**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 3-3 through six games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 3-1 in St. Petersburg and 0-2 in Cleveland the last two nights...tonight the Twins will play the third of three at Progressive Field...following tonight's game, the Twins will travel to Detroit for three over the weekend...the Twins have won 10 of their last 14 and 15 of their last 20...Twins are 11-5 vs. the AL Central this season; 11 of the next 17 games are against the division.

**TRIBE MATCH TWINS WITH LONGBALLS:** The Twins lost to the Indians last night by score of 9-7, dropping their fifth series of the season...Martin Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing five runs (2 earned) on six hits in 4.2 innings pitched...the bullpen allowed four runs in the final two innings, including three homers...the offense recorded just seven hits, two from Jorge Polanco...Polanco (10), Nelson Cruz (8) and Byron Buxton (7) all homered...the game experienced a one hour and 43 minute rain delay between the sixth and seventh inning.

**TWINS AND TRIBE:** The Twins are playing the Indians for the sixth of 19 scheduled meetings this season...they are just 2-8 in their last 10 in Cleveland, their last win here coming August 29, 2018. **☞** Eddie Rosario is hitting .327 (89-for-272) with 13 doubles, four triples, 16 home runs, 36 RBI, 43 runs scored and a .941 OPS in 72 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 89 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball...he is hitting .375 (54-for-144) in 38 career games at Progressive Field, hitting safely in eight straight in this park...in his career at Progressive Field, Rosario has a .660 slugging percentage, the only player all-time with a slugging percentage as high at this park is Albert Belle (.681). (min. 100 PA's). **☞** Nelson Cruz has 22 career home runs vs. the Indians, including 11 in his last 19 against them (20 RBI)...he's slugging .833 in that span with a 1.205 OPS. **☞** Marwin Gonzalez hit .538 (7-for-13) with five RBI in the ALDS vs. Cleveland last fall.

**SHORT SLIDE:** The Twins are looking to avoid losing three straight tonight for the first time all season...since 1961, only one Twins team has ever recorded their first three-game losing streak later in the season: the 1970 Twins, who lost three-straight from June 17-20...below are the latest dates in a season for the Twins to drop three-in-a-row:

**YES WAY, JORGE!:** Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 20 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .366 (30-for-82) with a .424 on-base percentage...the last two Twins streaks as long were Logan Morrison, 23 from April 20-May 16, 2018 and Joe Mauer, 20 from April 25-May 16, 2018.

**BOMBAS:** The Twins have hit 114 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 307, which would break the major league record of 267, done by the Yankees last season...they lead baseball in both home runs-per-game (1.90) and at-bats-per-home runs (18.11)...after Buxton's seventh homer of the season last night, Twins now have 10 players with seven-plus homers, the most in baseball, ahead of Oakland (9 players)...the most 10-plus homer players the Twins have had was 11 in 2016. **☞** Twins have 60 home runs over 400 feet this season, the most in baseball.

**LEADER OF THE BOMBASQUAD:** Eddie Rosario hit his 18th home run Tuesday night, already nine short of his career-high of 27, done in 2017...he is on pace to hit 48 homers...five of his 18 homers have come in his last 12 games...he enters today second in the AL in home runs, trailing Gary Sánchez (19) and second in RBI, behind José Abreu (52).

**EXIT SIGNS:** The Twins are tied with Tampa Bay for second in baseball with 423 batted balls measured with an exit velocity of 100 mph-or-more...they have 99 home runs measured at 100+ mph, trailing Seattle (100) for second most in baseball...Max Kepler leads the club with 48 batted balls at 100+, followed by C.J. Cron (46), Marwin Gonzalez (45), Byron Buxton (42) and Jonathan Schoop (41)...Nelson Cruz has the highest exit velo this season, a double off Brad Peacock on May 2 at 115.5 mph.

**TWINS COMPLETE DRAFT:** The Twins completed the 2019 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft...they finished the draft on the third day selecting 30 players in rounds 11-40...in all, the Twins selected 19 right-handed pitchers, four left-handed pitchers, 12 infielders, four outfielders and two catchers...of the 41 total players selected, 33 were drafted out of college and eight out of high school...additionally, the Twins selected four players from Minnesota in outfielder Matt Wallner (Forest Lake, MN), right-handed pitcher Louie Varland (Maplewood, MN), left-handed pitcher Drew Gilbert (Stillwater, MN) and right-handed pitcher Will Frisch (Stillwater, MN).

**SPEAKING OF TWINS DRAFTTEES:** Single-A Ft. Myers outfielder and 2018 20th overall pick Trevor Larnach was named mlb FSL Player of the Month for May yesterday...Larnach led the Florida State League in average (.371), hits (36), doubles (10), on-base percentage (.456) and OPS (1.075)...he finished second in slugging percentage (.619) and total bases (60), and third in walks (16).

**MINOR MATTER:** The Midwest League announced the rosters for the 55th Midwest League All-Star Game, scheduled for June 18 at Four Winds Field in South Bend, IN, and the Cedar Rapids Kernels have one starter and two reserves selected to the team...Chris Williams was selected as the starting DH for the MWL West squad...infielder Gabe Snyder and pitcher Josh Winder were selected as reserves.

**LAST START:** In his last outing, May 31 at Tampa Bay, Berríos was dealt a no-decision after pitching 6.2 innings of three-hit baseball, his fewest hits allowed since his start on April 7 at Philadelphia...it marked his 10th start this season with 6.0+ innings pitched while allowing just three runs or less.

**VS. THE TRIBE:** Berríos is making his ninth career start and second of the year against the Indians...is 4-2, 4.00 ERA (45.0 IP, 20 ER) with 15 walks and 42 strikeouts in his career...last start against Cleveland came on Opening Day, where he earned the win after allowing no runs on two hits and one walk with 10 strikeouts over 7.2 innings...last loss against Cleveland was September 11, 2016, allowed five runs (3 earned) on three hits and four walks with one strikeout over 2.2 innings pitched...last start at Progressive came August 9, 2018, allowing four runs on four hits in 4.0 innings pitched in a Twins 5-4 loss...last win at Progressive came May 13, 2017, allowing one run on two hits in 7.2 innings pitched in a Twins 4-1 victory.

• Against Cleveland on March 28, Berríos set a club record for strikeouts by an Opening Day starter, surpassing the previous high of eight done by Brad Radke (1996), Bert Blyleven (1975) and Dean Chance (1968).

**THE TERRIFIC TRIO:** Berríos has won seven games this season joining Jake Odorizzi (8) and Martín Pérez (7) as the only trio of pitchers in Twins history to win seven or more decisions within the team's first 60 games of any season...marks just the eighth time in Twins history with multiple 7+-game winners through 60 games, joining: Joe Mays (7) and Brad Radke (7) in 2001, Scott Erickson (9) and Jack Morris (7) in 1991, Frank Viola (9) and Juan Berenguer (7) in 1988, Mike Marshall (8) and Jerry Koosman (7) in 1979, Dave Goltz (7) and Bill Campbell (7) in 1976, Bert Blyleven (8) and Jim Kaat (7) in 1973 and Kaat (9) and Blyleven (8) again in 1972.

• With a win tonight, he and Odorizzi would become the third Twins duo to each have eight wins through 61 team games, joining Jim Kaat and Bert Blyleven, who turned the trick twice in 1972 and 1973. Also, Jack Morris (8) and Scott Erickson (10) did so in '91.

**NO FREE PASSES:** Entering tonight's start, Berríos has only walked 14 batters this year, which is the second fewest in the AL among starters with at least 59.0 innings pitched...his BB/9 rate is 1.64, which ranks third best in the AL and tied for seventh best in baseball...has five starts without walking a batter this season, and has yet to walk more than three batters in his 12 starts, the last time coming September 28, 2018 vs. CWS where he walked four.

**PITCH SELECTION:** José is throwing his curveball this season at a 32.8 percent usage rate...in 2018 he threw it 30.4 percent of time, 30 percent in 2017 and 21.6 in 2016...he has thrown a total of 1,067 pitches on the year with 52.4 percent of those landing in the strike zone...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitch arsenal, according to Baseball Savant:

**BERRÍOS & BAUER CONNECTION:** On the eve of Three Kings Day (January 5, 2019), a major holiday in Latin America marked by festivals and children eagerly awaiting presents, Berríos gave kids in his native Puerto Rico the gift of baseball with the "La Maikna Baseball Clinic"...with assists from Cubs infielder Javier Báez and Indians starter Trevor Bauer, the gift took the form of a youth clinic in Berríos' and Báez's hometown of Bayamón...approximately 150 children took part in the clinic which was held at a baseball complex in the Flamboyán Gardens sector of the city...they were divided into groups of 50, and took turns learning pitching mechanics from Berríos and Bauer, and fielded ground balls with Báez.

**Ks FOR GOOD:** Berríos will donate \$50 per strikeout in 2019 to Fundación CAP. Fundación CAP is a non-profit organization that since 1989 has been working for children with cancer at Hospital Pediátrico, the leading public pediatric hospital in Puerto Rico and the only one that treats certain types of cancer. The mission of CAP is to ensure that ALL children with cancer, regardless of their financial resources, have access to first-rate cancer treatment here in Puerto Rico, close to their family and home. 100% of the funds collected remain in Puerto Rico and their benefit is seen and felt in every corner of the Hospital.

- Became 21st pitcher in Twins history to reach the 200-strikeout mark (202 in 2018).
- Named to 2018 AL All-Star team, threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the All-Star Game.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
- Made MLB debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
