THE TWINS: The Twins completed their recent seven-game homestand with a record of 6-1, going 3-0 vs. Baltimore and 3-1 vs. Houston...today they will begin their third roadtrip of 2019, starting with three in the Bronx vs. the Yankees this weekend...the Twins will continue the trip with three in Toronto from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 10 of their last 13 games overall.

HOUSTON? WE HAVE NO PROBLEM: The Twins beat the Astros yesterday afternoon by a score of 8-2, scoring six runs in the fourth inning...José Berrios (5-1) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched with no walks...the offense recorded 10 hits, highlighted by Jason Castro, who went 2-for-4 with a double and home run while tying a career-high with four RBI...the Twins went 4-for-9 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS AND YANKEES: The Twins are Yankees are playing the first of six games with the next series coming July 22-24 at Target Field...they went 0-4 at Yankee Stadium last season from April 23-26 and 2-1 at Target Field from September 10-12...they are looking to snap a seven-game losing streak in New York and win here for the first time since a 7-1 victory on June 26, 2016; it is their only win in their last 13 games at Yankee Stadium.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .351 (20-for-57) with five doubles, two home runs and five RBI in his last 15 games at Yankee Stadium.
☞ Jonathan Schoop has hit safely in his last seven games vs. the Yankees, hitting .355 (11-for-31) with six doubles during the streak.

MINNESOTA WINS: The Twins enter tonight with a major league-best 19-10 (.655) record, marking the first time since September 23, 2010 that the Twins held the top record in baseball (92-60, .605 at the time), according to Elias...this marks the Twins best start since 2001, when the team started 19-7 (.731)...since 1961, only four Twins teams prior to this season have started better (2001, 1979: 15-7 (.682), 1972: 8-3 (.727) and 1969: 14-7 (.667))...the last time the Twins/Senators owned baseball's best record through May 2: 1932: 13-4 (.765)...below is where the Twins rank in baseball in terms of winning percentage:

YARD WORK: The Twins have hit 52 home runs so far through 29 games...they have homered in 21 of 29 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 12 of 29, going 9-3 in those games...the Twins are tied for third in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the second-fewest games.

☞ The Twins have seven players with five-plus home runs (Rosario - 11, Kepler - 7, & Cron, Cruz, Garver, Polanco and Schoop each with 5)...only Seattle has more players with five-plus (8).

LEFTY LOOSEY: James Paxton is the second left-handed starter the Twins have faced this season, the other being Wade Miley on April 23 at Houston in a 10-4 loss...they went 21-25 against left-handed starters last season...this season they are hitting .248 (28-for-113) with eight doubles, six home runs and a .331 on-base percentage against left-handed pitching.

THE SCOOP ON SCHOOP: Jonathan Schoop is hitting .340 (17-for-50) with six doubles, three home runs and eight RBI in his last 13 games (Twins 10-3)...Schoop has the fifth best slugging percentage among all second basemen in baseball (.515)...he ranks fifth in all of MLB in slugging percentage out of the seventh spot in the lineup (.684).

BACKSTOPS: Catchers Willians Astudillo (IL), Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .316 (30-for-95) with nine doubles, nine home runs, 22 RBI and 26 runs scored when catching...at catcher, Castro has made 13 starts, Garver has made 12 starts, and Astudillo has made four starts...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: tied for second in average (.316), first in slugging percentage (.695), tied for first in home runs (9), second in OBP (.396) and OPS (1.091), tied for third in doubles (9) and third in RBI (22)...also are one of 10 teams in the Majors with one-or-less errors at the catcher position.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2011, Francisco Liriano threw the fifth no-hitter in Twins history and first no-hitter of the MLB season as the Twins beat the White Sox, 1-0...Jason Kubel's solo homer in the fourth inning off Edwin Jackson was the game's only run...in 2013, Justin Morneau recorded his 800th career RBI in a Twins 7-6 loss at Cleveland...Morneau finished his Twins career with 860 RBI which stands as the sixth most in club history.

WELCOME AND HAPPY BIRTHDAY! Reliever Mike Morin, who had his contract selected by Minnesota yesterday morning, is celebrating his 28th birthday today...he has appeared on one game on his birthday, coming on May 3, 2016 at Milwaukee while playing with Los Angeles-AL, pitching 1.0 inning with one strikeout.

LAST TIME OUT: Gibson hit his second win of the season and recorded no walks with six strikeouts in 6.0+ innings pitched for the second consecutive game (third time this season with six strikeouts)...his three hits allowed were the fewest of the season and his fewest allowed since September 29 vs. the White Sox...committed his first error since 2015 on a throw to first in the sixth.

GIBBY IN THE BRONX: Gibson is making his ninth career start against New York-AL tonight... is 1-5 with a 6.86 ERA (40.2 IP, 31 ER), allowing 43 hits (three home runs), 20 walks and 28 strikeouts...in his last start on Sept. 10, 2018 in Minneapolis. Gibson was given the loss despite allowing just one run on four hits over 5.2 IP...after exiting the game, Trevor May kept the sheet clean, but the combination of Alan Busenitz, Andrew Vasquez and Matt Magill yielded six runs in the seventh inning, sealing the defeat...Gibson has three previous starts in the Bronx, going 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (16.0 IP, 8 ER) with just one of the three starts being a quality start.

- The last time Gibson pitched in the Bronx was April 26 of last year when he spun 6.0 one-hit innings, striking out a season-high 10 batters, in an eventual 3-4 Twins loss.

ON THE ROAD, AGAIN: Gibson is making his fourth start on the road this season (six total starts) and is looking for second road win this season, second career at Yankee Stadium... since the beginning of 2018, the Twins have gone 11-10 in road games started by Gibson, as he owns a personal 7-7 record, 3.85 ERA (128.2 IP, 55 ER)...over his career, Gibson has had success on the road, posting a 31-29 record with a 4.38 ERA across 84 starts as compared to his 25-32 record (4.59 ERA) at home.

950 IP MARK: In his last start Gibson surpassed the 950 career innings pitched mark, all with Minnesota, becoming the 14th player in Twins history to reach that threshold... he also ranks first on the Twins among players on the active roster...here's how he stacks up against his teammates with the most innings pitched:

PITCH ARSENAL: Gibson's 35.2 percent usage rate of his sinker is the most he's thrown that pitch since 2017 where it was logged at 35.4 percent...in 2018, he threw it 34.5 percent of time, 35.4 percent in 2017 and 29.6 percent in 2016...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

LEFT AND RIGHT: He has held right-handed hitters to a .188 (9-for-48) average with zero home runs, five walks, 12 strikeouts and a .264 OBP this season, while lefties have hit .283 (17-for-60) with four home runs, 12 strikeouts and a .328 OBP...for his career, righties have hit .254 (460-for-1813) with 154 walks and 399 strikeouts, while lefties have hit .284 (533-for-1878) with 190 walks and 310 strikeouts.

- The last time he gave up a homer to a righty came September 10, 2018 vs. these Yankees (Gary Sánchez, solo shot in the sixth).

2018 RECAP:

- Led Twins in innings pitched (196.2), ERA (3.62), and quality starts (18), tied for first in starts (32), and ranked second in strikeouts (179)...set career bests in every category (matching previous high for starts), while also setting career standard for strikeouts-per-9.0 IP (8.19).
- Along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI [SEASON: 3-2, 3.34 ERA // CAREER: 50-50, 3.93 ERA]

Odorizzi will be making his seventh start of the 2019 season Saturday...he was the winner in his last start April 29 vs. Houston allowing zero runs on four hits with one walk and seven strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched...marked just his third outing with 7.0+ innings pitched in a Twins uniform, done on August 24, 2018 vs. Oakland and September 12, 2018 vs. these Yankees...he struck out a total of seven batters bringing his total to 30 on the year which ties the most through his first six starts since 2017 (33)...he will be facing the Yankees for the 17th time (16th start) in his career...has faced the Yankees two times with the Twins...he earned the win in his last start vs. the Yankees September 12, 2018 at Target Field when he took a no-hitter into the eighth inning before yielding a one-out double to Greg Bird.

- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.
- Since the start of 2014 has induced 120 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martín Pérez is third with 109.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.

IP, 26 ER) w/ 20 walks 24 strikeouts in seven games played against the NYY last season...in four games at Yankee Stadium last season, went 0-1, with a 10.54 ERA (13.2 IP, 16 ER) w/ 9 walks and 16 strikeouts.
