THE TWINS: After completing their four-game roadtrip in Kansas City with a record of 2-2, the Twins began their three-game homestand against the Rays with a win last night...tonight the Twins will play the second of three with Tampa Bay and complete the series tomorrow afternoon... following tomorrow's game, the Twins will travel to Chicago to begin a six-game, seven-day roadtrip with three vs. the White Sox over the weekend, an off-day in the Bay Area on Monday then three against Oakland July 2-4...the Twins play five home games in their next 20 days.

TWINS ROLL OVER RAYS: The Twins beat the Rays last night by a score of 9-4, winning their fourth straight over Tampa Bay...Kyle Gibson (8-4) was the starter and winner, allowing four runs on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 15 hits, four from Eddie Rosario, tying his season-high...Williams Astudillo and Mitch Garver each added three hits-a-piece as Garver hit his 12th home run...the Twins went 7-for-15 with runners in scoring position.

37: Last night, Jorge Polanco extended his on-base streak to 37 games, dating back to May 13, hitting .327 (52-for-159) with a .375 on-base percentage...below are the longest on-base streaks in baseball this season:

TWINS-RAYS: The Twins and Rays are playing for the sixth of seven games this season...the Twins are looking to win their fifth straight vs. the Rays, which would be their longest since winning 14 straight over them from July 21, 2004-September 5, 2006...last night's victory secured the season-series for Minnesota, their first over Tampa since going 4-2 in 2015...a victory tonight would give the Twins three straight series wins over TB.

- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .341 (14-for-41) with three doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI and a .998 OPS in his last 11 games vs. TB.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco has hit safely in 10 straight vs. the Rays, hitting .341 (14-for-41) with six doubles and a .932 OPS in that span.
- ☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .315 (28-for-89) with eight home runs and 18 RBI in his last 21 games vs. TB...he has 17 career home runs and 42 RBI against the Rays, both his most vs. any opponent.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is a career .392 (38-for-97) hitter with seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, 20 RBI and a 1.077 OPS in 26 career games vs. the Rays.
- ☞ Through five games this season, the Twins are hitting .429 (21-for-49) with runners in scoring position vs. TB...conversely, the Rays are hitting .441 (15-for-34) with RISP vs. Minnesota.

SIMPLY THE BEST: At 51-27, the Twins are a half game up on the Yankees for the best record in the American League...Minnesota has held the top record in the AL for 41 days this season -- the last season in which the Twins held the best record in the AL for longer was in 1991.

POLLS ARE OPEN!: The first-ever Google MLB All-Star Starters Election voting began this morning at 11:00 am (CT) and runs through tomorrow at 3 pm (CT)...four Twins are in the Starters Election area at their respective positions: Jorge Polanco at shortstop, C.J. Cron at first base, Nelson Cruz at designated hitter and Eddie Rosario is one of the six outfielders...below are Twins AL ranks at their positions:

- ☞ Polanco: First in average (.326), hits (99) and slugging (.539), and second OPS (.923), OBP (.383) and doubles (22).
- ☞ Cron: Second in slugging percentage (.534), third in RBI (50), OPS (.877) and average (.280), and tied for third in doubles (16).
- ☞ Cruz: Second in slugging (.518), batting average (.262), OBP (.350), and OPS (.868).
- ☞ Rosario: Second in total bases (161), fourth in hits (85), fifth in slugging (.526), and 11th in OPS (.834).

ROSIE'S ARE RED HOT: Eddie Rosario is hitting .429 (15-for-35) with five doubles, one home run, seven RBI and a 1.086 OPS in his last seven games...he has hit 20 home runs this season, the first Twin to reach that mark before July since Justin Morneau in 2007...his 57 RBI this season are also the most pre-July since Morneau had 64 in 2009...in the first half of each of the last two seasons combined, he has hit .296 (202-for-682) with 38 doubles, 39 home runs, 119 RBI, 114 runs scored on a .856 OPS in 167 games...during that span, he ranks second in the AL in hits, tied for second in RBI, tied for fifth in home runs, and sixth in runs scored.

HITMEN: The Twins recorded 15 hits again last night for the 12th time this season, the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-AL (10)...Twins record for 15-plus hit games is 20, done in 1996...Twins enter today with a total of 746 hits on the season, second to only Boston (755).

ALL GOOD THINGS MUST COME TO AN END: Odorizzi saw his career-high 10-game winning streak come to a halt in his last start, as he suffered a 4-1 defeat June 20 at Kansas City, his first loss since April 10 at New York-NL...allowed eight hits and four runs in just 4.0 innings, his shortest start since lasting just 0.2-frame April 5 at Philadelphia.

- **Odo went 10-0 with a 1.52 ERA (65.0 IP, 11 ER) in 11 starts between April 17 and June 15 (Twins were a perfect 11-0)**, with 15 walks, 70 strikeouts and a .209/.261/.289 opponents' slash line...marked the third-longest winning streak ever by a Twins starter (second-longest single-season run)...here are the longest winning streaks by a starter in Twins history:

* **NOTE:** Jesse Crain won 11-straight decisions over 51 relief appearances between 9/1/04 and 7/1/05, LaTroy Hawkins won 10-consecutive in 83 games between 4/6/02 and 5/21/03, and Roy Corbin won 10-straight in 36 games (11 starts) between 7/26/73 and 6/20/74.

ODO-METER: Odorizzi is tied for the Major League lead with a career-high 10 wins and ranks third in the American League with a 2.58 ERA through 15 starts (80.1 IP, 23 ER)...he also ranks among AL leaders for: hits-per-9.0 innings (6th - 6.83), fielding-independent pitching (7th - 2.97), opponents' batting average (9th - .211, 61-for-289) and WHIP (12th - 1.07).

FOR THE WIN: At 10-3, Odorizzi has surpassed his wins total for all of his 2018 debut season with the Twins (7-10 in 32 starts) and is one shy of matching his career-high 11 (with Tampa Bay in 2014).

- **Is looking to become the first Twins pitcher since Joe Mays in 2001 to win 11 games before the All-Star Break**...there have been only 11 Twins pitchers (14 occurrences) to win at least 11 games during the season's first half (Frank Viola holds the club record by going 14-2 in 1988).

CLOSING IN ON 900: Odorizzi, who has a career-high rate of 9.75 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings through his first 15 starts (80.1 IP, 87 SO) is eight punchouts shy of 900 for his career (892 entering tonight)...if he gets there tonight, he will become the 55th active player with 900 career strikeouts.

SOFT CONTACT: Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (5th-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been equally difficult to square up - **he's allowed just 14 extra-base hits (five in his last start) and a .301 slugging percentage, both lowest among AL starters**...his .579 opponents' OPS is second-lowest in the AL, trailing only HOU's Justin Verlander (.564).

- Of the 206 balls put in play against Odorizzi (on 1341 pitches - just 15.4 percent), only 70 have been hit hard (exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH)...his 34.1 percent hard-hit rate is 15-lowest in the AL (min. 150 batted balls).
- **Odo has been the toughest pitcher in the AL for a right-handed batter to hit this season, as he has yielded just 24 hits in 157 at-bats (.153 batting average)**...only the Dodgers' Kenta Maeda (.144) has yielded a lower average against to righties in all of baseball.

ON TARGET AT HOME: In his first seven home starts this season, Odorizzi is 6-0 with an AL-best 1.91 ERA (42.1 IP, 9 ER - matching HOU's Wade Miley) and a .190 opponents' batting average (3rd in the AL, 29-for-153), along with nine walks, 48 strikeouts and a 0.90 WHIP (2nd in the AL).

- In his first 22 home starts with the Twins, Odorizzi is 11-4 with a 3.73 ERA (123.0 IP, 51 ER) and a .236 opponents' average (110-for-467), with 39 walks and 129 strikeouts...the Twins are 16-7 when he takes the mound at Target Field (6-1 in 2019).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is tied with Corey Kluber for third in the American League with 167 starts and ranks fifth with a .234 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (174), Justin Verlander (170) and Corey Kluber (167) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.213), Verlander (.219), Kluber (.223) and Marco Estrada (.234) are the four with lower BAAs.

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi is using his fastball at a career-high 59.7 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%). Below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

FLY AWAY: After posting the lowest ground ball percentage in the majors in 2018 (28.7 percent), Odorizzi once again has the lowest mark in the game this season at 31.1 percent.

- Since his first full big league season in 2014, Odorizzi ranks fourth in the majors with a 33.6 percent groundball rate, just ahead of Justin Verlander (35.3 percent).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ, LHP [SEASON- 7-3, 4.28 ERA ; CAREER- 50-52, 4.60 ERA]

Pérez will be making his second start of 2019 against Tampa Bay in tomorrow afternoon's series finale, his 14th start and 17th appearance of the season overall...is looking to snap a five-start winless streak (Twins are 2-3), having gone 0-2 with a 7.50 ERA (24.0 IP, 20 ER) since his May 23 win at Los Angeles-AL...opponents are hitting .287 off him (29-for-101) in that stretch, while he has 11 walks and 20 strikeouts...in his start last Friday at KC, he pitched 5.0 innings and allowed six runs, but only four were earned, in an eventual 8-7 Twins win...is 0-4 with a 7.49 ERA (39.2 IP, 33 ER) in nine lifetime appearances (7 starts) against the Rays, including an 11.32 ERA (20.2 IP, 26 ER) and an opponents' slash line of .378/.431/.592 over his last five starts.

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
