THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game, seven-day roadtrip by dropping two of three games against the White Sox, losing 6-4 on Friday, winning 10-3 Saturday and falling 4-3 on Sunday...tonight they will play the series opener in Oakland...following tonight's game, they will play two more against the A's on Wednesday and Thursday before returning home for a three-game series against Texas this weekend to finish the first half of the season.

RAIN DELAYS GAME, OFFENSE IN SERIES LOSS: The Twins were unable to take Sunday's series finale in Chicago as they fell 4-3 in a 2:47 game, that also included a rain delay of nearly three hours...Lewis Thorpe (0-1) made his big league debut, firing 5.0 innings of two-run ball with seven strikeouts, but exited after the rain delay...the offense mustered just six hits, with Nelson Cruz's 16th home run of the season providing two of the three runs.

☞ Lewis Thorpe's seven strikeouts matched Devin Smeltzer (May 28 vs. MIL) for the most by a Twins rookie this season...they also tied Smeltzer and three others for the second-most strikeouts by a Twin in his ML debut, one shy of Boof Bonser's eight on May 21, 2006 at MIL...marked the first time in Senators/Twins history to have multiple rookies strikeout seven-plus batters in their debuts in the same season, and just the eighth pair in baseball history (Toronto's Trent Thornton and Jacob Waguespack did so earlier this year).

☞ With his home run in the seventh inning, Nelson Cruz tied Hall of Famer Carlton Fisk for 77th on MLB's all-time home run list with 376...his next home run will tie Norm Cash and Jeff Kent for 75th.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR, TOO: Twins starting pitcher Jake Odorizzi was elected a first-time All-Star, making the American League team as a result of the Player Ballot - a vote of his fellow players, along with managers and coaches...he will join starting shortstop Jorge Polanco in representing the Twins at the Midsummer Classic, July 9 at Progressive Field in Cleveland, Ohio.

ON THE VERGE OF PRE-ASG HISTORY: The Twins have hit 157 home runs through 83 games this season, with six games remaining before the All-Star Break...the 157 homers are four shy of the all-time pre-ASG record set by last season's New York Yankees (161), while they have already passed the all-time Twins pre-ASG record of 125, set back in 1964...similarly, the Twins own a team .496 slugging percentage, which ranks fifth-best in baseball history pre-All Star break...the club's 53 wins are one shy of the Senators/Twins record of 54 (done 3 times, last in 1970) through 83 games, while they need to win all six of their remaining matchups this week to tie the franchise record of 59 pre-All Star Game wins, set back in 1969 (59-37).

TWINS AND ATHLETICS: The Twins and Athletics are playing each other for the first of seven times this season, with two more games here tomorrow and Thursday and a four-game series in Minneapolis beginning July 18...since 2010, the Twins are 27-39 against Oakland, including 10-21 here...last season, the Twins won the first and final games of the season series, with the A's winning all five matchups in the middle.

☞ Ehire Adrianza is slashing .417/.481/.583 (1.065 OPS) with four doubles and six runs scored in nine career games against Oakland, including going 5-for-12, with all four doubles, here last season.

☞ Jonathan Schoop is 31-for-99 (.313) career against the A's, with three home runs, six doubles, 12 RBI, 14 runs scored and an .817 OPS in 26 games...enters with a six-game hitting streak against Oakland.

☞ Nelson Cruz leads all active players with 34 home runs against the Athletics...also leads with 115 RBI, is second with 170 games played and third with 165 hits.

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins announced today that they have returned left-handed pitcher Adalberto Mejia from his rehab assignment and reinstated him from the 60-day Injured List...Mejia, who missed the Twins' last 56 games with a right calf strain, has allowed 12 runs (11 earned) with 11 strikeouts in 11.1 innings in 11 major league games this season...in six rehab appearances between Single-A Ft. Myers (2 games) and Double-A Pensacola (4 games), the left-hander threw 7.0 scoreless innings, scattering four hits and a walk with 10 strikeouts.

☞ To make room on the 40-man roster, the Twins have outrighted infielder Ronald Torreyes to Triple-A Rochester...Torreyes, 26, has played in 27 games between Single-A Ft. Myers and Rochester, batting a combined .179 (19-for-106) with four doubles, five home runs, 19 RBI and a .578 OPS.

☞ Mejia will take the place of Lewis Thorpe, who was optioned to Rochester yesterday, on the 25-man roster.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 27-16 on the road this season, the most road wins in baseball...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 271-212...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018 and didn't record their 28th road win until September 19 at Detroit...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Odorizzi is a first-time All-Star, making the American League team as a result of the Player Ballot - a vote of his fellow players, along with managers and coaches...he will join starting shortstop Jorge Polanco in representing the Twins at the Midsummer Classic, July 9 at Progressive Field in Cleveland.

- Odo enters tonight's start ranked among AL leaders in several categories (please see below)...he went 10-0 with a 1.52 ERA (65.0 IP, 11 ER) in 11 starts between April 17 and June 15 (Twins were a perfect 11-0), establishing a new career-long winning streak.

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the AL for a right-handed batter to hit this season, yielding league-lows for batting average (.151, 25-for-166) and OPS (.495)...only the Dodgers' Kenta Maeda has been better against righties in all of baseball, with a .145 average (23-for-159) and a .460 OPS.

ONE AWAY FROM 900: Odorizzi, who has a career-high rate of 9.88 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings through his first 16 starts (85.2 IP, 94 SO) is one punchout shy of 900 for his career (899 entering tonight)...with his next K, he will become the 55th active player with 900 career strikeouts.

FOR THE WIN: At 10-3, Odorizzi has surpassed his wins total for all of his 2018 debut season with the Twins (7-10 in 32 starts) and is one shy of matching his career-high 11 (with Tampa Bay in 2014).

- Will make his third attempt tonight at becoming the first Twins pitcher since Joe Mays in 2001 to win 11 games before the All-Star Break...there have been only 11 Twins pitchers (14 occurrences) to win at least 11 games during the season's first half (Frank Viola holds the club record by going 14-2 in 1988).

LAST TIME OUT: Odorizzi toed the rubber opposite fellow All-Star Charlie Morton of Tampa Bay last Wednesday at Target Field, an eventual 6-4 Twins win...Odo was staked to a 3-0, first-inning lead, but surrendered a season-high-tying two home runs and departed in the sixth with the score tied 3-3 (5.1 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO)...Nelson Cruz delivered a two-out, three-run, bases-clearing double in the bottom of the seventh to erase a 4-3 deficit and pin Morton with the loss.

- Including the final victory of his 10-game winning streak, in which he allowed four runs to Kansas City in 6.0 innings on June 15, Odo is 1-1 with a 6.46 ERA (15.1 IP, 11 ER) over his last three starts...opponents are slashing .311/.358/.557 in those games, while he has allowed four of his eight home runs on the season and seven of his 16 extra-base hits.

STRAIGHT A'S: In his last three starts against the A's (one each in 2016, 2017 and 2018), Odorizzi has a 0.82 ERA (22.0 IP, 2 ER) and has held Oakland batters to a .149/.179/.203 slash line...however, he is just 1-1 in those efforts, as he has received only four runs of support.

- Owns a 2.95 lifetime ERA (36.2 IP, 12 ER) against Oakland in six starts, four of which have qualified as a quality start...is 1-3 vs. the A's, with his last win coming July 17, 2017.
- Is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (21.0 IP, 3 ER) in three career starts at the Oakland Coliseum...pitched Tampa Bay to a 3-2 win here on July 17, 2017, allowing just one hit - a solo HR to Kris Davis - over 7.0 innings (2 BB, 5 SO).
- Was a hard-luck loser to the A's last August 24 at Target Field, allowing one earned run in 7.0 innings (5 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 4 SO)...Oakland scored five times off the 'pen in a 7-1 win.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), ranks third in the American League with 168 starts and is tied for fourth with a .234 opponents' batting average since 2014.

- Only Rick Porcello (175) and Justin Verlander (171) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.213), Verlander (.220) and Corey Kluber (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.9 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 59.0 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%). Below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON [SEASON: 8-4, 4.21 ERA ; CAREER: 62-65, 4.44 ERA]

Gibson will make his 16th start and 17th appearance of the season tomorrow night...was slated to pitch Sunday in Chicago, but was pushed back after making his first career relief appearance in last Thursday's 18-inning game vs. Tampa Bay...after starting (and winning) the series opener June 25 vs. the Rays, was forced into a 1.0-inning relief stint in the finale (retired all three batters he faced in the 17th inning)...has career-best rates for strikeouts-per-9.0 innings (9.03, with 88 in 87.2 IP) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.83, with 23 walks)...is 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA (22.1 IP, 10 ER) in four career starts against Oakland...defeated the A's 5-1 here at the Coliseum last September 23, scattering seven hits over 7.1 innings of one-run ball.

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berrios (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
