THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-2 to begin their nine-game homestand, losing a two-game series to the Mets, followed by a win over the A's last night...they will continue the homestand tonight with the second of four vs. Oakland...after this series, the Twins will host the Yankees for three games from Monday-Wednesday...17 of the Twins next 29 games are vs. teams above .500...all those opponents have a combined winning percentage of .515.

ED-DIE! ED-DIE! ED-DIE!: The Twins beat the A's last night by a score of 6-3...Kyle Gibson (9-4) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on six hits in 7.0 innings pitched...Taylor Rogers earned his 14th save with 2.0 scoreless innings - his eighth career save of more than three outs...the offense recorded nine hits and walked five times...Eddie Rosario hit a three-run pinch hit homer in the seventh inning (3rd PH HR of career), down 3-1, giving the Twins a one run lead...Mitch Garver (16) and C.J. Cron (18) each added solo homers in the eighth inning.

TWINS-A's: The Twins and Athletics are playing each other for the fifth of seven times this season...the Twins have gone 15-29 vs. the A's since the start of 2013 for a winning percentage of just .341, the Twins' second lowest winning percentage against any team since (New York-AL - .302)...Twins are looking to win consecutive games vs. Oakland for the first time since winning four straight July 5, 2016-May 3, 2017.

☞ Nelson Cruz leads all active players with 34 home runs against the Athletics...also leads with 115 RBI, is second with 173 games played and third with 169 hits.
 ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .342 (26-for-76) with four doubles, one triple, six home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.063 OPS in his last 20 games vs. Oakland.
 ☞ Twins are 18-9 vs. the AL West this season for a winning percentage of .667...the winning percentage is tied with their 2010 mark (24-12) for their best ever.

WE'RE BRINGIN' BOMBAS BACK: The Twins 177 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Seattle (167)...they have homered in 77 of 95 games, going 51-26 in those games...177 homers already are ninth-most in club history...they need 48 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...the Twins have hit three-plus homers 25 times this season, going 21-4 in those games.

☞ Twins hitters have a launch angle of 25 degrees-or-higher 129 times this season on home runs, the most in baseball.
 ☞ Twins have an exit velocity of 100-plus mph on 150 of their home runs this season, the most in baseball.
 ☞ Twins have hit 96 homers 400-plus feet, the most in baseball.

ADDITIONALLY: The staff as a whole, at home, rank first in the AL in opponent OPS (.669) and walks allowed (112), second in ERA (3.36) and third in WHIP (1.17).

TWINNING: Miguel Sanó and Luis Arraez both enter tonight with on-base/hitting streaks:
 ☞ Arraez has reached safely in 12 consecutive games and hit safely in 11 straight, the second longest active hit-streak in baseball, trailing Matt Olson (13)...during the on-base streak, he is hitting .348 (16-for-46) with four doubles, one home run, seven runs scored, a .400 on-base percentage and a .900 OPS.
 ☞ Miguel Sanó has reached safely in 14 straight games (with an at-bat)...tied for the fifth longest streak of his career, his longest being 21 from September 7-30, 2015...during the streak, he is hitting .340 (16-for-47) with three doubles, one triple, four home runs, 10 RBI, 11 runs scored, eight walks, a .436 on-base percentage and a 1.138 OPS.

CATCHERS CRUSHING: Catchers Williams Astudillo (IL), Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .316 (100-for-316) with 19 doubles, 27 home runs, 68 RBI, 31 walks and 73 runs scored when catching...at catcher, Castro has made 44 starts, Garver has made 38 starts, while Astudillo has made 13 starts...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: first in home runs, slugging percentage (.572) and OPS (.923), second in batting average and RBI (49), tied for second in hits, and fourth in OBP (.351).

☞ The 27 home runs are the most in club history for catchers...second most is 23, done in 2009, all from Joe Mauer during his MVP season (Mauer hit 4 as a DH and 1 as a PH that season, finishing with 28 total).

EXTRA! EXTRA!: The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base in 49 straight games, dating back to May 20...it marks the 15th longest XBH hit streak in club history...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009...for the season, the Twins rank first in baseball in extra-base hits with 388, ahead of Boston and Los Angeles-NL, each with 359.

FANS ON TARGET: Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,199,420 this season, trailing New York (2,005,933), Los Angeles (1,868,163), Boston (1,736,089), Houston (1,609,247) and Texas (1,409,726)...through games of May 9, the Twins had the third lowest attendance in the AL at 269,493, averaging 16,843 per date...they now have drawn 30,000+ in 12 of their last 16 home games.

THIS AND THAT:

- ☞ Twins are seeking their 60th win tonight...they reached 60 wins in 2018 on August 21 (60-65).
- ☞ Nelson Cruz has 11 home runs in 32 games since June 5, tied for sixth most in the AL since that date.
- ☞ Cruz has 378 career home runs, tied for 74th on baseball's all-time list, tied with Oakland's third base coach Matt Williams...next: Orlando Cepeda and Tony Perez with 379, Albert Belle with 381, and Frank Howard, Ryan Howard and Jim Rice with 382.
- ☞ Twins defense has committed nine errors in their last seven games.
- ☞ The Twins have struck out 770 times this season, the fifth fewest in baseball (Oakland fourth fewest with 751).
- ☞ The Twins have seen 3.80 pitchers-per-plate appearance, the third lowest rate in baseball.
- ☞ Taylor Rogers has a 10.2-scoreless inning streak (3rd in AL), Zack Littell has a 10.0-scoreless inning streak (T5th in AL)...the AL active leader is Liam Hendriks with 18.0 straight scoreless innings.
- ☞ The first 10,000 fans in attendance receive the second in a set of four commemorative Joe Mauer bobbleheads...tonight's bobblehead features a 21-year-old Mauer making his major league debut as the Twins starting catcher on April 5, 2004.
- ☞ Twins are 9-1 in their last 10 Friday games...they are 5-0 on Fridays at home this season.

CAREER YEAR CONTINUES: In his 18th start of the season, Odorizzi matched his career high with his 11th victory of the campaign, pitching the Twins past Trevor Bauer and the Indians, 6-2 last Saturday at Progressive Field...

- Jake tossed 5.1 innings of three-hit ball in Cleveland, allowing only a second-inning, solo homer to José Ramírez (2 BB, 2 SO)...four relievers combined for 3.2-scoreless frames, while three Twins homers off Bauer (two by Max Kepler) and three RBI from Jake Cave led to the win.
• Odo snapped a three-start winless streak, as he had gone 0-2 with a 8.76 ERA (12.1 IP, 12) between June 20-July 2 (Twins went 1-2).

LOOKING FOR A DOZEN: Tonight, Odorizzi has a chance for his 12th win in Minnesota's 96th game...the Twins have not had a pitcher win 12 games within the club's first 100 of the season since Carl Pavano in 2010, while there have been only 15 such occurrences in club history (since 1961).

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: Odorizzi, who averages 5.2 innings per start, is 1.0 inning shy of qualifying for league leaders entering tonight, aside from wins (will be among the qualifiers with 2.0 innings of work tonight)...what he has done in his 94.0 frames, however, has been among the very best in baseball...where he would rank, with 90.0 IP (note - each stat below, except opponents' OBP and FIP, would represent a full-season career high for Odo):

ODO ASG: Odorizzi was named to the AL All-Star team but did not pitch due to being on the Injured List with a blister on his right middle finger...at the break he was 10-4, 3.15 ERA (88.2 IP, 31 ER) with a .214 BAA...he ranked tied for third in the AL in wins, tied for sixth in BAA, and sixth in ERA.

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the AL for a right-handed batter to hit this season, yielding a league-low .145 batting average (26-for-179) and .488 OPS...only the Dodgers' Kenta Maeda has been better against righties in all of baseball, with a .144 batting average (27-for-188).

ON TARGET AT HOME: In his first eight home starts this season, Odorizzi is 6-0 with an AL-best 2.27 ERA (47.2 IP, 12 ER) and a .192 opponents' batting average (2nd in the AL, 33-for-172), along with 11 walks, 55 strikeouts and a 0.92 WHIP (2nd in the AL)...the Twins have won his last seven starts here at Target Field (only loss came March 30 to Cleveland, 2-1).

- In his first 22 home starts with the Twins, Odorizzi is 11-4 with a 3.79 ERA (128.1 IP, 54 ER) and a .235 opponents' average (114-for-486), with 41 walks and 136 strikeouts...the Twins are 17-7 when he takes the mound at Target Field.

AGAINST THE A'S: Odorizzi will face the A's for the second time this month, after suffering an 8-6 loss July 2 in Oakland (a start derailed by a blister issue)...after 2.0-scoreless innings, blister developed on his right middle finger and he surrendered a two-run homer to Matt Olson in the third and a grand slam to former Twin Chris Herrmann in the fourth...landed on the IL the next day.

- Is 1-4 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2 IP, 17 ER) in seven career starts vs. Oakland, including 0-2, 5.40 ERA (10.0 IP, 6 ER) in two starts with the Twins.
• Turned in a fantastic effort against the A's at Target Field last August 24, allowing two runs (one earned) on five hits over 7.0 innings...however, was the hard-luck loser after Oakland scored five runs off the Twins bullpen for a 7-1 victory.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), ranks third in the American League with 170 starts and ranks fourth with a .234 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (177) and Justin Verlander (173) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
• Chris Sale (.214), Verlander (.220) and Corey Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.9 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 57.9 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%). Below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
• Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
• Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
• On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
• Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
• Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.

10-SPOT: Any discussion of Odorizzi's 2019 season must include his brilliant two-month stretch between April 17 and June 15...Jake went 10-0 with a 1.52 ERA (65.0 IP, 11 ER) in 11 starts in that stretch (Twins were a perfect 11-0), with 15 walks, 70 strikeouts and a .209/.261/.289 opponents' slash line...marked the third-longest winning streak ever by a Twins starter (second-longest single-season run).

Ks AND Ws FOR GOOD: Odorizzi will donate \$50 per personal strikeout and \$50 per Twins win in 2019 to the Animal Humane Society (\$7,850 to date). Every year, Animal Humane Society cares for more than 23,000 animals in need and aids thousands more through programs that help people nurture and protect their pets.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS [SEASON: 8-5, 3.10 ERA // CAREER: 37-31, 4.14 ERA]

Berríos will take the mound tomorrow evening making his 20th start this season and his second against the Oakland A's...in his last start on July 14th at Cleveland, he did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs (all earned) on six hits with three walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings pitched...marked the first time he has allowed three walks in consecutive starts this season...over his career, he is 0-2, 6.32 ERA (15.2 IP, 11 ER) with six walks and 14 strikeouts vs. the A's...faced them last on July 4 and was given the loss after allowing the earned runs on six hits while only striking out two over 5.0 innings...his last start against Oakland at Target Field came August 26 of last season where he tossed 5.0 eight-hit innings while allowing three runs (all earned) and four strikeouts with zero walks.

- Twins 'pen is 17-12-28 with a 4.26 ERA (319.0 IP, 151 ER) with 44 holds, 121 walks & 332 strikeouts this season (95 games)...allowing a .252 opp. batting avg. (312-for-1240).
- In four games vs. OAK, Twins 'pen is 1-0-2 with an 3.38 ERA (16.0 IP, 6 ER) with six walks & 17 strikeouts...allowing a .262 opp. batting avg. (16-for-61), Twins are 2-2 in those 4 games this season.
- Most saves of more than three outs among Twins relievers since 2010: Taylor Rogers, 2019 (8), Bob Wells, 2000 (3), Brandon Kintzler, 2017 (3), Brandon Kintzler, 2016 (3), Glen Perkins, 2015 (3), Joe Nathan, 2007 (3), Eddie Guardado, 2001 (3) & LaTroy Hawkins, 2000 (3).
