Field June 25-27.

TWINS COME BACK ON ROYALS: The Twins beat the Royals last night by a score of 8-7 at Kauffman Stadium...Martín Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing six runs ( 4 earned) on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Taylor Rogers pitched 2.0 scoreless innings to earn his ninth save (11th opportunity)...the offense recorded 13 hits, three from Eddie Rosario...Miguel Sanó hit his 8th home run and C.J. Cron hit his 16th home run.
POLO ON THE MARK: Last night, Jorge Polanco extended his on-base streak to 34 games, dating back to May 13 , hitting. 329 (48-for-146) with a .379 on-base percentage....marks the longest Twins streak since Brian Dozier reached in 34 straight from September 12, 2017-April 23, 2018...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

EVEN MORE POLANCO: Jorge Polanco enters today with a 13 -game road hitting streak, hitting 357 (20-for-56) with seven doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.020 OPS in that span...longest road hit-streak for a Twin since Eddie Rosario's 13 -game streak August 28, 2018-April 9, 2019... last 14-game road hit-streak was Brian Dozier, 14, September 22, 2017-April 23, 2018...additionally, Polanco ranks second in baseball in road batting average (.359), trailing Jeff McNīeil (.362)
TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the eighth of 19 games this season... they are 5-2 vs. KC this season, going 3-1 at Kauffman Stadium and 2-1 at Target Field... the Twins have gone 11-6 in their last 17 vs. KC overall.
$\Phi$ Twins are just 19-34 at Kauffman Stadium since the start of 2014, the fewest wins of any AL Central team in this ballpark.
क Miguel Sanó is hitting . 344 ( 32 -for- 93 ) with 34 RBI, a . 413 0BP and a 1.080 OPS in his last 24 vs. Kansas City...he has hit safely in each of his last 12 starts at Kauffman. $\Phi$ C.J. Cron is hitting. 340 (16-for-47) with four doubles, six home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.176 OPS in 13 career games at Kauffman Stadium....he enters today with an eight-game hitting streak in this ballpark.
50 W'S: Twins are seeking their 50th win today in their 76th game...just one Twins team has reached 50 wins in this amount of games, that being the 1970 club, going 50-26 through 76 ...the 2018 Twins won their 50 th game on August 3 and were $50-58$ at the time.
ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced last night that they have reinstated right-handed pitcher Blake Parker from the Family Medica Emergency List...Parker, who missed the Twins last three games, has made 27 appearances this season going $0-2$ with a 4.26 ERA (25. IP, 12 ER ), 10 walks and 20 strikeouts...to make room on the 25 -man roster, the twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Kohl Stewart to Triple-A Rochester...Stewart made one relief appearance against the Royals, pitching 4.0 innings, allowing two hits with one strikeout.
MAX-ING OUT FOR A MONTH: Since May 20, Max Kepler is slugging .714, second in the AL to Mike Trout (.755)...he is hitting .333, tied for second best in the AL since that date (min. 100 AB 's)....additionally, his 10 home runs are tied for fourth and his 28 RB r rank third.
UPDATE ON THE POLLS: Finalists for the first-ever Google MLB AII-Star Starters Election were announced last night...the Starters Election begins at 12:00 pm (ET) on Wednesday, June 26, with fans voting during a 28-hour window that ends at 4:00 pm (ET) on Thursday, June 27...four Twins are in the Starters Election area at their respective positions: Jorge Polanco at shortstop, C.J. Cron at first base, Nelson Cruz at designated hitter and Eddie Rosario is one of the six outtielders...below are Twins AL ranks at their positions:
$\Phi$ Polanco: First in average (.326), hits (95), slugging (.550), and OPS (.936), and second in OBP (.386) and doubles (22)
$\Phi$ Cron: Second in slugging percentage (.534), third in RBI (48) and average (.279), tied for third in doubles (16), and fifth in OPS (.878). $\Phi$ Cruz: Second in slugging (.549), batting average (.275), OBP (.361), and OPS (.910).
$\Phi$ Rosario: Tied for third in total bases (150), tied for fourth in hits (79), seventh in slugging (.514), and 12th in OPS (.816).

LAST TIME OUT: Berríos was the tough-luck loser, being handed his third loss of the season despite spinning 8.0 innings of one-run ball in an eventual 2-0 loss to the Red Sox on Monday night...in it, he became the first Twins pitcher to strikeout 10-or-more batters and not issue a walk this season...the last two to do it were both Berríos, on June 7 and April 12 of last season, both against the White Sox.

- Berríos has a 2.86 ERA through 15 starts this season -- the last Minnesota pitcher with a sub-3.00 ERA through 15 starts was Ervin Santana in 2017 (2.97).
- Berríos is second in the American League behind Justin Verlander (13) with 12 quality starts (tied for fourth-most in baseball), while 13 out of his 15 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including five $7.0+$ inning efforts)...his 12 quality starts through his first 15 mark the best start of his career...in 2018 he had seven through his first 13, in 2017 he recorded eight and in 2016 he posted one quality start.

WESTERN AUTO-MATIC JOSÉ: Berríos enters tonight with a six-game streak of quality starts against Kansas City, dating back to Sept. 9, 2017 here at Kauffman Stadium (both of his last two starts against the Royals have been away from home)...has made one start against them this year, back on April 2, throwing 7.0 innings and yielding three runs on seven hits in an eventual 5-4 Twins win (did not factor into the decision)...his last win against the Royals came on August 4 of last year at Target Field, a start in which he scattered a pair of runs in 7.0 innings in an 8-2 Twins win.

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact off the bat of his opponents for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons....since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 85.9 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.0) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.3), (min. 500 batted balls)....he's also seventh in the American League (13th in baseball) with a wOBA of 289 since 2018, (min. 1,000 results).

HAVE A DÉ: The Puerto Rican right-hander is making his sixth day-game start of the year, and is $4-1$ with a 2.16 ERA ( $33.1 \mathrm{IP}, 8 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 37 strikeouts in those outings... among AL starters with at least five day-starts, he ranks: second in opponents' OPS (.508), fourth in ERA, fourth in opponents' batting average (.182, 22-for-121) and sixth in earned runs allowed.

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the great young pitchers in Twins history....his 2.86 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 17 walks in 15 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits with an $8.66 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ ratio ( 94 SO ), and is looking to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).
Note: Kyle Gibson and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have $\mathrm{SO} / 9$ rates higher than 8.00 , would become first trio of Twins to do so in the same season.
