THE TWINS: The Twins began their nine-game homestand with a series win over the Mariners, taking games one and three...tonight they will continue the homestand with the first of three vs. Kansas City through the weekend...following this series, the Twins will host Boston for three night games from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 15 of their last 21 and 20 of their last 27.

OFFENSE COMES ALIVE LATE VS. M's: The Twins beat the Mariners yesterday afternoon by a score of 10-5, scoring nine runs in the sixth and seventh innings...Michael Pineda was the starter, allowing one run on two hits in 5.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 14 hits, three coming from both Nelson Cruz and Ehre Adrianza...Cruz reached four times and hit his 12th home run of the season...C.J. Cron added a home run, his 15th of the season...the Twins recorded 14-plus hits for the 12th time this season, the most in baseball.

ROSTER MOVE: This morning the Twins recalled right-handed pitcher Zack Littell from Triple-A Rochester...Littell appeared in 12 games (7 starts) for the Red Wings this season, going 3-2 with a 3.91 ERA (50.2 IP, 22 ER), 17 walks and 58 strikeouts...to make room for Littell on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Fernando Romero to Triple-A Rochester.

BRING 'EM OUT! BRING 'EM OUT!: The Twins have sold out three games this season: Opening Day March 28 vs. Cleveland (39,519), May 25 vs. Chicago-AL (39,139) and May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (39,913)...the last 40,000+ attendance was Opening Day of 2016 (40,638).
☞ The Twins have sold out 164 regular season games at Target Field in 759 openings since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and three in 2019.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the third of 19 games this season...the Twins swept a two-game series at Kauffman Stadium April 2-3, winning both games by one run (5-4 and 7-6)...the Twins have gone 8-4 in their last 12 vs. KC overall and six of their last seven at Target Field...Twins have 11-plus hits in each of their last five vs. KC. ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .370 (10-for-27) with two doubles and two home runs in his last six vs. KC. ☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .320 (16-for-50) in his last 11 games vs. KC. ☞ Miguel Sanó has hit safely in 19 of his last 20 vs. KC, hitting .358 (29-for-81) with four doubles, one triple, six home runs, 32 RBI, nine walks and a 1.077 OPS.

POLO ON THE MARK: Yesterday Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 27 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .357 (41-for-115) with a .402 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...he has now *hit* in a career-high 14 straight games...the streak marks the longest by a Twin this season and longest active streak in baseball.

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins have hit 132 home runs this season, the most in baseball ahead of Seattle (129)...they are on pace to hit 319, which would mark a major league record...Twins have homered in all 11 games this month, totaling 26 in June tied with Seattle (26) for most in baseball...their current 11-game homer streak is two short of their 2019-high of 13, done from May 6-18...the club record is 16, done three different times, twice in 2017.
☞ Twins have partnered with Prostate Cancer Foundation for Home Run Challenge, starting last Tuesday through Sunday...the organization will donate \$7,500 for each homer by a Twins player and \$1,000 for each strikeout by a Twins pitcher...the running total is at \$79,500

THIS IS MY BOOMSTICK!: Nelson Cruz is hitting .344 (11-for-32) with five home runs, nine RBI and a 1.245 OPS in eight games since coming off the IL (left wrist strain) June 3...among designated hitters this season, he ranks second in batting average (.282), OBP (.365), slugging (.564) and OPS (.929)...he ranks fourth among all actives in career home runs with 372, trailing Albert Pujols (645), Miguel Cabrera (468) and Edwin Encarnación (401).

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 23 games over .500, their highest since ending the 2010 season 26 games over (94-68)...prior to that, their most games over .500 was 27, the day before their final game of 2010, on October 2 when they were 94-67.

RUNNERS HIGH: The Twins reached and passed the 400 runs scored mark yesterday and now have 404 on the season, the most in baseball, ahead of second-best Texas (386)...they are on pace to score 976 runs...the best in Twins history (since 1961) is 877 in 1996 and the best in Twins/Senators franchise history (since 1901) is 892 in 1930...the Twins didn't reach the 400-runs scored mark in 2018 until July 13.

C.J. CRUSH: C.J. Cron has 45 RBI this season, ranking second on the team to Eddie Rosario (52)...his 15 home runs are half way to his single-season career-high of 30, done last season with Tampa Bay...as of Monday's AL All-Star Game balloting, he ranked second among first basemen with 302,586 votes, trailing Luke Voit (393,356) and ahead of José Abreu (286,145)...ranks among AL first basemen: second in slugging percentage (.541), third in RBI (45), fourth in doubles (14), OPS (.878), wOBA (.380) and batting average (.275), fifth in home runs (15).

LAST START: Gibson was the starter and loser, pitching 5.0 innings and allowing a season-high tying five runs (also: April 3 at Kansas City) while yielding two home runs with eight strikeouts in a 9-3 loss June 8 at Detroit...threw a perfect first inning before allowing a single and a walk to precede a three-run home run from JaCoby Jones, all with two outs in the second inning...was never able to rebound as he'd scatter five more hits and a pair of runs in the third and fifth innings, exiting with 94 pitches, his most in a 5.0-inning start since May 3 at New York-AL (a 6-3 Twins loss).

ON THE VERGE OF A GRAND: Gibson enters today's start with 994.1 career innings pitched, 5.2 innings short of throwing 1,000 innings in his career...the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, will become just the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1000.0 IP threshold, first since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP as a Twin from 2000-2007. Below are the 10 pitchers in Twins history with 1000.0+ IP:

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enters tonight's start with the sixth-most starts (161) and the eighth-highest innings pitched total (943.1) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (124, most in baseball), 12th in wins (58) and 14th in strikeouts (727).

GETTING AHEAD: Gibson has made a habit this season of getting ahead, as referenced by his 68.8 percent on first pitch strikes, seventh-best in baseball, second in the AL behind only Yankee starter Masahiro Tanaka (69.6)...he has also induced a bevy of first pitch swinging strikes, as referenced by his 33.3 percent swings-on-first-pitch ratio, tied for sixth-best in the American League...Gibby also ranks seventh in the AL in percent of swings that miss (31.2) while he's 23rd with a 17.4 percentage on pitches in play.

- All this has led to a career-best pace for both strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9.49 - 14th in the AL) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.18, 10th in the AL).

AGAINST THE ROYALS: The right-hander is making his 20th career start against the Royals, second this season after making his 2019 debut in Kansas City on April 3...Gibson, who had a slightly delayed start to the season due to a bout with E. Coli in the offseason, was able to give the Twins 4.2 innings, but allowed a season-high six runs (5 earned) on eight hits in an eventual 7-6 win...his last win against the Royals came in his final start against them last year on Sept. 16, also in Kansas City (6.2 IP, 11 hits, 5 ER in a 9-6 win)...amazingly, he didn't face the Royals in Target Field last year, missing them on all three of their trips here...his last home start against them was back on Sept. 2, 2017, a game the Twins won 17-0, when Gibby threw 6.0 innings of five-hit, shutout ball.

THE REPERTOIRE: Below is a breakdown of his pitches in 2019, (Courtesy-Baseball Savant): PITCH NUMBER (vs.RHB-LHB)/AVG MPH PERCENTAGE. Lists Sinkers, Sliders, Four-Seam Fastballs, etc.

FUN WITH STATCAST: So far through 2019, Gibson has seen the most success with his slider, as opponents are hitting just .143 (9-for-63) against it, and 36 of his 71 strikeouts have come via the slider (54.3 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his sinker, going 33-for-105 with three home runs and an average exit velocity of 91.1 with a wOBA of .385 (weighted on-base average).

THE SHERIDAN STORY: Gibson, along with catcher Jason Castro, are proud to support The Sheridan Story, an organization dedicated to fighting child hunger in Minnesota...the innovative organization serves more than 6,500 kids in over 200 schools - with the aid of strong community partnerships... Kyle will donate \$100 for every Twins win while Jason will contribute \$250 per victory...coming into tonight's start, Gibson is set to donate \$4,500.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI [SEASON: 9-2, 1.92 ERA // CAREER: 56-50, 3.80 ERA]

Odorizzi makes his 14th start of the year tomorrow against Kansas City, his first start against the Royals in 2019...is 9-2, 1.92 ERA (70.1 IP, 15 ER) with 22 walks and 78 strikeouts... has a career-high nine-game winning streak, longest active streak in baseball and best by a Twin since Johan Santana also won nine-straight during his 2006 Cy Young season (9-0 in 12 starts from July 15 - September 10)...threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball in the series finale in Detroit, scattering five hits and just one walk with eight strikeouts...holds rankings in a myriad of American League categories, including: 1st in ERA (1.92), T-1st in wins (9), T-3rd in BAA (.186), T-4th in winning percentage (.818), 13th in percentage of swings-and-misses (28.5%) and 16th in strikeouts (78).

• Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).
• Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
• Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
• Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
• His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
• In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.

- Twins' bullpen went 4-4-4 with a 4.52 ERA (79.2 IP, 40 ER) vs. KC last season...in two games this season, are 2-0-2, with a 1.23 ERA (7.1 IP, ER) with two walks & six strikeouts.
- Twins relievers have pitched 208.2 innings, currently 3rd fewest in baseball behind the Nationals (202.0 IP) and Dodgers (206.0)...bullpen has gone 11-8-19 with 36 holds, a 4.83 ERA (112 ER), 91 walks, 226 strikeouts and a .262 opponents' batting average (216-for-823) in 67 games...Twins' pen is 6th in baseball in save percentage (79.2%), trailing just the Indians (87.0%), White Sox (84.2%), Blue Jays (82.4%), Giants (81.0 %) & Brewers (80.0%) going 19-for-24 in save opportunities and are also tied with Milwaukee for 5th-fewest blown saves in baseball with five.
- The bullpen has a 6.81 ERA (35.2 IP, 27 ER) with four saves and four holds in June (11 games), along with 20 walks, 40 strikeouts & a .305 average against (46-for-151).
