THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-1 through five games on their nine-game homestand, going 2-1 vs. the Mariners and 2-0 vs. the Royals...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale before welcoming in Boston for three night games from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 5 of their last 6, 7 of their last 9, 17 of their last 23 and 22 of their last 29.

WELL PLAYED, TWINS: The Twins beat the Royals last night on Joe Mauer's number 7 retirement night...Jake Odorizzi (10-2) was the starter and winner, allowing four runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Trevor May (9), Blake Parker (6) and Ryne Harper (5) each earned holds and Taylor Rogers earned the save (8)...the offense recorded just seven hits, two from Marwin Gonzalez who hit his ninth home run...Max Kepler added a home run, his 17th of the season.

BRING 'EM OUT! BRING 'EM OUT!: The Twins have sold out five games this season: Opening Day March 28 vs. Cleveland (39,519), May 25 vs. Chicago-AL (39,139), May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (39,913), Friday night (38,898) and last night (39,267)...the last 40,000+ attendance was Opening Day of 2016 (40,638)...Twins have sold out 166 regular season games at Target Field in 761 openings since 2010.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the fifth of 19 games this season...the Twins have gone 10-4 in their last 14 vs. KC overall and 8-1 in their last nine at Target Field. Miguel Sanó has reached safely in 21 straight games vs. KC, dating back to September 28, 2016, hitting .349 (29-for-83) with 32 RBI, a .419 OBP and a 1.058 OPS in that span.

POLO ON THE MARK: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 29 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .344 (42-for-122) with a .394 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

SOUND THE BOMBA HORN: The Twins have hit 135 home runs this season, the most in baseball ahead of Seattle (131)...they are on pace to hit 316, which would mark a major league record...Twins have homered in all 13 games this month, totaling 29 in June, tied with Atlanta and Arizona for the most in baseball...their current 13-game homer streak ties their season-high previously done from May 6-18...their last 14+ game streak came September 1-17, 2017 (16)...the club record is 16 straight, done three different times, twice in 2017 and once in 1979.

☞ The Twins have homered in each of their last 19 home games, tied with New York-NL (also current) and Milwaukee for the longest streak in MLB this season...additionally, it marks the longest streak in club history.

☞ Twins have seven players with 10 home runs, tied with Seattle for most 10+ HR players in baseball...Byron Buxton and Marwin Gonzalez each have nine homers...Twins record for players with 10+ homers is nine, done in 2014.

☞ With Max Kepler's solo home run in the fourth inning last night, the Twins will donate \$100,000 to the Prostate Cancer Foundation via the 2019 Home Run Challenge...the Twins organization has now contributed \$781,000 to the PCF since 1993 to support groundbreaking prostate cancer research in Minnesota.

THIS IS MY BOOMSTICK!: Nelson Cruz is hitting .306 (11-for-36) with five home runs, nine RBI and a 1.112 OPS in nine games since coming off the IL (left wrist strain) June 3...among designated hitters this season, he ranks second in batting average (.278), OBP (.362), slugging (.556) and OPS (.918).

CAUTION, HIGH WATER: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 25 games over .500, their highest since ending the 2010 season 26 games over (94-68)...prior to that, their most games over .500 was 27, the day before their final game of 2010, on October 2 when they were 94-67.

SWEEPS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their eighth sweep of an opponent this season...their previous seven sweeps came: three games May 24-26 vs. Chicago-AL, three games May 20-22 at Los Angeles-AL, three games May 6-8 at Toronto, three games April 26-28 vs. Baltimore, three games at Baltimore April 20-21, two games April 13-14 vs. Detroit, and two games April 2-3 at Kansas City...Twins recorded seven sweeps all of last season...Twins last three-game sweep of the Royals came August 3-5, 2018 at Target Field.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins have named Triple-A Rochester catcher/infielder Williams Astudillo and Rochester right-handed pitcher Sean Poppen minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Astudillo, who was optioned from the Twins on June 7, played in six games this week, hitting .600 (15-for-25) with three home runs, nine RBI, six runs scored and a 1.553 OPS...Poppen, who earned this award last week, made the start for the Wings on Thursday vs. Columbus, allowing two runs (1 earned) on five hits in 6.0 innings pitched with nine strikeouts.

LAST START: Lasted just 5.0 innings against Seattle on Tuesday night, marking his fourth consecutive start of 5.0-or-less innings pitched after having just one such start from April 15-May 17...set down eight of the first nine batters he faced, but gave up back-to-back singles with two outs in the third before Edwin Encarnación knocked a three-run home run... allowed one more run in the fifth, exiting down 3-4 in an eventual 6-5 win.

- Notched seven strikeouts for the fifth time this season, second time in 5.0 innings (May 12 vs. Detroit in a 3-5 loss).

AMONG THE LEAGUE'S BEST: Before joining the starting rotation on April 15, Pérez struggled in three relief outings, allowing seven runs in 8.2 innings pitched (7.56 ERA)...since then, he has compiled a 6-2 record with a 3.48 ERA (62.0 IP, 24 ER), 24 BB, 55 SO and a .246 opponents average (58-for-236)...six of his 11 starts have been at least 6.0 IP, with five of them being quality starts.

- Since joining the rotation on April 15, Pérez ranks tied for 10th in the Majors with six wins and is 14th in the AL in ERA (3.48).
- Among American League starters since April 15, he ranks tied for sixth in wins, tied for 18th in GIDP (5) and 22nd in hits-per-9.0 innings (8.42).
- However, Pérez is 0-1 with an 8.76 ERA (12.1 IP, 12 ER) and .327 BAA in his last three starts.

SUPPORTING THE MAN: Pérez has received the second-most runs of support in baseball dating back to April 15, when he joined the starting rotation, (59, six runs shy of Boston's Eduardo Rodríguez)...for the season, he has received 70 runs, an average of 8.96, tops in baseball.

THE TERRIFIC TRIO: Pérez has won seven games this season (six as a starter), joining Jake Odorizzi (10) and José Berríos (8) as the only trio of pitchers in Twins history to win seven-or-more decisions within the team's first 69 games of any season.

- With a win today, he, Odorizzi and Berríos would become the first Twins trio to each have eight wins apiece through 70 team games.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Is making his first start and appearance against the Royals this season, and first since July 14, 2017 at Kauffman Stadium...in just three starts, he owns a 2.29 ERA (19.2 IP, 5 ER) against Kansas City with nine strikeouts...in the aforementioned July affair in 2017, Pérez scattered three runs over 7.0 innings pitched, and four of the Royals in today's lineup were in the lineup that day as well: Merrifield (2-for-4 with a run), Bonifacio (2-for-4 with an RBI), Soler (0-for-3 with a run) and Gordon (0-for-3).

- Has only been the home starter against the Royals once in his career, back on July 30, 2016 as a member of the Texas Rangers.

HOME...FINALLY! Pérez is making his second straight start at Target Field after nearly a month straight on the road, dating back to May 12 vs. Detroit, snapping a four-start stretch on the road...he has gone 3-1, 3.21 ERA (T-14-best in the American League) (33.2 IP, 12 ER) in six games (5 starts) at home this season, while he has pitched to a 4-1 record on the road, but with an inflated 4.66 ERA (36.2 IP, 19 ER) with 10 of those earned runs coming in his last three starts away from home...owns a career 4.17 ERA (45.1 IP, 21 ER) in eight games (seven starts) at Target Field.

TURN THE LIGHTS OFF: Pérez has bounced back from his rough 2018 campaign by pitching to a 3.97 ERA (70.1 IP, 31 ER) this season through 14 appearances (11 starts)...he has done his best work when pitching at night, compiling a 5-1 record with a 3.65 ERA (56.2 IP, 23 ER) with 51 of his 67 strikeouts coming at night...despite the small sample size, he owns a 5.27 ERA (13.2 IP, 8 ER) in three day appearances (two starts).

ORGULLO VENEZOLANO: Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclena, daughter, Malena, and newborn son, Martín, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500.0 IP) in innings pitched (831.2), starts (139) and wins (50), while sitting seventh in strikeouts (529) and ninth in ERA (4.58).

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
