THE TWINS: The Twins completed their nine-game homestand with a record of 5-4, going 2-1 vs. the Mariners, 2-1 vs. the Royals and 1-2 vs. the Red Sox...tonight the Twins will begin a short four-game series in Kansas City through the weekend...they will travel home on Sunday evening, enjoy an off-day on Monday then begin a short three-game series with Tampa Bay at Target Field June 25-27...the Twins have won 8 of their last 13, 18 of their last 27 and 23 of their last 33.

TWINS DROP SERIES WITH SOX: The Twins lost to the Red Sox last night by a score of 9-4, losing the three-game series 2-1...Kyle Gibson (7-4) was the starter and loser, allowing six runs on seven hits in 4.1 innings pitched...the offense recorded nine hits, three from Williams Astudillo, who hit his third home run of the season...Max Kepler hit his 19th home run, one short of his single-season career-high (20 last season), while tying Eddie Rosario for team-lead in homers.

POLO ON THE MARK: Jorge Polanco has reached base in a career-long 32 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .328 (45-for-137) with a .382 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Polanco's 32-game streak is tied for 13th best in club history (since 1961), the all-time long being 43 by Joe Mauer from August 7-September 24, 2015.

BAD HOUSE GUESTS: The Twins have gone 24-12 on the road this season, tied with Arizona and Boston for the most road wins in baseball...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 25th road win until September 16 at Kansas City...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the sixth of 19 games this season...they are 4-1 vs. KC this season, going 2-0 at Kauffman Stadium April 2-3 and 2-1 at Target Field June 14-16...the Twins have gone 10-5 in their last 15 vs. KC overall...Twins have won three straight at Kauffman and looking to win four straight here for the first time since June 2-5, 2011.
☞ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in 22 straight games vs. KC, dating back to September 28, 2016, hitting .356 (31-for-87) with 33 RBI, a .429 OBP and a 1.095 OPS in that span...he enters tonight with an 11-game hitting streak at Kauffman Stadium, hitting .327 (16-for-49) with seven extra-base hits and 21 RBI in that span.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .333 (13-for-39) with four doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.171 OPS in 11 career games at Kauffman Stadium...he enters tonight with a six-game hitting streak in this ballpark.

☞ Max Kepler has reached base safely in 29 straight games vs. the Royals, hitting .290 (29-for-100) with 24 walks and a .421 OBP during that span (dates back to September 1, 2017)...the streak is tied for the 15th longest ever against the Royals, the best being Joe Mauer, reaching in 53 straight from June 30, 2009-June 6, 2013.

DANKE SCHOEN: Max Kepler has reached safely in 13 straight games with an at-bat, dating back to June 5...it is tied for the fourth longest streak of his career, his best being 19 games from July 5-27, 2018...during the streak, he is hitting .360 (18-for-50) with 12 walks and a .484 OBP...among AL outfielders, he ranks second in slugging percentage (.570), third in OPS (.930), tied for third in home runs (19), and ninth in on-base percentage (.359).

FUN WITH NUMBERS:

- ☞ The Twins are currently fourth in baseball with a 89.6 MPH average exit velocity on offense, trailing the Red Sox (89.8), Yankees (89.7) and Rays (89.7).
- ☞ The Twins have hit the second most balls over-or-equal-to 100.0 MPH (513) trailing only the Rays (520) this season.
- ☞ The Twins are hitting the ball higher (15.1 degree launch angle) than anyone in baseball other than the Mariners (16.0 degrees).
- ☞ Twins pitchers are third-best in the American League with an average of 2,272 revolutions-per-minute on pitches thrown, and that has equated to the Twins staff having the third lowest average exit velocity in the American League (87.6 MPH) trailing only Oakland (87.4 MPH) and Tampa Bay (86.9 MPH).

STATE OF BASEBALL: Today is championship day in the Minnesota state high school baseball tournament with title games in the four classes beginning at 10 am at Target Field.

- ☞ **10 am:** BOLD vs. New York Mills in Class 1A...BOLD has their sights set on a second state title this decade, also winning the championship in 2013...New York Mills has two state tournament runner-up trophies in program history.
- ☞ **1 pm:** Minnehaha Academy vs. Duluth Marshall in 2A...Minnehaha Academy is making their fourth championship game appearance in the past five seasons...Duluth Marshall lost to Maple Lake 8-4 in the 2018 championship game.
- ☞ **4 pm:** Margilde-St. Margaret's vs. St. Thomas Academy in 3A...the B-SM Red Knights (16-9) are on the verge of their first state championship in school history...they meet St. Thomas Academy (20-9) in the Class 3A finals.
- ☞ **7 pm:** East Ridge vs. New Prague in 4A...New Prague is one victory from the first baseball state championship in school history...the Trojans (18-8) play East Ridge who is playing in its first state tournament.

ODO-METER: Odorizzi leads the American League with a 2.24 ERA (3rd in the majors) and is tied for the Major League lead with 10 wins through 14 starts (76.1 IP, 19 ER)...he also ranks among AL top-10 leaders for: hits-per-9.0 innings (4th - 6.25), WHIP (4th - 1.01), fielding-independent pitching (4th - 2.96), opponents' batting average (5th - .196, 53-for-271) and strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9th - 10.02, with 85 strikeouts).

W-W-W-W-W-W-W-W: The Twins have won each of last Odorizzi's 11 starts (beginning April 17), while he is personally 10-0 with a 1.52 ERA (65.0 IP, 11 ER) to establish a career-long winning streak...he has held opponents to a .209/.261/.289 slash line during the stretch, with 15 walks and 70 strikeouts.

- Since April 17, Odorizzi leads the majors in wins (10-0) and the American League for ERA (1.52, 2nd-best in baseball)...among AL starters, he also ranks second for opponents' slugging percentage (.289), fourth for opponents' OPS (.550), sixth for WHIP (0.98), and ninth for opponents' batting average (.209, 49-for-235) and hits-per-9.0 innings (6.78).
- He is tied for the third-longest winning streak ever by a Twins starter (second-longest single-season streak), and is on the team's best run since Johan Santana set the club record with 17-consecutive wins between July 17, 2004 and April 26, 2005 (a span of 20 starts)... here are the longest winning streaks by a starter in Twins history:

* NOTE: Jesse Crain won 11-straight decisions over 51 relief appearances between 9/1/04 and 7/1/05, LaTroy Hawkins won 10-consecutive in 83 games between 4/6/02 and 5/21/03, and Roy Corbin won 10-straight in 36 games (11 starts) between 7/26/73 and 6/20/74.

FOR THE WIN: At 10-2, Odorizzi has surpassed his wins total for all of his 2018 debut season with the Twins (7-10 in 32 starts) and is one shy of matching his career-high 11 (with Tampa Bay in 2014).

- A win tonight would make Odo just the sixth Twins pitcher (seventh occurrence) to earn 11 victories within Minnesota's first 74 games...the others are: Camilo Pascual (11 in 1962), Dean Chance (11 in 1967), Jim Perry (12 in 1970 and 11 in '71), Frank Viola (12 in 1988) and Scott Erickson (12 in 1991).
- Is also looking to become the first Twins pitcher since Joe Mays in 2001 to win 11 games before the All-Star Break...there have been only 11 Twins pitchers (14 occurrences) to win at least 11 games during the season's first half (Frank Viola holds the club record by going 14-2 in 1988).

SWING AND A MISS: Odorizzi has struck out 33 batters in 23.1 innings over his last four starts to rank fourth in the AL since May 26 with an average of 12.73 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings...has allowed only five walks in that stretch, while going 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1 IP, 5 ER).

- SOFT CONTACT:** Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (5th-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been equally difficult to square up - he's allowed just nine extra-base hits, a .280 slugging percentage and a .546 OPS, all the lowest in the AL (min. 10 starts).
- Of the 189 balls put in play against Odorizzi (on 1,261 pitches - just 14.9 percent), only 61 have been hit hard (exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH)...his 32.4 percent hard-hit rate is eighth-lowest in the AL (min. 150 batted balls).
 - Odo has been the toughest pitcher in the majors for a right-handed batter to hit this season, as he has yielded just 22 hits in 148 at-bats (.149 batting average).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 166 starts and a .233 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (173), Justin Verlander (169) and Corey Kluber (167) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.212), Verlander (.220) and Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: After pitching just 5.1 innings with an 11.81 ERA (7 ER) in losing his first two road starts, Odorizzi has been fantastic in his last five efforts away from Target Field, going 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA (28.2 IP, 3 ER), eight walks and 33 strikeouts (Twins have won all five games).

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi is using his fastball at his career-high 60.6-percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%). Below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berrios (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.

HEY, YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Odorizzi will make his second-consecutive start against Kansas City and Glenn Sparkman, after pitching the Twins to a 5-4 victory last Saturday on "Joe Mauer Day" at Target Field...yielded four earned runs for the first time since his second start of the season and matched a season-high by allowing two home runs.

- Lifetime, is 3-4 with a 4.56 ERA (51.1 IP, 26 ER) in 10 games (9 starts) against KC.
- Is 1-2, 5.19 ERA (21.2 IP, 14 ER) in four career starts at Kauffman Stadium...pitched well here in an ND on July 22, 2018 (6.0 IP, 2 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 8 SO), as KC won, 5-3.
- Made his ML debut on September 23, 2012 at Kauffman Stadium, starting for the Royals against Cleveland...allowed three runs over 5.1 innings, but Indians won, 15-4.
