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THE TWINS: The Twins completed their nine-game homestand with a record of 3-6, going $0-2$ vs. the Mets, 2-2 vs. the A's and 1-2 vs. the Yankees..tonight the Twins will begin an

Twins have gone $8-10$ this month and have six July games remaining...they haven't had a losing record in any month since going 13-14 in June of last season.
TWINS OUT-SLUGGED AT HOME AGAIN: The Twins lost to the Yankees last night at Target Field by a score of $10-7$...Jake Odorizzi (11-5) was the starter and loser, allowing a career-high nine runs on 10 hits in 4.0 innings pitched...Devin Smeltzer allowing one run in 5.0 innings of relief...the offense recorded nine hits, including home runs from Nelson Cruz (22), Marwin Gonzalez (12) and Eddie Rosario (22)...the attendance was 40,127, marking the eighth sellout of the season and first crowd of at least 40,000 since Opening Day of $2016(40,638)$,

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for just the seventh of 19 times this season...Twins enter today having won eight of their last 10 over the Sox...Twins have gone $28-16$ vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.
$\Phi$ Mitch Garver is hitting . 340 ( 17 -for- 50 ) with five doubles, seven RBI, five walks and a .880 OPS in 16 career games vs. the Sox.
क Jorge Polanco has seven home runs and 20 RBI in 20 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field...the homers and RBI are his personal most in any opposing ballpark.
$\Phi$ Miguel Sanó has four home runs and eight RBI with a 1.726 OPS against CWS this season.
MAX KEPLER, GUARANTEED: Max Kepler is hitting . 386 ( 17 -for-44) with four doubles, one triple, six home runs, 16 RBI, a .932 slugging percentage and a 1.348 OPS in his last 11 vs. the Sox....riding a six-game hitting streak, with 12 hits in his last 26 at-bats vs. the Sox with three doubles, tive homers and 14 RBI...below are his game logs over this last six vs. the Sox: DATE


ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 30-19 on the road this season, tied with Atlanta (30-20) and Tampa Bay (30-21) for second most road wins in baseball, trailing just Boston (32-22)... Twins have outscored opponents on the road 297-239...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...their 105 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year, and are eight shy of the Twins record of 113 set back in 1963....where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

ROSTER MOVES: The Twins announced today that they have reinstated outfielder Byron Buxton from the 10-day Injured List and have recalled right-handed pitcher Sean Poppen from Triple-A Rochester...Buxton, who missed the last 10 games while on the Injured List with concussion-like symptoms, hit . 249 ( 61 -for-245) with 24 doubles, four triples, nine home runs, 42 RBI, 43 runs scored and a 798 OPS in 75 games...Poppen, 25, appeared in 11 games ( 8 starts) for the Red Wings this season, going 5-1 with a 3.77 ERA ( 57.1 IP, 24 ER), 25 walks and 62 strikeouts...he was previously recalled by the Twins on June 19 and pitched in relief that night against the Boston Red Sox, allowing three runs on five hits over 4.0 innings with four walks and two strikeouts...to make room for Buxton and Poppen on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer and outfielder Jake Cave to Triple-A Rochester...Smeltzer, who was recalled yesterday, pitched the final 5.0 innings last night against the New York Yankees, allowing one run on five hits with four strikeouts....he has posted a 2.91 ERA ( $21.2 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with four walks and 17 strikeouts in four games (2 starts) for the Twins this season...Cave appeared in 35 games for the Twins, hitting . 193 ( 16 -for-83) with three doubles, two home runs, 10 walks and nine RBI.

TWINS DIG THE LONGBALL: The Twins 194 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL (174)... 194 homers already are seventh most in club history, next most being 196, done in both 1986 and ' $87 \ldots$...they need 31 home runs to match their all-time record of 225 , set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 311 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season...their 1.92 home runs-per-game are the highest in MLB history, the next three all being teams this season: New York-AL - 1.71, Los Angeles-NL - 1.67, and Milwaukee - 1.66.

WINLESS, DESPITE DOMINANCE: Berríos was finally able to pitch back in his home confines on Saturday, snapping a four-game streak of starts, all coming on the road, dating back to his last start at Target Field on June 17 vs. Boston...the 2019 All-Star was true to form as he fired 5.2 scoreless innings against the surging Oakland Athletics, scattering five hits and striking out four...left with a promising 2-0 lead, but saw his lead diminish as four relievers combined to allow five runs over the final 3.1 innings pitched...Berríos threw a career-high 113 pitches in the effort...the no-decision extended Berríos' streak of winless outings to seven, dating back to June 6 at Cleveland
क Berríos has pitched to a 2.62 ERA ( 44.2 IP, 13 ER) in the seven games since his last win on June 6 at Cleveland...over that stretch, he is $0-3$ and the Twins are 1-6, but his ERA ranks fifth in the American League, behind Mike Fiers (3-0, 1.72), Gerrit Cole (6-0, 1.90), Marcus Stroman (3-3, 2.30) and Shane Bieber (5-1, 2.57)...similarly, in those seven games, the All-Star has received just nine runs of support, the second fewest among AL starters in that span (min. 5 starts, excludes openers).

TURNING THE CORNER: Berríos owns a 2.96 ERA through 20 starts this season, and has seen an uptick in performance in a myriad of different pitching categories between 2017-18 and 2019. 2017-18-58 GAMES

क Berríos is tied for fifth in the American League (T-10th in MLB) with 14 quality starts, while 15 out of his 20 starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including seven $7.0+$ inning efforts)...not only that, but in 91 career starts, Berríos has thrown 44 quality starts ( 48.4 percent).

YOUNG GUN: At 25 years old, Berríos continues to establish himself as one of the top young pitchers in Twins history....his 2.96 ERA is the lowest by a Twins starter younger than 26 years old since Johan Santana's Cy Young campaign in 2004 (2.61 ERA)...he also enters today's start with just 29 walks in 20 starts...last season, he walked a total of 61 batters in 32 starts...currently sits on an 8.04 SO /9 ratio ( 114 SO ), and is on-pace to become the third Twins pitcher to have back-to-back seasons with a SO/9 ratio north of 8.00, joining Dave Boswell (1966-67) and Johan Santana (2004-07).
क Kyle Gibson and Jake Odorizzi are also on-pace to have $\mathrm{SO} / 9$ rates higher than 8.00 , would become first trio of Twins to do so in the same season.

EL REY DE CHICAGO: Berríos owns a lifetime line of 8-2, 2.21 ERA (73.1 IP, 18ER) with 16 walks and 76 strikeouts over 11 games (all starts) vs. the White Sox; his 2.21 ERA is the 15th-lowest ERA all-time vs. the Pale Hose (min. 10 starts)...in five starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, Berríos owns a 3.77 ERA (28.2 IP, 12 ER), with his last win here coming on May 4, 2018, when he threw 6.0 innings, allowing four runs on six hits in a 6 -4 Twins win...he received the loss in his last start here on June 28 after allowing six runs (three earned) over 7.1 innings pitched... in that start, he allowed nine hits, the second-most he's allowed in a single game this season.

INDUCING WEAK CONTACT: José has been able to create weak contact for the entirety of his career, but especially over the past two seasons...since 2018, he has allowed an average exit velocity of 86.0 MPH on balls put into play, and only two American League starters have a lower average exit velocity on batted balls: Yankees starter CC Sabathia (85.2) and Rays pitcher Ryan Yarbrough (85.2), (min. 500 batted balls).
\$ A large part of Berríos' success in 2019 has been the horizontal movement on his curveball, a pitch he has thrown 602 times this season....according to Baseball Savant, his hook breaks 17.3 inches across the plate ( 7.2 inches more than average), ranking him fourth in baseball (min. 250 curveballs thrown).

BERRÍOS FIRES SCORELESS INNING IN ASG: Berríos was selected to his second consecutive All-Star Game as he replaced the injured Jake Odorizzi...José was handed the ball in the third inning, and following a leadoff double to Arizona's Ketel Marte, he would shut down the next three batters: a strikeout of 2018 NL Rookie of the Year Ronald Acuña Jr., another of 2018 NL Most Valuable Player Christian Yelich and a fly out recorded by his brother-in-law Javier Báez.
$\Phi$ Berríos became the first Twin to pitch a scoreless inning in back-to-back All-Star Games since Joe Nathan in 2008-09.

- Teamed with Jake Odorizzi ( 11 Ks on March 30 against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consec utive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks. - Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
