THE TWINS: The Twins began their "second half" with a series win over the Indians last weekend, winning games one and two, followed by a loss to the Mets last night...today the Twins will play the second of two with New York...tomorrow night they will begin a four-game series vs. Oakland from Thursday-Sunday and three vs. New York-AL July 22-24...19 of the Twins next 31 games are vs. teams above .500...all those opponents have a combined winning percentage of .513.

TWINS MEET THE METS: The Twins lost to the Mets last night by a score of 3-2...Michael Pineda (6-5) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs (1 earned) on six hits with no walks and six strikeouts...the bullpen combined for 3.0 scoreless innings...the offense recorded eight hits and walked five times...Jonathan Schoop hit his 15th home run, the fifth Twin with 15 homers this season...Twins went 1-for-9 with RISP and left 10 men on base.

THREE'S COMPANY: The Twins are looking to avoid losing three straight tonight for the first time all season...they have lost two straight nine different times...they are the only team in baseball yet to lose three-straight...date-wise and game-wise, this marks the latest into a season for the Twins to not have lost three-in-a-row...below are the latest dates in a season for the Twins to drop three-in-a-row:

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Previous MLB team to go this deep into a season without a three-game losing streak was the 2009 Dodgers, who lost four straight from July 26-29, in games 98-101 (credit Elias).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 3-5 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-2 vs. New York and 1-1 vs. Milwaukee...they are 214-196 all-time in IL play, the eighth most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (246), New York-AL (244), Los Angeles-AL (233), Texas (224), Oakland (222), Detroit (217) and Chicago-AL (215).

- ☞ Twins are 14-7 in their last 21 IL games at home.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .324 (44-for-136) with 11 doubles, eight home runs and 20 RBI in his last 33 games vs. NL opponents.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .351 (46-for-131) with a .941 OPS in 38 career games vs. NL teams.
- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .313 (56-for-179) with 13 doubles, 11 home runs, 36 RBI and a .940 OPS in 66 career IL games.

TWINS AND METS: The Twins are 8-13 all-time vs. the Mets, going 3-3 at Shea Stadium, 3-0 at the Metrodome, 2-6 at Citi Field, 0-4 at Target Field...Twins are just 1-9 vs. the Mets dating back to June of 2010.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .364 (12-for-33) with two doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks and a .476 OBP in his career vs. Vargas.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 172 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (164), already surpassing their 2018 total of 166 home runs...172 homers already are tied for ninth most in club history...they need 53 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they have a plus +59 home run differential, which also leads baseball.

- ☞ Jonathan Schoop hit his 15th home run last night giving the Twins five players with 15-plus (Max Kepler - 23, Eddie Rosario - 20, C.J. Cron - 17 and Nelson Cruz - 17)...only three other teams in baseball have at least five players with 15-plus (Chicago-NL - 6, Atlanta - 5 and Boston - 5).

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .294 (252-for-857) with 43 doubles, 45 home runs, 74 walks and an .865 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank second in OPS (Houston - .882).

- ☞ Individuals vs. LHP this season: Luis Arraez is hitting .391 (9-for-23)...Mitch Garver is hitting .353 (18-for-51)...C.J. Cron is hitting .369 (31-for-84) with seven home runs...Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .324 (23-for-71)...Ehire Adrianza is hitting .303 (10-for-33).

LEAVE THE BROOMS ON YOUR BUS: The Twins are looking to avoid being swept for the first time all season...the last time they were swept came in three games from September 3-5, 2018 at Houston...they are the only team in baseball yet to suffer a sweep...by this date last season, they had been swept five times.

ALL AR-RAEZ: Since being recalled back to Minnesota on June 18, Luis Arraez is hitting .389 (28-for-72) with four doubles, one home run, four RBI, 10 runs scored, seven walks, a .443 on-base percentage and a .929 OPS...among all rookies with a minimum of 70 plate appearances since that date, he ranks first in batting average, second in on-base percentage and tied for third in hits.

- ☞ Arraez has 37 hits through his first 30 career games, tied for fourth most in Twins history through 30: Kirby Puckett (42 in 1984), Kennys Vargas (40 in 2014), Chuck Knoblauch (38 in 1991), Danny Santana (37 in 2014).

FANS ON TARGET: Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,135,864 this season, trailing New York (2,005,933), Los Angeles (1,796,497), Boston (1,665,879), Houston (1,609,247) and Texas (1,383,045)...through games of May 9, the Twins had the third lowest attendance in the AL at 269,493, averaging 16,843 per date...they now have drawn 30,000+ in 11 of their last 14 home games.

IT'S A MIDWEST THING: The Midwest League and MiLB.com announced recently that Single-A Cedar Rapids right-pitcher Kai-Wei Teng has been named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the period ending July 14...Teng allowed five hits with 10 strikeouts in 6.0 IP in a no-decision, against Lansing on Sunday...Teng signed as a non-drafted free agent out of Taichung, Taiwan October of 2017...marks the second consecutive week a Kernels pitcher has been named MWL Pitcher of the Week (Andrew Cabezas) and third Kernel to win MWL weekly honors.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1990, the Twins became the first team in baseball history to turn two triple plays in the same game...both were started on grounders to third baseman Gary Gaetti...the Twins lost to the Red Sox at Fenway Park, 1-0.

- Twins 'pen is 17-11-27 with a 4.16 ERA (314.0 IP, 145 ER) with 44 holds, 120 walks & 327 strikeouts this season (93 games)...allowing a .246 opp. batting avg. (298-for-1210).
In seven Interleague games this season, the bullpen has gone 2-1 with a 6.00 ERA (30.0 IP, 20 ER) with 23 walks & 26 strikeouts (Twins are 3-5 in those games).
Have allowed two earned runs in 15.0 innings since the All-Star break (1.20 ERA)...last year, Twins relievers pitched to a 4.15 ERA (273.1 IP, 126 ER) and a .242 BAA in the second half.
Twins 'pen has gone 1-1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 5 ER) with 2 holds, four walks & 10 strikeouts in three Interleague games at home this season vs. 1-0 with a 6.43 ERA (21.0 IP, 15 ER) with four holds, 19 walks & 16 strikeouts in five Interleague games on the road this season.
