THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-1 through four games on their nine-game homestand, going 2-1 vs. the Mariners and beating the Royals last night...tonight the Twins will play the second of three...following tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will host Boston for three night games from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 16 of their last 22 and 21 of their last 28.

GARV SAUCE > YOUR SAUCE: The Twins beat the Royals last night by a score of 2-0, recording their sixth shutout this season...Kyle Gibson (7-3) pitched 8.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and six strikeouts...the offense recorded four hits, two from Ehre Adrianza...Mitch Garver hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning...the Twins sold out Target Field for the fourth time this season (38,898) and played the game in 2:21.

BRING 'EM OUT! BRING 'EM OUT!: The Twins have sold out four games this season: Opening Day March 28 vs. Cleveland (39,519), May 25 vs. Chicago-AL (39,139), May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (39,913) and last night (38,898)...the last 40,000+ attendance was Opening Day of 2016 (40,638)...Twins have sold out 165 regular season games at Target Field in 760 openings since 2010.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the fourth of 19 games this season...the Twins have gone 9-4 in their last 13 vs. KC overall and seven of their last eight at Target Field.

Jorge Polanco is hitting .302 (16-for-53) in his last 12 games vs. KC. Miguel Sanó has reached safely in 21 straight games vs. KC, dating back to September 28, 2016, hitting .349 (29-for-83) with 32 RBI, a .419 OBP and a 1.058 OPS in that span. Joe Mauer played in 212 career games against the Royals hitting .319 (251-for-788) with 47 doubles, four triples, 14 home runs, 123 RBI and a .401 on-base percentage...he ranks sixth all-time in batting average against KC (minimum 500 at-bats), trailing Rod Carew (.345), Iván Rodríguez (.337), Wade Boggs (.332), Alex Rodriguez (.329), and Derek Jeter (.322)...below are the all-time ranks vs. KC:

POLO ON THE MARK: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 28 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .347 (41-for-118) with a .397 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins have hit 133 home runs this season, the most in baseball ahead of Seattle (131)...they are on pace to hit 316, which would mark a major league record...Twins have homered in all 12 games this month, totaling 27 in June tied with Atlanta for second most in baseball, trailing Seattle (28)...their current 12-game homer streak is two short of their 2019-high of 13, done from May 6-18...the club record is 16 straight, done three different times, twice in 2017.

The Twins have homered in each of their last 18 home games, tied with New York-NL (also current) for the second-longest streak in MLB this season (Brewers, 19 straight from March 28-May 3)...since the franchise moved to Minnesota in 1961, there has only been one streak as long of home games with a home run (18 straight in 1986).

Twins have partnered with Prostate Cancer Foundation for Home Run Challenge, starting last Tuesday through Sunday...the organization will donate \$7,500 for each homer by a Twins player and \$1,000 for each strikeout by a Twins pitcher...the running total is at \$94,000.

THIS IS MY BOOMSTICK!: Nelson Cruz is hitting .344 (11-for-32) with five home runs, nine RBI and a 1.245 OPS in eight games since coming off the IL (left wrist strain) June 3...among designated hitters this season, he ranks second in batting average (.282), OBP (.365), slugging (.564) and OPS (.929).

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 24 games over .500, their highest since ending the 2010 season 26 games over (94-68)...prior to that, their most games over .500 was 27, the day before their final game of 2010, on October 2 when they were 94-67.

C.J. CRUSH: C.J. Cron has 45 RBI this season, ranking second on the team to Eddie Rosario (52)...his 15 home runs are half way to his single-season career-high of 30, done last season with Tampa Bay...in his last 17 games, he is hitting .304 (21-for-69) with nine doubles, 16 RBI and a .925 OPS...ranks among AL first basemen: second in slugging percentage (.533), tied for third in RBI (45), fourth in doubles (14) and batting average (.271), and fifth in OPS (.867) and wOBA (.375).

**ODO-METER:** Odorizzi leads the American League with a 1.92 ERA (T-2nd in the majors) and is tied for second in the majors with nine wins through 13 starts (70.1 IP, 15 ER)...he also ranks among AL top-10 leaders for: hits-per-9.0 innings (3rd - 5.89), fielding-independent pitching (3rd - 2.69), opponents' batting average (T-3rd - .186, 46-for-247), baserunners-per-9.0 innings (4th - 8.96), WHIP (5th - 0.97) and strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9th - 9.98, with 78 SO).

**FOR THE WIN:** At 9-2, Odorizzi has already surpassed his wins total for all of his 2018 debut season with the Twins (7-10 in 32 starts) and is two shy of his career high (11 for Tampa Bay in 2014).

- A win tonight would make Odo just the seventh Twins pitcher (eighth occurrence) to earn 10 victories within Minnesota's first 69 games...the others are: Dean Chance (10 in 1967), Jim Perry (11 in 1970 and '71), Jim Kaat (10 in 1972), Frank Viola (11 in 1988), Scott Erickson (11 in 1991) and Kevin Slowey (10 in 2009).
- Is also looking to become the 24th Twins pitcher (33rd occurrence) to reach double-digit wins before the All-Star Break...the last to do so was Ervin Santana in 2017 (10-6 in 18 starts).

**W-W-W-W-W-W-W-W-W-W:** The Twins have won each of last Odorizzi's 10 starts (beginning April 17), while he is personally 8-0 with a 1.07 ERA (59.0 IP, 7 ER) to establish a career-long winning streak...he has held opponents to a .199/.252/.261 slash line during the stretch, with 13 walks and 63 strikeouts.

- Since April 17, Odorizzi leads the majors in wins (9-0) and the American League for ERA (1.07, 2nd-best in baseball)...among AL starters, he also ranks second for opponents' slugging percentage (.261), third for opponents' OPS (.513), and fifth for WHIP (0.93), opponents' batting average (.199, 42-for-211) and hits-per-9.0 innings (6.41).
- He has the longest winning streak by a Twins starter since Johan Santana also won nine-straight during his 2006 Cy Young Award-winning season (12 starts from July 15-September 10)...the last with a longer run was also Santana, when he set the club record with 17-consecutive wins between July 17, 2004 and April 26, 2005 (a span of 20 starts).

**POSTING ZEROS:** Odorizzi has been unscored upon in six of his last eight starts, with a 0.76 ERA (47.2 IP, 4 ER) since April 29...opponents are slashing .170/.230/.224 in that span, with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts.

- Stretch includes a 22.1-inning scoreless streak (April 29-May 15), the fifth-longest ever for a Twins starter, and a 16.1-inning shutout run May 20-June 2.
- His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings in a single season is already tied for eighth-most in Twins history...three pitchers had nine such contests (most recently Ervin Santana in 2017), two had eight (last: rotation-mate Kyle Gibson in 2014) and two had seven (last: Francisco Liriano in 2010).

**SWING AND A MISS:** Odorizzi has struck out 26 batters in 17.1 innings over his last three starts to rank second in the AL since May 26 with an average of 13.50 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings...has allowed only three walks in that stretch, while going 3-0 with a 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).

**SOFT CONTACT:** Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (tied for 3rd-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been equally difficult to square up - he's allowed just nine extra-base hits and a .513 OPS, both the lowest in the majors (min. 10 starts)...his .255 opponents' slugging percentage is best in the AL (2nd in the majors).

- Of the 171 balls put in play against Odorizzi (on 1,169 pitches - just 14.6 percent), only 50 have been hit hard (exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH)...his 32.9 percent hard-hit rate is 10th-lowest in the AL (min. 150 batted balls).
- Odo has been the toughest pitcher in the majors for a right-handed batter to hit this season, as he has yielded just 17 hits in 137 at-bats (.124 batting average).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Odorizzi won his career-best ninth-straight decision, working 6.0 innings in a 12-2 win at Detroit on June 9 (5 H, 1 R, 1 ER)...allowed a first-inning run to snap his 16.1-inning scoreless streak, but blanked the Tigers over his final five frames.

- Threw a season-best 70.7 percent of his pitches for strikes (99-70)...finished with eight strikeouts, against only one walk.

**ON TARGET AT HOME:** In his first six home starts this season, Odorizzi is 5-0 with an AL-best 1.24 ERA (36.1 IP, 5 ER) and a .171 opponents' batting average (2nd in the AL, 22-for-129), along with seven walks, 41 strikeouts and a 0.80 WHIP (3rd in the AL).

- In his first 22 home starts with the Twins, Odorizzi is 10-4 with a 3.62 ERA (117.0 IP, 47 ER) and a .233 opponents' average (103-for-443), with 37 walks and 122 strikeouts...the Twins are 15-7 when he takes the mound at Target Field (5-1 in 2019).

**CONSISTENCY IS KEY:** Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 165 starts and a .232 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (172), Justin Verlander (168) and Corey Kluber (167) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.212), Verlander (.220) and Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ, LHP [SEASON: 7-2, 3.97 ERA ; CAREER: 50-51, 4.58 ERA]

Pérez will be making his 12th start and 15th appearance of the season in tomorrow's series finale vs. Kansas City...has struggled in his last three outings, going 0-1 with an 8.76 ERA (12.1 IP, 12 ER) and a .327 opponents' batting average (18-for-55), with seven walks and 11 strikeouts (Twins are 1-2)...has not reached the sixth inning in four-straight starts...worked 5.0 innings in the homestand opener last Tuesday vs. Seattle, departing trailing 4-3 before the Twins rallied in the eighth for a 6-5 victory...has not faced the Royals since July 14, 2017, when he pitched the Texas Rangers to a 5-3 win at Kauffman Stadium with 7.0 innings of three-run ball (8 H)...is 1-0 with a 2.29 ERA (19.2 IP, 5 ER) in three lifetime appearances (all starts) against Kansas City.

### CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berrios (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
