THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-5 through eight games on their nine-game homestand, going 0-2 vs. the Mets, 2-2 vs. the A's and 1-1 vs. the Yankees...they will complete the homestand tonight with the three-game series finale against the Yankees...postgame, the Twins will travel to Chicago to begin an eight-day, seven-game roadtrip with four vs. the White Sox from Thursday-Sunday, an off day on Monday, then three vs. the Marlins July 30-August 1...the Twins have gone 8-9 this month and have seven July games remaining.

KNOCKOUT SHOTS ALL NIGHT LONG: The Twins lost to the Yankees last night by a score of 14-12 in 10 innings...there were five different lead changes during the game and four blown saves - two by each team...Kyle Gibson was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing five runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Twins pitchers allowed a season-high 20 hits...the offense recorded 15 hits, three from Jorge Polanco, who homered for the second straight game, his 15th...Nelson Cruz added a home run (21) and Miguel Sanó hit two homers (15, 16).

TWINS AND YANKEES: The Twins and Yankees are playing the sixth and final time this season...Twins have gone just 4-11 in their last 15 vs. New York and 8-22 in their last 30...Twins won their last series at Target Field, taking two of three September 10-12, 2018.

☞ Twins are 8-26-2 in series play vs. the Yankees dating back to 2002.
☞ Miguel Sanó has 16 career hits vs. the Yankees, two doubles, eight home runs, 18 RBI, 13 runs scored and six walks...he has a .348 OBP, .712 SLG and a 1.060 OPS in those 15 career games...his 1.060 OPS is the third highest among actives with a minimum of 50 plate appearances, trailing Renato Núñez (1.134) and Mike Trout (1.067).
☞ Twins have a .643 (18-10) winning percentage against the AL East this season, highest in club history...6-0 vs. BAL, 2-3 vs. NYY, 4-3 vs. TOR, 5-2 vs. TB, 1-2 vs. BOS.

TWINS DIG THE LONGBALL: The Twins 191 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL (173)...191 homers already are tied for seventh most in club history (also 2004), next most being 196, done in both 1986 and '87...they need 34 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 309 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season.

☞ Miguel Sanó (16) and Jorge Polanco (15) each reached the 15-homer mark last night, becoming the seventh and eighth Twins with 15-plus homers, joining Max Kepler (25), Nelson Cruz (21), Eddie Rosario (21), Mitch Garver (19), C.J. Cron (18) and Jonathan Schoop (15)...it marks a club record and the most players with 15-plus since the Texas Rangers had nine in 2017...three other teams also had nine players with 15+, the 2012 Yankees, 2005 Indians and 2005 Rangers.

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins have recalled left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer and have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Carlos Torres from Triple-A Rochester...Smeltzer made three appearances (2 starts) for the Twins earlier this season, going 0-1 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2 IP, 6 ER), four walks, 13 strikeouts and a .217 opponent batting average...in 11 games (10 starts) for Rochester this season, he has gone 1-3 with a 3.02 ERA (59.2 IP, 20 ER), 14 walks and 59 strikeouts...Torres, 36, was signed by the Twins as a minor league free agent in late June and has appeared in eight games for the Red Wings, going 4-1 with a 4.15 ERA (17.1 IP, 8 ER), eight walks and 16 strikeouts...to make room for Smeltzer and Torres on the 25-man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Blake Parker for release or assignment and have optioned right-handed pitcher Kohl Stewart to Triple-A Rochester...Parker, who was signed by the Twins this off-season, appeared in 37 games for the Twins, going 1-2 with a 4.21 ERA (36.1 IP, 17 ER), 16 walks, 34 strikeouts and 10 saves...Stewart appeared in six games (2 starts) for the Twins this season, going 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA (19.1 IP, 10 ER), six walks and six strikeouts.

LET IT SANÓ: Miguel Sanó is hitting .299 (20-for-67) with four doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI, 15 runs scored, 11 walks, a .397 on-base percentage, .701 slugging percentage and a 1.099 OPS in 20 games since June 28...since that date, his slugging percentage ranks sixth-best in the AL and his OPS ranks eighth.
☞ He is hitting .400 (8-for-20) with two doubles, three home runs and a 1.405 OPS in his last 13 games vs. left-handed pitching.

CRUZ CONTROL: Nelson Cruz hit his 21st home run last night...he's the only player to reach 20-plus homers in each season since 2009 (11-straight) and 34th to hit 20-plus in 11-plus consecutive seasons...he is on pace to hit 34 home runs this season, which would mark the sixth straight season with 34-plus homers...he has homered in three of his last four games and four of his last seven.
☞ Since June 5, Cruz has hit 14 home runs, tied for third-most in the AL with Lourdes Gurriel Jr. and Matt Olson, and trailing Mike Trout (19) and Yuli Gurriel (16).

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins are hitting .290 (273-for-940) with 45 doubles, 55 home runs, 84 walks and an .874 OPS vs. lefties this season...they lead baseball in batting average vs. lefties and rank second in OPS (Houston - .881).
☞ Individuals vs. LHP this season: Mitch Garver is hitting .373 (22-for-59)...Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .304 (24-for-79)...Ehire Adrianza is hitting .324 (11-for-34).

THIS AND THAT:

☞ Ehire Adrianza is hitting .370 (17-for-46) with three doubles, two triples, four RBI, seven walks, 14 runs scored, a .463 on-base percentage and a .985 OPS in his last 16 games dating back to June 9.
☞ Twins have 276 Barrels this season, the most in baseball, ahead of Atlanta (253).
☞ Twins rank sixth in the AL in total attendance, having drawn 1,363,939 this season, trailing New York (2,174,093), Los Angeles (1,868,163), Houston (1,811,570), Boston (1,766,667) and Texas (1,409,726)...they have drawn 30,000+ in 17 of their last 21 home games (33,179 avg).
☞ Tonight's game can be seen nationally on ESPN...this marks the second time this season for the Twins to play on ESPN, the previous coming May 1 vs. Houston at Target Field as the Twins won by a score of 6-2.

A CAREER YEAR FOR THE ALL-STAR: Odorizzi, a first-time All-Star, has tied his career-high with 11 wins (T-5th in the American League, one behind the four co-leaders), matching his output from 2014 (11-13 in 31 starts for Tampa Bay)...was named to the AL All-Star team but did not pitch due to being on the Injured List with a blister on his right middle finger.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: Odorizzi, who averages 5.2 innings per start, is 1.0 inning shy of qualifying for league leaders entering tonight, aside from wins (will be among the qualifiers with 2.0 innings of work)...what he has done in his 99.0 frames, however, has been among the very best in baseball...where he would rank, with 100.0 IP (**note - 8 of the 11 stats below, except opponents' OBP, FIP, and strikeouts-per-9.0 innings, would represent a full-season career high**):

IF YOU'RE RIGHT, YOU'RE WRONG: Odorizzi has been the toughest pitcher in the AL for a right-handed batter to hit this season, yielding a league-low **.164 batting average (31-for-189)**, along with a **.547 OPS (3rd AL)...only the Reds' Luis Castillo (.143, 28-for-196) and the Dodgers' Kenta Maeda (.146, 30-for-205) have lower BAAs against righties in all of baseball.**

GET HIM EARLY: Odorizzi has struggled in the first inning over his 19 starts, with a 6.27 ERA (18.2 IP, 13 ER)...**after the opening frame, he has fashioned a 2.46 ERA (80.1 IP, 22 ER).**

LAST TIME OUT: Pitching in 94-degree weather with a heat index nearing 110, Odorizzi worked 5.0 innings last Friday in a no-decision vs. Oakland (6 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO)...surrendered a leadoff home run to Marcus Semien as part of a two-run first inning, and gave up the game-tying run in the fifth...departed tied 3-3, but the A's scored twice in the sixth for a 5-3 win.

JULY INDICATIVE OF RECENT STRUGGLES: July has been an up-and-down ride for the right-hander, with Odorizzi's first All-Star selection and a big July 13 win at Cleveland sandwiched around an injury and IL trip (which forced him to miss the All-Star Game), along with a 1-1 record (3 starts) and season monthly-worst 6.08 ERA (13.1 IP, 9 ER)...opponents are slashing **.255/.356/.549.**

• Going back further, entering play June 15, Odo led the AL with a 1.92 ERA (70.1 IP, 15 ER), while going 9-2 with 22 walks, 78 strikeouts and a **.186/.258/.255** opponents' slash line...beginning that night vs. KC, is 2-2 with a 6.28 ERA (28.2 IP, 20 ER) in his last six starts (Twins are 3-3)...has 12 walks and 23 strikeouts in that span, while opponents are slashing **.286/.357/.554.**

ON TARGET AT HOME: In his first nine home starts, Odorizzi is **6-0** and ranks fourth in the AL with a **2.56 ERA (52.2 IP, 15 ER)**...also ranks fifth with a 0.99 WHIP, while holding opponents to a **.203 batting average (39-for-192) with 13 walks and 58 strikeouts...**the Twins are 7-2 when he starts at Target Field this season (losing March 30 vs. Cleveland and last Friday vs. Oakland).

• In his first 25 home starts for Minnesota, Odo is 11-4 with a 3.85 ERA (133.1 IP, 57 ER)...the Twins are 17-8 (.733) when he takes the mound at Target Field.

SILENCING THE BOMBERS: Odorizzi has won consecutive starts against the Yankees, with a **0.68 ERA (13.1 IP, 1 ER)**, three hits allowed, seven walks and 13 strikeouts...tossed 6.0 innings of two-hit, shutout ball in a 7-3 win May 4 in the Bronx (4 BB, 8 SO).

• Took a no-hitter into the eighth inning in his last start vs. New York here at Target Field (Sept. 12, 2018)...had it broken up by Greg Bird (double), but earned a 3-1 win (7.1 IP, 1 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 3 BB, 5 SO).

• Is 7-8 with a 4.06 ERA (95.1 IP, 43 ER) in 17 career games (16 starts) vs. the Yankees...picked up his only career save Sept. 24, 2013 at Yankee Stadium (with Tampa Bay).

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has added velocity to his fastball (career-high 92.9 average MPH) and is throwing it at a career-best 57.2 percent rate (besting his 2018 mark of 54.1%). Below is the full breakdown of his 2019 pitches, according to Baseball Savant:

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Since 2014, Odo ranks third in the AL with 171 starts and fifth with a **.234 BAA...**only Rick Porcello (.178) and Justin Verlander (.174) have made more starts in that span, while Chris Sale (.214), Verlander (.220), Corey Kluber (.223) and Marco Estrada (.234) have lower BAAs.

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
