MOTOWN LET-DOWN: The Twins lost to the Tigers in the middle game of the three-game series at Comerica Park yesterday afternoon/evening by a score of 9-3...Kyle Gibson (6-3) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched with eight strikeouts... the offense recorded just six hits, two coming from Nelson Cruz who hit his 10th home run, his second homer in as many days...Twins went 1-for-6 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are playing the ninth of 19 games against the Tigers this season...they have gone are 5-3 vs. Detroit thus far...Twins have won seven of their last 10 over the Tigers and 11 of their last 15, dating back to August 19...they are 11-5 in their last 16 games at Comerica...Twins are 4-0-1 in series play vs. Detroit in their last five, home or away.

© C.J. Cron is hitting .322 (37-for-115) with six doubles, nine home runs and 28 RBI in 29 career games vs. Detroit...he has six homers and 17 RBI vs. DET in his last 15 games.

Twins have scored 139 runs against the Tigers since the start of last season, their most for any opponent...also the most Tigers pitchers have allowed to any team since.
 ➡ Since 2017, Minnesota has gone 28-18 against Detroit and has a +67 run differential in those games...this is the Iwins best run differential versus any opponent since, and the Tigers only have a worse mark against the Indians (-124).

POLO ON THE MARK: Yesterday Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 23 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .354 (34-for-96) with a .406 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Logan Morrison, 23 from April 20-May 16, 2018...the last 24-game on-base streak came from Brian Dozier when he reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins have hit 121 home runs this season, the most in baseball...they are on pace to hit 311, which would mark a major league record...they hit 166 all of 2018... they lead baseball in both home runs-per-game (1.92) and at-bats-per-home runs (17.95)... Twins have homered in six of their last seven at Comerica (9 total in that span)...the Twins have 63 home runs over 400 feet this season, the most in baseball.

◆ 45.3 percent of the Twins hits have gone for extra bases, highest in baseball.

◆ Nelson Cruz hit his 10th home run last night, giving the Twins seven players with double-digit homer totals this season, the most in baseball (Rosario - 18, Kepler - 15, Cron - 14, Schoop - 11, Garver - 10, Polanco - 10, Cruz - 10).

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .300 (154-for-514) with 24 doubles, 26 home runs, 48 walks and a .872 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in both batting average and OPS vs. left-handed pitching...they are 7-6 vs. left-handed starters this season. ₱ Individuals vs. LHP this season: Mitch Garver is hitting .400 (12-for-30)...C.J. Cron is hitting .360 (18-for-50) with six home runs...Byron Buxton is hitting .364 (16-for-44) with three home runs...Jorge Polanco is hitting .323 (21-for-65)...Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .321 (17-for-53).

TWO OUT OF THREE AIN'T BAD: The Twins are 12-5-3 in series play this season, going 6-1-2 at home and 6-4-1 on the road...the Twins are 8-2-1 in their last 11 series vs. the Tigers, dating back to August of 2017.

EXTRA-BASE BUCK: Byron Buxton leads the American League in doubles (21) and ranks second in all of baseball, trailing only Pittsburgh's Josh Bell (25)...he has 31 extra-base hits this season, second on the team, trailing only Jorge Polanco (33) and tied for fourth in the AL...he is on pace for 54 doubles, the club record being 47 by Justin Morneau in 2008.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins have named Triple-A Rochester outfielder Jake Cave and Triple-A Rochester right-handed pitcher Sean Poppen as Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Cave played in eight games for the Red Wings this week, hitting .417 (15-for-36) with seven doubles, two triples, one home run and nine RBI, which included a four-double game on Thursday at Syracuse...since being optioned from Minnesota in mid-May, Cave has played in 27 games for the Red Wings, hitting .294 (32-for-109) with 11 doubles, two triples, three home runs, 21 RBI and a .861 OPS...Poppen started two games this week for the Red Wings, going 1-0, 0.75 ERA (12.0 IP, 1 ER) with five walks and 13 strikeouts...Poppen, 25, was selected by the Twins in the 19th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Harvard.

ODO-METER: Odorizzi leads the American League with a 1.96 ERA (3rd in the majors) through 12 starts (64.1 IP, 14 ER)...he also ranks among AL leaders for opponents' batting average (3rd - 181, 41-for-226), hits-per-9.0 innings (3rd - 5.74), WHIP (4th - 0.96), wins (74th - 8), and strikeoutsper-9.0 innings (13th - 70 SO).

FOR THE WIN: At 8-2, Odorizzi has already surpassed his wins total for all of his 2018 debut season with the Twins (7-10 in 32 starts).

- A win today would give Odo his ninth of the season in Minnesota's 64th team game...the only eight Twins pitchers to accomplish that feat (10 occurences) are: Camilo Pascual (9 in both 1963 and '64), Dean Chance (9 in 1967), Jim Perry (10 in 1970 and 9 in '71), Jim Kaat (9 in 1972), Bert Blyleven (9 in 1973), Frank Viola (10 in 1988), Scott Erickson (10 in 1991) and Kevin Slowey (9 in 2009).
- He and José Berríos (also 8-2) are already just the Twins' fifth duo to both reach the eight-win mark in the club's first 63 games, joining: Jim Kaat (9) and Bert Blyleven (8) in 1972, Blyleven (9) and Kaat (8) again in 1973, Scott Erickson (10) and Jack Morris (8) in 1991, and Brad Radke and Joe Mays (both 8) in 2001

W-W-W-W-W-W: The Twins have won each of last Odorizzi's nine starts (beginning April 17), while he is personally 8-0 with a 1.02 ERA (53.0 IP, 6 ER) to establish a career-low winning streak...he has held opponents to a .195/.246/.263 slash line during the stretch, with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts.

• Since April 17, Odorizzi leads the majors in wins (8-0) and the American League for ERA

- (1.02, 2nd-best in baseball)...among AL starters, he also ranks second for opponents' slugging percentage (.263), third for opponents' OPS (.509), and fifth for WHIP (0.92), opponents' batting average (.195, 37-for-190) and hits-per-9.0 innings (6.28).
- He has the longest winning streak by a Twins starter since 2010 (Francisco Liriano also won eight-straight decisions over an 11-start stretch July 16-September 14), while the last with a longer run was Johan Santana during his 2006 Cy Young Award-winning season (9-0 in 12). starts from July 15-September 10).

POSTING ZEROS: Odorizzi has a current 16.1-inning scoreless streak and has been unscored upon in six of his last seven starts (beginning April 29), with a 0.65 ERA (41.2 IP, 3 ER), 11 walks, 47 strikeouts, a .160 batting-average-against (23-for-144) and a 0.82 WHIP.

• Also had a 22.1-inning scoreless streak (April 29-May 15), the fifth-longest ever for a Twins starter.

• His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings in a single season is already tied for eighthmost in Twins history...three pitchers had nine such contests (most recently Ervin Santana in 2017), two had eight (last: rotation-mate Kyle Gibson in 2014) and two had seven (last: Francisco Liriano in 2010).

SOFT CONTACT: Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (2nd-lowest opponents' batting average in the ÅL), but he's been equally difficult to square up - he's allowed just nine extra-base hits, second-fewest in the majors (min. 10 starts and 50.0 innings pitched).

• His .257 opponents' slugging pct. and .511 OPS are both 2nd-lowest in the AL.

- Of the 158 balls put in play against Odorizzi (on 1070 pitches just 14.8 percent), only 50 have been hit hard (exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH)...his 31.8 percent hard-hit rate is sixth-lowest in the AL (min. 150 batted balls).
- Odo has been the toughest pitcher in the majors for a right-handed batter to hit this season, as he has yielded just 15 hits in 123 at-bats (.122 batting average).

LAST TIME OUT: Odorizzi won his career-best eighth-straight decision in his return to Tropical Field, blanking his former team - the Tampa Bay Rays - on three hits over 6.0 innings of a 9-7 victory a week ago today (June 2)...marked his sixth scoreless effort in his last seven starts.

Threw a season-high 108 pitches, including 74 strikes (68.5 percent)...compiled nine strikeouts for his second-straight start, including four over his final 2.0 innings.

Retired his final nine batters faced after a leadoff infield single in the fourth inning...earlier, nitched around a runner at third one-out jam in the second

- pitched around a runner at third, one-out jam in the second.

- ON THE ROAD AGAIN: After pitching just 5.1 innings with an 11.81 ERA (7 ER) in losing his first two road starts, Odorizi has been fantastic in his last four efforts away from Target Field, going 3-0 with a 0.79 ERA (22.2 IP, 2 ER), seven walks and 25 strikeouts (Twins have won all four games).

 Odo has an 17.0-inning scoreless streak on the road, blanking the Yankees for 6.0 innings on May 4 to earn a 7-3 win, shutting out the Angels for 5.0 frames on May 20 (an eventual 3-1 Twins victory) and holding the Rays off the scoreboard over 6.0 innings on June 2 (a 9-7 victory).

 For the season, he is 3-2 with a 2.89 ERA (28.0 IP, 9 ER) in six road starts...in his career, he is 24.25 with property and the property of the score and a 24.5EPA (28.0 IP, 9 ER) in \$2.5 maps (92.5 tests).
- 24-25 with one save and a 4.24 ERA (432.2 IP, 204 ER) in 83 games (82 starts).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 164 starts and a .232 opponents' batting average since 2014.

• Only Rick Porcello (171), Corey Kluber (167) and Justin Verlander (also 167) have made more

- starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.

 Chris Sale (.212), Verlander (.220) and Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.
