THE TWINS: After completing their nine-game homestand with a record of 5-4 (2-1 vs. the Mariners, 2-1 vs. the Royals and 1-2 vs. the Red Sox), the Twins began their four-game roadtrip with a loss to the Royals last night...tonight the Twins will play the second of four in Kansas City through the weekend...they will travel home on Sunday evening, enjoy an off-day on Monday, then begin a short three-game series with Tampa Bay at Target Field June 25-27.

NO SPARK IN OUR OFFENSE: The Twins lost to the Royals last night by a score of 4-1, scoring four runs-or-fewer for the fifth time in their last seven games...Jake Odorizzi (10-3) was the starter and loser, allowing four runs on eight hits in 4.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded just five hits, two from C.J. Cron - both singles...Jorge Polanco extended his on-base streak to 33, hitting his 11th home run of the season in the first inning.

POLO ON THE MARK: Jorge Polanco has reached base in a career-long 33 straight games, dating back to May 13, hitting .326 (46-for-141) with a .378 on-base percentage...marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Polanco's 33-game streak is the 13th best in club history (since 1961), the all-time long being 43 by Joe Mauer from August 7-September 24, 2015.

BAD HOUSE GUESTS: The Twins have gone 24-13 on the road this season, tied with Arizona and Boston for the most road wins in baseball...Twins have out-scored opponents on the road 240-183...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 25th road win until September 16 at Kansas City...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

THREE'S COMPANY: The Twins are looking to avoid losing three straight tonight for the first time all season...they have lost two straight six different times...they are the only team in baseball yet to lose three-straight...date-wise and game-wise, this marks the latest into a season for the Twins to not have lost three-in-a-row...below are the latest dates in a season for the Twins to drop three-in-a-row:

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Previous MLB team to go this deep into a season without a three-game losing streak was the Yankees last season, losing three straight for the first time June 22-24, in games 73-75.

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the seventh of 19 games this season...they are 4-2 vs. KC this season, going 2-1 at Kauffman Stadium and 2-1 at Target Field...the Twins have gone 10-6 in their last 16 vs. KC overall.

☞ Twins are just 18-34 at Kauffman Stadium since the start of 2014, the fewest wins of any AL Central team in this ballpark.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .352 (31-for-88) with 33 RBI, a .424 OBP and a 1.083 OPS in his last 23 vs. Kansas City.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .357 (15-for-42) with four doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.196 OPS in 12 career games at Kauffman Stadium...he enters tonight with a seven-game hitting streak in this ballpark.

MAX-ING OUT FOR A MONTH: Since May 20, Max Kepler is slugging .730, second in the AL to Mike Trout (.757)...he is hitting .330, the third best in the AL since that date (min. 100 AB's), trailing Hanser Alberto (.352) and Xander Bogaerts (.336)...additionally, his 10 home runs are tied for second and his 27 RBI rank third.

FIRST DAY OF SUMMER, TIME TO HEAT IT UP AGAIN: Twins are hitting .256 (150-for-585) with 4.9 runs-per-game and an .803 OPS in their last 16 games since June 4, going 8-8 in that span...prior to that date, the Twins were hitting .275 (550-for-2001) with 6.0 runs-per-game and a .853 OPS in 58 games, going 40-18.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: Target Field hosted the MN state high school championships yesterday...**Class A:** BOLD Warriors defeated New York Mills 8-0 for the school's second baseball championship since 2013...**Class AA:** Duluth Marshall came-back on Minnehaha Academy to win 4-2, marking just the second state baseball championship for the City of Duluth and first since 1950...**Class AAA:** St. Thomas Academy defeated Benilde-St. Margaret's 1-0 after nearly a three-hour rain delay...**Class AAAA:** East Ridge defeated New Prague 7-2, marking the school's first baseball title.

THIS AND THAT:

☞ Twins have hit 35 home runs this month, tied with Seattle for most in baseball, trailing Atlanta (39) and Los Angeles-AL (36)...the 35 home runs are already seventh most in club history for the month, the club record for the month being 47 in 1964...Twins on pace for 52.

☞ The Twins have recorded 214 Barrels this season, the most in baseball, the next best being Atlanta with 200.

☞ Twins hitters have hit 518 balls measured with an exit velocity of 100 mph-or-more, second-most in baseball, trailing Tampa Bay (528).

☞ Twins defense ranks tied for third in defensive runs saved (45) with Arizona, trailing Los Angeles-NL (96) and Houston (61).

☞ Twins hitters rank first in baseball in fewest pitchers-per-plate appearance (3.78).

- He is making his 13th start and 16th appearance of the season.
• He is making his 141st career start and 157th career appearance.

LAST START: Pérez worked into the seventh inning for the first time in a month (since May 17), but was dealt his third loss of the season in an 8-6 defeat to these same Royals last Sunday...exited after 6.2 innings, allowing five runs (four earned) on six hits and a walk with seven strikeouts...

- Threw a season-high 105 pitches, surpassing the 102 he threw on May 6 at Toronto...the 105 pitches marked the most he's thrown since July 25 of last season at Oakland (107 pitches in a 6-5 loss).
• He threw 72 pitches for strikes, the most this season, and the 68.6 percent strike percentage is the second-highest for him this year (69.8 percent, April 20-G2 at Baltimore).

HOPING TO GET BACK ON TRACK: After a sizzling eight-start run after entering the Twins rotation on April 15 (6-1 with a 2.17 ERA in 49.2 IP), Pérez is 0-2 with a 7.58 ERA (19.0 IP, 16 ER) and a .298 opponents' batting average (24-for-81) in his last four starts (Twins are 1-3).

- However, since joining the rotation on April 15, Pérez still ranks tied for ninth in the AL with six wins (T-15th in the majors) and is 21st in the AL in ERA (3.67).
• Seven of his 12 starts have been at least 6.0 IP, with five of them being quality starts.
• Due to multiple off-days in the season's first three weeks, Pérez opened the campaign out of the Twins bullpen, allowing seven runs in 8.2 innings pitched (7.56 ERA).

THE TERRIFIC TRIO: Pérez has won seven games this season (six as a starter)...with a win today, Pérez, Jake Odorizzi (10) and José Berríos (8) would become the fourth Twins trio ever to have eight wins apiece through 75 team games.

- The impressive company the Twins 2019 trio could join: Camilo Pascual (9 wins), Jim Perry (8) and Jim Kaat (8) in 1963; Bert Blyleven (10), Kaat (9) and Dick Woodson (8) in 1973; and Joe Mays (9), Brad Radke (8) and Eric Milton (8) in 2001.

SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has been among the toughest pitchers in the game to square up this season, as his 84.8 MPH average exit velocity and percentage of hard-hit balls (26.9%, 61-of-227) are both lowest in the majors among pitchers that have yielded at least 200 batted balls.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Is making his second consecutive start and appearance against the Royals, following last Sunday's loss at Target Field (see "Last Start" note above)...in 10 career starts against KC, he owns a 1-1 record with a 3.08 ERA (26.1 IP, 9 ER).

- Tonight will mark just his third career start and appearance at Kauffman Stadium...pitched the Rangers to a 5-3 victory over the Royals on July 14, 2007, allowing three runs on five hits over 7.0 innings...also started here back on September 30, 2013 (no-decision in a 2-1 KC victory over Texas).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Pérez is 4-1 with a 4.66 ERA (36.2 IP, 19 ER), 21 walks, 31 strikeouts, three home runs allowed and a .259 (37-for-143) batting average against in six road starts this season...in six starts at Target Field, he is 3-2, 3.57 ERA (40.1 IP, 16 ER) with 13 walks, 43 strikeouts, three home runs and an opponents' average of .247 (38-for-154).

- Pérez is making his seventh road start of the season after taking the hill twice in the Twins just-completed nine-game homestand.

NIGHT OWL: Pérez has done his best work this season when pitching at night, compiling a 5-1 record with a 3.65 ERA (56.2 IP, 23 ER) under the lights...despite the small sample size, he owns a 5.31 ERA (20.1 IP, 12 ER) in four day appearances (three starts).

ORGULLO VENEZOLANO: Born in Guanare, Venezuela, where he makes his home today with his wife, Viclena, daughter, Malena, and newborn son, Martín, Pérez currently ranks fifth among active Venezuelan-born pitchers (min. 500.0 IP) in innings pitched (831.2), starts (139) and wins (50), while sitting seventh in strikeouts (529) and ninth in ERA (4.58).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS, RHP [SEASON: 8-3, 2.86 ERA ; CAREER: 37-29, 4.15 ERA]

Berríos will be on the bump tomorrow afternoon, making his 16th start of the season and his second against Kansas City...was the tough-luck loser in his last start June 18 vs. Boston, despite throwing a season-best 8.0 innings of one-run ball and matching his season-high with 10 strikeouts...allowed five hits (including three in the first inning to plate the Red Sox' lone run off him), but the Twins were blanked, 2-0...last time out at Kauffman Stadium, April 2 of this season, he allowed three runs on seven hits with zero walks and four strikeouts over 7.0 innings pitched (departed with the score tied 3-3; Twins rallied to win, 5-4 in 10 innings)...owns a lifetime record of 2-2 vs. the Royals, with a 4.30 ERA over 58.2 innings (28 ER)...looking to earn his first career win at Kauffman after not factoring into the decision in his six career road starts vs. KC (5.08 ERA in 33.2 IP).

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
• According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
• Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
• Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
• His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
• Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
• Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
• Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.

TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

- Twins' bullpen went 4-4-4 with a 4.52 ERA (79.2 IP, 40 ER) vs. KC last season...in five games this season, are 2-0-4 with an 0.51 ERA (17.2 IP, 1 ER) with five walks and 11 strikeouts.
Twins relievers have pitched 235.2 innings, 2nd-fewest in the AL (behind the Indians, 227.2) and 4th-fewest in baseball...bullpen has gone 12-8-21 with 39 holds, a 4.51 ERA (118 ER), 100 walks, 246 strikeouts and a .260 opponents' batting average (241-for-928) in 74 games...Twins' pen is 4th in baseball in save percentage (80.8%), trailing just the Indians (87.5%), White Sox (85.0%) & Giants (83.3%), going 21-for-26 in save opportunities and have the 5th-fewest blown saves in baseball with five.
Over the last seven games, the bullpen is 1-0-2 with three holds, a 2.00 ERA (27.0 IP, 6 ER) and a .238 opponents' batting average (25-for-105), along with nine walks and 20 strikeouts.

- Has faced the Royals 10 times in his career (three starts), going 2-2-1 with two holds and a 7.46 ERA (25.1 IP, 21 ER) with 23 strikeouts.
Has a 0.68 ERA (13.1 IP, 1 ER) with 21 strikeouts (against just four walks) in his last 10 games, with opponents slashing .208/.276/.302.
Has seen his average velocity on his fastball rise consistently in his career, jumping to 93.6 this season after registering at 91.1 in 2015...his offspeed pitches have also improved in 2019, with his slider dropping 51.2 inches vertically (37 pct. above league average).
Recalled from Triple-A Rochester May 13 for third time this season...was on team May 11 as 26th man for doubleheader vs. DET, striking out the side in a perfect ninth inning to close out the Twins' 8-3 win in Game 2...was previously with the Twins from 4/16-23.
Had a 1.32 ERA (13.2 IP, 2 ER) with five walks & 22 strikeouts in seven games for the Red Wings this season.
