**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 4-2 through six games on their nine-game homestand, going 2-1 vs. the Mariners and 2-1 vs. the Royals...tonight the Twins will begin a three-game series with Boston through Wednesday...the Twins have won 7 of their last 10, 17 of their last 24 and 22 of their last 30.

**TWINS CAN'T COMPLETE ROYALS SWEEP:** The Twins lost to the Royals yesterday afternoon by a score of 8-6...Martín Pérez (7-3) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs (4 earned) on six hits in 6.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 15 hits, left 15 men on base and went 4-for-18 with runners in scoring position...Max Kepler went 4-for-6 with two doubles, reaching 100 doubles for his career...Nelson Cruz (13) and Miguel Sanó (7) each hit solo home runs...the game marked sellout number six this season (38,886) and was played in 4 hours.

**POLO ON THE MARK:** Yesterday Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 30 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .341 (43-for-126) with a .397 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

**SOUND THE BOMBA HORN:** The Twins have hit 137 home runs this season, the most in baseball ahead of Seattle (132)...Twins have homered in all 14 games this month, totaling 31...their current 14-game homer streak is tied for their third longest (since 1961)...below are the all-time Twins streaks:

**ADDITIONAL NOTE:** The Twins have homered in each of their last 20 home games, the longest active streak in baseball and two short of the major league record of 22, done by Colorado from August 14-September 21, 2014.

**DOOR'S WIDE OPEN:** The Twins have sold out six games this season: Opening Day March 28 vs. Cleveland (39,519), May 25 vs. Chicago-AL (39,139), May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (39,913), Friday night (38,898), Saturday night (39,267), and yesterday afternoon (38,886)...the last 40,000+ attendance was Opening Day of 2016 (40,638)...Twins have sold out 167 regular season games at Target Field in 762 openings since 2010...the Twins drew a total of 117,051 during this three-game series, largest in a three-game series since June 19-21, 2015 vs. Chicago-NL (117,156).

**TWINS-SOX:** The Twins and Red Sox are playing the first of six scheduled meetings this season...the Twins will visit Fenway Park for three games September 3-5...the Twins went 3-4 against the Red Sox last season, going 2-1 at Target Field June 19-21 and 1-3 at Fenway Park July 26-29...Twins have lost three straight to the Sox and are just 4-9 in their last 13.

- ☞ Jason Castro has hit .304 (24-for-79) with 18 walks and a .439 on-base percentage in 25 career games vs. Boston.
- ☞ Nelson Cruz has hit .303 (99-for-327) with 19 doubles, 22 home runs, 64 RBI and a .956 OPS in 87 career games vs. Boston.
- ☞ Rocco Baldelli played 62 games for the Sox in 2009, hitting .253 (38-for-150) with four doubles, seven home runs and 23 RBI...the Woonsocket, Rhode Island native grew up a Red Sox fan.

**VOTE TWINS:** Major League Baseball released their second AL All-Star balloting update today...four Twins are in the "Starters Election" area at their respective positions: Jorge Polanco leads all shortstops with 818,082 votes, C.J. Cron ranks second among first basemen with 586,303 votes, Nelson Cruz ranks third among designated hitters with 506,211 votes, and Eddie Rosario ranks sixth among outfielders with 687,515 votes...players moving on to Starters Election will be announced on Friday night...below are Twins AL ranks at their positions:

- ☞ Polanco: First in average (.332), hits (90), slugging (.557), OBP (.395) and OPS (.952), and tied for first in doubles (21).
- ☞ Cron: Second in slugging percentage (.533), third in RBI (46), fourth in doubles (15) and batting average (.271), and fifth in OPS (.865).
- ☞ Cruz: First in slugging (.570), and second in batting average (.279), OBP (.362), and OPS (.931).
- ☞ Rosario: Third in total bases (130), fourth in hits (68), eighth in slugging (.50), and 11th in OPS (.809)

**LAST TIME OUT:** In his last start, June 12 vs. Seattle, Berríos allowed one run on seven hits with one walk and six strikeouts over 6.2 innings, but didn't factor into the decision in a 9-6 defeat...the outing marked his fourth consecutive quality start and his 11th this season in 14 starts (fifth-best in baseball, second in the AL to only Houston's Justin Verlander with 13)...was replaced with two outs in the seventh inning and watched as the bullpen yielded eight runs over the next 2.1 innings...tied a season-high with 107 pitches, (2nd straight game).

• His last start came in Game No. 66 for the Twins...in it, he lowered his season ERA to 3.01 (89.2 IP, 30 ER) and recorded six strikeouts, raising his season total to 84...his 84 strikeouts tied Camilo Pascual (1964) for the 16th most of any Twins starter through 66 team games, and the most since his 2018 campaign (91)...prior to that, the next highest total through 66 team games was Francisco Liriano's 93 strikeouts in 2010.

**DIRTY WATER:** Berríos is winless in three starts against the reigning champs, holding an 0-2 record with a 4.15 ERA (17.1 IP, 8 ER) and 19 strikeouts...has only seen the Red Sox once at home, almost exactly one year ago on June 19 when he threw 6.1 innings of one-run ball (five hits) with six strikeouts in a 6-2 Twins win...the one run came on a solo home run to Rafael Devers in the sixth inning with two outs.

**HIGH-QUALITY STUFF:** Berríos is tied for second in the American League behind Justin Verlander (13) with 11 quality starts (tied for fifth-most in baseball), while 12 out of his 14 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including four 7.0+ inning efforts).

• His 11 quality starts through his first 14 mark the best start of his career...in 2018 he had seven through his first 13, in 2017 he recorded eight and in 2016 he posted one quality start.

**NO FREE PASSES:** Entering tonight's start, Berríos has only walked 17 batters this year, which is tied for the sixth-fewest among American League starters with at least 10 starts...his walks/batters faced rate is 0.46, which ranks seventh best in the majors and is second to only Seattle's Mike Leake in the American League...has six starts without walking a batter this season, and has yet to walk more than three batters in his 14 starts, the last time coming back on September 28, 2018 vs. Chicago-AL (4).

**THIS IS JOSÉ'S HOUSE:** In seven starts at home this season, Berríos is 5-1, 2.53 ERA (46.1 IP, 13 ER) with 43 strikeouts, compared to going 3-1, 3.53 ERA (43.1 IP, 17 ER) with 41 strikeouts away from Target Field...has 23 career wins at Target Field, second to only Kyle Gibson since its inception in 2010...below is a chart of all-time wins at Target Field:

**TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON: 4-3, 5.04 ERA ; CAREER: 44-44, 4.14 ERA]**

Pineda will be on the hill tomorrow evening against the Red Sox...in his start last Thursday against the Mariners, he did not factor into the decision despite allowing just one run on two hits over 5.2 innings pitched in a 10-5 Twins win...is 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (29.2 IP, 13 ER) in his last five starts (Twins are 4-1)...will be facing the Red Sox for the 13th time in his career, first time since June 8, 2017 as a member of the New York Yankees (9-1 Yankees win)...owns a lifetime record of 5-5 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0 IP, 31 ER) with 62 strikeouts to just 12 walks...he will be matched up against left-hander David Price, who was also the starter for the Red Sox the last time Pineda saw them.

- Given 2018 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA...also awarded with the Carl R. Pohlad Community Service Award.
- Became 21st pitcher in Twins history to reach the 200-strikeout mark (202 in 2018).
- Named to 2018 AL All-Star team, threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the All-Star Game.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
- Made MLB debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
- Named Twins second best prospect entering 2016, as well as best curveball, best changeup, and best control in Twins system by *Baseball America*.
