) to match his career-best six-game winning streak (which happened over an eight-start stretch from July 17-August 25, 2016 with Tampa Bay). - Since April 17, Odorizzi is tied for the American League lead for wins (6), while ranking second in ERA (1.30), third for opponents' slugging percentage (292) and OPS (559), 11th for WHIP (1.03) and 16th for opponents' batting average (.214, 33-for-154) and hits-per-9.0 innings (7.13). - The winning streak features victories over Toronto, Houston (twice), New York-AL, Detroit and Los Angeles-AL...the last Twins starter to win seven-or-more consecutive decisions was Kyle Gibson from August 22, 2017 - March 31, 2018, while the last to do so in a single season was Francisco Liriano's streak of eight consecutive winning decisions from July 16-September 14, 2010...the franchise record for most consecutive winning decisions is 17 set by Johan Santana back in 2004-05, while the single-season record was set from June 7-August 4, 1997 by Brad Radke.
POSTING ZEROS: Odorizzi has been unscored upon in four of his last five starts, with a 0.89 ERA (30.1 IP, 3 ER), nine walks, 29 strikeouts, a 176 batting-average-against (19-for-108) and a 0.92 WHIP...that stretch includes a 22.1-inning scoreless streak (April 29-May 15), the fifth-longest ever for a Twins starter:

ODO-METER: For the season, Odorizzi ranks second in the American League with a 2.38 ERA (53.0 IP, 14 ER ), fourth with a 195 opponents' batting average ( 37 -for-190), tied for fourth with six wins, eighth with a 1.06 WHIP ( 19 BB ), 26th by striking out 8.83 batters-per- 9.0 innings ( 52 SO ) and 30th with a 2.74 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

SOFT CONTACT: Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (4th-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been equally difficult to square up - he's allowed just eight extra-base hits, third-fewest in the majors (min. 7 starts and 35.0 innings pitched).

- His . 279 opponents' slugging pct. is second lowest in the AL (fifth in baseball), while his
. 550 OPS is fifth-best in baseball
- Of the 139 balls put in play against Odorizzi, only 41 have been hit hard (exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH )...his 29.7 percent hard-hit rate is sixth-lowest in baseball (min. 130 batted balls)

LAST TIME OUT: Odorizzi did not factor in the decision for the first time since his initial 2019 start (on March 31), but still pitched the Twins to their seventh-straight victory when he's on the mound with 5.0-shutout innings in a 3-1 victory last Monday night at Los Angeles-AL.

- Gave up three singles (two infield hits) and two walks, while allowing only one runner to reach second base.
- Departed with a 1-0 lead; after the Angels tied the game in the bottom of the seventh, Miguel Sanó's two-run home run in the top of the eighth gave the Twins a 3-1 win.

AGAINST THE WHITE SOX: Odorizzi will face the South Siders for the seventh time in his career, having gone 1-2 with a 3.41 ERA ( 34.1 IP, 13 ER) in his first six outings (all starts)

- Faced Chicago-AL three times in 2018, going 0-1 with a 3.31 ERA (16.1 IP, 6 ER)...lost his only
start at Target Field, allowing three runs in 5.0 innings of a 5-2 White Sox victory on June 6.
- His last win against the Pale Hose came here on June 8, 2017, (6.2 IP, 8 H, 3 ER) a $7-5$ Twins win.

ON TARGET AT HOME: In his first five home starts this season, Odorizzi is 4-0 with an AL-best 1.45 ERA ( 31.0 IP, 5 ER) and a . 188 opponents' batting average ( 21 -for-112), along with six walks, 32 strikeouts and a 0.87 WHIP (fourth-best in the AL).

- In his first 21 home starts with the Twins, Odorizzi is $9-4$ with a 3.79 ERA (111.2 IP, 47 ER) and a . 239 opponents' average (102-for-426), with 36 walks and 113 strikeouts...the Twins are 14-7 when he takes the mound at Target Field (4-1 in 2019).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30 -start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 162 starts and a .234 opponents' batting aveage since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (168), Corey Kluber (167) and Justin Verlander (164) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past $5+$ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.213), Verlander (.221) and Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Starts in the
Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career. - Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-Ion-- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retir
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2). - Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON: 4-3, 5.43 ERA ; CAREER: 44-44, प.15 ERA]

Pineda makes his 11 th start and appearance of the season in tomorrow night's series opener against Milwaukee...is $4-3,5.43$ ERA ( $53.0 \mathrm{IP}, 32 \mathrm{ER}$ ) through the first 10 outings of his comeback season...won twice on the Twins' recent roadtrip (May 16 at Seattle and May 21 at Los Angeles-AL) and has now turned in three-consecutive quality starts, going $2-0$ with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 IP, 9 . 2 )...ranks 13 th in the AL with a 4.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio ( $44 \mathrm{SO}, 11 \mathrm{BB}$ ).... has never faced the Brewers, but has enjoyed tremendous Interleague success...is $8-3$ with a $2.99 \mathrm{ERA}(87.1 \mathrm{P}, 29 \mathrm{ER}$ ) and a .208 opponents' batting average ( 66 -for-318) in 15 career starts vs. the National League...earned a $6-2$ win at Philadelphia on April 6 of this season... will mark his 128 th Major League start and appearance.

Twins relievers have pitched 155.2 innings, 2nd fewest in baseball behind only the Nationals (152.1)...bullpen has gone 6-5-14 with 29 holds, a 4.16 ERA ( 155.2 IP, 72 ER), 66 walks, 167 strikeouts and a 246 opponents' batting average ( 147 -for-598) in 51 games...Twins bullpen is first in baseball in save percentage ( $87.5 \%$ ), going $14-$ for- 16 in save opportunities with two blown saves, tied for the fewest in MLB tied w/ White Sox.
