THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-1 on their seven-game eight-day roadtrip, taking the first two games in Chicago over the White Sox and losing the third game last night...the Twins will wrap up the series this afternoon, enjoy an off-day in Miami on Monday then play the Marlins for three games from Tuesday-Thursday...the Twins have gone 10-11 this month and have four July games remaining...they haven't had a losing record in any month since going 13-14 in June of last season.

TWINS DROP GAME THREE ON SOUTH SIDE: The Twins lost to the White Sox last night by a score of 5-1...Martín Pérez (8-4) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense collected just three hits, two from Byron Buxton...the three hits were their fewest since April 30 vs. Houston (also 3) and marked just the fourth time this season that the Twins recorded three hits or fewer.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing each other for the 10th of 19 times this season...the Twins are 10-3 in the last 13 vs. the Sox...Twins have gone 30-17 vs. Chicago since the start of 2017.

☞ Jorge Polanco has seven home runs and 21 RBI in 23 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field...the homers and RBI are his personal most in any opposing ballpark.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 32-20 on the road this season, a .615 road winning percentage, tied with Atlanta for the best road win-percentage in baseball...the Twins went 29-52 on the road in 2018...their 112 road home runs have already surpassed their total of 80 from last year, and are one shy of the Twins record of 113 set back in 1963...where the Twins offense ranks among all of baseball on the road:

MAD MAX: Max Kepler is hitting .345 (19-for-55) with four doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 21 RBI, a .891 slugging percentage and a 1.294 OPS in his last 14 vs. the Sox...he has reached safely in each of his last nine games vs. the Sox.

#BOMBASQUAD: The Twins 201 home runs are the most in baseball, ahead of Los Angeles-NL and Milwaukee (both with 176)...201 homers already are fourth most in club history...they need 24 home runs to match their all-time record of 225, set in 1963...they are on pace to hit 313 home runs which would pass the Major League Baseball record of 267, set by the Yankees last season.

WHEN IN ROMO: The Twins announced last night that they acquired right-handed pitchers Sergio Romo and Chris Vallimont, along with a player to be named later from the Miami Marlins, in exchange for first baseman Lewin Diaz...Romo, 36, appeared in 38 games for Miami this season, going 2-0 with a 3.58 ERA (37.2 IP, 15 ER), 13 walks and 33 strikeouts...the veteran has played parts of 12 seasons in the major leagues with San Francisco, Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay and Miami, going 40-31 with a 2.91 ERA (600.1 IP, 194 ER), 126 saves, 141 walks and 665 strikeouts in 681 games...Romo has allowed just one earned run in his last 15 games, posting a 0.61 ERA (14.2 IP, 1 ER) with only one walk, 12 strikeouts and an opponent batting average of .226...additionally, he has held right-handed hitters to a .200 batting average (15-for-75), including just two hits to righties in his last 16 at-bats with no walks and six strikeouts...Vallimont, 22, was drafted by Miami in the fifth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Mercyhurst College (PA)...the 6-foot-5, 220-pound Vallimont has made 19 starts this season between Single-A Clinton and Single-A Jupiter, going 6-7 with a 3.16 ERA (105.1 IP, 37 ER), 37 walks and 122 strikeouts...Diaz, 22, was signed by the Twins as an undrafted free agent on July 2, 2013. He split this season between Single-A Ft. Myers and Double-A Pensacola, hitting .297 (100-for-337) with 27 doubles, two triples, 19 home runs and 61 RBI.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins have named Single-A Cedar Rapids outfielder Gilberto Celestino and Double-A Pensacola right-handed pitcher Edwar Colina Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...in six games for the Kernels, Celestino hit .385 (10-for-26) with three doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk with a 1.023 OPS...Celestino was acquired by the Twins along with right-handed pitcher Jorge Alcalá near the 2018 trade deadline in exchange for right-handed pitcher Ryan Pressly...Colina made the start on Thursday for the Blue Wahoos against the Mobile BayBears, pitching 7.0 innings, allowing one unearned run with three hits allowed, one walk and 10 strikeouts...Colina was signed by the Twins as an undrafted free agent at the end of September in 2015.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: Twins Bench Coach Derek Shelton filled in for Paul Molitor as Twins Manager as Mollie traveled to Cooperstown for the 2018 Hall of Fame induction...the Twins lost both games under Shelton by scores of 10-4 and 3-0 at Fenway Park.

LAST TIME OUT: Gibson didn't factor into the decision in his last start on July 23 vs. the Yankees after throwing 5.0 innings, allowing five runs on seven hits (1 home run), with three walks and three strikeouts...Didi Gregorius, the Yankee shortstop, accounted for all five runs that Gibson allowed (a two-run double in the first inning and three-run home run in the fifth inning)...he pitched a clean slate in the second and fourth innings, while stranding the bases loaded in the third.

- Marked the seventh time in his career (180 games, 179 starts) in which he threw 100-or-more pitches in 5.0 innings or less, and second this season (May 3 at New York-AL).

CALLING CHICAGO: The right-hander is making his 16th career start against the White Sox, second this season...owns a career line of 8-4 with a 2.82 ERA (99.0 IP, 31 ER) vs. Chicago-AL...in his last start on May 25, he earned the win after allowing just one run on five hits over 7.0 innings of work...has made nine career starts against the White Sox at Guaranteed Rate Field with his last coming August 22, 2018, allowing seven runs (4 earned) on seven hits and five strikeouts over 4.2 innings pitched, suffering the loss...his last win in Chicago came August 22, 2017, where he tossed 7.0 innings of seven-hit ball allowing just one run and striking out eight...for his career, Gibby owns a 5-2 record, 2.97 ERA (60.2 IP, 20 ER) on the road against Chicago.

- He is one of six pitchers all-time with an ERA sub-3.00 at Guaranteed Rate, joining Danny Duffy (2.51), Corey Kluber (2.68), Johan Santana (2.75), Jeremy Guthrie (2.81) and Justin Masterson (2.82), with a minimum of nine starts here.

ROAD WARRIOR: Enters today 3-3, 4.33 ERA (52.0 IP, 25 ER) in 10 games (all starts) away from Target Field...is making his first start on the road since July 12 at Cleveland where didn't factor into the decision after allowing three runs (1 earned) over 3.2 innings.
• Over his last four road starts, the Twins are 3-1 while they are 7-3 over his 10 road starts this season.

WINNING WAYS: The Twins have gone 13-8 in Gibson's 21 games (20 starts) this season and his nine total wins is tied for second with José Berríos behind Jake Odorizzi (11)...the Twins are 28-25 since the beginning of the 2018 season with Gibson on the mound (52 starts).

- Has not lost a decision since June 29, a span of seven appearances (6 starts, 1 as opener)...is 2-0 with a 4.40 ERA over 30.2 innings pitched while striking out 29 and only walking 10 in that stretch.

TUESDAY'S STARTER - JAKE ODOORIZZI (SEASON: 11-5, 3.84 ERA // CAREER: 58-53, 3.94 ERA)

Odorizzi will be on the bump on Tuesday making his 21st start of the season and his first against Miami...in his last start on July 24 vs. the Yankees, he received the loss after tossing 4.0 innings and allowing a career-high nine runs on 10 hits with two home runs...Jake owns a career line of 2-1, 3.81 ERA (26.0 IP, 11 ER) with seven walks and 30 strikeouts over five career starts against the Marlins...hasn't faced Miami since May 1, 2017 at Marlins Park...he did not factor into the decision after two runs (1 earned) on two hits over 5.0 innings of work...his last win against them came May 24, 2016 in Miami, where he pitched 5.0 innings of two-hit ball allowing no runs while striking out seven...so far in 2019, he has pitched to an 11.81 ERA (5.1 IP, 7 ER) in two starts vs. National League opponents this season (both losses to Philadelphia and New York-NL).
