THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-0 on their seven-game eight-day roadtrip, taking the first two games in Chicago over the White Sox...the Twins will wrap the series tomorrow afternoon, enjoy an off-day in Miami on Monday then play the Marlins for three games from Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins have gone 10-10 this month and have four July games remaining...they haven't had a losing record in any month since going 13-14 in June of last season.

TWINS TAKE ANOTHER ON SOUTH SIDE: The Twins beat the White Sox last night by a score of 6-2...Michael Pineda (7-5) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on six hits in 7.0 innings pitched...Lewis Thorpe pitched 2.0 scoreless innings of relief...the offense recorded 10 hits, three from Nelson Cruz, who homered for the fifth straight game, 26th time this season and seventh time in his last five games...Max Kepler also homered, his team-leading 27th of the season.

CRUZ CONTROL: Nelson Cruz has homered in five-straight games (7 total)...at age 39, Cruz is the oldest player in MLB history to hit seven-plus homers in a five-game span, surpassing Barry Bonds, who hit seven in a four-game span in 2001 at age 36...Cruz leads the majors with 10 home runs since the All-Star break and has hit 19 since June 5, tied with Mike Trout for the most in baseball since that date...below are the longest homer streaks in club history:

NOTE: The MLB record is eight straight, set by Ken Griffey Jr. in 1993 and Don Mattingly in 1987...the most recent streak as long as Kendrys Morales, who homered in seven straight from August 19-26, 2018.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the ninth of 19 times this season...the Twins are 10-2 in the last 12 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 30-16 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

☞ Jorge Polanco has seven home runs and 21 RBI in 22 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field...the homers and RBI are his personal most in any opposing ballpark.

☞ Twins hitters have a collective .915 OPS vs. the White Sox this season, hitting .280 (78-for-279) with 16 doubles, one triple and 21 home runs.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 32-19 on the road this season, a .627 road winning percentage that is the best in baseball...at 31-20 (.608), Atlanta is the only other club with a .600-plus winning mark...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...their 112 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year, and are one shy of the Twins record of 113 set back in 1963...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

MAX KEPLER, GUARANTEED: Max Kepler is hitting .365 (19-for-52) with four doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 21 RBI, a .942 slugging percentage and a 1.356 OPS in his last 13 vs. the Sox...he is riding an eight-game hitting streak, with 14 hits in his last 34 at-bats vs. the Sox with three doubles, seven homers and 19 RBI.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 201 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL (175)...201 homers already are fourth most in club history...they need 24 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 316 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1978, Mike Cabbage went 4-for-4 and became the fifth Twin to ever hit for the cycle (11 now) in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in 1991, Dan Gladden hit a walk-off three-run homer in the ninth inning to give the Twins a 7-4 win over Milwaukee...it was in the middle of a five-game stretch in which Gladden drove in 12 runs (4, 3, 3, 1 & 1).

- ☞ Jorge Polanco is slugging .577 (164 total bases in 284 ABs) against RHP this season -- 8th best in MLB; League Avg: .472.
- ☞ Twins pitchers have an ERA of 3.20 (309.0 IP) against division opponents this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: 4.66.
- ☞ Twins hitters have 319 Extra-Base hits out of 710 total hits (44.9%) against RHP this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: 38.6%
- ☞ Twins hitters have a Well-Hit Avg of .142 (262/1,842) with two strikes this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: .114.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: In his last start, Pérez fought his command as he yielded three longballs and four walks to the New York Yankees, marking just the second start in his career in which he allowed at least three home runs and four walks...the left-hander was a part of history as he walked the first two batters of the game before getting Edwin Encarnación to ground into the Twins' 13th triple play, as Luis Arraez stepped on third, flipped to Jonathan Schoop at second, who fired to Miguel Sanó, to get right out of the inning...struck out the side in the second, coming one ball to Aaron Hicks away from an immaculate inning...the trouble began in the third inning as four hits (Gio Urshela home run) tacked on two runs before a Luke Voit homer in the fourth and a D.J. LeMahieu homer in the fifth forced Pérez out of the game, but the Twins' offense gave him seven runs of support, ultimately leading to an 8-6 Twins win.

SWEET, SOFT CONTACT: Pérez has created a lot of weak contact, as referenced by the 85.1 MPH average exit velocity against him this season, second-lowest in baseball to only Kenta Maeda (84.8), with a minimum of 250 batted balls...he also owns an average distance on balls in play of 150 feet, tied for fifth-best in the American League.

QUALITY QUINTET: Pérez struck out four in his outing against the Yankees (game No. 99 of the season), and with his first one to Gary Sánchez in the second inning, he joined all four Twins starters with 90 strikeouts, making the 2019 Twins' starting rotation the first five-man rotation in Twins history to record 90-plus strikeouts apiece through less than 100 games of any Twins season ever...Pérez has won eight games this season (seven as a starter)...Pérez, Jake Odorizzi (11), Kyle Gibson (9) and José Berrios (9) are the first quartet of Twins to reach eight wins in a season since 2015 (Gibson, Phil Hughes, Trevor May and Tommy Milone).

OVER THE WALL, A MAN GETS ONLY WHAT HE EARNS: Pérez has surrendered just 11 home runs this season in 105.0 innings of work, giving him a 0.94 HR/9 IP rate, which ranks 12th in all of baseball, fifth in the American League...he also ranks tied for 18th in baseball (T-11th in the AL) with 32 extra-base hits allowed, (min. 15 starts).

PÉREZ VS. PALE HOSE: Pérez is making his fifth career start against the Chicago White Sox, first since August 19, 2018 in Arlington as a member of the Texas Rangers...he earned the win in that outing despite allowing six runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched, as the Rangers gave him 16 runs of support in a 17-7 win.

- His last start in this ballpark came on April 22, 2016, receiving the loss after allowing five runs over 5.2 IP in a 5-0 Rangers loss.
- One of his three career complete games came on April 18, 2014 against these White Sox in Arlington, as that was the first of back-to-back complete game shutouts he'd throw (also April 23, 2014 at Oakland).

ROAD-TRIPPIN': Pérez is set to make his first start away from Target Field in over a month, (June 21 at Kansas City)...has fared better at home, as he owns a 4-1 record and a 4.97 ERA (41.2 IP, 23 ER) away from Minnesota...2019 has been par for the course on the road, as for his career, he owns a 20-30 record away from his home ballpark (Target Field, Globe Life Park), with a 4.97 ERA (396.1 IP, 219 ER).

TROUBLE WITH MEN ON: Martín has seen a lot of success in 2019 when working out of the wind-up, as he boasts an opponents' batting average of .204 (49-for-240) with an OPS of .586 when the bases are clear...however, once he allows someone to reach base, Pérez struggles to a .325 average (53-for-163) with a .910 OPS when pitching out of the stretch...with runners in scoring position, the lefty hasn't found much success either, as opponents are hitting .315 (29-for-92) with nine XBH and 40 RBI with RISP, including .354 (17-for-48) and 22 RBI with RISP and two outs.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON RHP [SEASON: 9-4, 4.24 ERA ; CAREER: 63-65, 4.44 ERA]

Gibson will take the mound tomorrow afternoon in the series finale against the White Sox...Gibby is coming off a rough outing on Tuesday as he allowed five runs over 5.0 innings in an eventual 14-12 loss to the Yankees...is 8-4 against the White Sox with a 2.82 ERA (99.0 IP, 31 ER), including a win in his only start against them this year back on May 25 at Target Field (7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 9 SO)...owns a career 2.97 ERA at Guaranteed Rate Field, the third-lowest in baseball since 2013 (min. 9 starts)...against the AL Central this season, Gibson is 2-1 with a 3.81 ERA (28.1 IP, 12 ER) with 30 strikeouts.

CAREER NOTES

- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts) across two levels.
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
