THE TWINS: The Twins completed their short four-game roadtrip in Kansas City by going 2-2, losing games one and four at Kauffman...tonight the Twins will begin a short three-game homestand against the Rays through Thursday...following this series, the Twins will travel to Chicago to begin a six-game, seven-day roadtrip with three vs. the White Sox over the weekend, an off-day in the Bay Area on Monday then three against Oakland July 2-4.

TWINS SPLIT IN KC: The Twins lost to the Royals on Sunday afternoon at Kauffman Stadium by a score of 6-1...Michael Pineda (4-4) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded nine hits, four from Luis Arraez, marking a season/career-high...Eddie Rosario hit his team-leading 20th home run in the fourth inning...the Twins are now 15-6-4 in series play in 2019.

36: On Sunday afternoon, Jorge Polanco extended his on-base streak to 36 games, dating back to May 13, hitting .327 (51-for-156) with a .374 on-base percentage...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

TWINS-RAYS: The Twins and Rays are playing for the fifth of seven games this season...the Twins won the four-game series at Tropicana Field May 30-June 2, winning the final three games...a win tonight would give the Twins their first four-game winning streak vs. the Rays since winning 14 straight July 21, 2004-September 5, 2006.

- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .351 (13-for-37) with three doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.051 OPS in his last 10 games vs. TB.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco has hit safely in nine straight vs. the Rays, hitting .342 (13-for-38) with six doubles and a .948 OPS in that span.
- ☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .314 (27-for-86) with seven home runs and 17 RBI in his last 20 games vs. TB...he has 16 career home runs and 41 RBI against the Rays, both his most vs. any opponent.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is a career .370 (34-for-92) hitter with six doubles, one triple, five home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.040 OPS in 25 career games vs. the Rays.

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .296 (204-for-689) with 32 doubles, 38 home runs, 61 walks and a .873 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank second in OPS...they are 11-7 vs. left-handed starters this season.

- ☞ Twins runners have stolen two bases against LHP this season -- tied for fewest in MLB.
- ☞ Twins hitters have a line drive rate of 28.7% (155/541) against LHP this season -- highest in MLB; League Avg: 23.5%.
- ☞ Twins hitters have 10 home runs against LHP over the last 14 days (9 Games) -- tied for 2nd most in MLB.
- ☞ Nelson Cruz has a Well-Hit Avg of .370 (17/46) against LHP this season -- 2nd best in MLB among hitters with at least 111 PA's; League Avg: .184.
- ☞ C.J. Cron is slugging .706 (48 total bases in 68 ABs) against LHP this season -- 5th best in MLB; League Avg: .468.

ROSTER MOVES: Earlier today the Twins reinstated infielder Ronald Torreyes from the restricted list and assigned him to Single-A Ft. Myers...to make room on the 40-man roster, the Twins have designated left-handed pitcher Gabriel Moya for release or assignment.

VOTE TWINS TOMORROW! Finalists for the first-ever Google MLB All-Star Starters Election were recently announced...the Starters Election begins at 12:00 pm (ET) tomorrow, with fans voting during a 28-hour window that ends at 4:00 pm (ET) on Thursday, June 27...four Twins are in the Starters Election area at their respective positions: Jorge Polanco at shortstop, C.J. Cron at first base, Nelson Cruz at designated hitter and Eddie Rosario is one of the six outfielders...below are Twins AL ranks at their positions:

- ☞ Polanco: First in average (.326), hits (98), slugging (.542), and OPS (.925), and second in OBP (.383) and doubles (22).
- ☞ Cron: First in slugging percentage (.538), third in RBI (50), OPS (.882) and average (.281), and tied for third in doubles (16).
- ☞ Cruz: Second in slugging (.526), batting average (.263), OBP (.353), and OPS (.880).
- ☞ Rosario: Fourth in total bases (156), tied for fourth in hits (81), fifth in slugging (.518), and 12th in OPS (.818).

DIDN'T LOVE THAT DIRTY WATER: Gibson was the starter and loser his last time out on June 19 vs. Boston, as he matched a career-high with five walks in a season-low 4.1 innings pitched in a 9-4 defeat...

HISTORY MADE: With a Cam Callagher ground out in the sixth inning on June 14, Gibson became the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1,000 inning threshold...

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enters tonight's start with the sixth-most starts (163) and the seventh-highest innings pitched total (955.2) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...

GETTING AHEAD: Gibson has made a habit this season of getting ahead, as referenced by his 67.2 percent rate on first pitch strikes, 11th-best in baseball, third in the AL behind Masahiro Tanaka (69.3) and Rick Porcello (67.6)...

- All this has led to a career-best pace for both strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9.04 - 16th in the AL) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.64, 14th in the AL).

AGAINST THE RAYS: The right-hander is making his 10th career start against Tampa Bay, second this season...Gibson began his month of June in St. Petersburg against these Rays, spinning 5.0-scoreless innings of six-hit ball with three strikeouts and a walk in a 6-2 Twins win...

• Since the start of 2014 has induced 125 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martin Pérez is third with 111.
• Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI [SEASON: 10-3, 2.58 ERA // CAREER: 57-51, 3.84 ERA]

Odorizzi will make his 16th start of the year tomorrow night in the second game of this series...is 10-3, 2.58 ERA (80.1 IP, 23 ER) with 25 walks and 87 strikeouts, tying for the American League lead in wins and ranking third in ERA...in his last start against Tampa Bay on June 2 in St. Petersburg, Odorizzi earned his eighth win of the season as he spun 6.0 innings of shutout ball against his former team, striking out nine batters in a 9-7 victory...

TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

- Over the last nine games, the bullpen is 3-0-3 with three holds, a 2.25 ERA (36.0 IP, 9 ER) and a .234 opponents' batting average (32-for-137), along with 11 walks and 26 strikeouts.
- Twins' bullpen went 2-3-1 with a 11.84 ERA (24.1 IP, 32 ER) in seven games vs. TB last season...in four games this season, are 1-0-1 with an 9.20 ERA (14.2 IP, 15 ER) with four walks and 14 strikeouts.
- Twins relievers have pitched 245.2 innings, 2nd-fewest in the AL (behind the Indians, 243.2) and 4th-fewest in baseball...bullpen has gone 14-8-23 with 39 holds, a 4.43 ERA (121 ER), 102 walks, 253 strikeouts and a .258 opponents' batting average (248-for-963) in 77 games...Twins 'pen has the 3rd highest save percentage in baseball (79.3%), trailing just the Indians (85.2%), & Giants (84.0%), going 23-for-29 in save opportunities and are tied for the fourth-fewest blown saves in baseball with six.

- Relies on five pitches: four seamer (54.2%), slider (24.5%), curve (17.6%), sinker (32.%) & changeup (0.5%).
- Recalled from Triple-A Rochester May 13 for third time this season...was on team May 11 as 26th man for doubleheader vs. DET, striking out the side in a perfect ninth inning to close out the Twins' 8-3 win in Game 2...was previously with the Twins from 4/16-23.
- Has seen his average velocity on his fastball rise consistently in his career, jumping to 93.6 this season after registering at 92.1 in 2017...his off-speed pitches have also improved in 2019, with his slider dropping 51.0 inches vertically (37% above league average).
