THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-3 through eight games on their nine-game homestand, going 2-1 vs. the Mariners, 2-1 vs. the Royals and 1-1 vs. the Red Sox...tonight the Twins will play the three-game series finale with Boston...after tonight's game, they will travel to Kansas City for four through the weekend...the Twins have won 8 of their last 12, 18 of their last 26 and 23 of their last 32...Twins are 4-3 in rubber games this season.

GOOD MORNING, TWINS WIN: The Twins beat the Red Sox last night at Target Field by a score of 4-3 in 17 innings, marking the longest X-innings game in Target Field's history (since 2010)...13th 17-plus inning game in club history and tied for fourth-longest game in terms of time (5:45)...eight pitchers relieved starter Michael Pineda and they combined to allow just two runs in 11.0 innings with one walk and 12 strikeouts...Zack Littell earned his first career win with 2.0 scoreless innings...Max Kepler hit the game-tying home run in the 13th and the walk-off single in the 17th, becoming the first player to have a game-tying RBI and a walk-off RBI in the 13th inning or later in the same game since Milwaukee's Willie Randolph on May 1, 1991.

POLO ON THE MARK: Last night Jorge Polanco extended his career-long on-base streak to 32 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .328 (45-for-137) with a .382 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Polanco's 32-game streak is tied for 13th best in club history (since 1961), the all-time long being 43 by Joe Mauer from August 7-September 24, 2015.

TWINS-SOX: The Twins and Red Sox are playing the third of six scheduled meetings this season...the Twins will visit Fenway Park for three games September 3-5...five of the last six games between these two teams have been decided by three runs-or-less.

☞ The Twins have gone 15-7 vs. AL East opponents this season, going 6-0 vs. Baltimore, 1-2 vs. New York, 4-3 vs. Toronto, 3-1 vs. Tampa Bay and 1-1 vs. Boston...they currently have a .682 winning percentage against the AL East...their best win percentage against the division came in 1991 (.655, 55-29), and their best since 1994 (when AL & NL divisions separated into three) came in 2006 (.629, 22-13).

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins made a series of roster moves this afternoon:

- ☞ Marwin Gonzalez was placed on the 10-day IL with a right hamstring strain...he was hitting .317 (19-for-60) with a .959 OPS since 5/13.
- ☞ Blake Parker was placed on the Family Medical Emergency List...he led the team in saves, going 9-for-10 and ranked third in games (27).
- ☞ Williams Astudillo has been recalled from Triple-A Rochester...he has hit .526 (20-for-38) with three home runs and 11 RBI in nine games since being optioned by the Twins in early June.
- ☞ Right-handed pitcher Sean Poppen has had his contract selected from Rochester...he spent four years at Harvard and was selected by the Twins in the 19th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...he was the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week the last two weeks.
- ☞ Adalberto Mejía was transferred to the 60-day IL...he has missed the Twins last 45 games with a right calf strain.

DANKE SCHOEN: Max Kepler has reached safely in 12 straight games with an at-bat, dating back to June 5...it is tied for the fifth longest streak of his career, his best being 19 games from July 5-27, 2018...during the streak, he is hitting .378 (17-for-45) with 12 walks and a .509 OBP...he has drawn a team-high 33 walks this season, 27 coming from the leadoff spot, third best in the AL and fifth best in baseball, trailing Andrew McCutchen (43), Matt Carpenter (36), Marcus Semien (32) and Shin-Soo Choo (31).

☞ Among AL outfielders, he ranks third in OPS (.928) and slugging percentage (.566), and eighth in on-base percentage (.362).

C.J. CRUSH: C.J. Cron has 47 RBI this season, ranking third on the team to Eddie Rosario (52) and Max Kepler (49)...in his last 33 games, he is hitting .331 (45-for-136) with 13 doubles, 30 RBI and a 1.022 OPS...ranks among AL first basemen: first in slugging percentage (.534), third in RBI (47), tied for third in doubles (16), third in batting average (.277), and fifth in OPS (.877) and wOBA (.378).

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .299 (187-for-626) with 31 doubles, 32 home runs, 55 walks and a .869 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank third in OPS...they are 10-6 vs. left-handed starters this season.

- ☞ Twins hitters have a line drive rate of 29.2% (144/493) against LHP this season -- highest in MLB; League Avg: 23.5%.
- ☞ Twins hitters have 11 home runs against LHP over the last 14 days (10 Games) -- tied for most in MLB.
- ☞ Nelson Cruz (MIN) has an average Exit Velocity of 97.7 MPH against left-handed pitchers in the 2019 season (25 balls in play) -- Rank: highest among 94 part time hitters in MLB; League Avg: 88.3.

HBD, PARK!: Blake Parker is celebrating his 34th birthday today...he has appeared in two games on his birthday, one in 2013 and one last season...he shares a birthday with Mets pitcher Jacob deGrom (31), former Twin Dustan Mohr (43), rapper Macklemore (35), former NBA star Dirk Nowitzki (40) and actress Kathleen Turner (65).

WON ONE FOR THE "GIBBER": Gibson was the starter and winner his last time out on Friday vs. Kansas City, pitching 8.0-shutout innings and allowing a season-low tying two hits (May 8 at Toronto) while striking out six Royals in a 2-0 win...didn't allow a hit until Whit Merrifield singled to lead off the fourth inning, while Billy Hamilton's two-out single in the sixth was the only other blemish on Gibson's otherwise flawless start...recorded his last out in the eighth with the game tied 0-0, but was at last given his two runs of support as Mitch Garver launched his 11th home run of the season with two outs in the eighth...gave Gibson his seventh win of the year as Taylor Rogers spun a perfect ninth inning to slam the door shut...brings a 2.45 ERA at home into tonight's start, 10th in the American League (min. 5 starts at home, excludes openers).

HISTORY: MADE: With a Cam Callagher ground out in the sixth inning, Gibson became the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1,000 inning threshold...the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, became the first Twin to do so since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP with Minnesota from 2000-2007...below are the 11 pitchers in Twins history with 1000.0+ IP:

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enters tonight's start with the sixth-most starts (162) and the eighth-highest innings pitched total (950.1) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (125, most in baseball), T-11th in wins (59) and 14th in strikeouts (733).

GETTING AHEAD: Gibson has made a habit this season of getting ahead, as referenced by his 67.4 percent rate on first pitch strikes, 10th-best in baseball, third in the AL behind Masahiro Tanaka (70.4) and Rick Porcello (68.1)...he has also induced a bevy of first pitch swinging strikes, as referenced by his 32.6 percent swings-on-first-pitch ratio, eighth-best in the American League...Gibby also ranks seventh in the AL in percent of swings that miss (31.2) while he's 20th with a 17.7 percentage on pitches in play.

- All this has led to a career-best pace for both strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9.20 - 17th in the AL) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.53, eighth in the AL).

AGAINST THE RED SOX: The right-hander is making his seventh career start against the Red Sox...Gibson saw the Red Sox twice last season, allowing just three runs over 14.0 innings pitched...earned the win in his last start against Boston on July 26 at Fenway Park, spinning 8.0 innings of one-run ball, scattering four hits and two walks with seven strikeouts in a 2-1 Twins win...took the loss, however, in his start against them here at home despite allowing just two runs over 6.0 innings, as the Sox prevailed 9-2 on June 21...owns a career 2.68 ERA against the Red Sox, his lowest ERA against any opponent (min. 5 starts)...in fact, his 2.68 ERA is the 10th lowest against Boston since 2014 among pitchers with at least five starts against them, with the lowest being Justin Verlander's 1.76 ERA in eight starts...with the same qualifiers, only Dean Chance (2.42 ERA in 13 games, nine starts) and Carlos Silva (1.95 ERA in five starts) have lower ERAs against Boston in Twins history.

FUN WITH STATCAST: Gibson has seen the most success this season with his slider, as opponents are hitting just .130 (9-for-69) against it, and 39 of his 77 strikeouts have come via the slider (54.4 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his sinker, going 34-for-116 (.293) with three home runs and an average exit velocity of 91.2 with a wOBA of .340 (weighted on-base average)...his slider has a 38.8 inches of vertical drop, 2.5 percent above average, 14th best in the Majors among qualified pitchers.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE OODRIZZI [SEASON: 10-2, 2.24 ERA // CAREER: 57-50, 3.82 ERA]

Odorizzi makes his 15th start of the year tomorrow against Kansas City, his second consecutive against the Royals after earning his 10th win here on Saturday by throwing 6.0 innings and allowing four runs in a 5-4 Twins win...is 10-2, 2.24 ERA (76.1 IP, 19 ER) with 24 walks and 85 strikeouts...has a career-high 10-game winning streak, longest active streak in baseball and best by a Twin since Johan Santana set the franchise record with 17 straight from July 14, 2004-April 26, 2005 (20)...holds rankings in a myriad of American League categories, including: 2nd in ERA (2.24), T-1st in wins (10), 5th in BAA (.196), 4th in winning percentage (.833), and 14th in strikeouts (85).
