**THE TWINS:** After completing their homestand with a record of 6-1 (3-0 vs. Baltimore and 3-1 vs. Houston), the Twins began their six-game roadtrip with a series loss in New York, winning the middle of the three games over the weekend...tonight they will play game one of a three-game series in Toronto against the Blue Jays...the Twins have won seven of their last 10 and 11 of their last 16.

**TWINS CUT SHORT IN NEW YORK:** The Twins lost to the Yankees by a score of 4-1 yesterday afternoon in a rain-shortened, 8.0-inning game, dropping the series 2-1...Michael Pineda (2-3) was the starter and loser, allowing four runs (3 earned) on six hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded just four hits, two from Marwin Gonzalez, who also drove in the Twins only run with a fourth-inning single...the start time was pushed back two hours due to inclement weather and was stopped short after eight innings due to heavy rain.

**MINNESOTA WINS:** The Twins enter tonight with the second best winning percentage in baseball, having gone 20-12, .625...the Twins won their 20th game of 2018 on May 21, beating Detroit 4-2...below is where the Twins rank in baseball in terms of winning percentage:

**TWINS-JAYS:** The Twins are playing the fifth of seven games vs. the Blue Jays this season...the Jays took the four-game series April 15-18 at Target Field, winning three of four...the Twins have gone just 23-42 vs. the Jays since 2010, but have gone 5-3 in their last eight, dating back to May 2018.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .340 (17-for-50) with eight home runs, 12 RBI, 12 runs scored and a 1.229 OPS in his last 12 games vs. the Blue Jays.

☞ Byron Buxton is hitting .372 (16-for-43) with five home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.216 OPS in 11 career games vs. the Jays...he hit three home runs at Rogers Centre on August 27, 2017.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .296 (104-for-351) with 19 doubles, 25 home runs, 88 RBI and a .931 OPS in 95 career games vs. Toronto.

☞ Jonathan Schoop has 80 hits (33 extra-base hits) against the Jays, his most off any opponent, and 14 home runs in his career vs. Toronto, his second-most off any opponent (15-Tampa Bay).

☞ Twins have hit 27 home runs off Jays pitching since the start of 2017, their second-most vs. any non-divisional opponent.

☞ Twins bench coach Derek Shelton served as Toronto's Quality Control Coach in 2017.

**YARD WORK:** The Twins have hit 56 home runs so far through 32 games...they have homered in 23 of 32 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 13 of 32, going 10-3 in those games...the Twins are fifth in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the second-fewest games...they are on pace to hit 283 home runs, which would pass the club record of 225, done in 1963.

☞ The Twins have seven players with five-plus home runs (Rosario - 11, Kepler - 7, Cruz - 7, Cron - 6, Garver - 6, Polanco - 5, Schoop - 5)...only Seattle has more with five-plus (8).

**ODO, AL POW:** Major League Baseball announced today that right-handed starter Jake Odorizzi has been named American League Player of the Week...Odorizzi claimed his first career weekly award, the first for a Twins player since Eduardo Escobar for the week ending June 11, 2018, and the first by a Twins pitcher since Francisco Liriano for the week ending May 8, 2011...Noah Syndergaard also claims his first career weekly award, and the first for a Mets player since Jacob deGrom for the week ending June 18, 2017...this marks the first time that the AL and NL Players of the Week are both pitchers since last April, when Patrick Corbin of the D-backs claimed the NL honor, while Sean Manaea of Oakland was a co-winner in the AL for the week ending April 22, 2018.

☞ Odorizzi went 2-0 in two starts last week without allowing a run over 13.0 innings pitched...permitted six hits and five walks with 15 strikeouts across the two outings.

☞ Among AL leaders, finished the period first in wins; tied for first in ERA and strikeouts; and tied for second in innings pitched.

☞ The 29-year-old right-hander made his first start of the week last Monday against the Houston Astros at Target Field, outdueling Justin Verlander in Minnesota's 1-0 win...Odorizzi hurled 7.0 scoreless frames, allowing four hits and a walk with seven strikeouts.

☞ His second start of the week came on Saturday against the Yankees at Yankee Stadium in the Bronx as the Twins topped New York, 7-3 behind 6.0 scoreless innings from the Illinois native, who surrendered just two hits and four walks with eight strikeouts in the win.

☞ Odorizzi lowered his ERA to 2.78 on the season in the victory, which marked his fourth consecutive start with a win...during that stretch, he has allowed just three earned runs in 24.1 innings for a 1.11 ERA.

☞ His back-to-back scoreless starts were the first time the former first round Draft pick (2008 by Milwaukee) accomplished the feat since July 22-August 3, 2016, when he had a career-best three straight scoreless starts

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 2015, Eddie Rosario homered in his first career at-bat becoming the 11th Twin to homer in his first game as a Twin and sixth to ever homer in his first at-bat as a Twin...he became one of 115 players in MLB history to homer in his first career at-bat and one of 109 players to homer in his first career plate appearance...additionally, he became the 29th player in baseball history to homer on his first-ever pitch seen.

**WINNER WINNER, CHICKEN DINNER:** Pérez enters tonight's start after earning his third consecutive win as a starter (also won on March 31 vs. CLE in relief) on Wednesday after beating the Astros 6-2...pitched season-high 8.0 scoreless innings, allowing just four hits and striking out seven...marked the seventh start of his career with 8.0+ IP, and the first since August 9, 2017 at New York-NL, while it marked his first start with 7+ strikeouts since May 8, 2016 at Detroit, the eighth of his career.

- In four starts this season, is 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (26.0 IP, 6 ER), 5 BB, 18 SO and a .242 opponents average...all four starts have been at least 6.0 IP with three of them being quality starts.
- Made three relief appearances prior, pitching to a 7.56 ERA (8.2 IP, 7 ER) on 11 hits, nine walks and 12 strikeouts...recorded the win in relief March 31 vs. CLE (his Twins debut) after allowing three runs over 3.2 IP in relief of starter Michael Pineda in a pre-arranged outing for the duo.

**AGAINST THE JAYS:** The Venezuelan lefty is making his second start against the Blue Jays this season, with the other coming on Jackie Robinson Day (April 15), when he threw 6.0 one-run innings, striking out five, in an eventual 5-3 Twins loss...in five starts against Toronto, he owns a 1-2 record with a 2.96 ERA (27.1 IP, 9 ER), the third lowest of any team he has made at least three starts against, trailing only Kansas City (2.29) and Houston (2.70)...at the Rogers Centre, he owns a career line of 0-1, 4.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 4 ER), with his last start in Canada coming on April 29, 2018, when he allowed four runs on five hits (three HR, tied a career-high) in 4.0 IP...against American League East opponents, Pérez has a 5.64 ERA (174.0 IP, 109 ER) in 33 games (31 starts).

**CABALLO ZURDO:** Pérez has thrown 503.1 innings since 2016, fifth-most among left-handed pitchers in the American League...below is a list of AL lefties with 490.0+ IP since 2016:

**THE REPERTOIRE:** Pérez has relied on using his pitch variety to keep batters off balance throughout his eight-year big league career, as referenced by his usage rates for all-but-one pitch this season being less than 30 percent...his cut-fastball and his sinker are his go-to pitches, as he throws them 35.1 and 25.5 percent of the time, respectively...he'll also feature a four-seamer (16.8 percent), a changeup (15.1 percent), a curveball (6.9 percent), a slider (0.3 percent) and a splitter (0.2 percent)...has thrown 576 pitches this year, with 102 of those pitches being batted into play with an average exit velocity of 87.7 MPH...below is the breakdown of each pitch and its usage, according to Baseball Savant:

**VENEZUELAN PRIDE:** Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclena, and daughter, Malena, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500 IP) in innings pitched (795.2), starts (132) and wins (47) while sitting seventh in strikeouts (492) and ninth in ERA (4.58)...is eight strikeouts shy of 500 for his career...will become the 19th Venezuelan-born pitcher in baseball history to reach the 500-strikeout threshold, the seventh active pitcher...the record for most strikeouts by a Venezuelan pitcher is held by Seattle's Félix Hernández (2,496).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS, RHP (SEASON: 5-1, 2.91 ERA ; CAREER: 34-27, 4.31 ERA)

Berrios takes the ball in the second game of the series tomorrow evening against Toronto...earned the win in the series finale last Thursday against the Astros, clinching the series victory, after yielding just two runs over 7.0 IP with five strikeouts...has matched a career-high with a four-game winning streak (in four consecutive starts)...brings a 5.75 SO/BB ratio into tomorrow's game, (third-best among American League starters)...is 1-0 in two starts against the Blue Jays and owns a lifetime ERA of 0.71 (12.2 IP, 1 ER) with a .200/.280/.244 opponents slash line...the 0.71 ERA is his lowest against any opponent he has made at least two starts against...last matched up against Toronto on July 24, 2018 at Rogers Centre, tossing 7.0-shutout, four-hit innings with nine strikeouts in a 5-0 Twins win.

## CAREER NOTES

- His 503.1 innings since 2016 are the fifth-most among American League lefties.
- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts).
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
