THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-3 through eight games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 3-1 in St. Petersburg, $1-2$ in Cleveland and 1-0 in Detroit...today the Twins will play the sec ond of three at Comerica Park against the Tigers and wrap the series tomorrow afternoon.. following this series, the Twins will travel to Minneapolis for an off-day on Monday, then begin a nine-game homestand with three against Seattle, Kansas City and Boston...the Twins have won 12 of their last 16 and 17 of their last $22 . .$. Twins are $13-5$ vs. the AL Central this season; nine of the next 15 games are against the division.

BOMBAS AND BULLPENS: The Twins beat the Tigers last night at Comerica Park by a score of 6-3...Michael Pineda returned from his IL stint, allowing three runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the bullpen combined for 4.0 shutout innings with just three hits as Ryne the offense recorded 14 hits as Marwin Gonzalez tied his career-high with four hits...Nelson Cruz (9), C.J. Cron (14) and Mitch Garver (10) each homered.

ROSTER MOVE: Earlier today the Twins selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Ryan Eades from Triple-A Rochester....he appeared in 16 games for the Red Wings this season, going 2-2 with a 5.68 ERA ( $31.2 \mathrm{IP}, 20 \mathrm{ER}$ ), 12 walks and 39 strikeouts but recently posted a 2.45 ERA (14.2 IP, 4 ER ) with five walks and 16 strikeouts in his last eight games...to make room for Eades on the 25 -man roster, the Twins have optioned catcher Willians Astudillo to Triple-A Rochester...Astudillo played in 33 games for the Twins this season, hitting . 250 (28-for-112) with six doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the eighth of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone are 5-2 vs. Detroit thus far...Twins have won seven of their last nine over the Tigers and 11 of their last 14, dating back to August 19...they are 11-4 in their last 15 games at Comerica...Twins are 4-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last five, home or away. ¥ C.J. Cron is hitting . 324 ( 36 -for-111) with six doubles, nine home runs and 27 RBI in 28 career games vs. Detroit...he has six homers and 16 RBI vs. DET in his last 14 games.

POLO ON THE MARK: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 22 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .359 (33-for-92) with a .412 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Logan Morrison, 23 from April 20-May 16, 2018... Polanco leads the AL in hits (80), ranks second in average (.338), and sixth in OPS (.978).
\#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 120 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 313...they hit 166 all of 2018 and didn't reach the 120 homer mark unti August 17...they lead baseball in both home runs-per-game (1.94) and at-bats-per-home runs (17.83)...the Twins have 62 home runs over 400 feet this season, the most in baseball. $\Phi 45.5$ percent of the Twins hits have gone for extra bases, highest in baseball.
$\Phi$ The Twins have homered multiple times in a game 31 times this season, tied with
Milwaukee and Chicago-NL for second most in baseball, trailing Seattle (32)...Twins are
24-7 when homering multiple times...they homered multiple times in 40 games in 2018.

LAST START: Gibson was the starter and winner, pitching 5.0 innings of one-run ball (unearned) last Saturday against the Rays in Tampa Bay...pitched a clean first inning betore allowing three of singles in the second, followed by a throwing error from second baseman Jonathan Schoop, allowed the only run of the game to score on Gibson....went on to retire 10 of his last 15 batters, scattering a pair of singles, a double, a hit-by-pitch and a walk...threw 88 pitches, 59 for strikes ( 67.0 percent) and has had a strike percentage north of 60.0 percent in seven of his last eight starts.

ON THE VERGE OF HISTORY: Gibson enters today's start with 989.1 career innings pitched, 10.2 innings short of marking 1,000 innings in his career...the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, will become just the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1000.0 IP threshold, first since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP as a Twin from 2000-2007. KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enter's today's start with the sixth most starts (160) and the eighth-highest innings pitched total (938.1) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (124, most in baseball), 12th in wins (58) and 15th in strikeouts (719).

AGAINST THE TIGERS: The right-hander is making his 20th career start against the Tigers, first this season....owns a career record of 8-8 with a 5.13 ERA (107.0 IP, 61 ER) against them....in his only start here last season came on August 11, Gibson earned the win after throwing 7.0 innings, allowing just one run on seven hits with four strikeouts, in an eventual $4-3$ win....verall against MoTown last year, he held them to just seven runs in 20.0 innings with 12 strikeouts...is a career 4-4 with a 4.53 ERA at Comerica Park, his second-highest ERA among opposing AL Central ballparks (Progressive Field, 4.72).
$\Phi$ Gibson is one of just three players on the current Twins roster ever on a Ron Garden-hire-managed team in Minnesota, starting 10 games for Gardy in 2013 and 31 games in 2014...the others: Trevor May pitched in 10 games (9 starts) in 2014 and Jorge Polanco played five games in 2014.

FUN WITH STATCAST: So far through 2019, Gibson has seen the most success with his slider, as opponents are hitting just. 123 (7-for-57) against it, and 33 of his 63 strikeouts have come via the slider ( 54.8 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his sinker, going 28 -for-104 with three home runs, with an average exit velocity of 91.5 against his heater and a wOBA of 388 (weighted on-base average).

THE SHERIDAN STORY: Gibson, along with catcher Jason Castro, are proud to support The Sheridan Story, an organization dedicated to fighting child hunger in Minnesota...the innovative organization serves more than 6,500 kids in over 200 schools - with the aid of strong community partnerships...Kyle will donate $\$ 100$ for every Twins win while Jason will contribute $\$ 250$ per victory...coming into today's start, Gibson is set to donate $\$ 4,200$.

Odorizzi makes his 13th start of the year tomorrow in the series finale...is 8-2, 1.96 ERA ( 64.1 IP, 14 ER) with 21 walks and 70 strikeouts...in his last start, Odorizzi earned his eighth win on the season (surpassing his total from all of last year) after throwing 6.0, three-hit, shutout innings against the Tampa Bay Rays at Tropicana Field in an eventual 9-7 victory... is currently riding an 16.1 scoreless inning streak, dating back to his start on May 15 vs . LAA, which is the longest current streak of any American League starter...owns a career line of 4-1, 3.24 ERA and 53 strikeouts against the Tigers...saw the Tigers this past May when he threw a sterling 7.0 innings of one-hit ball, (a Christin Stewart double in the first inning), as he sat down 20 consecutive batters, a Twins season-high...making his first start at Comerica since Sept. 18 of last year ( 6.1 IP, 2 ER in a 5-3 Twins win).
