**THE TWINS:** The Twins opened their eight-day, seven-game roadtrip with a 10-3 victory here last night in Chicago...will play three more vs. the White Sox through the weekend, followed by an off day on Monday in Miami, then three vs. the Marlins from Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins have gone 9-10 this month and have five July games remaining...they haven't had a losing record in any month since going 13-14 in June of last season.

**RECORD-SETTING ROUT:** The Twins slugged their way into the record books in last night's 10-3 victory over the White Sox, becoming the first team in Major League Baseball history to hit at least five home runs in nine different games...Nelson Cruz enjoyed his first career three-homer game, the 11th such effort in Twins history, while Max Kepler (26) and Miguel Sanó (17) also went deep...starter José Berríos (9-5) was the beneficiary, snapping a seven-start winless streak (in which he had received only nine runs of support) after allowing three runs (two earned) on six hits over 7.0 innings, with one walk and eight strikeouts.

**TWINS AND SOX:** The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the eighth of 19 times this season...Twins have won five of the first seven meetings this season and are 9-2 in the last 11 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 29-16 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

☞ Jorge Polanco has seven home runs and 21 RBI in 21 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field...the homers and RBI are his personal most in any opposing ballpark.  
☞ Twins hitters have a collective .933 OPS vs. the White Sox this season, hitting .280 (68-for-243) with 15 doubles, one triple and 19 home runs...Twins have gone deep 13 times in four games at Guaranteed Rate Field, including two five-homer contests.

**CRUZ AND SANÓ HANGING THE SOX OUT TO DRY:** Nelson Cruz has played three games against the White Sox this season, all here at Guaranteed Rate Field, and has gone 8-for-14 (.571) with one double, six home runs, 12 RBI, a 1.929 slugging percentage and a 2.529 OPS...Miguel Sanó has played six games vs. CWS, going 8-for-19 (.421) with five homers (four in Chicago), 10 RBI and a 1.732 OPS.

**MAX KEPLER, GUARANTEED:** Max Kepler is hitting .383 (18-for-47) with four doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 18 RBI, a .957 slugging percentage and a 1.391 OPS in his last 12 vs. the Sox...riding a seven-game hitting streak, with 13 hits in his last 29 at-bats vs. the Sox with three doubles, six homers and 16 RBI.

**ROAD RULES:** The Twins have gone 31-19 on the road this season, a .620 road winning percentage that is the best in baseball...at 30-20 (.600), Atlanta is the only other club with a .600-plus winning mark...Twins have outscored opponents on the road 307-242...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...their 110 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year, and are three shy of the Twins record of 113 set back in 1963...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

**CRUZ CONTROL:** Last night, Nelson Cruz became the ninth Twins player (11th occurrence, 2nd this season) to hit three home runs in one game, joining Bob Allison (1963), Harmon Killebrew (1963), Tony Oliva (1973), Justin Morneau (2007), Max Kepler (2016 and '19), Brian Dozier (2016), Eddie Rosario (2017 and '18) and Byron Buxton (2017).

☞ Has homered in four-straight games (6 total)...at age 39, Cruz is the oldest player in MLB history to hit six-plus homers in a four-game span, surpassing Barry Bonds, who hit seven in a four-game span in 2001 at age 36.

☞ With 25 home runs this season (most by a DH and T-6th in the AL overall), he is the 28th player in MLB history to hit 25-plus homers in his age-38 season (age as of June 30)...is on pace to hit 39 homers this season...he's the only player to reach 20-plus homers in each season since 2009 (11-straight) and the 34th all-time to hit 20-plus in 11-plus consecutive seasons.

☞ Cruz leads the majors with nine home runs since the All-Star break and has hit 18 since June 5, second most in the AL since that date, trailing only Mike Trout (19).

☞ He has 385 career home runs, tied with Dwight Evans for 65th in MLB history, one shy of Aramis Ramirez (386) for 64th and four back of Johnny Bench (389) for 63rd.

**TWINS DIG THE LONGBALL:** The Twins 199 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL (174)...the fastest team in baseball history to reach 200 home runs are the 2005 Texas Rangers, who hit their 200th and 201st in their 122nd team game (Twins are playing their 103rd game tonight)...199 homers already are fifth most in club history, with their next long ball matching the 2016 squad at an even 200...they need 26 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 316 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season.

☞ The Twins have homered in 84 of their 102 games (82.4%)...their 1.95 home runs-per-game are the highest in MLB history, the next three all being teams this season: New York-AL - 1.71, Los Angeles-NL - 1.67, and Milwaukee - 1.66.

☞ Have homered in 12 of 13 games since the All-Star break (33 total), including 10-straight games (28 total)...have four-consecutive multi-homer games (17 total) and nine such contests in the second half.

☞ Their nine games with five-plus homers are a Major League record, surpassing the eight by the 1977 Boston Red Sox.

**SANÓ STORM:** Miguel Sanó has four home runs in his last six games, including a two-run shot here last night...in 22 games since June 28, he is 22-for-73 with four doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 19 RBI and a .301/.417/.712 slash line...his 1.119 OPS is sixth-best in the AL during that stretch.

☞ He is the fastest player in Twins history to 100 career home runs, reaching the mark Tuesday night in his 432nd game (now has 101 in 434 games)...Harmon Killebrew owned the previous club record, hitting his 100th homer in his 440th game.

**LAST START:** Did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs on four hits while recording eight strikeouts (one shy of his season-high) over 5.1 innings of work in Sunday's 7-6, walk-off win over Oakland...held the A's scoreless through 4.1 innings until a two-run home run from Josh Phegley in the fifth put the A's on the board...Chris Davis was then walked in the sixth and came around to score on an eventual sac fly from Chad Pinder...Pineda threw a season-high 109 pitches, the most he's thrown in a start since June 8, 2017 vs. Boston (110).

- Walked a career-high tying five batters (done thrice, last on June 28, 2011 vs. Atlanta), snapping a streak of 46 starts (dating back to 2016) in which he walked no more than three batters...the streak was the fourth-longest active streak in baseball, trailing only Cleveland's Carlos Carrasco, Baltimore's Alex Cobb and Los Angeles-NL's Ross Stripling.

**BIG EFFORTS FROM "BIG MIKE":** Pineda has posted a 2.93 ERA (40.0 IP, 13 ER) over his last seven starts, as he ranks seventh in the AL for ERA since June 13...the Twins have won five of his seven starts in that stretch (Pineda is 2-2)...he has allowed 34 hits, with 10 walks, 42 strikeouts and an opponents' slash line of .230/.280/.345.

- If you throw out his June 23 start at Kansas City, in which he allowed five earned runs in 5.0 innings, he has a 2.06 ERA (35.0 IP, 8 ER) in the last six weeks.
- Going back further, Pineda has now limited teams to three earned runs or less in 12 of his last 13 starts, dating back to May 5 at New York-AL...he owns a 3.72 ERA (75.0 IP, 31 ER) over that stretch (Twins are 8-5), with eight quality starts.

**A DEEPER LOOK AT TIMES THROUGH THE LINEUP:** Pineda has been the epitome of a "fast-starter" this season, as he boasts a 1.88 ERA (43.0 IP, 9 ER) while he weaves through a given lineup for the first time in a game, with a BAA of .222 (35-for-158) and just eight XBH...however, those numbers spike drastically the second time through, as his ERA balloons to 5.63 (40.0 IP, 25 ER) and his opponents' average jumps to .253 the second time through...when he makes it to a third tour, his ERA rests at 7.29 (21.0 IP, 17 ER) with 11 extra-base hits and a BAA of .333 (30-for-90).

**WALK TALK:** Pineda ranks tied for 10th in all of baseball with 21 free passes this season, and is tied for the fourth-fewest in the American League among starters with at least 15 starts (excludes openers)...his walks-per-nine innings rate is 1.82, which ranks eighth-best in the majors among qualified starters and is second in the American League (behind Mike Leake-1.30)...has seven starts without walking a batter this season and six with walking just one.

- Michael also averages one walk per 0.49 batters he faces, the eighth-lowest in baseball (2nd-best in the AL, behind Leake), while his 4.52 strikeout-to-walk rate sits 21st (9th in the AL).

**CRUISING TO CHICAGO:** Pineda will be making his sixth career start against the White Sox this evening and his second this season...owns a lifetime record of 2-3 with a 3.19 ERA (31.0 IP, 11 ER) with seven walks and 30 strikeouts...his last time out against the Pale Hose came June 29 at Guaranteed Rate Field where he was the starter and winner after allowing just one earned run on four hits with one walk and eight strikeouts...in three career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, Pineda is 1-2, 3.79 ERA (19.0 IP, 8 ER) while holding batters to a .209 average.

- In six starts against AL Central opponents this season, Pineda is 2-1, 4.22 ERA (32.0 IP, 15 ER) with two walks and 31 strikeouts...however, in his career he is 11-12, 3.91 ERA (177.1 IP, 77 ER) with 31 walks and 175 strikeouts over 30 starts.

**FUN WITH STATCAST:** So far through 2019, Pineda has seen the most success with his changeup as opponents are hitting just .237 (14-for-59) against it...his slider has induced the most strikeouts, as 51 of his 95 strikeouts have come via the slider (35.3 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most overall success against his fastball, hitting .273 (35-for-194) with nine home runs and an average exit velocity of 90.2 MPH.

### CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
