THE TWINS: The Twins completed their Pre-ASG portion of the 2019 season with a record of 56-33 and remain 5.5 games up in the American League Central...after starting the season with a record of 47-22 through June 15, the Twins have gone 9-11 in their final 20...today they will begin the "second half" with a three-game weekend series in Cleveland...following Sunday afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel home for an off-day on Monday, then begin a nine-game homestand with two vs. New York-NL July 16-17, four vs. Oakland July 18-21 and three vs. New York-AL July 22-24.

90TH MID-SUMMER RECAP: The Twins sent three players to Cleveland for the MLB All-Star Game, as shortstop Jorge Polanco was elected the starting shortstop, while starting pitcher Jake Odorizzi (injury) was replaced by José Berríos...Polanco and Berríos were able to make contributions to the American League's 4-3 victory over the National League, as Berríos fired a scoreless third inning before Polanco drove in the second run of the game with an RBI single in the fifth.

☞ Berríos became the first Twin to pitch a scoreless inning in back-to-back All-Star Games since Joe Nathan in 2008-09.

☞ With his RBI single vs. Walker Buehler, Polanco became just the fifth Twins player to record an RBI in an All-Star Game since 2000...he also became the third to do so off a Dodger, joining Joe Mauer (2009 off Billingsley) and Miguel Sanó (2017 off Wood).

#56 wins were second most in club history, behind their 1969 total of 59 (37 losses).

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 28-18 on the road this season, the second-most road wins in baseball (Boston - 29)...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 283-230...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 29th (and final) road win until September 23 at Oakland, and their 100 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

A GLIMPSE OF THE FUTURE: With 73 remaining games in 2019, the Twins have 35 games remaining with teams who own winning percentages above .500 and 38 games with teams below .500...additionally, the Twins only have three games remaining against above-.600 teams (New York-AL), but have 23 games against sub-.400 clubs...including tonight, they have 13 games left against the Indians, and 33 between the Royals, Tigers and White Sox.

TWINS-TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the seventh of 19 scheduled meetings this season...they are just 3-7 in their last 10 in Cleveland, but are an even 25-25 in their last 50.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .324 (89-for-275) with 13 doubles, four triples, 16 home runs, 36 RBI, 43 runs scored and a .933 OPS in 73 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 89 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball...he is hitting .367 (54-for-147) in 39 career games at Progressive Field, hitting safely in 15 of his last 18 here with an at-bat...in his career at Progressive Field, Rosario has a 1.034 OPS...the only players all-time with higher OPS' here: Belle (1.098), Andrus (1.084), Glaus (1.084) and Thome (1.064).

☞ Nelson Cruz has 22 career home runs vs. the Indians, including 11 in his last 19 against them (20 RBI)...he's slugging .833 in that span with a 1.205 OPS.

☞ Marwin Gonzalez hit .538 (7-for-13) with five RBI in the ALDS vs. Cleveland last fall.

ROSTER MOVES: The Minnesota Twins announced today that they have reinstated right-handed pitcher Blake Parker from the Paternity List...this season, Parker has recorded 10 saves with a 3.77 ERA (31.0 IP, 13 ER) and 29 strikeouts...Parker will take the 25-man roster spot of left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer, who was optioned to Triple-A Rochester on Sunday...Smeltzer appeared on Sunday vs. Texas, allowing one run on five hits in 4.1 innings of relief.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 166 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (160)...they had 166 home runs all of last season...they have a plus +57 home run differential, which also leads baseball.

☞ The Twins now have 10 players with 10-plus homers (Kepler - 21, Rosario - 20, Cron - 17, Cruz - 16, Schoop - 14, Sanó - 13, Garver - 13, Polanco - 13, Castro - 10 and Gonzalez - 10)...Buxton has nine...the club record is 11 players in 2016.

☞ The Twins are the first team since 1933 (the first All-Star Game) to have 10 players with 10+ HR at the All-Star break...the previous high was eight players, done several times, including the Houston Astros and Philadelphia Phillies this season.

LAST TIME OUT: Gibson pitched a scoreless inning as the "opener" in last Sunday's game vs. the Rangers...allowed a leadoff single and a two-out walk before striking out Joey Gallo to end the inning...marked his second career appearance of 1.0 inning-or-less (both this season)...his second shortest stint was 2.0 innings, done so on May 5, 2014 at Cleveland, where he allowed no runs on two hits with three walks and a strikeout.

SWING AND A MISS: Gibson has recorded 94 strikeouts through 18 appearances (17 starts) and owns a SO/9 rate of 8.94 and a SO/BB ratio of 3.36...the SO/9 ranks 13th in the American League while his SO/BB rate ranks 14th.

- Gibson has improved his strikeouts-per-9.0 innings rate nearly every year in his career, setting a career-high in 2018 with 8.19 K/9 (6.89-2017, 6.35-2016, 6.70-2015, 5.37-2014, 5.12-2013).

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Gibson enters today's start tied for the fifth-most starts (166) and the seventh-highest innings pitched total (970.2) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in strikeouts grounding into double plays (128, most in baseball), 11th in wins (60) and 14th in strikeouts (750).

AGAINST THE INDIANS: Gibson is making his 19th career start against Cleveland tonight and his first this season...he last faced the Indians August 28, 2018 at Progressive Field where he was dealt the loss after surrendering five runs on eight hits with three walks and four strikeouts over 5.1 innings...went 1-3, 4.66 ERA (29.0 IP, 15 ER) with 15 walks and 23 strikeouts in his five starts vs. the Indians last season; is 3-3, 4.72 ERA (47.2 IP, 25 ER) with 26 walks and 26 strikeouts in nine career starts at Progressive Field...Gibson's last win at Progressive Field came on June 15 of last season, when he threw 7.0 innings of one-run ball, allowing three hits with four walks and three strikeouts; the Twins won the game 6-3.

- Gibson is 2-1, 4.01 ERA (24.2 IP, 11 ER) with five walks and 25 strikeouts over four starts vs. the AL Central this season...over his career, he is 27-27, 4.27 ERA (430.1 IP, 204 ER) with 145 walks and 332 strikeouts while holding batters to a .267 average.

STRUGGLES ON THE ROAD: Gibby is 3-3, 4.47 ERA (48.1 IP, 24 ER) with 15 walks and 52 strikeouts over nine starts on the road this season as opposed to 5-1, 3.69 ERA (46.1 IP, 19 ER) with 13 walks and 42 strikeouts in nine games (8 starts) at Target Field...over his career, Gibson is 33-32, 4.34 ERA (528.2 IP, 255 ER) with 399 strikeouts and 197 walks in 90 away starts...however, is 29-33, 4.53 ERA (493.0 IP, 248 ER) with 167 walks and 380 strikeouts over 87 games (86 starts) at Target Field.

- His last road win came June 1 at Tampa Bay, where he allowed no runs on six hits with just one walk and three strikeouts over 5.0 innings.

HISTORY MADE: With a Cam Callaghan ground out in the sixth inning on June 14, Gibson became the 11th pitcher in Twins history to eclipse the 1,000 inning threshold...the right-hander, who began his tenure as a Twin back in 2013, became the first Twin to do so since Johan Santana, who tossed 1308.2 IP with Minnesota from 2000-2007...below are the 11 pitchers in Twins history with 1000.0+ IP:

- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.
- Since the start of 2014, he has induced 128 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martin Pérez is third with 11.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11, 2018 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
