THE TWINS: The Twins completed their recent seven-game homestand with a record of 6-1 going 3-0 vs. Baltimore and 3-1 vs. Houston...today they will continue their third roadtrip of 2019, playing the second of three in the Bronx vs. the Yankees this weekend...the Twins will continue the trip with three in Toronto from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 10 of their last 14 games overall.

A NEW HOPE: The Twins fell to the Yankees yesterday evening by a score of 6-3, as a pair of defensive miscues set the stage for three unearned runs while the Twins offense plated three runs despite only notching four hits...Kyle Gibson (2-1) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs (two earned) on seven hits in 5.0 innings pitched....after falling behind 2-0 early, the Twins drew closer with a C.J. Cron sac fly, scoring Byron in the third, but wouldn't score again until the eighth when Nelson Cruz cracked his sixth home run of the season to leftfield, a two-run shot.

TWINS AND THE EVIL EMPIRE: The Twins and Yankees are playing the second of six games with the next series coming July 22-24 at Target Field...they went 0-4 at Yankee Stadium last season from April 23-26, 2-1 at Target Field from September 10-12 last year, and lost here last night 6-3...they are looking to snap an eight-game losing streak in New York and win here for the first time since a 7-1 victory on June 26, 2016; it is their only win in their last 14 games at Yankee Stadium.
क Jonathan Schoop has reached safely in his last eight games vs. the Yankees, hitting . 324 (11-for-34) with six doubles and a walk during the streak.
क Nelson Cruz enters today's game batting . 417 (10-for-24) against Yankees starter J.A Happ with two doubles, a triple and two RBI.

POWER, UNLIMITED POWER!: The Twins have hit 53 home runs so far through 30 games... they have homered in 22 of 30 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 12 of 30 , going 9-3 in those games...the Twins are fourth in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the second-fewest games.
\$ The Twins have seven players with five-plus home runs (Rosario - 11, Kepler - 7, Cruz - 6 \& Cron, Garver, Polanco and Schoop each with 5)...only Seattle has more with five-plus (8).
MAY THE 4TH BE WITH YOU: The Twins come into today's affair 28-24 (.538) on May 4, including 2-3 against the Yankees.... have not faced the Yankees on Star Wars Day since 1999, an 8-4 Twins win that included 17 hits (tied for the fourth-most hits in a single game that season)....Mike Lincoln was the starter and winner, tossing 6.0 IP and allowing two runs on four hits with five strikeouts...Torii Hunter and Ron Coomer each collected three hits and scored two runs on the day with Doug Mientkiewicz and Terry Steinbach each driving in two... Rick Aguilera secured his fifth save of the season, and the Twins' 3,000 th win as a franchise.

THE IMPERIAL CRUZER: Nelson Cruz collected his sixth home run of the season in the eighth

$\Phi$ Nelson Cruz is hitting .350 (21-for-60) with five doubles, three home runs and seven RBI in his last 16 games at Yankee Stadium.
THE FORCE IS STRONG WITH THESE BACKSTOPS: Catchers Willians Astudillo (IL), Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .303 ( $30-$ for- 99 ) with nine doubles, nine home runs, 22 RBI and 26 runs scored when catching...at catcher, Castro and Garver have made 13 starts, while Astudillo has made four starts...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: tied for first in home runs (9), second in average (.303), slugging percentage (.667), OBP (.383) and OPS (1.049), tied for third in doubles (9) and third in RBI (22)...also are one of 10 teams in the Majors with one-or-less errors at the catcher position.

LOAD THE (OUTFIELD) CANNONS: Marwin Gonzalez uncorked a pair of throws from leftfield last night (his first start in the outfield for the Twins), nailing Luke Voit at home to end the first inning and again at second base to end the second inning...the Twins have already registered nine outfield assists this season, tied for fourth-best in baseball behind San Francisco (11), Boston and Chicago-AL (10).

REUNITED, AND IT FEELS SO GOOD: The FOX Sports North television booth recreated a little history of their own last night, as 36-year play-by-play veteran Dick Bremer was joined by three-time All-Star pitcher Jim Kaat, who spent 13 of his 25 Major League seasons with the Twins from 1961-1973...Bremer and Kaat broadcasted games together when the latter called games for the Twins from 1988-1993, and last night marked their first broadcast together in over 25 years.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2016, Twins legend Joe Mauer collected two hits at Houston, reaching base for his 28th consecutive game, a franchise record...in 2015, the Twins recalled outfielder Eddie Rosario from Triple-A Rochester after placing outfielder Oswaldo Arcia on the 15-day injured list...Rosario made his major league debut two days later, homering on the first pitch he saw off Oakland's Scott Kazmir, becoming the 10th Twin to ever homer in his first career game, the sixth to do so in his first at-bat.

- He is making his seventh start and appearance of the season.
- He is making his 165 th career start and 168th career appearance


HOUSTON? WE HAD NO PROBLEM: Odorizzi picked up his third consecutive win of the season in his last start after tossing 7.0 shutout inning ball, striking out seven in a 1-0 victory April 29 over Justin Verlander (2011 Cy Young Award winner and MVP) and the Houston Astros...needed just 86 pitches to carve through seven masterful innings against the 2017 World Series champs while he issued just one walk, the third straight start in which he's issued one-or-less free passes.

- Marked the first 1-0 win over a former Cy Young Award winning pitcher since Sept. 7, 1976 when the Twins took down Gaylord Perry (1972 Cy Young) and the Texas Rangers 1-0 on a third inning RBI groundout by Steve Braun.

SPECIAL K: With his career-high-tying, 11-strikeout performance March 30 vs. Cleveland, Odorizzi teamed with José Berríos ( 10 Ks on Opening Day against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.

AGAINST THE YANKEES: Odorizzi has gone 6-8, 4.33 ERA (89.1 IP, 43 ER) in 16 career appearances ( 15 starts) against the Bronx Bombers...went 1-1, 4.50 ERA ( $12.0 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in two starts last year. - Made one start here last season and took the loss after allowing five earned runs on five hits (two home runs) in 4.2 innings pitched on April 23 in an eventual 14-1 Twins loss.

ON THE ROAD, AGAIN: In three starts away from Target Field this year, Odo is 1-2, 7.36 ERA (11.0 IP, 9 ER), has walked seven and struck out six, while not reaching the sixth inning....by contrast, he has been spectacular at home, going 2-0 with a sparkling 0.96 home ERA ( $18.2 \mathrm{IP}, 2$ ER), third-lowest in the American League.

- In his Twins career (since 2018), Odorizzi is 3-8, 4.66 ERA (94.2 IP, 49 ER) with 47 walks and

87 strikeouts in 19 road starts (Minnesota is $6-13$ in those games).

- For his career (Tampa Bay and Minnesota), Odorizzi is 22-25, 4.42 ERA (415.2 IP, 204 ER) on the road and 28-25, 3.52 ERA (483.2 IP, 189 ER) at home.

DON'T LEAVE ME HANGING: Odorizzi is tied for the American League lead with 16 no-decisions since Opening Day 2018 (in 37 starts), matching Chicago-AL's Reynaldo López and Tampa Bay's Charlie Morton....only Arizona's Robbie Ray (20), Colorado's Tyler Anderson (18) and Washington's Patrick Corbin (18) have more in baseball during that span. (Matz has 16 and pitches tonight.)

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30 -start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 158 starts since 2014 (teammate Kyle Gibson is tied for fifth with 155).... he is also sixth in that span with a . 235 opponents batting average.

- Only Corey Kluber (167), Rick Porcello (164) and Justin Verlander (160) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the last $5+$ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.215), Kluber (.223), Verlander (.224), Carlos Carrasco (.233) and Marco Estrada (.234) are the five with lower opponent averages in that same span.

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has opened 2019 by relying on his four-seam fastball at a greater rate than any other pitch, as referenced by his 57.1 percent usage rate in 2019 ... his full-season high is 54.1 percent, which came in 2018 with the Twins...between 2014-18 with Tampa Bay, his fastball usage ranged from a high of 49.4 percent (2017) to a low of 31.1 (2016)...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

Ks FOR GOOD: Odorizzi will donate $\$ 50$ per strikeout in 2019 to the Animal Humane Society (\$750 to date)...every year, Animal Humane Society cares for more than 23,000 animals in need and aids thousands more through programs that help people nurture and protect their pets...they take in every animal surrendered, regardless of its health, age, breed, or behavior and provide extensive medical treatment, behavior programs, compassionate care, and new homes for these cats, dogs and critters....as of today, he will donate $\$ 1,500$.

FLY AWAY: In 2018 Odorizzi had the lowest ground ball bercentage in baseball with a rate of 28.7 percent....since 2012 Odorizzi has the second lowest ground ball percentage ( 33.5 percent) in the Majors, trailing only Oakland's Marco Estrada (32.1)...so far in 2019, he owns a 23.3 percentage, the lowest in MLB (min. 29.0 IP)...José Berríos sits eighth with a 35.2 percentage.

EXTRA, EXTRA, READ ALL ABOUT ITI: Odorizzi has limited the extra-base hit this season as he is tied for the Major League low with Cincinnati's Luis Castillo (4)....in fact, since the beginning of Odo's Twins tenure (2018), he has allowed the 12th-least extra-base hits among pitchers in the American League who have thrown at least 190.0 innings.

## CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva 33 , and Boof Bonser - 30 ).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2). - Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
