THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-4 through seven games on their nine-game homestand, going $0-2$ vs. the Mets, $2-2$ vs. the A's and 1-0 vs. the Yankees...they will continue the homestand tonight with the second of three night games against the Yankees...following tomorrow night's series finale, the Twins will travel to Chicago to begin an eight-day seven-game roadtrip with four vs. the White Sox July $25-28$ and three vs. the Marlins July 30 -August 1.. Twins are looking to win three straight for the first time since June 13-15.
TWINS TAKE DOWN YANKEES: The Twins beat the Yankees last night by a score of 8-6...Martín Pérez was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings pitched...Lewis Thorpe earned his first career win with 2.2 innings of relief...the offense recorded eight hits, five being home runs from Mitch Garver ( 18,19 ), Jorge Polanco (14), Nelson Cruz (20), and Max Kepler (25)...it marked the eighth time this season with five-plus homers, the most in club history.
$\Phi$ The Twins began the game with a triple play, the 13th in club history and first since 2017...
it marked the 12 th time since 1969 for a game to begin with a triple play.
TWINS AND YANKEES: The Twins and Yankees are playing the fifth of six games this season... Twins have gone just 4-10 in their last 14 vs. New York and 8-21 in their last 29...Twins won their last series at Target Field, taking two of three September 10-12, 2018.
$\Phi$ Two more wins and the Twins would win their first season-series over New York since
2001 (4-2)...Yankees have won 15 of the last 17 season-series (ties in 2005 and 2006).
क Miguel Sanó has 14 career hits vs. the Yankees, two doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, 11 runs Scored and six walks...he has a .350 0BP, 642 SLG and a .992 OPS in those 14 career games... his .992 OPS is the fifth highest among actives with a minimum of 50 plate appearances. क Twins have a 667 (18-9) winning percentage against the AL East this season, highest in club history...6-0 vs. BAL, 2-2 vs. NYY, 4-3 vs. TOR, 5-2 vs. TB, 1-2 vs. BOS.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: The Twins 187 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of LOS Angeles-NL (173)...they have homered in 81 of 99 games, going 53-28 in those games... 187 homers already are eighth-most in club history, next being 191 homers in 2004...they need

| Last 20 games. | 9-11 | 38 home runs to match their all-time record of 225 , set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 306 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season. $\Phi$ Twins hitters have a launch angle of 25 degrees-or-higher 136 times this season on home runs, the most in baseball (NYY 8th with 112). $\Phi$ Twins have an exit velocity of 100 -plus mph on 158 of their home runs this season, the most in baseball (NYY 5th with 141). $\Phi$ Twins have hit 99 homers 400 -plus feet, the most in baseball (NYY 12th with 76).

BETTER WITH AGE: Nelson Cruz hit his 20th home run last night, becoming the 43rd player in baseball history (72nd occurrence) with 20plus in age 38 -or-greater season (turned 39 July 1)...he's the only player to reach 20 -plus homers in each season since 2009 (11-straight) and the 72 nd player with 11 different 20-homer seasons...additionally, he is the 34 th player to hit 20 -plus in 11-plus consecutive seasons. $\Phi$ Since June 5, Nelson Cruz and Max Kepler are both tied for fourth in the AL in home runs (13).

DANKE SCHOEN: Max Kepler hit his 25th home run last night and now ranks fifth in the American League in homers, trailing Mike Trout (32), Edwin Encarnacion (29), Jorge Soler (27) and Alex Bregman (26)...he has 19 home runs against right-handed pitching and six against left-handed pitching...he has 23 home runs and 53 RBI from the leadoff spot, the home runs leading baseball and the RBI, ranking fourth, trailing DJ LeMahieu (62), Charlie Blackmon (60) and George Springer (56).
ALL A-RRAEZ: Luis Arraez has reached safely in 33 of 36 games this season (with an at-bat)...in 26 games since June 18 , he ranks first among American League rookies in hits (34), batting average (.370) and on-base percentage (.437), second in OPS (.893), and third in walks (10).

FANS ON TARGET: Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,331,469 this season, trailing New York (2,174,093), Los Angeles ( $1,868,163$ ), Houston ( $1,772,366$ ), Boston ( $1,766,667$ ) and Texas ( $1,409,726$ )...they now have drawn $30,000+$ in 16 of their last 20 home games...the Twins have sold out 168 regular season games at Target Field since 2010...they sold out 81 in 2010, 57 in 2011, eight in 2012, six in 2013, none in 2014, six in 2015, one in 2016, one in 2017, one in 2018, and seven in 2019.

$\Phi$ Ehire Adrianza is hitting .381 (16-for-42) with two doubles, two triples, four RBI, five walks, 12 runs scored, a 458 on-base percentage and a .982 OPS in his last 15 games dating back to June 9 .
$\Phi$ The Twins have scored 557 runs and are on pace for 911 , which would set a club record (877 in 1996)
$\Phi$ The Twins enter tonight with a record of 18-9-5 in series play.
玉 The bottom third of the Twins batting order has posted a .270/.343/.499 slash line in 2019 -- these marks rank second, second, and first in MLB, respectively (Yankees lead batting average - . 275 and on-base percentage -.344 ).

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win and recorded his ninth quality start of the year with 7.0 innings of three-run ball, allowing six hits (1 home run) and seven strikeouts...stranded four baserunners through three innings before Ramón Laureano came around to score the Athletics' first run on a Khris Davis double in the fourth inning....pitched a perfect fifth inning before Jurickson Profar knocked a two-out, two-run home run to right field...exited with 106 pitches, 73 strikes, a 68.9 strike percentage, his highest since May 25 vs. Chicago-AL (69.4\%),

- The 7.0 innings were the most he's thrown since June 25 vs. Tampa Bay, a span of four games, three starts, and it was just the fifth time this season he's thrown at least 7.0 innings.

SWING AND A MISS: Gibson has recorded 106 strikeouts through 20 appearances (19 starts) and owns a SO/9 rate of 9.06 and a SO/BB ratio of 3.66 ...the SO/9 and SO/BB both rank 13th in the American League.

- Gibson has improved his strikeouts-per-9.0 innings rate nearly every year in his career, setting a career-high in 2018 with 8.19 S0/9 (6.89-2017, 6.35-2016, 6.70-2015, 5.37-2014, 5.12-2013).

BRONX BOYS: Gibson will be making his 10th career start against the Yankees tonight... he is 1-6, 6.50 ERA (45.2 IP, 33 ER) with 22 walks and 33 strikeouts...faced them last May 3 at Yankee Stadium...suffered the loss after allowing five runs (2 earned) on seven hits with a home run, two walks and five strikeouts...his only win vs. the Yankees came July 14, 2013 after tossing 5.0 innings of five-hit ball while allowing three runs (2 earned)...is looking for his first career win vs. New York-AL at Target Field, is 0-5 over five starts at home with a 8.39 ERA.

- This season Gibson is 5-2, 3.86 ERA (46.2 IP, 20 ER ) with 13 walks and 46 strikeouts over nine games ( 8 starts) against AL East opponents...over his career, Gibson is 17-18, 4.81 ERA (263.2 IP, 141 ER) with 106 walks and 213 strikeouts...his 4.81 ERA is the highest against any AL division (AL Central-4.25 ERA, AL West-3.86 ERA).

HOME SWEET HOME: Gibson is making his second consecutive home start and his 11 th this season... is looking for his seventh win at Target Field this year and his first ever at home vs. the Yankees.

- Is $6-1$ with a 3.71 ERA at home this year as opposed to a 3-3 record with a 4.33 ERA in 10 road games (all starts)....however, owns a lifetime record of $30-33$ with a 4.52 ERA in 88 home games ( 87 starts) as opposed to a 33-32 road record over 91 games (all starts).

WINNING WAYS: The Twins have gone 13-7 in Gibson's 20 games (19 starts) this season and his nine total wins is second behind Jake Odorizzi (11)...the Twins are 28-24 since the beginning of the 2018 season with Gibson on the mound ( 51 starts).

[^0]:    Odorizi will take the ball tomorrow evening for the final game of the three-game series vs. the Yankees...he is making his 20th start this season and his second against the Yankees... in his last outing on July 19 vs. Oakland, he did not factor into the decision after lasting just 5.0 innings allowing three earned runs on six hits and two walks with three strikeouts... was the starter and winner last time he faced the Yankees on May 4 at Yankee Stadium...gave up just two hits without allowing a run with four walks and eight strikeouts over 6.0 innings pitched...over his career, Odorizzi is 7-8, 4.06 ERA ( $95.1 \mathrm{IP}, 43 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 32 walks and 86 strikeouts over 17 career games against the Yankees ( 16 starts).
