night...tonight the Twins will complete the homestand with the second of two with Milwaukee... following tonight's game, the Twins will travel to St. Petersburg for a 10-game roadtrip... they will have an off-day in Florida tomorrow, play four with the Rays Thursday-Sunday, an off day in Cleveland June 3, three with the Tribe June 4-6, then three in Detroit June 7-9...the Twins have won 16 of their last 21 and 11 of their last 13 ...they lead baseball with 19 wins this month and have the best winning percentage in baseball overall at .679.

CAN'T WIN 'EM ALL: The Twins lost to the Brewers last night by a score of 5-4, blowing a one-run lead in the eighth inning....Michael Pineda was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Taylor Rogers allowed an Orlando Arcia two-run homer in the eighth inning, just the third blown save for the Twins this season - tied for second fewest in baseball...the offense recorded 10 hits, two from Max Kepler... Byron Buxton hit his fifth home run of the season, a three-run shot in the second inning,

PINEDA PLACED ON SHELF: The Twins announced today that they have placed right-handed pitcher Michael Pineda on the 10-day Injured List with right knee tendinitis...Pineda, who made the start last night vs. the Milwaukee Brewers, has started 11 games for the Twins this season, going 4 -3 with a 5.34 ERA ( $59.0 \mathrm{IP}, 35 \mathrm{ER}$ ), 11 walks and 50 strikeouts...to replace Pineda on the $25-\mathrm{man}$

| Saves/Opps | $0 / 1$ | roster, the Twins have selected the contract of left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer from Triple-A Rochester...Smeltzer, 23 , made four starts for the Red Wings, going $0-1$ with a 1.82 ERA ( 24.2 IP, 5 ER), seven walks and 15 strikeouts...in nine combined starts for the Red Wings and Double-A Pensacola this season, he went 3-2 with a 1.15 ERA' (54.2 IP, 7 ER ), 10 walks, 48 strikeouts, an opponents' batting average of . 199 and just two home runs allowed...Smeltzer was the Twins Minor League Pitcher of the Week for the week ending April 14 (2-0 with 14.0 shutout innings for the Blue Wahoos)...the Voorhees, New Jersey native was acquired by the Twins at the 2018 trade deadline from the Los Angeles Dodgers (along with outfielder Luke Raley), in exchange for second baseman Brian Dozier.

MAX, POW: Max Kepler has been named American League Player of the Week, the second honor for the Twins this season (also Jake Odorizzi on May 6)...this marks Kepler's second career AL Player of the Week honor, previously winning with Joe Mauer on August 7, 2016...during the week: $\Phi$ Posted a slash line of $.571 / .600 / 1.190$ with 10 runs scored, 12 hits, four doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, three walks and a stolen base across five games played.
$\mp$ Among AL leaders, finished the week first in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage, runs scored and extra-base hits (7); tied for first in RBI; and tied for second in doubles and hits.
$\Phi$ Enters play today with a nine-game hitting streak dating back to May 16th, leading the Twins to eight wins during his stretch. $\Phi$ Has also logged multi-hit efforts in each of his last six contests dating back to May 20th, becoming the first Twins player to post a streak of at least six such games since Justin Morneau in 2010 (June 19-25).
$\Phi$ Homered in three consecutive games from May 23-26, and enters action today with 12 home runs on the season
BORDER BATTLE/INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 2-4 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia April 5-7, 1-1 in New York April 9-10 and 0-1 vs. Milwaukee...they are 213-195 all-time in IL play, the seventh most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (245), New York-AL (241), Los Angeles-AL (228), Texas (222), Oakland (220) and Detroit (214).

历 The Twins are 229-223 all-time against the Brewers (games since 1970) and have a record against them of 63-54 in Interleague Play...the Twins are looking to snap a four-game losing streak to the Brewers, their last win coming May 20, 2018 at Target Field. $\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting. 320 ( 41 -for-128) with 11 doubles, seven home runs and 18 RBI in his last 31 games vs. NL opponents.
$\mp$ Jorge Polanco is hitting . 423 ( 33 -for-78) in his last 20 games against NL teams.
FOR STARTERS: This month, Twins starters have gone 17-5, 2.87 ERA (157.0 IP, 50 ER) with 39 walks, 153 strikeouts, an opponent batting average of 231 and an opponent OPS of . 663 ...they also have 15 quality starts among the 26 games started this month...for the entire season, the Twins starting staff ranks third in baseball in ERA (3.52), tied for third in quality starts (27), fourth in innings pitched (306.2), fifth in opponent OPS (.698) and ninth in strikeouts (282).

SHIFTING: The Twins infield has shifted 3,547 times this season, the fourth most in baseball, trailing Baltimore $(4,038)$, Milwaukee $(3,714)$ and Houston $(3,681)$.
$\Phi$ Twins fielders enter today with 27 defensive runs saved, third in the AL and eighth best in baseball...Twins lead baseball in Ultimate Zone Rating at 14.1.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Tonight marks the Major League debut for 23-year-old Devin Smeltzer, a left-handed pitcher from New Jersey...Smeltzer comes into tonight's debut after making nine starts this season in the Minor Leagues, covering two levels (five starts for Double-A Pensacola and four starts for Triple-A Rochester)....made five starts for the Blue Wahoos, allowing a miniscule two earned runs in 30.0 innings pitched ( 0.60 ERA) with three walks and 32 strikeouts, including his best statistical start on April 12 vs. Jacksonville ( 8.1 IP, 3 hits, 0 runs, 1 walk and 9 strikeouts)...was promoted to Triple-A on May 2 and made his debut the next night at Pawtucket, throwing 7.0 innings of one (unearned) run ball, scattering a trio of hits with three strikeouts.

GET TO KNOW THE KID: Smeltzer was raised in New Jersey and graduated from Bishop Eustace Preparatory School in Pennsauken Township in 2014 (becomes the ninth New Jersey-born player, seventh pitcher to make his debut for the Twins, first since RHP Rob Delaney on Sept. 4, 2010)... was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the 33rd round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft, but chose to continue his development at Florida Gulf Coast University... in nine starts at FGCU, he pitched to a $1-4$ record with a 6.19 ERA in 52.1 innings pitched.

- Following his season at FGCU, the left-hander transferred to San Jacinto College North in San Jacinto, Texas, where he would go on to lead the NJCAA League 14 in ERA (1.18) and strikeouts (128), while ranking third with nine wins....won the National Junior College Athletic Association Player of the Week award for April 4-10, 2016, after throwing a complete game no-hitter in an 8-0 win over Wharton County Junior College, in which he struck out 16 batters and walked three...also threw two no-hitters in high school and one in a college summer league game.
- Smeltzer had planned to transfer to Texas Tech University, but forewent the opportunity after being drafted in the fifth round (No. 161 overall) in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers, one pick before the Toronto Blue Jays selected Cavan Biggio out of Notre Dame (son of Hall of Fame infielder Craig Biggio)...the Twins selected right-handed pitcher Jordan Balazovic (currently 5-1, 2.22 ERA in Ft. Myers) eight picks before the Dodgers selected Smeltzer. - Spent parts of three seasons in the Dodgers organization before being traded to the Twins, along with infielder Luke Raley, for infielder Brian Dozier at last year's trade deadline...amassed a $5-5$ record, 4.52 ERA (95.2 IP, 48 ER) between Double-A Tulsa (LAD) and Double-A Chattanooga last year, including 10 relief appearances for the Lookouts, allowing six runs (four earned) with 16 strikeouts.

SMELTZER THE CANCER SURVIVOR: When Smeltzer was just nine years old, he was diagnosed with pelvis rhabdomyosarcoma (bladder cancer), as a tumor had formed against his bladder that was connected to his prostate... he underwent surgery and chemotherapy at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and sent the cancer into full remission in 2012.

- While he fought off the cancer, he lost a substantial amount of weight as the radiation and chemotherapy weakened his immune system, leading to frequent vomiting....missed baseball while he was ill, but heightened activity threatened his threat of infections, so he made a deal with the chief of oncology at St. Christopher's, Greg Halligan, that he could go back to playing baseball, but if he grew weaker, he'd have to stop and be fed through a feeding tube. -In a story published on MiLB.com from May 20, Smeltzer said this of his time battling cancer: II put a lot of me being able to do what I can today because I stayed moving and played. tt's crazy looking back, but I just took it day by day. Every time I step on the field, I know there may not be a tomorrow."(Courtesy: Joe Bloss, MiLB.com)
- While getting treatment, Smeltzer became popular throughout the hospital as he would always talk to the other kids, helping them get through treatments the way he did...the lefty, who's worn glasses and a goatee for the majority of his professional career, continues to offer support to others fighting cancer.
- His likeness is featured on a specially-designed t-shirt with his goatee-glasses combination on the chest, supporting his Catch Cancer Looking campaign and benefitting Katie's Krusaders, an organization founded in memory of Katie Ann Duffin, to cover the out-of-pocket expenses for pediatric cancer patients.
- Writes names as a tribute to those who have lost their battle to cancer on the inside of his cap.

LAST TIME OUT: Smeltzer last saw game action on May 23 against the Buffalo Bisons (Toronto), receiving a no-decision after throwing 5.0 innings, allowing two runs (one earned) with five hits, a season-high four walks and three strikeouts in a 4-3 Rochester loss.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Smeltzer earned the Twins' minor league Pitcher of the Week award earlier this season, for the week ending on April 14 after making two starts for Double-A Pensacola, going 2-0, 0.00 ERA (14.0 IP) with five hits allowed, two walks and 17 strikeouts.

AT TIME OF PROMOTION TO ROCHESTER: Smeltzer ranked among Southern League leaders at the time of his promotion on May 2 in ERA (1st, 0.60 ), WHPP (1st, 0.73 ), innings ( $(-4 t \mathrm{th}, 30.0$ ), strikeouts ( $T-4 t \mathrm{th}, 33$ ), average against ( $T-4 t h, .183$ ), and wins ( $(-5 t \mathrm{th}, 3$ ).

SUCCESS IN THE CAPE \& AFL: Smeltzer pitched for Hyannis Harbor in the Cape Cod League in 2015, going 4-3 with a 3.48 ERA in eight games, seven starts. He was named Co-MVP of the West Team in the Friendly's All-Star Game, pitching a perfect 3rd inning while striking out two...also played for the Salt River Rafters in the 2018 Arizona Fall League...pitched to a 1-0 record, 5.87 ERA (7.2 IP, 5ER) with seven strikeouts, and was selected to the Arizona Fall Stars Game...threw 0.2 IP in the AFSG, allowing one run on a walk with two strikeouts. struck out Meibrys Viloria (KC) and Luis Robert (CWS) before walking Khalil Lee (KC), who later scored on a Yu Chang (CLE) single off Melvin Adon (SF).
