**THE TWINS:** After completing their homestand with a record of 6-1 (3-0 vs. Baltimore and 3-1 vs. Houston), the Twins began their six-game roadtrip with loss and a win in New York... today they will complete the three-game series with the Yankees before traveling to Toronto post-game for a three-game series with the Jays from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won seven of their last nine and 11 of their last 15.

**WINNING STATE OF MIND:** The Twins beat the Yankees yesterday afternoon by a score of 7-3...Jake Odorizzi (4-2) was the starter and winner, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, four walks and eight strikeouts...the offense recorded 12 hits, three from Mitch Garver, who hit his sixth home run of the season...Nelson Cruz (7) and C.J. Cron (6) each homered as well...the Twins scored in six different innings, including each of the final five.

**TWINS AND YANKEES:** The Twins and Yankees are playing the third of six games with the next series coming July 22-24 at Target Field...yesterday's win snapped an eight-game losing streak in Yankee Stadium, winning here for the first time since a 7-1 victory on June 26, 2016...the Twins won their previous series with the Yankees, taking two of three September 10-12, 2018 at Target Field; a win today would give them their first back-to-back series wins over New York since July 12-14, 2013 and May 30-June 1, 2014.

☞ Jonathan Schoop has reached safely in his last nine games vs. the Yankees, hitting .351 (13-for-37) with six doubles and a walk during the streak.

☞ Today's starter Michael Pineda pitched parts of four seasons with the Yankees from 2014-17, going 31-31, 4.16 ERA (509.0 IP, 235 ER) with 102 walks and 514 strikeouts...he was acquired by the Yankees on January 23, 2012, along with right-handed pitcher Vicente Campos, in exchange for catcher Jesus Montero and right-handed pitcher Hector Noesi.

**MINNESOTA WINS:** The Twins enter tonight with a major league-best 20-10 (.645) record... this marks the Twins best start since 2001, when the team started 20-7 (.741)...the Twins won their 20th game of 2018 on May 21, beating Detroit 4-2...below is where the Twins rank in baseball in terms of winning percentage:

**YARD WORK:** The Twins have hit 56 home runs so far through 31 games...they have homered in 23 of 31 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 13 of 31, going 10-3 in those games...the Twins are third in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the second-fewest games...they are on pace to hit 292 home runs, which would pass the club record of 225, done in 1963...the all-time MLB record is 267 set by the Yankees last season.

☞ The Twins have seven players with five-plus home runs (Rosario - 11, Kepler - 7, Cruz - 7, Cron - 6, Garver - 6, Polanco - 5, Schoop - 5)...only Seattle has more with five-plus (8).

**THE BOOMSTICK:** Nelson Cruz collected his sixth and seventh home run on Friday and Saturday in the Bronx...it was the 367th home run of his career, moving within two homers of tying Todd Helton and Ralph Kiner (369) for 80th on baseball's all-time list...in fact, since 2014, he leads all of baseball with 210 home runs.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .338 (22-for-65) with five doubles, four home runs and eight RBI in his last 17 games at Yankee Stadium.

**BACKSTOPS WITH THE BATS:** Catchers Willians Astudillo (IL), Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .317 (33-for-104) with nine doubles, 10 home runs, 24 RBI and 28 runs scored when catching...at catcher, Garver have made 14 starts, Jason has made 13 starts, while Astudillo has made four starts...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: tied for first in home runs (10) and slugging percentage (.667), second in average (.317), OBP (.392) and OPS (1.084), tied for third in doubles (9) and third in RBI (24).

**TWINS ML WEEKLYS:** Single-A Cedar Rapids infielder Chris Williams and Double-A Pensacola right-handed pitcher Jorge Alcalá have been named Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...in seven games for the Kernels, Williams hit .333 (6-for-18) with three home runs, six RBI, six walks, six runs scored and a 1.333 OPS...the 22-year-old was drafted by the Twins in the eighth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Clemson University...Alcalá made one start for the Blue Wahoos, coming on Thursday vs. Biloxi, pitching 5.0 shutout innings with five hits allowed, no walks and eight strikeouts...the 23-year-old, Dominican Republic native, was acquired by the Twins via trade with Houston at the deadline last season, in exchange for right-handed pitcher Ryan Pressly.

**HOUSTON, WE HAD A PROBLEM:** In his last time out, Pineda struggled against the Astros last Tuesday at Target Field, his second consecutive start against Houston, allowing five runs on a season-high nine hits over just 5.0 innings, taking his second loss in an 11-0 loss...came out of the gates strong, getting through the Astros lineup unscathed the first try, but George Springer deposited a double to left that scored the first run in the third, and then launched his ninth homer of the year in the fifth...Pineda was pulled in the sixth after allowing a Robinson Chirinos single to be followed up by Jake Marisnick's second home run of the season...the Twins were shutout by Gerit Cole in the loss, their only shutout defeat of the season so far.

**A TALE OF TWO HALVES:** In Pineda's first three starts of his comeback campaign (all Twins wins), "Big Mike" went 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (15.0 IP, 5 ER), .241 opponents' batting average (13-for-54) and .689 OPS, along with 15 strikeouts and a WHIP of 1.00...in his last three outings (all Twins losses), Pineda is 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA (14.0 IP, 15 ER), .381 opponents' average (24-for-63) and 1.103 OPS, along with just seven strikeouts and a WHIP of 2.00.

**WALK HARD:** Through six starts this year, Pineda has only issued six free passes in 29.0 innings pitched...owns 709 career strikeouts, 163 walks and a lifetime SO/BB ratio of 4.35, sixth best among pitchers currently on a 25-man roster (min. 700.0 IP)...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 34 starts...is one of 13 pitchers with an active streak of 34+ starts and less than four walks (full list is below).

**AGAINST NEW YORK-AL:** Pineda returns to Yankee Stadium for the first time as an opposing pitcher after spending 2014-2017 in pinstripes...has faced the Bronx Bombers just once back in 2011 (as a member of the Seattle Mariners), tossing 5.0 innings, allowing three runs in a no-decision...two players on the current Yankees team were there that night in Seattle: OF Brett Gardner went 0-for-4 with a strikeout while CC Sabathia wouldn't see the field, but pitched two games later.

**BACK TO THE SCENE OF THE CRIME:** This marks Pineda's first start in Yankee Stadium since July 5, 2017 vs. Toronto, his final start before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery on his pitching elbow, ending his tenure with the Yankees...when he made the start March 31 vs. Cleveland, it snapped a 633-day hiatus from the mound.

**ON THE ROAD, AGAIN:** "Big Mike" owns an 18-24 record as the opposing pitcher with a 4.42 ERA (337.2 IP, 166 ER), 331 strikeouts to 76 walks...in Yankee Stadium, however, he is 18-13 with a 3.95 ERA (275.2 IP, 121 ER) with 283 strikeouts and just 57 walks...this season, he's pitched to a 5.23 ERA (10.1 IP, 6 ER) away from Target Field.

### CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ, LHP [SEASON- 4-0, 3.41 ERA ; CAREER- 47-49, 4.58 ERA]

Pérez is making his fifth start of the season and his 133rd career start tomorrow night against Toronto...made his fourth start on Wednesday against the Astros at Target Field and earned his third consecutive win as a starter, tossing a season-high 8.0 innings, allowing no runs on four hits in a 6-2 victory...is now 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (26.0 IP, 6 ER) since joining the Twins rotation...is 47-49 with a 4.58 ERA (795.2 IP, 405 ER), 284 walks and 492 strikeouts in 148 career appearances...lifetime against Toronto, Pérez is 1-2, 2.96 ERA (27.1 IP, 9 ER) with 14 walks and 17 strikeouts in five appearances (all starts)...made his first start of the season against the Blue Jays back on Jackie Robinson Day, allowing one run over 6.0 IP, striking out five in an eventual Twins 5-3 loss.



TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

Twins lead baseball in save percentage (90.9%), going 10-for-11 in save opportunities so far...is 6th in MLB with 21 holds in 31 games...Twins relievers have combined for 105 strikeouts, tied for 25th in baseball...Twins bullpen has pitched the 4th fewest innings in baseball (98.1 IP)...Twins relievers went 1-1, with one save, 9.12 ERA (25. IP, 26 ER) w/ 20 walks 24 strikeouts in seven games played against the NYY last season...in four games at Yankee Stadium last season, went 0-1, with a 10.54 ERA (13.2 IP, 16 ER) w/ 9 walks and 16 strikeouts.
