**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 0-2 to begin their nine-game homestand, losing a two-game series to the Mets this week...they will continue the homestand tonight with the first of four vs. Oakland...after this series, the Twins will host the Yankees for three games from Monday-Wednesday...18 of the Twins next 30 games are vs. teams above .500...all those opponents have a combined winning percentage of .513.

**TWINS SUFFER FIRST SWEEP:** The Twins lost to the Mets yesterday afternoon by a score of 14-4, allowing 12 runs between innings 7-9...it marked their first sweep since September 3-5, 2018, losing three at Houston...Martin Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs (1 earned) on five hits in 6.0 innings pitched...infielder Ehire Adrianza made his first career pitching appearance, allowing three runs on five hits in 1.0 inning - the 23rd time a position player has pitched for the Twins and 14th different player...the offense recorded eight hits, two from Mitch Garver, who hit his 15th home run.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** The Twins have lost three straight for the first time all season...they were the last team in baseball to lose three straight...date-wise and game-wise, it marks the latest into a season for the Twins to have lost three-in-a-row...below are the latest dates in a season for the Twins to drop three-in-a-row:

**ADDITIONAL NOTES:** Previous MLB team to go this deep into a season without a three-game losing streak was the 2009 Dodgers, who lost four straight from July 26-29, in games 98-101 (credit Elias).  
 ☞ The Twins last four-game losing streak came September 1-5, 2018, losing five straight.

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Twins announced today that they have recalled right-handed pitcher Kohl Stewart from Triple-A Rochester...Stewart, who will be in his fifth stint with the Twins this season, appeared in four games with Minnesota, going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (17.1 IP, 8 ER), five walks and four strikeouts...in 14 games (13 starts) for the Red Wings this season, he has gone 5-5 with a 6.28 ERA (61.2 IP, 43 ER), 33 walks and 58 strikeouts...to make room for Stewart on the 25-man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Matt Magill for release or assignment...Magill appeared in 28 games this season, going 2-0 with a 4.45 ERA (28.1 IP, 14 ER), 15 walks and 36 strikeouts.

**TWINS-A's:** The Twins and Athletics are playing each other for the fourth of seven times this season...their last meeting came July 2-4 in Oakland as the Twins won the middle game of the three-game series...the Twins have gone 14-29 vs. the A's since the start of 2013 for a winning percentage of just .326, the Twins' second lowest winning percentage against any team since (New York-AL - .302).

☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .315 (34-for-108) with six doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, 15 runs scored and an .805 OPS in 28 career games vs. the A's...he enters tonight with an eight-game hitting streak vs. Oakland.

☞ Nelson Cruz leads all active players with 34 home runs against the Athletics...also leads with 115 RBI, is second with 172 games played and third with 168 hits.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .347 (25-for-72) with four doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.051 OPS in his last 19 games vs. Oakland.

**#BOMBASQUAD:** The Twins 174 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (164), already surpassing their 2018 total of 166 home runs...174 homers already are ninth-most in club history...they need 51 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they have a plus +58 home run differential, which also leads baseball.

☞ Mitch Garver hit his 15th home run yesterday giving the Twins six players with 15-plus (Max Kepler - 23, Eddie Rosario - 20, Nelson Cruz - 18, C.J. Cron - 17, Jonathan Schoop - 15)...the Chicago Cubs are the only other team in baseball with six players having 15-plus homers...Jorge Polanco and Miguel Sanó have both hit 13.

☞ The Twins have had six players with 15+ homers four other times outside of this season: 2017, 1965, 1964 and 1963.

**ARRAEZ AND SHINE:** Since being recalled back to Minnesota on June 18, Luis Arraez is hitting .382 (29-for-76) with four doubles, one home run, four RBI, 10 runs scored, seven walks, a .434 on-base percentage and a .907 OPS...among all rookies with a minimum of 70 plate appearances since that date, he ranks first in batting average and on-base percentage, and tied for third in hits.

☞ Arraez has reached safely in 11 consecutive games and hit safely in 10 straight, the fourth longest active hit-streak in baseball...Arraez's second 10-game hit-streak this season.

**FANS ON TARGET:** Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,170,988 this season, trailing New York (2,005,933), Los Angeles (1,832,235), Boston (1,700,732), Houston (1,609,247) and Texas (1,409,726)...through games of May 9, the Twins had the third lowest attendance in the AL at 269,493, averaging 16,843 per date...they now have drawn 30,000+ in 12 of their last 15 home games.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, TORII:** Torii Hunter is celebrating his 44th birthday today...Hunter appeared in 12 games on his birthday throughout his career, hitting .262 (11-for-42) with three doubles, two home runs and six RBI.

### THIS AND THAT:

☞ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in 13 consecutive games with a plate appearance, posting a .412 OBP during that span.

☞ Nelson Cruz has 11 home runs in 31 games since June 5, tied for sixth most in the AL since that date.

☞ Cruz has 378 career home runs, tied for 74th on baseball's all-time list, tied with Oakland's third base coach Matt Williams...next: Orlando Cepeda and Tony Perez with 379, Albert Belle with 381, and Frank Howard, Ryan Howard and Jim Rice with 382.

☞ Twins defense has committed seven errors in their last six games.

Is batting .385 (15-for-39) with RISP, including 19 RBI and a 1.160 OPS.
Despite missing 16 games with a high left ankle sprain, his 13 home runs were the third-most ever by a Twins catcher before the All-Star break, trailing Earl Battey's 17 in 1963 and Joe Mauer's 15 in 2009...additionally, his .609 slugging percentage was the second-best, behind Mauer's .622 also in 2009.
Ranks T-4th among AL among catchers in HR (15) & 6th in total bases (105), T-10th in hits (50), T-10th in 2B (8) & 5th in XBH (24) this season.

Batting .273 w/ an .834 OPS (13 XBH, 35 hits, 12 walks) at home...is also batting .254 (16-for-63) with runners in scoring position this year.
Tied w/ Buxton for team-lead in OF assists (5)...21 as team ranks T-4th in MLB (w/ Marlins).
Has hit safely in 20 of his last 30 games with 10 multi-hit games, batting .304 (34-for-112) with seven doubles, five home runs and 14 RBI (Twins are 16-14 in those games).
Is now slashing .263/.326/.420 with 23 XBH, 33 R & 31 RBI in 74 games this season.
Has played 1B (10), 2B (2), SS (1), 3B (37), LF (15), RF (16) and DH (2) this year, becoming the fourth player in Twins history to play at least one game at each position in a season, joining Trevor Plouffe (2012), Denny Hocking (5 seasons from 1997-2003) & Jeff Reboulet (1994 & '96).

MAX KEPLER - OF #26

- Career 3-for-17 vs. Mike Fiers (3 H, 1 BB)...hitting .200 (3-for-15) in three games vs. OAK in '19.
Ranks 1st among AL leadoff hitters in homers (22) and 3rd in RBI (49), T-3rd in 2B (18), 3rd in slugging (.558), 4th in OPS (.890) and 9th in hits (74).
Among Twins ranks -1st in runs (59), 2nd in hits (90), 3rd in 2B (22) & 1st in HR (23).
Became the 1st player ever to hit a HR in five straight at-bats vs. a pitcher (Trevor Bauer) in a single season - 3 HR (6/6) & 2 HR (7/13)...became the 2nd Twin to hit 5 in same season, joining Michael Cuddyer, who hit five off White Sox lefty John Danks in 2009.
21 home runs pre-ASG were tied for the most by any Twins outfielder in history (Allison, 2x, last: 1964) and Hisle (1977)...his 77 home runs were the sixth-most of any Twin through 500 career games (list includes Miguel Sanó, who has 97 home runs through 425 games).
Joined Rosario (20) as second Twins duo all-time w/ 20+ HR pre-ASG, joining Harmon Killebrew (30) and Bob Allison (21) in 1964.
