THE TWINS: The Twins began their "second half" with consecutive wins over the Indians the last two nights...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale at Progressive Field...they will enjoy an off-day in the Twin Cities tomorrow, then begin a nine-game homestand with two vs. New York-NL July 16-17, four vs. Oakland July 18-21 and three vs. New York-AL July 22-24.
TWINS TAKE TRIBE AGAIN: The Twins beat the Indians last night by a score of $6-2$, winning the series, their 18th of the season (18-8-4)...Jake Odorizzi (11-4) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on three hits in 5.1 innings pitched...the bullpen combined to allow just one run in 3.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 11 hits, including home runs by Max Kepler (22 \& 23) and Jake Cave (2)...Kepler homered off Indians starter Trevor Bauer for the fourth and fifth time this season, the first player in baseball history to homer in five straight at-bats vs. one pitcher in a single season.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 30-18 on the road this season, the most road wins in baseball...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 294-235...the Twins went $29-52$ on the road in 2018...their 105 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year....where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

TWINS-TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the ninth of 19 scheduled meetings this season...including today's game, they play each other 11 more times this season, four at Progressive Field and seven at Target Field.
$\Phi$ Nelson Cruz has 23 career home runs vs. the Indians (second-most among actives), including 12 in his last 21 games (21 RBI)...he's slugging . 810 in that span with a 1.185 OPS. क Max Kepler is hitting just 233 (28-for-120) in 31 career games at Progressive Field but has seven hits in his last 14 at-bats here, including five home runs and seven RBI....he now has 11 career homers at Progressive Field, six more than any other road ballpark (5 at Comerica).

WINNESOTA: The Twins are currently at their high-water mark of 25 games over .500 for the second time this season (47-22 through games of June 15), their highest since ending the 2010 season 26 games over (94-68)...prior to that, their most games over . 500 was 27 , the day before their final game of 2010, on October 2 when they were $94-67$...below is a look at the standings in the division and where the Twins sit in the American League:

STREAKING SANÓ: Miguel Sanó enters tonight with a 10-game hitting streak, tying his career-high, done twice previously (July 5-19, 2016 and June $30-$ Jul 8, 2017)...during the current streak, he is hitting 382 (13-for-34) with three doubles, one triple, four home runs, nine RBI, nine runs scored, five walks and a 1.344 OPS...it marks the second longest active streak in baseball, trailing Whit Merrifield (11).
\#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 171 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (160)... they had 166 home runs all of last season...they have a plus +59 home run differential, which also leads baseball.

THE SCOOP ON SCHOOP: Jonathan Schoop has hit safely in a season-long eight straight games, hitting . 333 (11-for-33) with a . 904 OPS during that span...his career-long is 12 , done twice, last from July 13-29, 2018.

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Twins bullpen has posted a 3.03 ERA ( 92.0 IP, 31 ER) with a . 220 opponent batting average and 92 strikeouts in their last 20 games, dating back to June 18...since that date, their ERA ranks third best in baseball, their 92 strikeouts rank fifth and their opponent batting average ranks sixth.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Single-A Ft. Myers infielder Royce Lewis and Ft. Myers right-handed pitcher Edwar Colina have been named Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Lewis, who played in the SiriusXM Futures Game at Progressive Field on Sunday, played in four games for the Miracle late this week, hitting . 353 ( 6 -for-17) with two home runs, three RBI and two walks...Colina made the start on Wednesday vs. Daytona, pitching 7.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, no walks and eight strikeouts.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2014. Target Field hosted the Home Run Derby as part of the 85th Midsummer classic...Yoenis Cespedes was the winner hitting a total of 28 home runs...second place Todd Frazier hit 10 total, Jose Bautista hit 14, Giancarlo Stanton hit six, Adam Jones hit seven, Troy Tulowitzki hit six, Josh Donaldson hit three, Justin Morneau hit two, Brian Dozier hit two and Yasiel Puig hit none...the contest started late due to rain.

ROOTED IN OAKLAND: Berríos was handed his fifth loss of the year as the Twins fell to the Athletics on Independence Day after allowing three runs on six hits over 5.0 innings pitched in a 7-2 Twins loss... the 5.0 innings marked the shortest start of his season, and he snapped a seven-game quality start streak dating back to May 24 vs. Chicago-AL...allowed just two baserunners through the first three innings, but scattered five hits, including a solo home run to Marcus Semien, over his final two...exited down 3-2, but the Twins' offense wasn't able to muster anymore runs, while Semien would launch an eighth-inning grand slam to seal the Twins' fate...threw $58.1 \%$ strikes, his worst showing this year.
BERRÍOS FIRES SCORELESS INNING IN ASG: Berríos was selected to his second consecutive All-Star Game as he replaced the injured Jake Odorizzi...José was handed the ball in the third inning, and following a leadoff double to Arizona's Ketel Marte, he would shut down the next three batters: a strikeout of 2018 NL Rookie of the Year Ronald Acuña Jr., another of 2018 NL Most Valuable Player Christian Yelich and a fly out recorded by his brother-in-law Javier Báez.
玉 Berríos became the first Twin to pitch a scoreless inning in back-to-back All-Star Games since Joe Nathan in 2008-09.

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 3.00 ERA through 18 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019. 2017-18-58 GMMES

*Berríos is tied for second in the American League (T-4th in MLB) behind Gerrit Cole (15) with 14 quality starts, while 15 out of his 18 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including seven $7.0+$ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 89 career starts, Berríos has an even 44 quality starts ( 49.4 percent).
YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the great young pitchers in Twins history... his 3.00 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 ( 2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 23 walks in 18 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an $8.00 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ ratio (104 S0), and is looking to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a S0/9 ratio north of 8.00 , joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07). Note: Kyle Gibson and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have SO/9 rates higher than 8.00 , would become first trio of Twins to do so in the same season.

- Owns 494 career strikeouts...if he records six today, would become first pitcher in Senators/Twins history to reach 500 strikeouts in 91 career games or fewer (fastest: Bert Blyleven in 92 games, reached on August 4, 1972 at The Met)...will also become the eighth Twin to do so at 25 -or-younger, first since Johan Santana in 2004.

BELIEVELAND. Berríos is making his third start of the season against indians against the Tribe so far, winning both decisions while pitching to a sparkling 0.66 ERA (13.2 IP 1 $E R$ ), including 6.0 innings of two-run ball (one earned) in his last start at Progressive Field on June 6, a 5-4 Twins win...is 5-2 lifetime against Cleveland, and hasn't lost to the Indians since Sept. 11, 2016 at Target Field (six starts, 4-0, 2.45 ERA since).

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact off the bat of his opponents for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 86.0 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.1) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.4), (min. 500 batted balls).

HAVE A DE: The Puerto Rican right-hander is making his eighth day-game start of the year, and is 4-2 with a 2.58 ERA ( $45.1 \mathrm{IP}, 13 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 42 strikeouts in those outings...among AL starters with at least five day-starts, he ranks seventh in opponents' OPS (.572), 11th in ERA, tied for ninth in opponents' batting average (.200, 33-for-165) and tied for 12th in earned runs allowed.
