THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-4 through six games on their nine-game homestand, going 0-2 vs. The Mets and 2-2 vs. the A's...they will continue the homestand tonight with the first of three night games against the Yankees...16 of the Twins next 26 games are against teams above .500...all those opponents have a combined winning percentage of .507.

KEPLER GETS STRAIGHT A'S: The Twins beat the Athletics yesterday afternoon by a score of 7-6, splitting the series at 2-2...Max Kepler recorded his second walk-off hit this season, singling in the bottom of the ninth inning...Michael Pineda was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on four hits in 5.1 innings pitched...the offense recorded 13 hits, three from Kepler, Luis Arraez and Ehire Adrianza...Kepler hit his 24th home run and Adrianza fell a home run short of the cycle...the game was played in 4:02, the fifth Twins game this season played in at least four hours...below are the fewest games to 60 wins in club history (since 1961):

NOTE: The Twins reached 60 wins last season on August 21 (60-65).

TWINS AND YANKEES: The Twins and Yankees are playing the fourth of six games this season...their last series came May 3-5 at Yankee Stadium as the Twins won the second of three games...Twins have gone just 3-10 in their last 13 vs. New York and 7-21 in their last 28...Twins won their last series at Target Field, taking two of three September 10-12, 2018.

- ☞ Jonathan Schoop has reached safely in his last nine games vs. the Yankees, hitting .351 (13-for-37) with six doubles and a walk during the streak.
- ☞ Miguel Sanó has 14 career hits vs. the Yankees, two doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, 11 runs scored and six walks...he has a .375 OBP, .694 SLG and a 1.069 OPS in those 13 career games...his slugging % is his best vs. any AL team and his OPS is second best (1.078 vs. TEX).
- ☞ Twins are looking to beat CC Sabathia for the first time since July 14, 2013 at Yankee Stadium...0-5 in their last five of his starts (Sabathia 3-0 since).
- ☞ Twins have a .654 (17-9) winning percentage against the AL East this season, highest in club history...6-0 vs. BAL, 1-2 vs. NYY, 4-3 vs. TOR, 5-2 vs. TB, 1-2 vs. BOS.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: The Twins 182 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL (173) and Milwaukee (169)...they have homered in 80 of 98 games, going 52-28 in those games...182 homers already are ninth-most in club history, next being 185 homers in 1962...they need 43 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 300 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season.

☞ The Twins enter tonight having recorded at least one extra-base in 52 straight games, dating back to May 20...marks the 14th longest XBH hit-streak in club history...the club record is 98 straight from June 9-September 29, 2009...for the season, the Twins rank first in baseball in extra-base hits with 400, ahead of Boston (370) and Colorado (370).

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins have recalled left-handed pitcher **Lewis Thorpe** and have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher **Cody Stashak** from Triple-A Rochester...Thorpe, 23, made one start for the Twins this season on June 30 at Chicago-AL, allowing two runs on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched with two walks and seven strikeouts...Stashak, 25, appeared in 12 games (2 starts) for the Red Wings this season, going 5-0, 1.61 ERA (22.1 IP, 4 ER), four walks, 31 strikeouts and one home run allowed...prior to joining the Red Wings in mid-June, Stashak pitched in 19 games at Double-A Pensacola, going 2-3, 4.76 ERA (28.1 IP, 15 ER), five walks and 40 strikeouts...to make room on the 25-man roster, the Twins have placed first baseman **C.J. Cron** on the 10-day Injured List with right thumb inflammation and have optioned right-handed pitcher **Zack Littell** to Triple-A Rochester...Cron, who previously missed five games in early July with the same injury, hit .263 (84-for-320) with 20 doubles, 18 home runs, 55 RBI and an .814 OPS in 83 games this season...in 14 games for the Twins this season, Littell went 2-0, 4.91 ERA (18.1 IP, 10 ER), six walks and 17 strikeouts.

BETTER WITH AGE: Nelson Cruz hit his 19th home run on Saturday...one more homer and he will become the 43rd player in baseball history (72nd occurrence) w/ 20-plus in age 38-or-greater season (turned 39 July 1)...Twins have had three such seasons: Dave Winfield (21 HR at age 41 in 1993), Jim Thome (25 at 39 in 2010) & Torii Hunter (22 at 39 in '15)...last in MLB was 2016 (40-year-old David Ortiz hit 40 for BOS; 39-year-old Carlos Beltrán w/ 29 for NYY & TEX).

☞ If he reaches 20, he'd be the only player to reach 20-plus in each season since 2009 (11-straight)...he'd become the 72nd player with 11 different 20-homer seasons...he would become the 34th player to hit 20-plus in 11-plus consecutive seasons.

☞ Since June 5, Nelson Cruz and Max Kepler are both tied for sixth in the AL in home runs (12).

SANÓ STORMING: Miguel Sanó is hitting .316 (18-for-57) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs, 11 RBI, 13 runs scored, 11 walks, a .426 on-base percentage and a 1.111 OPS...since June 28, he has raised his batting average 39 points (.195 to .234) and his on-base percentage 50 points (.278 to .328).

FANS ON TARGET: Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,296,842 this season, trailing New York (2,174,093), Los Angeles (1,868,163), Boston (1,766,667), Houston (1,730,832) and Texas (1,409,726)...they now have drawn 30,000+ in 15 of their last 19 home games...the Twins have sold out 168 regular season games at Target Field since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and seven in 2019.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: In his last start he limited the visiting New York Mets to two runs (one earned) over 6.0 innings...the bullpen surrendered 12 runs over the final three innings to blow the lead...held the Mets hitless through 2.1 innings before Amed Rosario recorded the first run against Pérez in the third inning with a solo home run...Pérez would yield another run in the fourth as a leadoff error by third baseman Miguel Sanó would come around to score on a Todd Frazier double play...stranded men in scoring position in both the fifth and sixth innings, and left having thrown just 83 pitches, 60 for strikes, a 72.3 strike percentage, his highest of any outing this season.

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact, as referenced by the 84.9 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, second-lowest in baseball to only Kenta Maeda (84.6), with a minimum of 250 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 147 feet, tied for fourth-best in the American League.

QUALITY QUARTET: Pérez has won eight games this season (seven as a starter)...**Pérez, Jake Odorizzi (11), Kyle Gibson (9) and José Berríos (8) are the first quartet of Twins to reach eight wins in a season since 2015 (Gibson, Phil Hughes, Trevor May and Tommy Milone)**...if Pérez can strike out one batter today, the five members of the rotation (including Michael Pineda) each will have 90 strikeouts or more through 99 team games, making them the first five-man starting rotation in Twins history to record 90-plus strikeouts apiece through less than 100 games of any Twins season ever.

OVER THE WALL, A MAN GETS ONLY WHAT HE EARNS: Pérez has surrendered just eight home runs this season in 101.0 innings of work, giving him a **0.71 HR/9 IP rate, which ranks third in all of baseball** behind only Washington's Max Scherzer (0.63, 9 HR in 129.1 IP) and Atlanta's Mike Soroka (0.44, 5 HR in 102.1 IP)...he also ranks tied for 10th in baseball (6th in the AL) with 28 extra-base hits allowed, (min. 15 starts).

BOMBAS MEET BOMBERS: Pérez is making his fifth career start against the New York Yankees, first since August 12, 2018 at Yankee Stadium (with Texas)...in that outing, he was dealt the loss after allowing seven runs on 11 hits in just 5.0 innings pitched, and he matched up against tonight's starter CC Sabathia, who threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball with seven strikeouts.

- His last win against the Yankees came back on Sept. 8, 2017 in Arlington in what was an 11-5 Rangers win...Pérez allowed five runs (two earned) over 5.2 innings pitched that night.
- Tonight will be the third matchup between Pérez and Sabathia, joining the aforementioned game in 2018 as well as April 27, 2016 (Pérez won, 3-2 Texas victory, both starters threw QS).
- Sabathia has been pitching in the majors since 2001, and Pérez since 2012...since Pérez's debut, Sabathia has made 198 starts, Pérez has made 144, third-most and eighth-most among AL left-handers.

HOME COOKIN': Pérez is set to make his fourth consecutive start at Target Field, and sixth in his last seven starts...has fared much better at home this season, pitching to a 4-2 record with a 3.49 ERA (59.1 IP, 23 ER) and an opponents' slash line of .237/.295/.339 in 10 games (9 starts) in Minneapolis, while he owns a 4.97 ERA (41.2 IP, 23 ER) in nine games (7 starts) on the road this year.

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of **.197 (45-for-229) with an OPS of .548 when the bases are clear**...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .316 average (50-for-158) with an .870 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .315 (28-for-89) with nine XBH and 39 RBI with RISP, including .354 (17-for-48) and 22 RBI with RISP and two outs.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON RHP (SEASON: 9-4, 4.02 ERA ; CAREER: 63-65, 4.42 ERA)

Gibson will take the mound tomorrow night against the Yankees...Gibby is coming off his ninth win of the year on Thursday as he pitched 7.0 innings of three-run ball in a 6-3 win over the Oakland A's...is 1-6 against the Yankees with a 6.50 ERA (45.2 IP, 33 ER), with his only win coming on July 14, 2013 at Yankee Stadium, and he hasn't won a start against them in seven outings...faced them in New York on May 3, allowing five runs (two earned) on seven hits and two walks over 5.0 innings of work (Twins lost 6-3)...is 5-2 with a 3.86 ERA (46.2 IP, 20 ER) against the AL East this season, but 2-1 with a 5.47 ERA (24.2 IP, 15 ER) in five home starts vs. the AL East.

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
