THE TWINS: The Twins completed their 10-game roadtrip with a record of 6-4, going 3-1 vs. Tampa Bay, 1-2 vs. Cleveland and 2-1 vs. Detroit...the Twins will begin a nine-game home-stand with three against the Mariners tonight-Thursday, three vs. Kansas City this weekend and three vs. Boston June 17-19...the Twins have won 13 of their last 18 and 18 of their last 24...Twins are playing their first home game since May 28 vs. Milwaukee - 14 days ago.

TWINS CRUSH TIGERS TO TAKE SERIES: The Twins beat the Tigers on Sunday afternoon by a score of 12-2, winning their 13th series (13-5-3)...Jake Odorizzi (9-2) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on five hits in 6.0 innings pitched with one walk and eight strikeouts...the offense recorded 17 hits marking the sixth time this season with 17-plus in a game...Nelson Cruz and Eddie Rosario each had three hits and both homered...Miguel Sanó and Byron Buxton also added home runs...ninth four-homer game for the Twins this season.

TWINS AND M'S: The Twins and Mariners are playing the fifth of seven games this season...the Twins took three of four at T-Mobile Park in mid-May...a win tonight would secure the season series which would mark their first over Seattle since 2016 (4-2).

- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .305 (25-for-82) with seven home runs, 13 RBI and 17 runs scored in his last 21 vs. the Mariners.
- ☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .325 (100-for-308) with 22 doubles, 18 home runs, 43 RBI and a .944 OPS in 92 career games vs. the Mariners...he has hit safely in 10 straight games against Seattle, hitting .405 (17-for-42) during that span.
- ☞ Miguel Sanó has nine career homers vs. SEA, his most vs. any non AL Central opponent...he has the highest OPS (1.105) among actives vs. the Mariners.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .344 (22-for-64) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs, 12 RBI and a 1.045 OPS in 18 career games against Seattle.
- ☞ Twins have out-scored the Mariners 40-18 this season and out-hit them 52-34...they hit .329 with a .966 OPS in their four game series May 16-19.

POLO ON THE MARK: Sunday Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 24 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .347 (35-for-101) with a .393 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018.

☞ Polanco has now *hit* in 11 straight games, the second longest of his career, his best being 13 games from May 20-August 11, 2016...the streak ties Marwin Gonzalez (May 7-21) for longest by a Twin this season...he is tied with Yoán Moncada for longest active streak in baseball.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 125 home runs this season, the second most in baseball, trailing Seattle (126 in 69 games)...they are on pace to hit 316, which would mark a major league record...they hit 166 all of 2018...the Twins have 69 home runs over 400 feet this season, the most in baseball.
☞ 45.4 percent of the Twins hits have gone for extra bases, the highest in baseball.
☞ Twins have already matched their Pre-All-Star break record for home runs...they hit 125 before the break in 1964...Twins have 25 games until the break.

WHOA NELLY!: Nelson Cruz has homered in four straight games, one short of his career-high of five, done twice: July 31-August 4, 2015 and April 1-15, 2015 when he was with Seattle...the club record is five-in-a-row, done five times: Brian Dozier September 2-6, 2016, Marty Cordova May 16-20, 1995, and Harmon Killebrew three times July 11-18, 1970, May 3-8, 1970 and June 26-29, 1964...he is looking to match Jose Altuve for the longest streak this season, Altuve did it April 8-13.

ALL-STAR UPDATE: Major League Baseball released their first AL All-Star balloting update yesterday...five Twins are in the "Starters Election" area at their respective positions: Jorge Polanco leads all shortstops with 395,210 votes, C.J. Cron ranks second among first basemen with 302,586 votes, Jason Castro ranks third among catchers with 199,497 votes, Nelson Cruz ranks third among designated hitters with 214,702 votes, and Eddie Rosario ranks sixth among outfielders with 344,215 votes...the next AL ballot update will be Monday, June 17.

HERE'S WHAT'S POPPEN: Triple-A Rochester right-handed pitcher Sean Poppen has been named the International League Pitcher of the Week...Poppen made one start during the league's award period (June 3-9) and pitched 7.0 scoreless innings with two hits and two walks allowed with eight strikeouts on June 6 at Syracuse to earn his third win with Rochester.

THIS AND THAT:

- ☞ The Twins are fourth in baseball with a 89.6 MPH average exit velocity, trailing the Red Sox (89.8), Yankees (89.8) and Rays (89.7).
- ☞ The Twins have also hit the second most balls over-or-equal-to 100.0 MPH (449) trailing only the Rays (476) this season.
- ☞ The Twins have the furthest average distance on balls hit at 193 feet, five feet farther than Seattle's 188.

LAST START: Did not receive a decision for the first time since his initial start as a Twin back on April 15 (eight consecutive starts)...threw 4.2 innings, allowing five runs (two earned) with a season-low one strikeout in a 9-7 Twins loss on June 5 at Cleveland...labored through the first inning, allowing a run on two hits and a walk, before yielding two runs apiece in the third and the fifth...couldn't qualify for a decision as he fell one out shy of 5.0 innings after a two-out RBI double was followed by an RBI single from José Ramírez...continued his strike-throwing ways, with 56 strikes in 92 pitches (60.9 percent), as he has thrown 60%-or-higher strikes in all but one of his outings this year (May 23 at LAA, 58.0 percent).

- Has not pitched into the sixth inning in five starts (since May 12 vs. Detroit), after throwing at least 6.0 innings in six of his first seven starts this year.

AMONG THE LEAGUE'S BEST: Before joining the starting rotation on April 15, Pérez struggled in three relief outings, allowing seven runs in 8.2 innings pitched (7.56 ERA)...since then, he has compiled a 6-2 record with a 3.16 ERA (57.0 IP, 20 ER), 21 BB, 48 SO and a .242 opponents average (52-for-215)...six of his 10 starts have been at least 6.0 IP, with five of them being quality starts.

- Since joining the rotation on April 15, Pérez ranks tied for eighth in the Majors with six wins and is 11th in the AL in ERA (3.16).
- Among American League starters since April 15, he ranks tied for fourth in wins, tied for 15th in GDP (5) and 18th in hits-per-9.0 innings (8.21)...in that span, he has received the third-most runs of support in baseball (56, one shy of José Berríos, two of Arizona's Robbie Ray).
- However, Pérez is 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (7.1 IP, 8 ER) and a .353 BAA in his last two starts.

THE TERRIFIC TRIO: Pérez has won seven games this season (six as a starter), joining Jake Odorizzi (9) and José Berríos (8) as the only trio of pitchers in Twins history to win seven-or-more decisions within the team's first 64 games of any season.

- With a win tonight, he, Odorizzi and Berríos would become the first Twins trio to each have eight wins apiece through 65 team games.

AGAINST THE M'S: Is making his second start and appearance against the Mariners this season...threw 6.2 innings of one-run ball in a 7-1 win at Seattle on May 17, striking out seven and walking a season-high tying four...in 22 career games (20 starts) against Seattle, he owns an 8-5 record with a 3.26 ERA (116.0 IP, 42 ER), 45 walks and 80 strikeouts...has seen the M's more than any other opponent in baseball, due to his extensive time as a starter for the Texas Rangers.

- Has a career 3.03 ERA (62.1 IP, 21 ER) in 11 games (10 starts) at home against Seattle, but this will be his first home start against them as a Twin.

HOME...FINALLY!: Pérez is making his first start at Target Field in nearly a month, dating back to May 12 vs. Detroit, snapping a four-start stretch on the road...he has gone 3-1, 2.51 ERA (sixth-best in the American League) (28.2 IP, 8 ER) in five games (4 starts) at home this season, while he has pitched to a 4-1 record on the road, but with an inflated 4.66 ERA (36.2 IP, 19 ER) with 10 of those earned runs coming in his last three starts away from home...owns a career 3.79 ERA (40.1 IP, 17 ER) in seven games (six starts) at Target Field.

I AM THE NIGHT: So far in 2019, Pérez has done his best work when pitching at night, compiling a 5-1 record with a 3.31 ERA (51.2 IP, 19 ER) and 44 of his 60 strikeouts coming at night...he ranks seventh in the American League in nighttime ERA, tied for 16th in the AL in strikeouts and 17th in the AL in opponents' batting average (.247)...despite the small sample size, he owns a 5.27 ERA (13.2 IP, 8 ER) in three day appearances (two starts).

ORGULLO VENEZOLANO: Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclena, daughter, Malena, and newborn son, Martín, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500.0 IP) in innings pitched (826.2), starts (138) and wins (50), while sitting seventh in strikeouts (522) and ninth in ERA (4.56).

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
