THE TWINS: The Twins completed their five-game homestand with a record of 4-1, sweeping the White Sox in three, followed by a two-game split with the Brewers on Monday and Tuesday... tonight the Twins will begin a 10-game, 12-day roadtrip with four against the Rays over the weekend, an off day in Cleveland on Monday, three vs. the Tribe June 4-6, then three in Detroit June 7-9...the Twins have won 17 of their last 22 and 12 of their last 14...Twins have not lost a series since May 3-5 at New York-AL (3 games)...they lead baseball with 20 wins this month and have the best winning percentage in baseball overall at .685.

DEVIN DEALS ON HIS DEBUT: The Twins beat the Brewers on Tuesday night by a score of 5-3, splitting the two-game series...Devin Smeltzer, who was acquired in the Brian Dozier trade last July, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, no walks and seven strikeouts...Smeltzer became the sixth Twins starter to throw 6.0-plus shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1, 8/6/13 at KC), Anthony Swarzak (7.0, 5/23/09 vs. MIL) and Eric Milton (6.0, 4/5/98 vs. KC)...the game was scoreless until a five-run bottom of the seventh for the Twins, highlighted by an Eddie Rosario two-run homer.

TWINS-RAYS: The Twins and Rays are playing for the first of seven games this season...the Twins will host the Rays for three games June 25-27...last season the Twins went 3-4 against Tampa, getting swept in three games at the Trop from April 20-22 and winning three of four at Target Field from July 12-15...Twins are just 4-7 in their last 11 vs. the Rays...they are just 7-14 at Tropicana Field in their last 21 here.

SMELL WHAT THE ROC' IS COOKIN': Twins Manager Rocco Baldelli became the 14th manager of the Twins on October 25 after spending parts of six years with the Tampa Bay Rays as a player and splitting eight seasons between their front office and coaching staff, most recently as their Major League Field Coordinator...Baldelli was drafted sixth overall by the Rays in the 2000 First-Year Player Draft and played parts of six seasons with the Rays, hitting .280 (493-for-1760) with 95 doubles, 17 triples, 53 home runs, 239 RBI, 258 runs scored and 59 stolen bases in 457 games...ranks on Tampa Bay's all-time list: ninth in triples, 10th in RBI and stolen bases, 13th in hits, doubles and runs, 14th in home runs, and 17th in games.

☞ Baldelli has helped lead the Twins to their most wins in club history through their first 54 games.

CALENDAR CHECK: Twins are 20-7 this month, marking the Twins most wins in a month since they went 20-10 in August of 2017...prior to that, their winningest month was May of 2015, going 20-7...the Twins have two games remaining in May...the Twins have won 20-plus games in a single month 11 times in their history...below are the Twins all-time 20-win months:

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 106 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 318, which would break the major league record of 267, done by the Yankees last season...the Twins lead baseball with a +42 home run differential, in front of Houston at +19...Twins have homered in eight straight and in 21 of their last 22...for the season, they are 21-5 when homering multiple times in game.

EDDIE! EDDIE! EDDIE!: Eddie Rosario enters tonight with an eight-game hitting streak...he has homered in four of his last six games...in his last 14 games, Rosario is hitting .387 (24-for-62) with three doubles, four home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.035 OPS...he is tied for first in the AL in home runs (17) with Alex Bregman, Gary Sánchez and George Springer...he ranks eighth in the AL in slugging percentage (.565).
☞ Career .403 hitter (31-for-77) with five HR, a .464 BABIP and a 1.147 OPS in 21 games vs. TB.
☞ Collected his third career grand slam on April 20 here off Sergio Romo in the eighth inning, tying the game before an eventual 8-7 loss in 10 innings...was just the fourth game-tying grand slam in Twins history, joining Buxton (9/4/16), Cuddyer (6/7/06) and Winfield (4/23/93).

FOR STARTERS: This month, Twins starters have gone 17-5, 2.76 ERA (163.0 IP, 50 ER) with 39 walks, 160 strikeouts, an opponent batting average of .229 and an opponent OPS of .656...they also have 16 quality starts among the 27 games started this month...for the entire season, the Twins starting staff ranks third in baseball in ERA (3.45), fourth in quality starts (28), and fifth in opponent OPS (.699).

LAST START: Was the starter and winner, winning his second consecutive start and seventh overall this season...limited the Angels to two runs on six hits on 5.0 innings pitched in an eventual 16-7 Twins victory...kept the Halos off the board through his first two innings before a home run by David Fletcher got the Angels their first tally of the game...left the game with 88 pitches (51 strikes - 58.0 pct.), and an 8-2 Twins lead.

AMONG THE LEAGUE'S BEST: Before joining the starting rotation on April 15, Pérez struggled in three relief outings, allowing seven runs in 8.2 innings pitched (7.56 ERA)...since then, he has compiled a 6-1 record with a 2.17 ERA (49.2 IP, 12 ER), 17 BB, 44 SO and a .221 opponents average (40-for-181)...six of the eight starts have been at least 6.0 IP, with five of them being quality starts.

- Since joining the rotation on April 15, Pérez ranks tied for second in the Majors in wins (trailing only Odorizzi) and is eighth in ERA.
- Among American League starters since April 15, he ranks tied for second in wins, fifth in ERA, tied for 10th in GDP (5), 10th in hits-per-9.0 innings (7.25), 18th in WHIP (1.15) and tied for 21st in strikeouts (min. 5 games started)...in that span, he has received the most runs of support in the AL (50).

THE TERRIFIC TRIO: Pérez has won seven games this season (six as a starter), joining Jake Odorizzi and José Berríos as the only trio of pitchers in Twins history to win seven decisions within the team's first 54 games of any season...marks just the fourth time in Twins history with multiple 7+-game winners through 54 games, joining: Joe Mays (7) and Brad Radke (7) in 2001, Mike Marshall (8) and Jerry Koonsman (7) in 1979, and Jim Kaat (8) and Bert Blyleven (7) in 1972.

AGAINST THE RAYS: Is making his ninth appearance (seventh start) against Tampa Bay tonight...he owns a lifetime 0-3 record with a 6.57 ERA (37.0 IP, 27 ER), 12 walks and 29 strikeouts.

- Struggled against the Rays last season, going 0-1 in two games (one start) with a 9.45 ERA (6.2 IP, 7 ER)...made his lone start against them at The Trop on April 16, allowing eight runs (seven earned) in 4.0 innings pitched...the eight runs matched a season-high (4/10 vs. LAA).
- Has a career 9.00 ERA (15.0 IP, 15 ER) in three games (2 starts) at Tropicana Field.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Enters tonight 4-0, 3.38 ERA (29.1 IP, 11 ER) in six games (4 starts) away from Target Field...is making his third consecutive start on the road after throwing in Seattle (May 17) and Los Angeles (May 23)...among Twins starters, he owns the best ERA, the most wins (3) and the second lowest opponents' batting average (.229) on the road...by comparison, he has gone 3-1, 2.51 ERA (28.2 IP, 8 ER) in five games (4 starts) at home this season.

TURN THE LIGHTS OFF: Pérez has bounced back from his rough 2018 campaign by pitching to a 2.95 ERA (58.0 IP, 19 ER) this season through 11 appearances (eight starts)...he has done his best work when pitching at night, compiling a 5-0 record with a 2.23 ERA (44.1 IP, 11 ER) with 40 of his 56 strikeouts coming at night...he ranks seventh in baseball (fourth in the American League) in nighttime ERA, 15th in the AL in strikeouts and 12th in the AL in opponents' batting average (.225)...despite the small sample size, he owns a 5.27 ERA (13.2 IP, 8 ER) in three day appearances (two starts).

REST UP: With the stellar debut from fellow left-hander Devin Smeltzer Tuesday night, Pérez will now make his first start in six days, as opposed to four...this will be just his second start on 6+ days of rest, the other coming on April 15...for his career, Pérez hasn't fared as well with 6+ days, going 10-12 with a 4.41 ERA (175.2 IP, 86 ER) with 52 walks and 94 strikeouts.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE: Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclana, daughter, Malena, and newborn son, Martín, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500.0 IP) in innings pitched (819.1), starts (136) and wins (50), while sitting seventh in strikeouts (518) and tied for eighth in ERA (4.51). Pérez reached a couple of milestones in his start on May 6, eclipsing 800.0 career innings pitched while also recording his 500th strikeout, becoming just the 19th Venezuelan-born major leaguer to reach the 500-strikeout mark.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS, RHP [SEASON: 7-2, 3.20 ERA ; CAREER: 36-28, 4.28 ERA]

Berrios will take the ball in game two of this series tomorrow night at The Trop...in his last start (May 24), he earned his seventh win of the season after allowing four runs (one earned) over 6.2 innings against the Chicago White Sox in an 11-4 Twins win...despite the win, has labored in his last three starts, allowing a combined 13 runs (10 earned) on 29 hits, raising his season opponents' batting average by nearly 50 points since May 7, to .256 overall...before the last three starts, he had set a career-high with a five-game winning streak (in five consecutive starts), in which he had an ERA of 2.76 (32.2 IP, 10 ER) and a SO/BB rate of 8.50...no team has given José more trouble in his career than Tampa Bay, who he is 0-2 against in three starts with an ERA of 8.44 (16.0 IP, 15 ER) and a .292/.361/.538 opponents' slash line (.900 OPS)...last matched up against the Rays on July 14, 2018 at Target Field, tossing 6.0 innings, allowing six runs on six hits in a 19-6 loss.

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts).
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
