TWINS SPLIT IN KC: The Twins lost to the Royals on Sunday afternoon at Kauffman Stadium by a score of 6-1...Michael Pineda (4-4) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded nine hits, four from Luis Arraez, marking a season/career-high...Eddie Rosario hit his team-leading 20th home run in the fourth inning... the Twins are now 15-6-4 in series play in 2019.

36: On Sunday afternoon, Jorge Polanco extended his on-base streak to 36 games, dating back to May 13, hitting . 327 ( 51 -for-156) with a .374 on-base percentage...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting . 296 (204-for-689) with 32 doubles, 38 home runs, 61 walks and a .873 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank second in OPS...they are $11-7$ vs. left-handed starters this season. $\Phi$ Twins runners have stolen two bases against LHP this season -- tied for fewest in MLB.
$\Phi$ Twins hitters have a line drive rate of $28.7 \%$ (155/541) against LHP this season -- highest in MLB; League Avg: 23.5\%. $\Phi$ Twins hitters have 10 home runs against LHP over the last 14 days ( 9 Games) -- tied for 2nd most in MLB.
$\Phi$ Nelson Cruz has a Well-Hit Avg of $.370(17 / 46)$ against LHP this season -- 2nd best in MLB among hitters with at least 111 PA's; League Avg: . 184.

ROSTER MOVES: Earlier today the Twins reinstated infielder Ronald Torreyes from the restricted list and assigned him to Single-A Ft. Myers...to make room on the 40-man roster, the Twins have designated left-handed pitcher Gabriel Moya for release or assignment.
VOTE TWINS TOMORROW!: Finalists for the first-ever Google MLB All-Star Starters Election were recently announced...the Starters Election begins at 12:00 pm (ET) tomorrow, with fans voting during a 28 -hour window that ends at 4:00 pm (ET) on Thursday, June 27...four Jwins are in the Starters Election area at their respective positions: Jorge Polanco at shortstop, C.J. Cron at first base, Nelson Cruz at designated hitter and Eddie Rosario is one of the six outtielders....below are Twins AL ranks at their positions:

DIDN'T LOVE THAT DIRTY WATER: Gibson was the starter and loser his last time out on June 19 vs. Boston, as he matched a career-high with five walks in a season-low 4.1 innings pitched in a 9-4 defeat...pitched a perfect first inning before the wheels fell off in the second when the first five batters reached base, ultimately leading to the Red Sox' first of three different three-run innings on the night...scattered just two more walks through the fourth inning before the Red Sox erupted once more in the fifth, going walk, single, double, sac fly and single before Ryne Harper stranded Gibson's last runner...Gibby threw 94 pitches, just 49 for strikes (a 52.1 strike percentage, a season-low).

HISTORY MADE: With a Cam Callagher ground out in the sixth inning on June 14, Gibson became the 11 th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1,000 inning threshold... the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, became the first Twin to do so since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP with Minnesota from 2000-2007.... below are the 11 pitchers in Twins history with $1000.0+$ IP:

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Playing off the above note, Gibson enters tonight's start with the sixth-most starts (163) and the seventh-highest innings pitched total (955.2) in the American League since the beginning of 2014....he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (125, most in baseball), T-11th in wins (59) and 14th in strikeouts (736).

GETTING AHEAD: Gibson has made a habit this season of getting ahead, as referenced by his 67.2 percent rate on first pitch strikes, 11th-best in baseball, third in the AL behind Masahiro Tanaka (69.3) and Rick Porcello (67.6)...he has also induced a bevy of first pitch swinging strikes, as referenced by his 32.2 percent swings-on-firstpitch ratio, tied for sixth-best in the American League...Gibby also ranks seventh in the AL in percent of swings that miss (31.1) while he's 21 st with a 17.7 percentage on pitches in play.

- All this has led to a career-best pace for both strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9.04-16th in the AL) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.64, 14th in the AL).

AGAINST THE RAYS: The right-hander is making his 10th career start against Tampa Bay, second this season...Gibson began his month of June in St. Petersburg against these Rays, spinning 5.0 -scoreless innings of six-hit ball with three strikeouts and a walk in a 6-2 Twins win...last saw the Rays at Target Field on July 12 of last year when he threw 113 pitches over 8.0 innings, allowing five hits and one run with nine strikeouts in a 5-1 Twins win...owns a career 5.22 ERA against Tampa Bay, and a 4.82 ERA (255.2 IP, 137 ER) against American League East opponents...since 2018, however, Gibson is 8 -5 with a 2.79 ERA ( $96.2 \mathrm{IP}, 30 \mathrm{ER}$ ) against AL East teams, including quality starts in three of his last six starts.

FUN WITH STATCAST: Gibson has seen the most success this season with his slider, as opponents are hitting just 137 (10-for-73) against it, and 40 of his 80 strikeouts have come via the slider ( 54.1 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his sinker, going 37 -for-123 (.301) with three home runs and an average exit velocity of 91.1 with a wOBA of .352 (weighted on-base average)... his slider has 38.9 inches of vertical drop, 2.6 percent above average, 15th best in the Majors among pitchers who have thrown 250 -or-more sliders this season.
