THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-4 through nine games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 3-1 in St. Petersburg, 1-2 in Cleveland and 1-1 in Detroit...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale at Comerica Park before traveling back home for an off-day on Monday... on Tuesday they will begin a nine-game homestand with three against Seattle, Kansas City and Boston...the Twins have won 12 of their last 17 and 17 of their last 23...Twins are 13-6 vs. the AL Central this season; eight of the next 14 games are against the division...the Twins are 2-2 in rubber games this season and are 12-5-3 in series play.

MOTOWN LET-DOWN: The Twins lost to the Tigers in the middle game of the three-game series at Comerica Park yesterday afternoon/evening by a score of 9-3...Kyle Gibson (6-3) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched with eight strikeouts... the offense recorded just six hits, two coming from Nelson Cruz who hit his 10th home run, his second homer in as many days...Twins went 1-for-6 with runners in scoring position.

* - Twins have scored multiple runs in the third inning 21 times this season, including four times in their last seven games...the Twins lead baseball in third inning runs.

NOTE: As a team, the Twins are hitting .267 (365-for-1368) the first time through the lineup, .291 (147-for-506) the second time through and .267 (75-for-281) the third time through...their OBP (.359) the second time through the lineup is best in baseball.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the ninth of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone 5-3 vs. Detroit thus far...Twins have won seven of their last 10 over the Tigers and 11 of their last 15, dating back to August 19...they are 11-5 in their last 16 games at Comerica...Twins are 4-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last five, home or away.
☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .322 (37-for-115) with six doubles, nine home runs and 28 RBI in 29 career games vs. Detroit...he has six homers and 17 RBI vs. DET in his last 15 games.
☞ Twins have scored 139 runs against the Tigers since the start of last season, their most for any opponent...also the most Tigers pitchers have allowed to any team since.
☞ Since 2017, Minnesota has gone 28-18 against Detroit and has a +67 run differential in those games...this is the Twins best run differential versus any opponent since, and the Tigers only have a worse mark against the Indians (-124).

BAD HOUSE GUESTS: The Twins have gone 23-12 on the road this season, the most road wins in baseball...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 23rd road win in 2018 until August 29 and their 24th road win until August 31...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

POLO ON THE MARK: Yesterday Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 23 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .354 (34-for-96) with a .406 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Logan Morrison, 23 from April 20-May 16, 2018...the last 24-game on-base streak came from Brian Dozier when he reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 121 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 311, which would mark a major league record...they hit 166 all of 2018...they lead baseball in both home runs-per-game (1.92) and at-bats-per-home runs (17.95)... Twins have homered in six of their last seven at Comerica (9 total in that span)...the Twins have 63 home runs over 400 feet this season, the most in baseball.
☞ 45.3 percent of the Twins hits have gone for extra bases, highest in baseball.
☞ Nelson Cruz hit his 10th home run last night, giving the Twins seven players with double-digit homer totals this season, the most in baseball (Rosario - 18, Kepler - 15, Cron - 14, Schoop - 11, Garver - 10, Polanco - 10, Cruz - 10).

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .300 (154-for-514) with 24 doubles, 26 home runs, 48 walks and a .872 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in both batting average and OPS vs. left-handed pitching...they are 7-6 vs. left-handed starters this season.
☞ Individuals vs. LHP this season: Mitch Garver is hitting .400 (12-for-30)...C.J. Cron is hitting .360 (18-for-50) with six home runs...Byron Buxton is hitting .364 (16-for-44) with three home runs...Jorge Polanco is hitting .323 (21-for-65)...Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .321 (17-for-53).

TWO OUT OF THREE AIN'T BAD: The Twins are 12-5-3 in series play this season, going 6-1-2 at home and 6-4-1 on the road...the Twins are 8-2-1 in their last 11 series vs. the Tigers, dating back to August of 2017.

EXTRA-BASE BUCK: Byron Buxton leads the American League in doubles (21) and ranks second in all of baseball, trailing only Pittsburgh's Josh Bell (25)...he has 31 extra-base hits this season, second on the team, trailing only Jorge Polanco (33) and tied for fourth in the AL...he is on pace for 54 doubles, the club record being 47 by Justin Morneau in 2008.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins have named Triple-A Rochester outfielder Jake Cave and Triple-A Rochester right-handed pitcher Sean Poppen as Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Cave played in eight games for the Red Wings this week, hitting .417 (15-for-36) with seven doubles, two triples, one home run and nine RBI, which included a four-double game on Thursday at Syracuse...since being optioned from Minnesota in mid-May, Cave has played in 27 games for the Red Wings, hitting .294 (32-for-109) with 11 doubles, two triples, three home runs, 21 RBI and a .861 OPS...Poppen started two games this week for the Red Wings, going 1-0, 0.75 ERA (12.0 IP, 1 ER) with five walks and 13 strikeouts...Poppen, 25, was selected by the Twins in the 19th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Harvard.

- Went 2-for-3 last night against the Tigers with a run scored, a walk, a home run and one RBI...his 10th HR of the season and 19th of his career against DET...has homered in three of four games since return from IL.
- Hitting .267 (8-for-30) w/ 3 HR, 5 RBI & a 1.012 OPS vs. LHP and .270 (30-for-111) w/ 7 HR, 7 2B, 20 RBI and a .869 OPS vs. RHP this season - 39 games played, 141 at-bats, all as DH.
- Batting .270 (10-for-37) with 12 RBI with runners in scoring position...is 6-for-16 (.375) with 7 RBI hitting with 2 outs and RISP.

- Is T-2nd in AL among catchers in HR (10) & T-7th in total bases (68), T-8th in hits (31), T-10th in 2B (5)...more than half of his hits have gone for XBH (31 hits, 16 XBH), and is T-16th with 30 games.
- Is batting .400 (12-for-30) vs. lefties and .284 (19-for-67) vs. righties this season.
- Was reinstated from the 10-day Injured List on 6/2 after missing 16 games with a high left ankle sprain...has gone 5-for-18 with two runs, 2B, HR & five RBI in 5 games since.

- Hitting .308 (41-for-133) w/ 17 R, 3 HR, 11 2B, 16 RBI & a .817 OPS in 41 career games vs. DET...hitting .370 with three R, HR & three RBI in seven games vs. DET this season.
- Has hit safely in 5 of 9 games on this roadtrip with four multi-hit games, batting .314 (11-for-34) with 4 doubles, 2 home runs & 4 RBI...has three games with multiple XBH's.
- Is now slashing .252/.336/.406 with 17 XBH, 25 R & 21 RBI, after starting the year .147/.216/.176 through his first 11 games this season.
- Had season-high 11-game hitting streak (17-for-45, .378) from 5/7-21.
- Has seen time at 1B, 2B, SS, 3B, LF, RF and DH this season, becoming the fourth player in Twins history to play at least one game at each of those positions in a season, joining Trevor Plouffe (2012), Denny Hocking (five seasons from 1997-2003) and Jeff Reboulet (1994 & '96).

- Slashing .261/.351/.571 (42-for-161, 13 HR) vs. RHP. .273/.305/.436 (15-for-55, 2 HR) vs. LHP...ranks second among Twins hitters with most RBI (15) vs. LHP.
- Snapped out of a career-long (0-for-21) hitless at-bat streak on 6/6 with 3 R, 4 hits, including 3 HR's in a game for second time in his career (last, 8/1/16 at CLE), see page #83 of Twins Media Guide...also reached base safely 5 times for 2nd time in his career (last, 7/3/17 vs.LAA).
- Recorded six straight games with a double from 5/21-28, which was tied for the second longest stretch of games w/ 2B as Twin, trailing Todd Walker's seven-game streak from April 22-May 2, 1998.
- Won 2nd career AL Player of the Week Award for week of May 20-26 (previous period ending 8/7/16), 2nd Twins player this season to earn weekly honors (also: Jake Odorizzi, May 6th).

- 1st in total bases in AL (139), 1st in hits (81), 2nd in average (.338), 3rd in 3B (5), T-4th in 2B (18), 6th in OPS (.975), 7th in OBP (.398) and is 6th in SLG (.577).
- Has the most hits (51), the highest avg. (.367), is 1st in doubles (13) & T-2nd highest slugging (.662) in the AL this season on the road.
- Hitting .367 (51-for-139) w/ eight home runs & 25 RBI in 33 games on the road this season.
