THE TWINS: After completing their nine-game homestand with a record of 5-4 (2-1 vs. the Mariners, 2-1 vs. the Royals and 1-2 vs. the Red Sox), the Twins began their four-game roadtrip by going 2-1 at Kauffman over the last three days...today the Twins will play the series finale in Kansas City...they will travel home this evening and enjoy an off-day tomorrow, then begin a short three-game series with Tampa Bay at Target Field June 25-27.

TWINS OUTLAST ROYALS IN EXTRAS: The Twins beat the Royals yesterday afternoon at Kauffman Stadium by a score of 5-3 in 10 innings...José Berríos was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing just two runs on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded nine hits, three from C.J. Cron, who hit his 17th home run...Miguel Sanó (9) and Jake Cave (1) also homered.

POLO ON THE MARK: Yesterday, Jorge Polanco extended his on-base streak to 35 games, dating back to May 13, hitting .325 (49-for-151) with a .373 on-base percentage...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

EVEN MORE POLANCO: Jorge Polanco enters today with a 14-game road hitting streak, hitting .344 (21-for-61) with seven doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI and a .970 OPS in that span...last 15-game road hit-streak was Ben Revere, 15, July 5-August 7, 2012.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 26-13 on the road this season, the most road wins in baseball...Twins have out-scored opponents on the road 253-193...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 26th road win until September 17 at Detroit...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

TWINS AND ROYALS: The Twins and Royals are playing the ninth of 19 games this season...they are 6-2 vs. KC this season, going 4-1 at Kauffman Stadium and 2-1 at Target Field...the Twins have gone 12-6 in their last 18 vs. KC overall.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .340 (33-for-97) with 35 RBI, a .407 OBP and a 1.088 OPS in his last 25 vs. Kansas City...he has hit safely in each of his last 13 starts at Kauffman.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .365 (19-for-52) with four doubles, seven home runs, 13 RBI and a 1.235 OPS in 14 career games at Kauffman Stadium...he enters today with a nine-game hitting streak in this ballpark.

TWINS SIGN CODY ALLEN: The Twins announced that they have signed free agent reliever Cory Allen to a minor league contract...Allen was released earlier this week by the Angels after appearing in 25 games for the Halos in 2019...Allen has appeared in 481 career games in parts of eight major league seasons, including seven with the Cleveland Indians...the 30-year old right-hander has 153 career saves with a 3.14 ERA (463.2 IP, 162 ER) and 593 strikeouts.

SCORING EARLY: The Twins have hit 60 home runs in the first, second or third innings this season – the most in baseball...they also own a major league best .267 batting average with 84 home runs vs. pitchers the first time in a game...additionally, they have scored a major league leading 314 runs in innings 1-6 and are 41-2 when leading after 7 innings.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: The Twins have named Triple-A Rochester outfielder/first baseman Brent Rooker and Rookie-Elizabethton left-handed pitcher Ryley Widell as the organization's minor league player and pitcher of the week...Rooker, who was drafted 35th overall by the Twins in the 2017 First-Year Player Draft, played seven games for the Red Wings this week, hitting .429 (9-for-21) with two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, four walks and a 1.488 OPS...Widell, who was drafted by the Twins in the seventh round of the 2017 Draft, pitched in one game this week, Wednesday against Bluefield, allowing just two runs (1 earned) on two hits, with no walks and six strikeouts in 4.0 innings pitched.

LAST START: Pineda was the starter but did not factor into the decision, his seventh of the season and his fourth consecutive, as the Twins won 4-3 vs. Boston in 17 innings, the longest recorded game by inning in Target Field history...the outing marked his second consecutive start allowing only one run over 5.2+ innings pitched...gave up a single to Andrew Benintendi in the first inning and didn't allow hit until Rafael Devers slapped a single to rightfield in the fourth that scored Mookie Betts, who reached on a walk... allowed a hit in the fifth and two in the sixth and exited with just one earned run on five hits over 6.0 innings pitched.

WALK HARD: Through 14 starts, Pineda has only issued 14 walks in 75.2 innings which is the third fewest in the American League among starters with at least 70.0 innings pitched...owns 749 career strikeouts, 171 walks and a lifetime SO/BB ratio of 4.38...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 42 starts...since 2016, is one of seven starters with an active streak of 40+ starts and three or less walks (full list below).

VS. THE ROYALS: Pineda is making his 11th career start against the Royals and his first since May 22, 2017...he is 5-5, 3.84 ERA (63.1 IP, 27 ER) with 13 walks and 57 strikeouts in his 10 career starts...he made his first career start against the Royals, as a member of the Seattle Mariners, April 17, 2011...in his last start against Kansas City, back on May 22, 2017 with the New York Yankees, he threw 6.1 innings, allowing two runs (all earned) on six hits with one walk and six strikeouts...earned the win as the Yankees won the game 4-2.

QUALITY CONTROL: In his last six starts, Pineda has gone 2-0, 3.53 ERA (35.2 IP, 14 ER) with an opponent batting average of .213 (27-for-127), five walks and 27 strikeouts... in that span he has five quality starts and was one out short of a quality start 6/13 vs. Seattle, and three outs from a QS the start before that (6/7 at DET)...he has not lost a start since May 5 at New York-AL.

MORE WALK TALK: Pineda's 14 walks on the year is tied for the fifth fewest in the all of baseball and the third fewest in the American League among starters with at least 14 starts...his walks allowed per nine innings rate is 1.67, which ranks 10th best in the majors and is third in the American League (behind Mike Leake-1.43 and Carlos Carrasco-1.52)... has five starts without walking a batter this season and five with walking just one.

THE REPERTOIRE: Coming into 2019, Pineda relied on high-velocity fastball, as referenced by the 59.6 percent (2011), 29.7 (2014), 38.7 (2015), 47.6 (2016) and 47.9 (2017) usage rates for his fastball that averaged 94.1 MPH each year...similarly this season, has thrown the fastball 53.4 percent of the time, despite a 1.6 MPH drop in velocity this season (92.5)...right-handed batters are batting .282 (48-for-170) against Pineda this season, and lefties are hitting .235 (28-for-119) below is Baseball Savant's breakdown of Pineda's pitches and usage in 2019:

ROAD SUCCESS: Pineda owns a 3-1 record away from Target Field this season with a 4.86 ERA over 33.1 innings pitched, with eight walks and 29 strikeouts in six starts...however, is 1-2, 4.68 ERA (42.1 IP, 22 ER) with six walks and 33 strikeouts in eight home starts... has not been dealt a loss on the road since May 5 at New York-AL.

TUESDAYS' STARTER - KYLE GIBSON, RHP [SEASON: 7-4, 4.18 ERA ; CAREER: 61-65, 4.44 ERA]

Gibson will take the mound in the series opener against the Tampa Bay Rays on Tuesday evening...this will be his 15th start of the season and his second against the Rays...in his last start, June 19 vs. the Red Sox, he was the starter and loser after allowing six runs (all earned) on seven hits with five walks and three strikeouts...the six runs marked a season high and before the start, he hadn't allowed more than five runs over his last 60 starts dating back to July 9, 2017 vs. Baltimore...in his one start vs. the Rays this season, he earned the win after allowing no runs on six hits with one walk and three strikeouts over 5.0 innings pitched...owns a lifetime record of 3-5, (50.0 IP, 29 ER) with 19 walks and 34 strikeouts in nine starts vs. TB.

CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
