THE TWINS: After completing their five-game homestand with a record of 4-1 (0-3 vs. Chicago-AL and 1-1 vs. Milwaukee), the Twins began their 10-game roadtrip with a loss and a win at Tropicana Field the last two nights...today the Twins will play the third of four with the Rays through tomorrow...they will enjoy an off-day in Cleveland on Monday, play three vs. the Tribe June 4-6, then three in Detroit June 7-9...the Twins have won 18 of their last 24 and 13 of their last 16.

THAT'S MORE LIKE IT: The Twins beat the Rays last night by a score of 5-3, evening the four-game series at one game-a-piece...José Berrios was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on three hits in 6.2 innings pitched with eight strikeouts...the offense recorded 10 hits and went 4-for-8 with runners in scoring position...Eddie Rosario broke a 3-3 tie with a two-run single in the top of the ninth...Twins went homerless for the second straight game.

TWINS-RAYS: The Twins are Rays are playing for the third of seven games this season...the Twins will host the Rays for three games June 25-27...Twins are just 5-8 in their last 13 vs. the Rays...they are just 8-15 at Tropicana Field in their last 23 here...Twins haven't won a season-series vs. the Rays since going 4-2 in 2015.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .333 (11-for-33) with two doubles, three home runs, eight RBI and a 1.028 OPS in his last nine games vs. TB.
☞ Jorge Polanco has hit safely in seven straight vs. the Rays, hitting .345 (10-for-29) with five doubles and a 1.010 OPS in that span.
☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .325 (25-for-77) with six home runs and 15 RBI in his last 18 games vs. TB...he has 15 career home runs and 39 RBI, the 39 RBI being his most vs. any team and the 15 home runs are tied for his most (Toronto).

THREE POINT LINE: The Twins have scored three-or-more runs in 24 consecutive games, dating back to May 6 at Toronto, tying the single-season franchise record, done twice before, most recently from June 7-July 3, 2006...the stretch marks the ninth time in franchise history with 20-or-more games scoring three-plus runs in each...the overall franchise record is 30 consecutive games from September 14, 2003-April 23, 2004.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 106 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 312, which would break the major league record of 267, done by the Yankees last season...the Twins have not homered in their last two games, marking the first back-to-back homerless games since April 2 and 3 at Kansas City...their last stretch of three straight without a homer came September 27-29, 2018 when they went four straight.

YES WAY, JORGE! Jorge Polanco ranks first in the American League in average (.338), second in wOBA (.430), third in slugging percentage (.590), and fourth in OPS (1.000)...in his last 76 games, dating back to September 5, he is hitting .336 (103-for-307) with a .951 OPS...Twins are 51-25 in those games.

☞ He is hitting .350 (55-for-157) with 23 walks, a .431 OBP and a 1.074 OPS vs. right-handed pitching on the season.

ROSIES ARE RED HOT: Eddie Rosario is hitting .344 (33-for-96) with three doubles, six home runs, 24 RBI and a .913 OPS in his last 23 games, dating back to May 6...for the entire month, he is hitting .313 (35-for-112) with 25 RBI in 27 games; in May of 2018, Rosario hit .368 (43-for-117) with 11 doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI in 28 games...he has 78 hits in May of 2018 and May of 2019 combined, tied with Nolan Arenado for most in baseball.

☞ Career .376 (32-for-85) with six doubles, one triple, five home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.065 OPS in 23 career games vs. the Rays...he has multiple hits in five of his last eight vs. the Rays and multiple RBI in five of his last nine vs. TB.

BULLPEN BULLIES: The Twins bullpen ranks second in all of baseball in save percentage at 83.3%, going 15-for-18...they have pitched the second fewest innings in baseball (173.0), behind Washington (169.2)...the Twins are 32-2 when leading after 6.0 innings.

☞ Individual highlights for the season: Blake Parker - 1.96 ERA, 1.04 WHIP and .194 BAA...Taylor Rogers - 2.16 ERA, 31 K's in 25.0 IP...Trevor May - .211 BAA, 1 HR allowed...Matt Magill - 1.42 ERA, 1.96 BAA & 12.08 K/9.0 IP...Ryne Harper - 1.61 ERA, .175 BAA & 0.85 WHIP...Tyler Duffey - 14.49 K/9.0 IP & 1.24 WHIP...Mike Morin - 0.87 ERA, .162 BAA & 0.58 WHIP.

☞ Twins hitters have 192 Extra-Base hits out of 399 total hits (48.1%) against RHP this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: 38.3%

LAST START: Pitched 7.0 innings last Saturday against the White Sox, allowing a season-low tying one run on five hits as the Twins won 8-1 over Chicago...held the Pale Hose scoreless through the first turn through the order before a solo home run off the bat of José Abreu registered the only run the White Sox would earn in the game...for the seventh consecutive start, Gibson has not allowed more than two batters to walk against him...lowered his ERA to 3.34 in May, tied for the 21st lowest in the AL last month, and his 36 strikeouts were tied for 14th.

ON THE VERGE OF HISTORY: Gibson enters today's matchup with 984.1 career innings pitched, 15.2 innings short of marking 1,000 innings in his career...the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, will become just the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1000.0 IP threshold, first since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP as a Twin from 2000-2007. Below are the 10 pitchers in Twins history with 1000.0+ IP:

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enters today's start with the sixth most starts (teammate Odorizzi is fourth with 163) and the eighth-highest innings pitched total (933.1) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (124, most in baseball), tied for 12th in wins (57) and 15th in strikeouts (716).

AGAINST THE RAYS: The right-hander is making his ninth career start against the Rays, first this season...owns a career line of 2-5 with a 5.80 ERA (45.0 IP, 29 ER) against them...in his only start here last season, Gibson threw 6.1 innings, allowing four runs on five hits with seven strikeouts, but only received a single run of support in a 10-1 loss...overall against Tampa Bay last year, he held them to just five runs in 14.1 innings with 16 strikeouts...last win over the Rays was July 12, 2018 at Target Field, allowing one run on five hits in 8.0 innings pitched with nine strikeouts...only career win at the Trop came August 7, 2016, allowing two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Gibby has held AL East hitters to a .198 (21-for-106) BAA this year.

RIGHTY-LEFTY SPLITS: Right-handed batters are hitting .235 (24-for-102) against Gibson this season, and lefties are hitting .265 (31-for-117)...below is a breakdown of how he uses each pitch depending on handedness entering today's start:

FUN WITH STATCAST: So far through 2019, Gibson has seen the most success with his slider, as opponents are hitting just .113 (6-for-53) against it, and 32 of his 60 strikeouts have come via the slider (55.2 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his sinker, going 26-for-87 with three home runs, with an average exit velocity of 91.6 against his heater and a wOBA of .410 (weighted on-base average).

THE SHERIDAN STORY: Gibson, along with catcher Jason Castro, are proud to support The Sheridan Story, an organization dedicated to fighting child hunger in Minnesota...the innovative organization serves more than 6,500 kids in over 200 schools - with the aid of strong community partnerships...Kyle will donate \$100 for every Twins win while Jason will contribute \$250 per victory...coming into today's start, Gibson is set to donate \$3,800.

- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.
• Since the start of 2014 has induced 124 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martín Pérez is third with 111.
• Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).
• Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
• Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
• Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
• His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
• In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI [SEASON: 7-2, 2.16 ERA // CAREER: 54-50, 3.84 ERA]

Odorizzi will make his 12th start of the year, is 7-2, 2.16 ERA (58.1 IP, 14 ER) with 20 walks and 61 strikeouts...in his last start, Odorizzi earned his seventh win on the season (tying all of last year) after throwing 5.1 shutout innings against the White Sox at Target Field in an eventual 7-0 victory...is currently riding an 11.1 scoreless inning streak, dating back to his start on May 15 vs. LAA...spent five seasons as a member of these Rays from 2013-2017, and owns a career line of 21-19, 3.38 ERA and 354 strikeouts at The Trop...has only faced Tampa Bay once before, back on July 13 of last season, when he allowed six runs (five earned) over just 4.1 innings in an eventual 11-8 Twins win at Target Field.



TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

- Twins relievers have pitched 173.0 innings, currently second fewest in baseball behind Washington (169.2)...bullpen has gone 8-6-15 with 32 holds, a 4.42 ERA (85 ER), 71 walks, 186 strikeouts and a .253 opponents' batting average (170-for-672) in 56 games...Twins' pen is second in baseball in save percentage (83.3%), going 15-for-18 in save opportunities also tied for fewest BS in MLB.
- Twins relievers posted a 4.20 ERA (83.2 IP, 39 ER) with five saves and 12 holds in May (29 games), along with 21 walks, 89 strikeouts and a .252 average against (82-for-326).
- Struggled against TB as a unit last year, yielding 32 earned runs in 24.1 innings over seven games...allowed eight HR along with a .388 average (45-for-116) and 1.106 OPS.
