THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-3 through eight games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 3-1 in St. Petersburg, 1-2 in Cleveland and 1-0 in Detroit...today the Twins will play the second of three at Comerica Park against the Tigers and wrap the series tomorrow afternoon... following this series, the Twins will travel to Minneapolis for an off-day on Monday, then begin a nine-game homestand with three against Seattle, Kansas City and Boston...the Twins have won 12 of their last 16 and 17 of their last 22...Twins are 13-5 vs. the AL Central this season; nine of the next 15 games are against the division.

BOMBAS AND BULLPENS: The Twins beat the Tigers last night at Comerica Park by a score of 6-3...Michael Pineda returned from his IL stint, allowing three runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the bullpen combined for 4.0 shutout innings with just three hits as Ryne Harper earned his first career win and Blake Parker earned his ninth save on the season... the offense recorded 14 hits as Marwin Gonzalez tied his career-high with four hits...Nelson Cruz (9), C.J. Cron (14) and Mitch Garver (10) each homered.

* - Twins have scored multiple runs in the third inning 21 times this season, including four times in their last six games...the Twins lead baseball in third inning runs.

NOTE: As a team, the Twins are hitting .268 (359-for-1340) the first time through the lineup, .293 (147-for-502) the second time through and .267 (75-for-281) the third time through...their OBP (.360) the second time through the lineup is best in baseball.

ROSTER MOVE: Earlier today the Twins selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Ryan Eades from Triple-A Rochester...he appeared in 16 games for the Red Wings this season, going 2-2 with a 5.68 ERA (31.2 IP, 20 ER), 12 walks and 39 strikeouts but recently posted a 2.45 ERA (14.2 IP, 4 ER) with five walks and 16 strikeouts in his last eight games...to make room for Eades on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned catcher Williams Astudillo to Triple-A Rochester...Astudillo played in 33 games for the Twins this season, hitting .250 (28-for-112) with six doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the eighth of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone 5-2 vs. Detroit thus far...Twins have won seven of their last nine over the Tigers and 11 of their last 14, dating back to August 19...they are 11-4 in their last 15 games at Comerica...Twins are 4-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last five, home or away.
☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .324 (36-for-111) with six doubles, nine home runs and 27 RBI in 28 career games vs. Detroit...he has six homers and 16 RBI vs. DET in his last 14 games.
☞ Twins have scored 136 runs against the Tigers since the start of last season, their most for any opponent...also the most Tigers pitchers have allowed to any team since.
☞ Since 2017, Minnesota has gone 28-17 against Detroit and has a +73 run differential in those games...this is the Twins best run differential versus any opponent since, and the Tigers only have a worse mark against the Indians (-124).

POLO ON THE MARK: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 22 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .359 (33-for-92) with a .412 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Logan Morrison, 23 from April 20-May 16, 2018... Polanco leads the AL in hits (80), ranks second in average (.338), and sixth in OPS (.978).

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 120 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 313...they hit 166 all of 2018 and didn't reach the 120 homer mark until August 17...they lead baseball in both home runs-per-game (1.94) and at-bats-per-home runs (17.83)...the Twins have 62 home runs over 400 feet this season, the most in baseball.
☞ 45.5 percent of the Twins hits have gone for extra bases, highest in baseball.
☞ The Twins have homered multiple times in a game 31 times this season, tied with Milwaukee and Chicago-NL for second most in baseball, trailing Seattle (32)...Twins are 24-7 when homering multiple times...they homered multiple times in 40 games in 2018.

EXTRA-BASE BUCK: Byron Buxton recorded his American League leading 21st double last night (Castellanos second with 20)...he has 31 extra-base hits this season, second on the team, trailing only Jorge Polanco (32)...he is on pace for 54 doubles, the club record being 47 by Justin Morneau in 2008...overall, he ranks tied for third in the AL in extra-base hits.
☞ Buxton ranks third in all of baseball in sprint speed at 30.4, trailing Arizona's Tim Lincecum (30.6) and Washington's Trea Turner (30.5).

BACKSTOPS WITH THE BATS: Catchers Williams Astudillo (now at AAA), Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .309 (68-for-220) with 14 doubles, 18 home runs, 47 RBI, 21 walks and 52 runs scored when catching...at catcher, Castro has made 28 starts, Garver has made 22 starts, while Astudillo has made 12 starts...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: first in home runs (18), slugging percentage (.627), OPS (1.010), batting average (.309), RBI (47), second in OBP (.382) and hits (68), and tied for fourth in doubles (14).
☞ The Twins have a 1.010 OPS from the catching spot, the highest in club history...next being .931 in 2009 when Joe Mauer was the primary catcher and eventual AL MVP.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2006, the Twins beat the Mariners in Seattle by a score of 7-3...at the time, the Twins were 26-33 and in fourth place, 11.5 games back in the AL Central...that particular win sparked a stretch of 21 wins in their next 23 games and the Twins would go 71-33 the rest of the way, winning the division with a record of 96-66...in 2013, Joe Mauer hit his 100th career home run at Washington, a fifth inning solo shot off Gio Gonzalez...16 players in Twins history have hit 100 home runs as a Twin...Mauer finished his career with 143 home runs, 11th most in club history.

Odorizzi makes his 13th start of the year tomorrow in the series finale...is 8-2, 1.96 ERA (64.1 IP, 14 ER) with 21 walks and 70 strikeouts...in his last start, Odorizzi earned his eighth win on the season (surpassing his total from all of last year) after throwing 6.0, three-hit, shutout innings against the Tampa Bay Rays at Tropicana Field in an eventual 9-7 victory...

TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

- Twins relievers have pitched 192.0 innings, currently 3rd fewest in baseball behind Nationals (189.0 IP) & Dodgers (191.1 IP)...bullpen has gone 9-7-18 with 36 holds, a 4.59 ERA (98 ER), 79 walks, 208 strikeouts and a .254 opponents' batting average (190-for-748) in 62 games...Twins 'pen is 2nd in baseball in save percentage (81.8%), trailing just the Indians (87.0%), going 18-for-22 in save opportunities and are also T-4th for fewest blown saves in baseball (with 4).
- The bullpen has a 6.16 ERA (19.0 IP, 13 ER) with three saves and four holds in June (6 games), along with eight walks, 22 strikeouts & a .273 average against (20-for-76).
- Twins' bullpen went 7-3-5 with a 2.38 ERA (79.1 IP, 21 ER) with 75 strikeouts to just 30 walks in 19 games vs. DET last season...in 7 games this season, 1-1-3, with a 2.53 ERA (21.1 IP, 6 ER).
