THE TWINS: The Twins began their "second half" with a win over the Indians last night... tonight the Twins will play the second of three at Progressive Field...they will wrap the series tomorrow afternoon, travel home for an off-day on Monday, then begin a nine-game homestand with two vs. New York-NL July 16-17, four vs. Oakland July 18-21 and three vs. New York-AL July 22-24.

NOW THAT'S PROGRESSIVE: The Twins beat the Indians last night by a score of 5-3, scoring four of their runs in the seventh and eighth innings...Kyle Gibson was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs (1 earned) on four hits in 3.2 innings pitched...the bullpen combined to pitch 5.1 scoreless innings with just two hits allowed and seven strikeouts...the offense recorded eight hits, including homers from Nelson Cruz (17) and Mitch Garver (14)...Jorge Polanco drove in the go-ahead run with a two-RBI double in the seventh inning.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 29-18 on the road this season, tied with Boston for the most road wins in baseball...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 288-233...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 29th (and final) road win until September 23 at Oakland, and their 102 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

TWINS-TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the eighth of 19 scheduled meetings this season...they are just 4-7 in their last 11 in Cleveland...including tonight's game, they play each other 12 more times this season, five at Progressive Field and seven at Target Field.
☞ The last series win for the Twins at Progressive Field came June 15-17, 2018...they are 0-3 in series play in this ballpark since then.
☞ Nelson Cruz has 23 career home runs vs. the Indians (second-most among actives), including 12 in his last 20 games (21 RBI)...he's slugging .842 in that span with a 1.216 OPS.

WINNESOTA: The Twins have spent 96 days in first place in the AL Central this season, the second-most games any team has lead their division (Dodgers - 101 days)...below is a look at the standings in the division and where the Twins sit in the American League:

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have reinstated right-handed pitcher Jake Odorizzi from the 10-day Injured List...the 2019 American League All-Star missed the Twins last six games due to a right middle finger blister...in 17 starts this season, Odorizzi has gone 10-4 with a 3.15 ERA (88.2 IP, 31 ER), 30 walks and 96 strikeouts...to make room on the 25-man roster, the Twins have designated left-handed pitcher Adalberto Mejía for release or assignment...Mejía, who was acquired by the Twins via trade with San Francisco in 2016 (Eduardo Núñez), appeared in 13 games for the Twins this season, going 0-2 with an 8.80 ERA (15.1 IP, 15 ER), 12 walks and 15 strikeouts.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 168 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (160)...they had 166 home runs all of last season...they have a plus +58 home run differential, which also leads baseball.

☞ The Twins have 10 players with 10-plus homers (Kepler - 21, Rosario - 20, Cron - 17, Cruz - 17, Schoop - 14, Garver - 14, Sanó - 13, Polanco - 13, Castro - 10 and Gonzalez - 10)...Buxton has nine...club record is 11 players in 2016...HOU & PHI have 8 players w/ 10 HR.

- ☞ Twins pitchers have an ERA of 3.28 (274.0 IP) against division opponents this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: 4.64.
- ☞ Luis Arraez has a line drive rate of 47.5% (19/40) against RHP over the last 30 days (16 Games) -- highest in MLB; League Avg: 24.5%.
- ☞ Twins hitters have a Well-Hit Avg of .215 (686/3,196) this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: .180.
- ☞ Twins hitters have 54 home runs in "late innings" this season -- most in MLB.
- ☞ Right-handed batters are hitting just .149 (26-for-175) against Jake Odorizzi this season -- 2nd best among qualified SPs in MLB; League Avg: .240.

BACK ON THE HILL: Odorizzi missed the final five games prior to the All-Star break (including one turn through the rotation) after being placed on the 10-day Injured List on July 3 with a blister on the middle finger of his right (pitching) hand...was activated today.

AN ALL-STAR FIRST-HALF: Odorizzi was named to his first career American League All-Star team, garnering a spot via the Player Ballot -- a vote of his fellow players, along with managers and coaches, after going 10-4 with a 3.15 ERA (88.2 IP, 31 ER) in 17 starts.

- Jake surpassed his wins total for all of his 2019 debut season with the Twins (7-10 in 32 starts) and enters the second half one victory shy of matching his career high of 11 (with Tampa Bay in 2014).
- Odo's first half was highlighted by a dominant, 11-stretch start between April 17 and June 15... he went 10-0 with a 1.52 ERA (65.0 IP, 11 ER), 15 walks and 70 strikeouts, while opponents slashed .209/.261/.289...the Twins were a perfect 11-0 when he took the hill, while he established a new career-long winning streak (tied for the third-longest ever by a Twins starter).

ODO-METER: Jake earned his trip to the Midsummer Classic after a stellar first half...his injury-shortened last start (3.0 IP July 2 at Oakland) has him 1.1-innings shy of ranking among AL leaders in several categories, outside of wins...where he would rank, with 90.0 IP:

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the AL for a right-handed batter to hit this season, yielding a league-low .149 batting average (26-for-175) and ranking second for OPS (.495, behind TB's Charlie Morton at .488)...only the Dodgers' Kenta Maeda has been better against righties in all of baseball, with a .144 batting average (27-for-187).

SWING AND A MISS: Odorizzi's current rate of 9.74 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings would stand as a full-season career high, as he has fanned 96 batters over 88.2 innings of work...has punched out at least seven in eight of his 17 starts this season, and has at least one-per-inning in 10 outings...is one of 56 active pitchers with 900-plus career strikeouts (901 entering tonight's start).

A PAINFUL START: Jake's last start before the break was his injury-shortened outing July 2 at Oakland, an 8-6 loss...worked a perfect first inning, before blister issue on his right middle finger began to develop during a scoreless second...was staked to a 3-0 lead and tried to pitch through the blister, but effectiveness suffered and he left after surrendering six runs (five earned) in 3.0-plus innings (yielded a two-out, two-run homer to Matt Olson in the third and a grand slam to Chris Herrmann in the fourth).

RECENT STRUGGLES: Odo is looking to snap a three-start winless streak tonight, as he is 0-2 with a 8.76 ERA (12.1 IP, 12) beginning June 20 (Twins are 1-2)...has allowed four home runs, with six walks and 11 strikeouts, while opponents are slashing .314/.386/.627.

- Dating back to his June 15 effort against Kansas City (a 5-4 win), Odorizzi has allowed two home runs in three of his four starts (6 of his 10 on the season) and has yielded 10 extra-base hits (of 19 for the season).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), ranks third in the American League with 169 starts and is tied for fourth with a .234 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (176) and Justin Verlander (172) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.214), Verlander (.220) and Corey Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs, while Marco Estrada is also at .234.

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.8 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 58.7 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%). Below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
