WELCOME BACK, SAUCE: The Twins announced today that they have reinstated catcher Mitch Garver from his rehab assignment at Double-A Pensacola and reinstated him from the 10-day Injured List... Garver, who was placed on the Injured List on May 15 with a high left ankle sprain, played three games for the Blue Wahoos, going 1-for-9 with a run scored...prior to his injury, he played in 25 games for the Twins, hitting .329 ( 26 -for-79) with four doubles, nine home runs and a 1.164 OPS...to make room for Garver on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Zack Littell to Triple-A Rochester...Littell made two appearances with the Twins this season, posting an 11.37 ERA ( $6.1 \mathrm{IP}, 8 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with one walk and five strikeouts.

TWINS-RAYS: The Twins and Rays are playing for the fourth of seven games this season. the Twins will host the Rays for three games June 25-27...Twins are just 6-8 in their last 14 vs. the Rays...they are just $9-15$ at Tropicana Field in their last 24 here....Twins are looking to win a series in St. Petersburg for the first time since taking two of three August 5-7, 2016. $\Phi$ C.J. Cron is hitting . 333 (11-for-33) with two doubles, three home runs, eight RBI and a 1.028 OPS in his last nine games vs. TB.
$\Phi$ Jorge Polanco has hit safely in eight straight vs. the Rays, hitting . 324 (11-for-34) with six doubles and a .954 OPS in that span.
$\Phi$ Jonathan Schoop is hitting . 317 (26-for-82) with six home runs and 15 RBI in his last 19 games vs. TB...he has 15 career home runs and 39 RBI, the 39 RBI being his most vs. any team and the 15 home runs are tied for his most (Toronto).
© Eddie Rosario is a career . 382 ( 34 -for-89) with six doubles, one triple, five home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.068 OPS in 24 career games vs. the Rays... he has multiple hits in six of his last nine vs. the Rays and multiple RBI in five of his last 10 vs. TB.
Ф Starter Jake Odorizzi pitched five seasons for the Rays from 2013-17, going 40-37, 3.82 ERA ( 698.0 IP, 296 ER) with 228 walks and 639 strikeouts...he ranks fifth on the Rays all-time list in strikeouts, sixth in innings pitched and tied for sixth in wins.

FOR STARTERS: Since the start of May, Twins starters have gone 18-6, 2.99 ERA (177.1 IP, 59 ER) with 45 walks, 174 strikeouts, an opponent batting average of .231 and an opponent OPS of .661...on the season, the Twins have three pitchers with seven wins: Martín Pérez (7-2), José Berríos (7-2) and Jake Odorizzi (7-2)...only the Los Angeles Dodgers have multiple seven-plus game winners in Hyun-Jin Ryu ( $8-1$ ) and Kenta Maeda ( $7-2$ ), and no other team in baseball has more than one pitcher with seven wins.

THREE POINT LINE: The Twins have scored three-or-more runs in 25 consecutive games, dating back to May 6 at Toronto, setting a single-season franchise record...the stretch marks the ninth time in franchise history with 20-or-more games scoring three-plus runs in each...the overall franchise record is 30 consecutive games, snapping two seasons, from September 14, 2003-April 23, 2004.

HITMEN: The Twins have recorded double-digit hit totals in 13 of their last 16 games, hitting .304 (117-for-582) with 7.8 runs-pergame in those 16 ...the Twins 538 hits rank third most in baseball, trailing Arizona (552) and Houston (540)...Twins have 29 games with double-digit hit totals, tied with Colorado for most in baseball.
GOOD TRAVELERS: The Twins have gone 20-9 on the road this season, the best record in baseball...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't win their 20th away from Target Field since August 7 at Cleveland when they were 20-35...Twins have gone 5-3-1 in road series', their three losses coming in New York-AL, Houston and Philadelphia.
$\Phi$ Twins have scored 6.7 runs-per-game on the road, best in baseball ahead of New York-AL (6.28)...the Twins best mark in runs-per game on the road came in 1996 when they scored 5.31...Twins have the fifth best mark in baseball history, trailing four Yankees teams: game on the road came in 1996 (7.35) and 1994 (6.77).

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Single-A Ft. Myers outfielder Trevor Larnach and Ft. Myers right-handed pitcher Johan Duran have been named Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...in five games for the Miracle, Larnach hit . 524 (11-for-21) with two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, four runs scored and a 1.427 OPS...the 22 -year-old Larnach was drafted by the Twins 20th overall in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft and this marks his second POW honor this season (also May 12)...Duran made one start for the Miracle coming last Sunday at Daytona, allowing two runs (1 earned) on two hits in 6.0 innings pitched with 14 strikeouts (23 batters faced)...the 21-year-old was acquired by the Twins at the trade deadline last season from Arizona, in exchange for Eduardo Escobar.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1986, Rod Carew announced his retirement from baseball at the age of 40...Carew retired with a .328 career batting average, compiled over 19 major league seasons...he was elected into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1991

ODO-METER: Odorizzi leads the American League with a 2.16 ERA (2nd in the majors, behind only LAD's Hyun-Jin Ryu at 1.48 ) through 11 starts ( $58.1 \mathrm{IP}, 14 \mathrm{ER}$ )...he also ranks among AL leaders for: opponents' batting average (2nd -. 184, 38-for-207), wins (T3rd -7), and WHPP (4th - 0.99 ).

W-W-W-W-W-W-W: The Twins have won each of last Odorizi's eight starts (beginning April 17), while he is personally $7-0$ with a $1.15 \mathrm{ERA}(47.0 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{ER})$ to establish a career-long winning streak....he has held opponents to a $.199 / .251 / .266$ slash line during the stretch, with 11 walks and 46 strikeouts.

- Since April 17, Odorizzi leads the majors in wins (7-0) and the American League for ERA (1.15, 3rd-best in baseball)...among AL starters, he also ranks second for opponents' slugging percentage (.292), third for opponents' OPS (.520), fifth for WHIP (0.96), and sixth for opponents' batting average (.199, 34-for-171) and hits-per-9.0 innings (6.51).
- The last Twins starter to win seven-or-more consecutive decisions was Kyle Gibson from August 22, 2017 - March 31, 2018, while the last to do so in a single season was Francisco Liriano (eight-straight winning decisions from July 16 -September 14, 2010)...the franchise record for most consecutive winning decisions is 17 set by Johan Santana back in 2004-05, while the single-season record of 12 was set from June 7-August 4, 1997 by Brad Radke.

SOFT CONTACT: Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (2nd-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been equally difficult to square up - he's allowed just eight extrabase hits, third-fewest in the majors (min. 8 starts and 40.0 innings pitched).

- His .261 opponents' slugging pct. and .520 OPS are both the lowest in all of baseball.
- Of the 147 balls put in play against 0 dorizzi (on 962 pitches - just 15.3 percent), only 45 have been hit hard (exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH )...his 30.8 percent hard-hit rate is ninth-lowest in baseball (min. 140 batted balls).

POSTING ZEROS: Odorizzi has been unscored upon in five of his last six starts (beginning April 29), with a 0.76 ERA ( 35.2 IP, 3 ER), 10 walks, 38 strikeouts, a 160 batting-average-against ( $20-$ for-125) and a 0.84 WHP.

- That stretch includes a 22.1-inning scoreless streak (April 29-May 15), the fifth-longest ever for a Twins starter.
MAY FLOWERS: A bona fide American League Pitcher of the Month candidate, Odorizzi takes the mound for the first time in June... he pitched to an AL-best 0.94 ERA ( 28.2 IP, 3 ER) over five May starts, while going 4-0 (T-2nd) with nine walks, 31 strikeouts and a paltry .160 batting average against ( 16 -for-100).

LAST TIME OUT: Odorizzi won his career-best seventh-straight decision, blanking the Chicago White Sox on one hit over 5.1 innings of a 7-0 victory May 26 at Target Field...marked his fifth scoreless effort in his last six starts.

- Gave up just one single and one walk, both of which came in the third inning...pitched around that two-on, two-out jam with a strikeout of Yoán Moncada.
- Retired his final eight batters faced before departing having thrown 93 pitches ( 58 strikes).
- Finished with nine strikeouts, his highest total since matching a career-best with 11 on March 30 vs. Cleveland.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: After pitching just 5.1 innings with an 11.81 ERA ( 7 ER) in losing his first two road starts, Odorizzi has been fantastic in his last three efforts away from Target Field, going 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA ( $16.2 \mathrm{IP}, 2$ ER), six walks and 16 strikeouts (Twins have won all three games).

- Odo has an 11.0 inning scoreless streak on the road, blanking the Yankees for 6.0 innings
on May 4 to earn a $7-3$ win, and shutting out the Angels for 5.0 frames on May 20 (an eventual 3-1 Twins victory).
- For the season, he is $2-2$ with a 3.68 ERA ( 22.0 IP, 9 ER) in five road starts...in his career, he is $23-25$ with one save and a $4.30 \mathrm{ERA}(426.2 \mathrm{IP}, 204 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 82 games ( 81 starts).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30 -start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 163 starts and a .233 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (169), Corey Kluber (167) and Justin Verlander (165) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.213), Verlander (.221) and Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.


FLY AWAY: After posting the lowest ground ball percentage in the majors in 2018 (28.7 percent), Odorizzi once again has the lowest mark in the game this season at 27.0 percent.

- Since his first full big league season in 2014, Odorizzi ranks fourth in the majors with a 33.4 percent groundball rate, just ahead of Justin Verlander (35.3 percent).

## CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career. - Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-Iongest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
