ROOTED IN OAKLAND: Berríos was handed his fifth loss of the year as the Twins fell to the Athletics on Independence Day after allowing three runs on six hits over 5.0 innings pitched in a 7-2 Twins loss. the 5.0 innings marked the shortest start of his season, and he snapped a seven-game quality start streak dating back to May 24 vs. Chicago-AL...allowed just two baserunners through the first three innings, but scattered five hits, including a solo home run to Marcus Semien, over his final two...exited down 3-2, but the Twins' offense wasn't able to muster anymore runs, while Semien would launch an eighth-inning grand slam to seal the Twins' fate...threw 58.1% strikes, his worst showing this year.

BERRÍOS FIRES SCORELESS INNING IN ASG: Berríos was selected to his second consecutive All-Star Game as he replaced the injured Jake Odorizzi...José was handed the ball in the third inning, and following a leadoff double to Arizona's Ketel Marte, he would shut down the next three batters: a strikeout of 2018 NL Rookie of the Year Ronald Acuña Jr., another of 2018 NL Most Valuable Player Christian Yelich and a fly out recorded by his brother-in-law Javier Báez. © Berríos became the first Twin to pitch a scoreless inning in back-to-back All-Star Games since les Nathera in 2000 00

Joe Nathan in 2008-09.

 TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 3.00 ERA through 18 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019.

\*Berríos is tied for second in the American League (T-4th in MLB) behind Gerrit Cole (15) with 14 quality starts, while 15 out of his 18 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including seven 7.0+ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 89 career starts, Berríos has an even 44 quality starts (49.4 percent).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the great young pitchers in Twins history...his 3.00 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 23 walks in 18 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an 8.00 SO/9 ratio (104 SO), and is looking to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07). Note: Kyle Gibson and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have SO/9 rates higher than 8.00, would become first trio of Twins to do so in the same season

 • Owns 494 career strikeouts...if he records six today, would become first pitcher in Senators/Twins history to reach 500 strikeouts in 91 career games or fewer (fastest: Bert Blyleven in 92 games, reached on August 4, 1972 at The Met)...will also become the eighth Twin to do so at 25-or-younger, first since Johan Santana in 2004.

**BELIEVELAND:** Berríos is making his third start of the season against the Indians...has fared well against the Tribe so far, winning both decisions while pitching to a sparkling 0.66 ERA (13.2 IP, 1 ER), including 6.0 innings of two-run ball (one earned) in his last start at Progressive Field on June 6, a 5-4 Twins win...is 5-2 lifetime against Cleveland, and hasn't lost to the Indians since Sept. 11, 2016 at Target Field (six starts, 4-0, 2.45 ERA since).

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact off the bat of his opponents for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 86.0 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.1) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.4), (min. 500 batted balls).

HAVE A DÉ: The Puerto Rican right-hander is making his eighth day-game start of the year, and is 4-2 with a 2.58 ERA (45.1 IP, 13 ER) with 42 strikeouts in those outings...among AL starters with at least five day-starts, he ranks seventh in opponents' OPS (.572), 11th in ERA, tied for ninth in opponents' batting average (.200, 33-for-165) and tied for 12th in earned runs allowed.

### TUESDAY'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP (SEASON: 6-4, 4.56 ERA ; CAREER: 46-45, 4.11 ERA)

Pineda will take the ball in the series opener against the New York Mets on Tuesday night at Target Field...is 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (28.2 IP, 9 ER) over his last five starts, with five ER coming on his start June 23 at KC...in fact, his 2.83 ERA is the 10th-lowest in baseball since June 13, and is the lowest on the Twins...did not face the Mets in Flushing earlier this season, and has not faced them since Sept. 19, 2015 at Citi Field (W, 5.1 IP, 0 R)...in that start, Twins great Michael Cuddyer knocked a pinch-hit single for the Mets in the ninth inning...is 2-0 in two career starts against New York-NL, allowing just one run over 13.0 innings pitched with one walk and 11 strikeouts...owns a career line of 8-3, 3.09 ERA (93.1 IP, 32 ER) with a 9.06 SO/9 and a 0.99 WHIP in Interleague Play...is 6.2 IP shy of qualifying, but his ERA would rank 10th in Interleague matchups among American League pitchers since 2011...has 84 strikeouts this year to just 16 walks

Placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.
Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with a start of the start of 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
