THE TWINS: The Twins have begun their 10-game roadtrip by winning a four-game series at Tropicana Field, winning the final three games...tonight the Twins will continue the trip with the first of three in Cleveland...following this series, the Twins will travel to Detroit for three games over the weekend...the Twins have won 10 of their last 12 and 15 of their last 18...Twins are 11-3 vs. the AL Central this season; 13 of the next 19 games are against the division.

TWINS TAKE THE TRIPLE IN THE TROP: The Twins beat the Rays on Sunday afternoon in St. Petersburg by a score of 9-7, winning their 12th series of the season (12-4-3)...Jake Odorizzi (8-2) was the starter and winner, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with three hits, one walk and nine strikeouts - marked his sixth scoreless start in his last seven outings...the offense recorded 12 hits, three from Miguel Sanó, who singled twice and doubled...Jonathan Schoop hit his 11th home run of the season.

THIS IS 40: With the Twins win on Sunday, they improved to 40-18, marking the fastest team in Twins/Senators history to reach 40 wins...the previous high through 58 games was the 1931 Washington Senators (39-19 through 58), who earned their 40th win in Game No. 59 of the season...the fastest *Twins* team to 40 wins prior to this season was the 1970 group, who earned their 40th win in their 61st game of the year.

TWINS TAKE CAVACO: Last night the Twins selected infielder Keoni Cavaco from Eastlake High School in Chula Vista, CA with the 13th overall selection in the first round of the 2019 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft...Cavaco just completed his high school career at Eastlake High School...Cavaco becomes the first player from Eastlake High School to be drafted in the first round of the First-Year Player Draft since Adrián González was the first overall pick by the Florida Marlins in 2000...Cavaco was named to the 2019 Preseason California Region All-High School Senior First Team, was named a 2018 High School Underclassmen All-American High Honorable Mention and was ranked the No. 1 high school player in the state of California by Perfect Game...since 2001, the Twins have selected a high school position player 14 times in the first round (includes compensation and competitive balance picks), including: Joe Mauer (2001), Denard Span (2002), Trevor Plouffe (2004), Aaron Hicks (2008), Byron Buxton (2012), Alex Kirilloff (2016) and Royce Lewis (2017).

☞ With pick No. 39, the Twins selected Matt Wallner...Wallner hit .323 (73-for-226) with 12 doubles, 23 home runs and 60 RBI in 61 games for the University of Southern Mississippi Golden Eagles as a junior in 2019.

☞ With pick No. 54, the Twins selected Matt Canterino...he wrapped up his 2019 season with Conference USA Pitcher of the Year honors after recording a 6-5 record, 2.81 ERA (99.1 IP, 31 ER) with 121 strikeouts to just 23 walks for Rice University.

TWINS AND TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the fourth of 19 scheduled meetings this season...these two opened the season at Target Field as the Twins won the book-end games...the Twins last played at Progressive Field August 28-30, losing the three-game series, 2-1...they are just 2-6 in their last five in Cleveland.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .330 (87-for-264) with 13 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs, 35 RBI, 41 runs scored and a .935 OPS in 70 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 87 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball...he is hitting .382 (52-for-136) in 36 career games at Progressive Field, hitting safely in six straight in this park.

☞ Byron Buxton has hit safely in eight straight games vs. the Indians.

CRUZ INTO CLEVELAND: The Twins announced yesterday that they have returned designated hitter Nelson Cruz from his rehab assignment at Single-A Ft. Myers and have reinstated him from the 10-day Injured List...Cruz, who was placed on the Injured List on May 17 with a left wrist strain, recently played in two games on rehab assignment for the Miracle, going 2-for-7...prior to his injury, he played in 35 games, hitting .270 (34-for-126) with nine doubles, seven home runs, 22 RBI, 14 walks and a .862 OPS...to make room for Cruz on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned rookie infielder Luis Arraez to Triple-A Rochester...Arraez appeared in 10 games for the Twins, hitting .375 (9-for-24) with one home run, two doubles and six runs scored.

THREE POINT LINE: The Twins have scored three-or-more runs in 26 consecutive games, dating back to May 6 at Toronto, a *single-season* franchise record...the overall franchise record is 30 consecutive games, spanning two seasons, from September 14, 2003-April 23, 2004.

HITMEN: The Twins have recorded double-digit hit totals in 14 of their last 17 games, hitting .307 (189-for-616) with 7.8 runs-per-game in those 17...the Twins 550 hits rank third most in baseball, trailing Arizona (565) and Houston (556)...Twins have 30 games with double-digit hit totals, tied with Arizona for most in baseball.

GOOD TRAVELERS: The Twins have gone 21-9 on the road this season, the best record in baseball...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't win their 21st away from Target Field until August 11 at Detroit when they were 21-38...Twins have gone 6-3-1 in road series', their three losses coming in New York-AL, Houston and Philadelphia.

ON THIS DAY IN...: 2012, the Twins selected Byron Buxton with the second overall selection in the MLB First-Year Player Draft after Houston selected Carlos Correa first overall...Buxton came out of Appling County High School in Baxley, Georgia.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Smeltzer made his Major League debut last Tuesday at Target Field against the Milwaukee Brewers and fired 6.0 shutout innings en route to a 5-3 Twins victory...Smeltzer's start was historic in a myriad of ways, and they are listed below:

- Retired each of the first three batters he faced...struck out Lorenzo Cain (2015 ALCS MVP), got Christian Yelich (2018 NL MVP) to ground out to shortstop and struck out Ryan Braun (2011 MVP) looking.
- Became the fourth Twins starter in history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1 on August 6, 2013), Anthony Swarzak (7.0 on May 23, 2009) and Eric Milton (6.0 on April 5, 1998).
- Recorded seven strikeouts, one shy of the franchise record in a debut set by Boof Bonser on May 21, 2006 at Milwaukee...became just the fifth pitcher to record seven-or-more strikeouts, joining Bonser, Johan Pino (7 in 2014), Darrell Jackson (7 in 1978) and Bert Blyleven (7 in 1970).
- Smeltzer threw 6.0 innings, the longest by any Twins starter in their debut since Aaron Slegers on August 17, 2017 (Game Two) vs. CLE...became just the 30th Twins starter to throw 6.0-plus innings in his debut.
- Became just the fifth starter in Twins history to not issue a single walk in his debut, and just the second to last 6.0-plus IP and not walk a batter, (Kyle Gibson, June 29, 2013)...the other starters to not issue a walk: Nik Turley (4.0 IP on June 11, 2017), Gibson, LaTroy Hawkins (1.2 IP on April 29, 1995) and Albert Williams (3.0 IP on May 7, 1980).
- Was just the 11th pitcher since 2000 to throw 6.0-plus IP, not allow a run and strikeout seven-or-more batters in his debut...the last to do so was Pittsburgh's Nick Kingham on April 29, 2018.
- With his Major League debut against the Brewers, he became the third player to make his big-league debut for the Twins this season, joining Ryne Harper (3/31 vs. CLE) and Luis Arraez (5/18 at SEA).

GET TO KNOW THE KID: Smeltzer was raised in New Jersey and graduated from Bishop Eustace Preparatory School in Pennsauken Township in 2014 (became the ninth New Jersey-born player, seventh pitcher to make his debut for the Twins, first since RHP Rob Delaney on Sept. 4, 2010)...was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the 33rd round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft, but chose to continue his development at Florida Gulf Coast University...in nine starts at FGCU, he pitched to a 1-4 record with a 6.19 ERA in 52.1 innings pitched.

- Following his season at FGCU, the left-hander transferred to San Jacinto College North in San Jacinto, Texas, where he would go on to lead the NJCAA League 14 in ERA (1.18) and strikeouts (128), while ranking third with nine wins...won the National Junior College Athletic Association Player of the Week award for April 4-10, 2016, after throwing a complete game no-hitter in an 8-0 win over Wharton County Junior College, in which he struck out 16 batters and walked three...also threw two no-hitters in high school and one in a college summer league game.
- Smeltzer had planned to transfer to Texas Tech University, but forewent the opportunity after being drafted in the fifth round (No. 161 overall) in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers, one pick before the Toronto Blue Jays selected Cavan Biggio out of Notre Dame (son of Hall of Fame infielder Craig Biggio)...the Twins selected right-handed pitcher Jordan Balazovic (currently 5-1, 2.15 ERA in Ft. Myers) eight picks before the Dodgers selected Smeltzer.
- Spent parts of three seasons in the Dodgers organization before being traded to the Twins, along with infielder Luke Raley, for infielder Brian Dozier at last year's trade deadline...amassed a 5-5 record, 4.52 ERA (95.2 IP, 48 ER) between Double-A Tulsa (LAD) and Double-A Chattanooga last year, including 10 relief appearances for the Lookouts, allowing six runs (four earned) with 16 strikeouts.

SMELTZER THE CANCER SURVIVOR: When Smeltzer was just nine years old, he was diagnosed with pelvic rhabdomyosarcoma (bladder cancer), as a tumor had formed against his bladder that was connected to his prostate...he underwent surgery and chemotherapy at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and sent the cancer into full remission in 2012.

- While he fought off the cancer, he lost a substantial amount of weight as the radiation and chemotherapy weakened his immune system, leading to frequent vomiting...missed baseball while he was ill, but heightened activity heightened his threat of infections, so he made a deal with the chief of oncology at St. Christopher's, Greg Halligan, that he could go back to playing baseball, but if he grew weaker, he'd have to stop and be fed through a feeding tube.
- While getting treatment, Smeltzer became popular throughout the hospital as he would always talk to the other kids, helping them get through treatments the way he did...the lefty, who's worn glasses and a goatee for the majority of his professional career, continues to offer support to others fighting cancer.
- His likeness is featured on a specially-designed t-shirt with his goatee-glasses combination on the chest, supporting his Catch Cancer Looking campaign and benefitting Katie's Crusaders, an organization founded in memory of Katie Ann Duffin, to cover the out-of-pocket expenses for pediatric cancer patients...on May 9, unveiled a new lineup of Catch Cancer Looking apparel with 500 Level, a clothing company, with all proceeds benefitting Katie's Crusaders.
- Writes names as a tribute to those who have lost their battle to cancer on the inside of his cap.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ, LHP [SEASON: 7-2, 3.71 ERA ; CAREER: 50-51, 4.57 ERA]

Pérez will be making his 10th start of the season on Friday in Cleveland...had his first rough start of the season on Thursday in Tampa Bay, allowing six earned runs on six hits in just 2.2 innings, his season-low as a starter, in a 14-3 Twins loss...will be making his seventh appearance (fifth start) against the Indians...is 1-2 with a 9.13 ERA (23.2 IP, 24 ER) with 12 walks, 19 strikeouts and an opponents' batting average of .379 (39-for-103)...made his 2019 debut as a reliever on March 31 against these Indians, allowing three runs on five hits over 3.2 innings pitched with six strikeouts while recording the win...in four starts against the Tribe, has thrown just one quality start back on April 4, 2017 (6.0 IP, 3 ER in a 4-3 Texas loss).
