THE TWINS: After completing their 10-game roadtrip with a record of 6-4 (3-1 vs. Tampa Bay, 1-2 vs. Cleveland and 2-1 vs. Detroit), the Twins began their nine-game homestand with a win and a loss to Seattle the last two nights...today they will play the three-game series finale...tomorrow night the Twins will host Kansas City for three through the weekend then Boston for three from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 14 of their last 20 and 19 of their last 26.

TWINS FALL FLAT IN EXTRAS: The Twins lost to the Mariners last night by a score of 9-6 in 10 innings...José Berrios was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on seven hits in 6.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 11 hits and scored all six of their runs in from the seventh-ninth inning...Max Kepler (16), Marwin Gonzalez (8) and Byron Buxton (9) each homered...the defense committed five errors, their most since June 4, 1994 at Detroit (also 5).

ROSTER MOVE: This morning the Twins recalled right-handed pitcher Fernando Romero from Triple-A Rochester...since being optioned back there from Minnesota in mid-May, he appeared in 10 games, posting a 6.06 ERA (16.1 IP, 11 ER) with six walks and 15 strikeouts...to make room for Romero, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Ryan Eades to Rochester.

POLO ON THE MARK: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 26 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .358 (39-for-109) with a .405 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...he has now *hit* in 13 straight games, tying his career-high, last done from May 20-August 11, 2016...the streak marks the longest by a Twin this season and longest active streak in baseball...below are his AL rankings on the season:

TWINS AND M'S: The Twins and Mariners are playing for the final time this season...Tuesday night's win secured the season series, their first over Seattle since 2016 (4-2).

- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .302 (26-for-86) with seven home runs, 13 RBI and 17 runs scored in his last 22 vs. the Mariners...he has five homers and nine RBI in his last seven vs. the M's.
- ☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .325 (103-for-317) with 22 doubles, 19 home runs, 46 RBI and a .945 OPS in 94 career games vs. the Mariners...he has hit safely in 12 straight games against Seattle, hitting .392 (20-for-51) during that span.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .315 (23-for-73) with five doubles, one triple, five home runs, 12 RBI and a .959 OPS in 20 career games against Seattle.

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins have hit 130 home runs this season, the most in baseball ahead of Seattle (129)...they are on pace to hit 319, which would mark a major league record...Twins have homered in all 10 games this month, totaling 24 in June, tied with Atlanta for second most in baseball, trailing Seattle (26).

☞ Minnesota has seven players with at least 10 home runs this season, most in baseball (Buxton has 9)...the Twins had seven such players all of last season...the only other team with more than five such players this season is Seattle (6).

☞ Twins have partnered with Prostate Cancer Foundation for Home Run Challenge, starting Tuesday through Sunday...the organization will donate \$7,500 for each homer by a Twins player and \$1,000 for each strikeout by a Twins pitcher...the running total is at \$57,500.

TWO OUT OF THREE AIN'T BAD: The Twins are 13-5-3 in series play this season, going 6-1-2 at home and 7-4-1 on the road...the Twins are looking to win back-to-back series vs. the Mariners for the first time since July 7-10, 2014 and April 24-26, 2015.

RUNNERS HIGH: The Twins have scored 394 runs this season, the most in baseball, ahead of second-best Texas (380)...they are on pace to score 967 runs...the best in Twins history (since 1961) is 877 in 1996 and the best in Twins/Senators franchise history is 892 in 1930...the Twins didn't reach the 400-runs scored mark in 2018 until July 13.

DID I CATCH A 'NINER' IN THERE?: Byron Buxton is hitting .353 (12-for-34) with two doubles, four home runs and nine RBI in 10 games this month, hitting in the ninth spot of the order in each game...where he ranks from the ninth spot in the batting order among all of baseball: hits - 1st (51), doubles - 1st (19), home runs - 1st (9), RBI - 1st (37), runs - 1st (32), walks - 2nd (12), OPS - 2nd (.856).

FOR STARTERS: Since the start of May, Twins starting pitchers have combined to go 21-8, 3.20 ERA (228.0 IP, 81 ER) with 224 strikeouts, a .237 opponent batting average and .682 opponent OPS...for the entire season, the Twins starting staff ranks first in baseball in wins (34), fourth in ERA (3.60), tied for fourth in quality starts (33), and seventh in opponent OPS (.721).

ON THIS DAY...: In 2017, the Twins set a franchise record with 28 hits in a 20-7 victory over the Mariners at Target Field...Eddie Rosario hit three homers and drove in five runs...the 28 hits were the most by any major league team since the Rangers had 29 when they scored 30 runs in a game against the Orioles on August 22, 2007.

LAST START: Pineda did not factor into the decision, his fifth of the season as the Twins won 6-3 last Friday in Detroit...over 5.0 innings pitched, his shortest performance since May 5 at New York-AL, he allowed three runs (all earned), struck out three and did not issue a walk for the fifth time this season and just the eighth time since the beginning of 2017...allowed a first inning run on a Brandon Dixon sac fly...allowed a run in the fourth on a Ronny Rodriguez RBI-double...allowed a run in the fifth on a Nick Castellanos RBI-single.

WALK HARD: Through 12 starts, Pineda has only issued 11 walks in 64.0 innings which is tied for the third fewest in the American League among starters with at least 60.0 innings pitched...owns 740 career strikeouts, 168 walks and a lifetime SO/BB ratio of 4.40...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 40 starts...since 2016, is one of nine starters with an active streak of 40+ starts and three or less walks (full list below).

VS. THE MARINERS: Pineda brings a lifetime 2-1 record with a 5.18 ERA (24.1 IP, 14 ER) against the Seattle Mariners into today's start...last saw the Mariners on May 16 at T-Mobile Park...earned the win and threw 7.0 innings in that start, his longest outing of the season, striking out six, while allowing three runs (all on solo home runs) on five hits...is 0-1 when facing Seattle at home in his career with a 6.00 ERA over 6.0 innings pitched. •Signed as a free agent with the Mariners in 2005, and made his Major League debut with them in 2011...in his rookie season, he was named an All-Star and finished fifth in balloting for American League Rookie of the Year...went 9-10 with a 3.74 ERA (171.0 IP, 71 ER) with 55 walks and 173 strikeouts...the Mariners traded Pineda to the New York Yankees with José Campos for Jesús Montero and Héctor Noesi on January 13, 2012.

HOME STRUGGLES: In six home starts this season, Pineda is 1-2, 5.87 ERA (30.2 IP, 20 ER) with three walks, 24 strikeouts, eight home runs and a .281 (34-for-121) opponents' batting average...on the road, he is 3-1, 4.86 ERA (33.1 IP, 18 ER) with eight walks, 29 strikeouts and a .271 (35-for-129) batting average against in six starts.

THE REPERTOIRE: Coming into 2019, Pineda relied on high-velocity fastball, as referenced by the 59.6 percent (2011), 29.7 (2014), 38.7 (2015), 47.6 (2016) and 47.9 (2017) usage rates for his fastball that averaged 94.1 MPH each year...similarly this season, has thrown the fastball 56.4 percent of the time, despite a 1.8 MPH drop in velocity this season (92.3)...right-handed batters are batting .299 (46-for-154) against Pineda this season, and lefties are hitting .240 (23-for-96) below is Baseball Savant's breakdown of Pineda's pitches and usage in 2019:

JUNE NUMBERS: "Big Mike" owns a 6-9 record and a 4.13 ERA (162.0 IP, 68 ER) in the monthof June, his second lowest of any month (September, 3.24), and his 138 strikeouts are the third most of any month. In 2017, Pineda finished June 2-2, with a 5.35 ERA (33.2 IP, 20 ER), including a season-high 11 strikeout appearance on April 10.

KEEPING IT ON THE DOWN-LOW: Since his debut in 2011, Pineda has recorded 947 ground balls to his 714 fly balls, a 44.5 percent ground ball rate.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON, RHP (SEASON: 6-3, 4.14 ERA ; CAREER: 60-64, 4.44 ERA)

Gibson is making his 13th start of the season and his second against Kansas City tomorrow evening...last time out came Saturday at Detroit where he was dealt his third loss of the season after allowing a season-high tying five earned runs (also allowed five earned runs April 3 at KC) on eight hits with two home runs, two walks and eight strikeouts...marked the third game this year and the second in his last four starts giving up two homers...in his last appearance against the Royals on April 3, he received the no-decision after allowing five runs on eight hits with two walks and two strikeouts in his first start after battling E. Coli during Spring Training...owns a lifetime stat line of 7-5, 3.84 ERA (117.1 IP, 50 ER) with 34 walks and 83 strikeouts in 19 starts against the Royals.

CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
