THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-2 through five games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 3-1 in St. Petersburg and losing game one in Cleveland last night...tonight the Twins will play the second of three at Progressive Field...following tomorrow night's series finale, the Twins will travel to Detroit for three over the weekend...the Twins have won 10 of their last 13 and 15 of their last 19...Twins are 11-4 vs. the AL Central this season; 12 of the next 18 games are against the division.

BIEBER FEVER HITS THE TWINS: The Twins lost to the Indians at Progressive Field last night by a score of 5-2...Devin Smeltzer (0-1) made his second career start, allowing five runs on five hits (4 homers) in 6.1 innings pitched...the offense recorded five hits, their fewest since May 5 at New York-AL when they had four...Marwin Gonzalez had two of the five hits, including a home run...Eddie Rosario also added a home run, his AL lead-tying 18th (Sánchez, NYY).

East night snapped a streak of the Twins scoring three-or-more runs in 26 consecutive games, dating back to May 5, losing to the Yankees 4-1, which was a single-season franchise record...the overall franchise record is 30 consecutive games, spanning two seasons, from September 14, 2003-April 23, 2004.

TWINS AND TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the fifth of 19 scheduled meetings this season...they are just 2-7 in their last nine in Cleveland.

₱ Eddie Rosario is hitting .328 (88-for-268) with 13 doubles, three triples, 16 home runs, 36 RBI, 42 runs scored and a .940 OPS in 71 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 88 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball...he is hitting .379 (53-for-140) in 37 career games at Progressive Field, hitting safely in seven straight in this park...in his career at Progressive Field, Rosario has a .657 slugging percentage, the only players all-time with a slugging percentage as high at this park are Albert Belle (.681) and Juan González (.657) (min. 100 PA at Progressive Field).

₱ Nelson Cruz has 21 career home runs vs. the Indians, including 10 in his last 18 against them (19 RBI)...he's slugging .824 in that span with a 1.202 OPS.

₱ Twins pitching has posted a 2.57 ERA (35.0 IP, 10 ER) with a .151 BAA and 43 strikeouts in four games vs. the Tribe this season...in those games, they have struck out 13, 13, 13 and four batters respectively.

YES WAY, JORGE!: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 19 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .359 (28-for-78) with a .420 on-base percentage...it is the longest streak since Max Kepler had 19 from July 5-27, 2018...the last two Twins streaks longer than 19 were Logan Morrison, 23 from April 20-May 16, 2018 and Joe Mauer, 20 from April 25-May 16, 2018...below are his numbers and ranks in several categories among AL players:

LEADER OF THE BOMBASQUAD: Eddie Rosario hit his 18th home run last night, already nine short of his career-high of 27, done in 2017...he is on pace to hit 49 homers...five of his 18 homers have come in his last 11 games...he enters today tied for first in the AL in home runs with Gary Sánchez and tied for first in RBI with José Abreu.

◆ He has 78 hits in May of 2018 and May of 2019 combined, tied with Nolan Arenado for most in baseball.

LAST START: Was the starter and loser May 30 at Tampa Bay, allowing a season-high six runs on six hits in a season-low 2.2 innings pitched (as a starter)...pitched two clean innings, allowing just one hit, before the wheels fell off in the third inning...after striking out Guillermo Heredia to begin the frame, the next eight batters went: single, walk, walk, bases-clearing double, 1-3, RBI single, double, two-RBI single...was relieved by Zack Littell, who set down Heredia to end the inning.

• Saw his ERA balloon from 2.95 to 3.71 and his opponents' batting average rise to .248 from .236.

AMONG THE LEAGUE'S BEST: Before joining the starting rotation on April 15, Pérez struggled in three relief outings, allowing seven runs in 8.2 innings pitched (7.56 ERA)...since then, he has compiled a 6-2 record with a 3.10 ERA (52.1 IP, 18 ER), 19 BB, 47 SO and a .236 opponents average (46-for-195)...six of his nine starts have been at least 6.0 IP, with five of them being quality starts.

- Since joining the rotation on April 15, Pérez ranks tied for fourth in the Majors with six wins (trailing only Odorizzi, Ryu and Verlander) and is 10th in the AL in ERA (3.10).
 Among American League starters since April 15, he ranks tied for third in wins, tied for
- 14th in GIDP (5), 17th in hits-per-9.0 innings (7.91), 24th in WHIP (1.15) and tied for 21st in strikeouts (min. 5 games started)...in that span, he has received the third-most runs of support in the AL (50, tied with Lance Lynn).

THE TERRIFIC TRIO: Pérez has won seven games this season (six as a starter), joining Jake Odorizzi (8) and José Berríos (7) as the only trio of pitchers in Twins history to win sevenor-more decisions within the team's first 59 games of any season...marks just the eighth time in Twins history with multiple 7+-game winners through 59 games, joining: Joe Mays (7) and Brad Radke (7) in 2001, Scott Erickson (9) and Jack Morris (7) in 1991, Frank Viola (9) and Juan Berenguer (7) in 1988, Mike Marshall (8) and Jerry Koosman (7) in 1979, Dave Goltz (7) and Bill Campbell (7) in 1976, Bert Blyleven (8) and Jim Kaat (7) in 1973 and Kaat (9) and Blyleven (8) again in 1972.

• With a win tonight, he and Odorizzi would become the third Twins duo to each have eight wins through 60 team games, joining Jim Kaat and Bert Blyleven, who turned the trick twice in 1972 and 1973.

AGAINST THE TRIBE: Pérez is making his seventh career appearance (fifth start) against the Indians tonight...he owns a lifetime 1-2 record with a 9.13 ERA (23.2 IP. 24 ER), 12 walks and

- Made his Twins debut against these Indians on March 31, yielding three runs on five hits over 3.2 innings pitched in relief of starter Michael Pineda...the Twins won 9-3.
- Is ending a six-year drought since his last appearance in Cleveland, making his second career start here and first since July 26, 2013...in that game, tonight's designated hitter Nelson Cruz batted third for the Texas Rangers and played right field, knocking his 24th home run of the season...Pérez lasted just 3.0 innings, allowing six earned runs.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Enters tonight 4-1, 4.78 ERA (32.0 IP, 17 ER) in seven games (5 starts) away from Target Field...is making his fourth consecutive start on the road after throwing in Seattle (May 17), Los Angeles (May 23) and Tampa Bay (May 30)...has not pitched in Minneapolis since May 12...among Twins starters, he owns the most wins (4) on the road...by comparison, he has gone 3-1, 2.51 ERA (28.2 IP, 8 ER) in five games (4 starts) at home this season.

I AM THE NIGHT: So far in 2019, Pérez has done his best work when pitching at night, compiling a 5-1 record with a 3.26 ERA (47.0 IP, 17 ER) with 43 of his 59 strikeouts coming at night...he ranks sixth in the American League in nighttime ERA, 14th in the AL in strikeouts and 14th in the AL in opponents' batting average (.241)...despite the small sample size, he owns a 5.27 ERA (13.2 IP, 8 ER) in three day appearances (two starts).

ORGULLO VENEZOLANO: Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclena, daughter, Malena, and newborn son, Martín, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500.0 IP) in innings pitched (822.0), starts (137) and wins (50), while sitting seventh in strikeouts (521) and ninth in ERA (4.57).
