THE TWINS: The Twins began their "second half" with a series win over the Indians last weekend, winning games one and two, followed by a loss to the Mets last night...today the Twins will play the second of two with New York...tomorrow night they will begin a four-game series vs. Oakland from Thursday-Sunday and three vs. New York-AL July 22-24...19 of the Twins next 31 games are vs. teams above .500...all those opponents have a combined winning percentage of .513.

TWINS MEET THE METS: The Twins lost to the Mets last night by a score of 3-2...Michael Pineda (6-5) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs (1 earned) on six hits with no walks and six strikeouts...the bullpen combined for 3.0 scoreless innings...the offense recorded eight hits and walked five times...Jonathan Schoop hit his 15th home run, the fifth Twin with 15 homers this season...Twins went 1-for-9 with RISP and left 10 men on base.

THREE'S COMPANY: The Twins are looking to avoid losing three straight tonight for the first time all season...they have lost two straight nine different times...they are the only team in baseball yet to lose three-straight...date-wise and game-wise, this marks the latest into a season for the Twins to not have lost three-in-a-row...below are the latest dates in a season for the Twins to drop three-in-a-row:

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Previous MLB team to go this deep into a season without a three-game losing streak was the 2009 Dodgers, who lost four straight from July 26-29, in games 98-101 (credit Elias).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 3-5 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 at Philadelphia, 1-2 vs. New York and 1-1 vs. Milwaukee...they are 214-196 all-time in IL play, the eighth most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (246), New York-AL (244), Los Angeles-AL (233), Texas (224), Oakland (222), Detroit (217) and Chicago-AL (215).

▼ Twins are 14-7 in their last 21 IL games at home.

▼ Eddie Rosario is hitting .324 (44-for-136) with 11 doubles, eight home runs and 20 RBI in his last 33 games vs. NL opponents.

▼ Jorge Polanco is hitting .351 (46-for-131) with a .941 OPS in 38 career games vs. NL teams.

▼ C.J. Cron is hitting .313 (56-for-179) with 13 doubles, 11 home runs, 36 RBI and a .940 OPS in 66 career IL games.

TWINS AND METS: The Twins are 8-13 all-time vs. the Mets, going 3-3 at Shea Stadium, 3-0 at the Metrodome, 2-6 at Citi Field, 0-4 at Target Field...Twins are just 1-9 vs. the Mets dating back to June of 2010.

To Nelson Cruz is hitting .364 (12-for-33) with two doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks and a .476 OBP in his career vs. Vargas.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 172 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (164), already surpassing their 2018 total of 166 #BUMBASQUAD: The TWINS 1/2 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (164), already surpassing their 2018 total of 166 home runs...172 homers already are tied for ninth most in club history...they need 53 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they have a plus +59 home run differential, which also leads baseball.

Jonathan Schoop hit his 15th home run last night giving the Twins five players with 15-plus (Max Kepler - 23, Eddie Rosario - 20, C.J. Cron - 17 and Nelson Cruz - 17)...only three other teams in baseball have at least five players with 15-plus (Chicago-NL - 6, Atlanta - 5 and Boston - 5).

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .294 (252-for-857) with 43 doubles, 45 home runs, 74 walks and an .865 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank second in OPS (Houston - .882).

▼ Individuals vs. LHP this season: Luis Arraez is hitting .391 (9-for-23)...Mitch Garver is hitting .353 (18-for-51)...C.J. Cron is hitting .369 (31-for-84) with seven home runs...Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .324 (23-for-71)...Ehire Adrianza is hitting .303 (10-for-33).

LEAVE THE BROOMS ON YOUR BUS: The Twins are looking to avoid being swept for the first time all season...the last time they were swept came in three games from September 3-5, 2018 at Houston...they are the only team in baseball yet to suffer a sweep...by this date last season, they had been swept five times.

ALL AR-RAEZ: Since being recalled back to Minnesota on June 18, Luis Arraez is hitting .389 (28-for-72) with four doubles, one home run, four RBI, 10 runs scored, seven walks, a .443 on-base percentage and a .929 OPS...among all rookies with a minimum of 70 plate appearances since that date, he ranks first in batting average, second in on-base percentage and tied for third in hits.

◆ Arraez has 37 hits through his first 30 career games, tied for fourth most in Twins history through 30: Kirby Puckett (42 in 1984), Kennys Vargas (40 in 2014), Chuck Knoblauch (38 in 1991), Danny Santana (37 in 2014).

FANS ON TARGET: Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,135,864 this season, trailing New York (2,005,933), Los Angeles (1,796,497), Boston (1,665,879), Houston (1,609,247) and Texas (1,383,045)...through games of May 9, the Twins had the third lowest attendance in the AL at 269,493, averaging 16,843 per date...they now have drawn 30,000+ in 11 of their last 14 home games.

IT'S A MIDWEST THING: The Midwest League and MiLB.com announced recently that Single-A Cedar Rapids right-pitcher Kai-Wei Teng has been named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the period ending July 14...Teng allowed five hits with 10 strikeouts in 6.0 IP in a no-decision, against Lansing on Sunday...Teng signed as a non-drafted free agent out of Taichung, Taiwan October of 2017...marks the second consecutive week a Kernels pitcher has been named MWL Pitcher of the Week (Andrew Cabezas) and third Kernel to win MWL weekly honors.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1990, the Twins became the first team in baseball history to turn two triple plays in the same game... both were started on grounders to third baseman Gary Gaetti...the Twins lost to the Red Sox at Fenway Park, 1-0.

TEXAS, FOREVER: In his last start July 5, Pérez got back to his winning ways as he, aided by a 15-run outburst by the offense, conquered the Rangers 15-6...snapped a six-start winless streak, dating back to May 23 at Los Angeles-AL...the stat line (6.0 IP, season-high tying 7 H, 4 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO) doesn't do his outing justice, as the lefty cruised through his first 6.0 innings, scattering four hits and not allowing a run before he began the seventh inning with a walk, two singles and a double and exited with two men on and no outs. (reliever Ryne Harper allowed both runners to eventually score in a five-run seventh inning)

• It was Pérez's first start against the Rangers since signing with the Twins this past offseason...he had previously spent all 11 years of his professional career in Texas' organization, including parts of seven seasons with the big league club.

QUALITY QUARTET: Pérez has won eight games this season (seven as a starter)...Pérez, Jake Odorizzi (11), Kyle Gibson (8) and José Berríos (8) are the first quartet of Twins to reach eight wins in a season since 2015 (Gibson, Phil Hughes, Trevor May and Tommy Milone)... the five members of the rotation (including Michael Pineda) each have 85 strikeouts or more through 93 team games, making them the first five-man starting rotation in Twins history to record 85-plus strikeouts apiece through 93 games of any Twins season ever.

OVER THE WALL, A MAN GETS ONLY WHAT HE EARNS: Pérez has surrendered just seven home runs this season in 95.0 innings of work, **giving him a 0.66 HR/9 IP rate, which ranks third in all of baseball** behind only Washington's Max Scherzer (0.63, 9 HR in 129.1 IP) and Atlanta's Mike Soroka (0.37, 4 HR in 96.1 IP)...he also ranks tied for seventh in baseball (4th in the AL) with 25 extra-base hits allowed, (min. 15 starts).

AMAZIN': Pérez is making his second career start against the New York Mets, first since August 9, 2017 at Citi Field...in that outing, he earned the win with 8.0 innings of one-run ball, scattering three hits with five strikeouts

- He did face the Mets earlier this year in Queens, but it came in relief on April 10 as he allowed three runs on three hits and two walks over just 2.0 innings in a 9-6 Twins loss.
- Lifetime, is 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA against New York-NL, with a BAA of .171 (6-for-35).

NATIONAL (LEAGUE) TREASURE: Pérez enters today's start with a 6-7 record against National League opponents in 23 games (20 starts), but his teams are 14-9 in those games. 4.14 ERA (128.1 IP, 59 ER) with 79 strikeouts, but a total of 39 extra-base hits out of 131 total.

• Is making his first start against a National League opponent this season, but his third appearance, as he pitched twice on the Twins' initial roadtrip of the season in Philadelphia and Flushing against these Mets, allowing a combined five runs (four earned) in 4.2 IP of relief.

HOME COOKIN': Pérez is set to make his third consecutive start at Target Field, and fifth in his last six starts...has fared much better at home this season, pitching to a 4-2 record with a 3.71 ERA (53.1 IP, 22 ER) and an opponents' slash line of .239/.297/.328 in nine games (8 starts) in Minneapolis, while he owns a 4.97 ERA (41.2 IP, 23 ER) in nine games (7 starts) on the road this year.

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .194 (42-for-216) with an OPS of .516 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .324 average (48-for-148) with a .890 OPS when pitching out of the stretch... with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .329 (28-for-85) with nine XBH and 39 RBI with RISP, including .378 (17-for-45) and 22 RBI with RISP and two outs.

- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP. Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER). Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting
- a career-best in strikeouts (115).
 His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and
- the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels. Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball Ameri-
- ca as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
