THE TWINS: After completing their last homestand with a record of 6-1 (3-0 vs. Baltimore and 3-1 vs. Houston), the Twins began their six-game roadtrip with a series loss in New York, winning the middle of the three games over the weekend, and taking the first of three in Toronto last night...tonight they will play game two of a three-game series in Toronto against the Blue Jays...the Twins have won seven of their last 10 and 12 of their last 17.
TWINS BOUNCE BACK IN TORONTO: The Twins won the first game of the series against the Blue Jays, 8-0 last night...Martín Pérez (5-0) was the starter and winner, tossing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just four baserunners while striking out a career-high nine batters...the offense gave Perez plenty of support, notching eight runs on 12 hits, including a hit in eight of nine innings, with Jorge Polanco and Nelson Cruz (three hits each) leading the way and Eddie Rosario collecting his AL-best 12th home run of the season in the fifth inning.

MINNESOTA WINS: The Twins enter tonight with the second best winning percentage in baseball, having gone 21-12, .636...the Twins won their 21st game of 2018 on May 22, beating Detroit 6-0...below is where the Twins rank in baseball in terms of winning percentage: TEAM

TWINS-JAYS: The Twins are playing the sixth of seven games vs. the Blue Jays this season... the Jays took the four-game series April 15-18 at Target Field, winning three of four, and the Twins won the first of three here last night...the Twins have gone just $24-42$ vs. the Jays since 2010, but have gone 6-3 in their last nine, dating back to May 2018.
क Eddie Rosario is hitting . 333 ( 18 -for-54) with nine home runs, 15 RBI, 13 runs scored and a 1.225 OPS in his last 13 games vs. the Blue Jays.
$\Phi$ Byron Buxton is hitting .362 (17-for-47) with four doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI \& a 1.178 OPS in 12 career games vs. the Jays....hit three home runs in Toronto on Aug. 27, 2017. $\Phi$ Nelson Cruz is hitting 301 (107-for-356) with 19 doubles, 25 home runs, 88 RBl and a .935 OPS in 96 career games vs. Toronto.
क Jonathan Schoop has 82 hits ( 35 extra-base hits) against the Jays, his most off any opponent, and 14 home runs in his career vs. Toronto, his second-most off any opponent (15-Tampa Bay).

玉 The Twins have seven players with five-plus home runs: Rosario-12 (best in AL), Kepler - 7, Cruz - 7, Cron - 6, Garver - 6, Polanco -6 , Schoop -5 ...only Seattle has more with five-plus (8).

GIMME A MARTíN-I, SHAKEN: Twins starter Martín Pérez spun 7.0 IP of two-hit ball last night, registering his fourth win in as many chances, dating back to April 20-G2 at Baltimore...since that date, he owns a 1.67 ERA ( $27.0 \mathrm{IP}, 5 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 22 strikeouts and an opponents average of . 189 ( 18 -for-95)...his 27.0 innings pitched are the most in baseball since April 20, and his 1.67 ERA is eighth (third in the American League).
$\Phi$ He has a five-game winning streak overall (one in relief), marking his longest since a seven-game stretch from August 9-Sept. 8 2017, his career-long...is one of seven pitchers in the Majors with at least five wins.
$\Phi$ Marks the second time in his big league career registering back-to-back starts with 7.0+ IP and zero earned runs, (also: April 18 at CHW \& April 23 vs. OAK, back-to-back complete game shutouts).
ODO, AL POW: Major League Baseball announced yesterday that right-handed starter Jake Odorizzi was named American League Player of the Week...Odorizzi claimed his first career weekly award, the first for a Twins player since Eduardo Escobar for the week ending June 11, 2018, and the first by a Twins pitcher since Francisco Liriano for the week ending May 8, 2011.
$\Phi$ Odorizzi went 2-0 in two starts last week without allowing a run over 13.0 innings pitched...permitted six hits and five walks with 15 strikeouts across the two outings.
玉 His back-to-back scoreless starts were the first time the former first round draft pick (2008 by Milwaukee) accomplished the feat since July 22 -August 3, 2016, when he had a career-best three straight scoreless starts.
$\Phi$ A full list of Twins AL Player of the Week award winners can be found on page 234 of the Twins 2019 Media Guide.
ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2005, the Kyle Lohse-led Twins stormed into Tampa Bay and took down rookie Scott Kazmir 8-1 at The Trop, notching the 3,500th victory in franchise history...in 1995, the Twins entered the third and final game of a series at Jacobs Field in Cleveland with a flight to Chicago for a matchup with the White Sox to follow...the game lasted 17 innings, saw a total of 44 hits and lasted 6:36, the longest game (in terms of time) in franchise history, with the Twins falling 10-9...in 1978, shortstop Roy Smalley collected a franchise-record five walks to go along with a double, an RBI and three runs scored in a 15-9 victory over the Baltimore Orioles.

FANTASTIC FOUR: Berríos has won four consecutive starts, matching his career-high winning streak for a second time (last: June 4-21, 2017).... has posted a 3.51 ERA (25.2 IP, 10 ER) with four walks and 25 strikeouts during the streak, which includes victories over Detroit, Baltimore (twice) and Houston.

- Is one of three Twins starters to be currently riding four-starting winning streaks, joining Jake Odorizzi and Martín Pérez (who has won five-straight decisions overall, including one as a reliever).

LAST OUTING: Set the stage for the series win against Houston with a 7.0 -inning performance in last Thursday's 8-2 victory, allowing two runs on seven hits with five strikeouts...earned his fifth win on the season, fourth in a row, lowering his season ERA to 2.91.

- Extended his winning streak at Target Field to five games, dating back to September 28, 2018, and is 4-0 with a 1.98 ERA ( $27.1 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{ER}$ ) at home this season.

DELIVERING QUALITY: Berríos is tied for the American League lead with six quality starts (tied for second-most in baseball), while each of his starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including a trio of $7.0+$ inning efforts).

NO BASES, NO PROBLEMS: Through seven starts in 2019, Berríos has struck out 46 batters and walked eight batters, for a $5.75 \mathrm{SO} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio, which is fourth best among AL starters and ninth in baseball...Berríos has also only allowed 37 hits and owns a 0.97 WHIP , which is seventh best for an AL starter and 12th in baseball.

- Has gone consecutive starts without walking a batter ( 13.0 IP ) and has three such outings this year (and two others with just one free pass).

MORE LEADERBOARD LOVE: Berríos leads Twins starters in innings pitched (46.1), wins (5), strikeouts (46), quality starts (6), WHIP (0.97) and $\mathrm{SO} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio (5.75), while he is second in opponents batting average (.216).

- Among American League starters, Berríos ranks tied for first in quality starts, tied for second in wins, fourth in opponent $0 B P$ (.257), fourth in SO/BB ratio, seventh in innings pitched and WHIP, 10th in ERA (2.91), tied for 10th in strikeouts, 14th in opponent OPS (.654) and 16th in opponent batting average.
- Has notched 46 strikeouts through the Twins' first 33 games this season, making him the seventh Twins pitcher to record 46+ strikeouts in the team's first 33 games, joining Blyleven (five times), Santana (three times), Chance (two times), Pascual (two times), Viola (one time) and Kaat (one time)...the last to do so was Santana who recorded 50 strikeouts in 2007 through 33 team games.

AGAINST TORONTO: Berríos has made two career starts against the Blue Jays, going 1-0, 0.71 ERA ( $12.2 \operatorname{IP}, 1 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with five walks and 14 strikeouts...the 0.71 ERA is his lowest against any opponent in which he has made at least two starts against.

- His last start at Rogers Centre came July 24, 2018, as he earned a 5-0 win after allowing four hits and one walk with nine strikeouts over 7.0-shutout innings....llowed runners on second and third with one out in the second, but struck out Martin and Grichuk to leave the runners stranded...did not allow a runner to get into scoring position the rest of the game.

LEFT AND RIGHT: He has held right-handed hitters to a . 219 (21-for-96) average with five home runs, four walks, 25 strikeouts and a .695 OPS, while lefties are hitting .213 ( 16 -for-75) with two homers, four walks, 21 strikeouts and a . 602 OPS.

- For his career, righties have hit 240 (207-for-864) with 52 walks, 220 strikeouts and a 695 OPS, while lefties have hit . 239 ( 104 -for-811) with 100 walks, 216 strikeouts and a .729 OPS.

ROAD WOES: In 41 career road starts, Berríos is $12-17$ with a 5.22 ERA over 217.1 innings...of the 59 home runs Berríos has surrendered in his career, 43 have been at opposing ballparks. - Is 1-1 in three starts away from Target Field this year, with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 IP, 9 ER) and five home runs allowed.

PITCH SELECTION: José is throwing his curveball this season at a 31.9 percent usage rate...in 2018 he threw it 30.4 percent of time, 30 percent in 2017 and 21.6 in $2016 \ldots$...he has thrown a total of 671 pitches on the year with 52.2 percent of those landing in the strike zone...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitch arsenal, according to Baseball Savant:
