THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-0 through three games on their five-game homestand, sweeping the White Sox in three over the weekend...tonight the Twins will begin a short two-game series with the Brewers...following tomorrow night's finale, the Twins will travel to St. Petersburg, FL for a 10-game roadtrip...they will have an off-day in Florida on Wednesday, play four with the Rays May 30-June 2, off day in Cleveland June 3, three with the Tribe June 4-6, then three in Detroit June 7-9...the Twins have won 16 of their last 20 and 11 of their last 12...they lead baseball with 19 wins this month and have the best winning percentage in baseball overall at .692.

TWINS CLEAN UP THE SOX: The Twins beat the White Sox yesterday afternoon by a score of 7-0, earning their seventh sweep and winning their sixth straight game...Jake Odorizzi (7-2) was the starter and winner, pitching 5.1 shutout innings with one hit, one walk and nine strikeouts...the offense recorded just six hits, their fewest since collecting just four on May 5 at New York-AL...Max Kepler (12) and Eddie Rosario (16) each homered as Kepler had the only multi-hit game for the Twins...Twins sold out their third game of the season with 39,913 in attendance.

CALENDAR CHECK: Twins are 19-6 this month, marking the Twins most wins in a month since they went 20-10 in August of 2017...prior to that, their winningest month was May of 2015, going 20-7...the Twins have four games remaining in May...the Twins have won 20-plus games in a single month 10 times in their history...below are the Twins all-time 20-win months:

NOTE: The Major League Baseball record for home runs in any month by any team is 58 by the Baltimore Orioles in May of 1987 and Seattle Mariners in May of 1999.

MINNESOTA WINS: 52 games marks the fewest amount of games for the Twins to reach 20 games over .500 in Twins/Senators franchise history...the Twins prior fewest games to 20 over was 54 games in 1931...additionally, May 26 is the earliest date in a calendar year for the Twins to be 10-plus games up in their division...three other teams have reached a 10-plus game lead in their respective divisions as of May 26 or earlier: Los Angeles-NL, through games of May 6, 1977 (22-4, +10.5 on Cincinnati) // Seattle, through games of May 11, 2001 (26-9, +10 on Anaheim) // Boston, through games of May 18, 2007 (28-12, +10 on Baltimore)...the earliest by any Twins team prior to this season was through games of July 15, 2002 when they were 10 games up on Chicago-AL (54-40).

WHITE HOT TWINS: The Twins have won six straight and have gone 11-1 (.917) since May 14, outscoring opponents 105-44 in that span...their +61 differential is the highest by the franchise in any 12-game span since the 1933 Washington Senators were +76 in 12 games from June 11-25...Twins last win-streak of seven-plus came September 26, 2018-Opening Day; last in a *single-season* was history June 11-21, 2011.

BRING 'EM OUT! BRING 'EM OUT!: Yesterday marked the third sellout of the season, the 164th in Target Field's history and second consecutively...it marked the Twins first back-to-back sellouts since June 20 & 21, 2015 vs. Chicago-NL, drawing 40,066 and 40,273 respectively...Target Field sellouts through the years: 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018 and three in 2019.

BORDER BATTLE/INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 2-3 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia April 5-7 and 1-1 in New York April 9-10...they are 213-194 all-time in IL play, the seventh most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (245), New York-AL (240), Los Angeles-AL (228), Texas (222), Oakland (220) and Detroit (214).

☞ The Twins are 229-222 all-time against the Brewers (games since 1970) and have a record against them of 63-53 in Interleague Play...last season, they went 1-5 vs. the Brewers, going 1-2 at Target Field from May 18-20 and 0-3 at Miller Park from July 2-4.
☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .325 (40-for-123) with 11 doubles, seven home runs and 18 RBI in his last 30 games vs. NL opponents.
☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .438 (32-for-73) in his last 19 games against NL teams...has multiple hits in 10 of those games.

LAND OF 10,000 RAKES: The Twins have hit 104 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 324, which would break the major league record of 267, done by the Yankees last season...the Twins lead baseball with a +43 home run differential, in front of Houston at +27...the +43 run differential is tied with the 2003 New York Yankees for third best through 52 games in the live-ball era.

FOR STARTERS: This month, Twins starters have gone 17-5, 2.80 ERA (151.0 IP, 47 ER) with 39 walks, 147 strikeouts, an opponent batting average of .234 and an opponent OPS of .673...they also have 14 quality starts among the 25 games started this month...on the season, the Twins have three pitchers with seven wins: Martín Pérez (7-1), José Berríos (7-2) and Jake Odorizzi (7-2)...no other team in baseball has more than one pitcher with seven wins and just five other pitchers have at least seven wins: Domingo Germán (9), Justin Verlander (8), Max Fried (7), Hyun-Jin Ryu (7) and Brandon Woodruff (7).

☞ Three Twins with seven-plus wins within the Twins first 52 marks the first time for the club...three previous times with *two starters* to have seven-plus: 1972 Bert Blyleven (7) and Jim Kaat (8), 1979 Jerry Koosman (7) and Mike Marshall (8), 2001 Joe Mays (7) and Brad Radke (8).

HAPPY MEMORIAL DAY: The Twins are 20-28 all-time on Memorial Day...last season the Twins beat the Royals in Kansas City on Memorial Day by a score of 8-5...Lance Lynn was the winner and Fernando Rodney earned the save...the offense recorded 12 hits as Brian Dozier recorded three hits and Miguel Sanó hit his sixth home run of the season.

- Twins relievers have pitched 159.1 innings, 2nd least in baseball behind the Nationals (1st with 156.1 IP)...bullpen has gone 6-5-14 with 30 holds, a 4.07 ERA (15912 IP, 72 ER), 68 walks, 174 strikeouts and a .246 opponents' batting average (151-for-613) in 52 games...Twins bullpen is first in baseball in save percentage (87.5%), going 14-for-16 in save opportunities with two blown saves, tied for the fewest in MLB tied w/ White Sox (2).

- In two career games vs. Brewers (both as reliever) is 1-0 with 3.0 IP & five strikeouts...has a 0.67 WHIP & a 66.7 GB% in those two games. Owns a 1.50 ERA (6.0 IP, ER) with two walks, one home run and 14 strikeouts at home this season. Has held opponents to a .241 batting average (14-for-58)... .233 (7-for-30) against LHB & .250 (7-for-28) against RHB this season. 1.32 ERA (13.2 IP, 2 ER) with five walks & 22 strikeouts in seven games for the Red Wings this season. Recalled from Triple-A Rochester May 13 for third time this season...was on team May 11 as 26th man for doubleheader vs. DET, striking out the side in a perfect ninth inning to close out the Twins' 8-3 win in Game 2...was previously with the Twins from 4/16-23. Appeared in 19 games for the Twins last season, going 2-2 with a 7.20 ERA (25.0 IP, 20 ER), four walks and 19 strikeouts.

One of three rookies on Twins...18 of first 20 ML appearances have been scoreless, including 10 consecutive scoreless outings from 4/23-5/18. Combined to go 1-5, (65.0 IP, 26 ER) with 10 BB, 86 K's and 6 saves in 38 games between Chattanooga and Rochester last season...named Southern League Midseason All-Star with Lookouts in 2018. Has allowed only one run in last 12 appearances...0.75 ERA over 12.0 innings pitched with one walk and 11 strikeouts in that span.

In one career game vs. Milwaukee (as a reliever) is 0-1 (0.1 IP, ER) with two walks & a hit batter (7/2/18 at Miller Park). Pitched to 3.71 ERA (17.0 IP, 7 ER) in his final six MLB appearances in 2018, after allowing seven runs in his first 3.1 career innings (18.90 ERA). Made his major league debut on June 5 (Game Two of a doubleheader) last year against the White Sox, allowing six runs on six hits in 3.0 IP...recorded his first ML strikeout in the first inning, punching out Yoán Moncada to begin the game. Is 48-35 lifetime with a 3.41 ERA (710.1 IP, 269 ER) in 131 Minor League games (120 starts), with 649 strikeouts and a 1.26 WHIP. Was acquired by Minnesota along with LHP Dietrich Enns on July 30, 2017 in exchange for LHP Jaime García.

Only 52 batted balls vs. 377 pitches thrown...83.5 MPH average exit velocity off him...relies on 5 pitches - 4-seamer (61.3%), Curve (19.4%), Slider (11.1%), Changeup (8.0%) and Sinker (0.3%). Third longest tenured Twin, appearing in first game w/ MIN 8/9/14 at Oakland in a start...Kyle Gibson is the leader, first appearing on 6/29/13. Spent the first half of 2018 on the 60-day IL recovering from "Tommy John" surgery he had in March 2017, before making 2018 debut 7/31.

Appeared in eight games (1 start) with Triple-A Rochester, going 0-1 w/ a 2.25 ERA (12.0 IP, 3 ER), one save, three walks & 12 strikeouts. Has pitched in 187 career games in the minor leagues, going 15-13 (6 starts) w/ a 3.43 ERA (247.0 IP, 94 ER) w/ 54 walks and 238 strikeouts. In MLB career has gone 10-8-2 w/ a 4.49 ERA (182.1 IP, 91 ER), 49 walks and 172 strikeouts in 195 relief appearances...the Twins mark his fourth organization, joining Los Angeles-AL (2012-17), Kansas City (2017) and Seattle (2018).

Is 8-for-8 in save opportunities this season, is one of 10 ML pitchers with 8+ saves, 100 percent SV%...has pitched in 18 games (16 scoreless) and ranks 4th among AL relief pitchers in ERA (1.04; 17.1 IP, 2 ER). RHB are 6-for-37 (.162) with a .468 OPS, LHB are 3-for-19 (.158) with a .478 OPS off him this season. Relies on four pitches: Four-Seamer (57.5%), Split Finger (19.4%), Curve (16.0%) and Cutter (7.1%)...has a 54.8 ground ball percentage.
